Directions to November meeting in Bremerton.

From the North (Poulsbo, Lofall, Edmonds Ferry etc.)
Follow high 3 south; take the Bremerton exit. Turn left on Kitsap Way; follow to Warren Avenue (about 6 lights). Turn left on Warren Ave., proceed north to 16th Street. Go left on 16th around block of Roosevelt Field. Hall is on 18th street across from the N.E. corner of the field.

From the South: (from Tacoma, Shelton, etc.) Follow 4-lane highway into W. Bremerton. Turn right on Burwell Street (2nd traffic light after entering city limits); follow Burwell to Warren Avenue and continue as directed above. If you have questions on ferry schedules, call Washington State Ferries.

Shirley was a very gracious lady and an excellent teacher. I think she and her husband enjoyed their visit to the Northwest.

There were lots of new participants in the classes and this is good. There is a nice group of enthusiastic painters in the Portland area—we even had Peggy Osher from California. Trollhaugen is always special. Besides painting, there are walks in the woods, hot tubbing, friendly games of cards, and lots of good food. I hope everyone will consider the classes scheduled for next year.

New Guidelines

We will be formulating new guidelines for major workshops in the next few months. The amount of deposits; deadlines for deposits, student cancellations, final payments; amount of refunds and so on. The teachers we have for major workshops go to a great deal of preparation to teach as they come from long distances, and expenses incurred are very large.

All this means we must have firm commitments many weeks before the class is scheduled. And through the night, it's told.

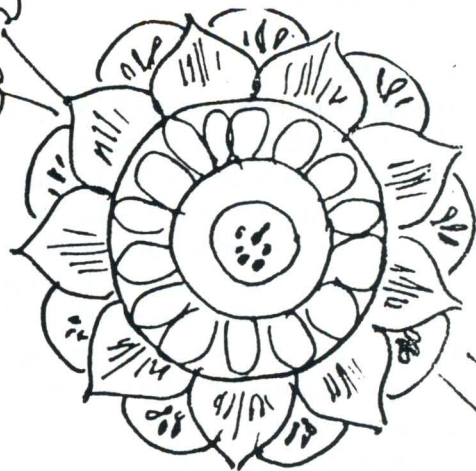
The energetic hikers

Western Rosemalers Showcase at the Nordic Heritage Museum

The President's Showcase is elegant. The committee placed 26 items on display from past presidents.

1975-1976 Florence Buck, President

Entered her first piece painted, 1975-1976. It is a Hallingdal design on a bowl. She also entered her more recent pieces, a hexagon box with a stabur on the front and a bentwood box in the Telemark style.

1977-1978 Mary Ellerman, President

Shared three pieces: a cutting board painted in American Rogaland, an oval plaque done in Valdres and another cutting board painted in 1982 in the Telemark style.

1979-1980 Jean Alfson, President

Loaned by Betty Edwards, a 14" fluted plate in the Telemark style.

1981-1982 Dena Iverson, President

Loaned a large tine done in the Telemark style. She also shared two Norwegian style bowls. One bowl is the Halling style, the other in Telemark.

1983-1984 Cecelia Hendrix, President

Betty Edwards secured these pieces from Louie Hendrix. One is an American Rogaland plate; two are panels; one is Halling, the other Telemark.

1985 Betty Edwards, President

Three pieces done by Betty are a 10" Hallingdal bowl; an 11" Telemark bowl; and a 12" plate in the Halling style.

