Information on coming workshops was supplied by Deanna Skelton - (see details in this issue). She also reported that Florence Buck informed her that next year the new Scandinavian Cultural Center at PLU (Tacoma) will be able to have the WRA Juried Show.

President Marie Ganfield reported on Events and Sales. The World Fest at the Northgate Mall was a great success -- participating were Connie Sullivan as Chairperson, Anita Boren, Louise Frair, Vanessa Strand, Gurine Nordby and Marie Ganfield. WRA received a thank you letter from Marianne Forssblad, Director of the Nordic Heritage Museum, for this participation. Gurine Nordby reported the Norweigan Days at PLU was a disaster, total sales were only \$300. Marie and Jack Ganfield are going to Chair the Midsummer Festival in Astoria June 23rd and 24th. Anita Boren is Chairperson for the Heritage Festival at Marymoor Park at Redmond June 30th and July 1st. Betty Edwards and Wilda Snider will Co-Chair Tivoli, Nordic Heritage Museum July 7th.

The program was presented by Sharon Engelbert on "Rosemaling with Acrylics" and was very informative.

 $\overline{\text{Old Business}}$ - A discussion was held on having a permanent storage place for the rosemaled pieces owned by WRA. Anita Boren and Gurine Nordby were appointed to look into new display tablecovers.

New Business - Ida Mae Swedberg proposed that WRA invite all members to paint ornaments in traditional shapes for Christmas trees for the Nordic Heritage Museum and the Scandinavian Cultural Center at PLU. The motion passed.

Material for the new WRA bunad will cost between \$20.00 and \$25.00. Dena Iverson has volunteered to have a workshop for making the blouse.

The doorprize of tracing paper was won by Gurine Nordby.

What a wonderful group of teenagers, counselors, directors and cooks! These young people are learning so much about their Norwegian background — language, history, arts and crafts, fold dancing, respect of this country and Norway, working, playing and having fund together.

MARILYN HANSEN VISITS NORWAY

Bjorg Kleivi was a delightful guide for me in May. She met me and my relatives at Seljord and drove us to her husband's ancestoral farm where there is a beautiful, carved stabbur. It's on the national historic buildings list. We visited her home and studio. She was in the midst of painting kubestols and chests. She took us to three different farms which have old rosemaling. Usually the upstairs guest bedroom is the most decorated. Farmers built one-story houses. When they made more money, they added a second floor. Now the owners have room-darkening shades to protect the rosemaling from the sun. They live right among their antiques. Microwave ovens were next to 200 year old bowls and carving. Bjorg had never been to these places herself! I apologized for taking up so much of her times. She said she rosemals from 6:30 am to 5:30 pm and never takes time off. So she was glad for an excuse to have a day off.

The second day she arranged for us to go to another farm and to the Heddal stave church. It was a little before the regular tourist season, so they were not open to the public. Then she joined us and people from the Folk High School in Gvarv to go to a "living museum" where there is old rosemaling and outdoor buildings which are used for receptions, art shows and cultural events. We arrived just as a post-funeral gathering was singing in honor of the deceased.

We had a wonderful time with her. She greets all her friends in WRA and is looking forward to coming to Seattle again.