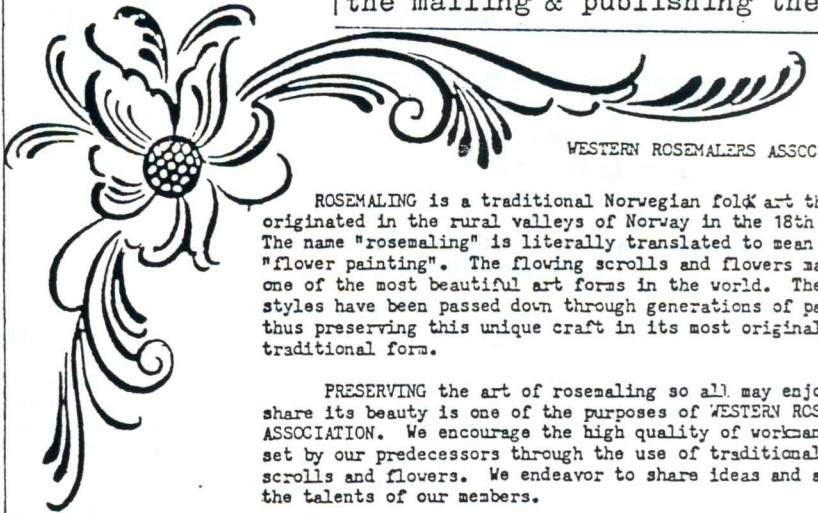

The meeting was called to order by Mary McDonald. 30 people were present.

Minutes of the May meeting were changed to add --must be accompanied "by a check request form, a self-addressed envelope" and actual receipts..., this being part of item 3 in the May minutes.

Treasurer's report reflected a September 12 bank balance of \$4,239.08.

Juried Show 1995; Oct. 2 - Nov. 13. Florence Buck reported that 54 pieces will be shown by members from Washington and Oregon. Items will be received Sept. 27 from 10 am - 3 pm at PLU. She and Lois Tucker took items brought to this meeting. A sign-up sheet was sent around for people willing to demonstrate on Sunday afternoons during the exhibit.

Actions taken:

1. Motion was made, seconded and passed that a photographer take slides and prints of juried show items, not items for display only. \$200 maximum fee.
2. Motion made, seconded and carried that WRA have a \$60 ad in 'Western Viking' commemorative edition. Naomi Price will submit the ad.
3. Motion made, seconded and carried that WRA buy a year's subscription to 'Western Viking' to be sent to Betty Edwards, publicity chairperson, cost \$30.
4. Motion made, seconded and passed that WRA pay \$25 to be a sponsor of Christmas music on the Scandinavian Hour on KBLE radio.
5. Motion made, seconded and carried that WRA purchase 30 sets ea. of 2 Christmas card designs from Vesterheim, and 30 sets each of two rosemaling design sets of notecards. These will be sold at our sales. We have 150 sets of WRA cards remaining.
6. Motion was made, seconded and carried that WRA members be permitted to sell stationary products, i.e. printed or hand-painted cards and stationary, at our sales.
7. Motion made, seconded, but only discussed, that members pay 30% commission at WRA sales. Some felt that was too high. Others urged membership fee be raised so that sales could be subsidized. More discussion will be held at the November meeting.

Mary McDonald announced there will be a parade for the King and Queen of Norway in Ballard on October 25. WRA has been invited to participate. After some discussion it was the feeling of the group that we not participate.

Library Laurie Medill has had discussions with Nordic Heritage Museum regarding a permanent location for the library. Discussions will continue.

Workshops Gurine Nordby announced that Marlys Hammer is scheduled to teach in Portland April 11-13, 1996, and in Seattle-Tacoma area April 15-19, 1996. Gurine urged changes in required deposits and fees paid ahead of time to prevent the uncertainty experienced with the last workshop.

Door prizes of photos and patterns from Shirley Evanstad were won by Laurie Medill and Gurine Nordby.

20 6 350 degree oven (325 glass)

1 3/4	1/2 lb	Monterey Jack Cheese
10	3	Whole Chicken breasts
20	6	Slices <u>thin</u> dried beef or ham
10	3	Slices lean bacon
3	1	Can (10 1/2 oz) Cream of mushroom soup
3 cups	3/4 cup	Sour Cream (or cottage cheese blended)
1 1/2 cn	3/4 can	Tomato Paste (or tomato sauce)

Fillet chicken breasts and separate into two pieces. Lay one slice meat on top each check breast piece. Cut cheese into blocks about the size of your pointer-finger, same number of chicken breasts. (left-over will be shredded) Lay finger of cheese on meat. Roll up and lay 1/2 strip bacon on top. Mix soup, sour cream, tomato paste and grated cheese. Spray pan with PAM.

Arrange rolls of chicken in pan, cover with mix and bake in pre-heated oven for 1 hour and 15 minutes or until tender. Can be frozen for up to 1 month ahead. Thaw in refrigerator overnight. Re-heat just before serving. Garnish with pimento and minced parsley.
