Local Man Receives Wings

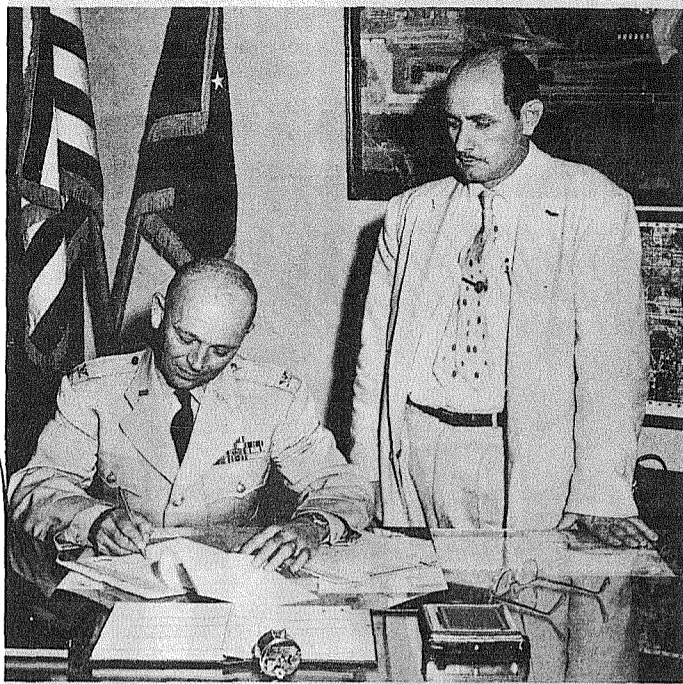

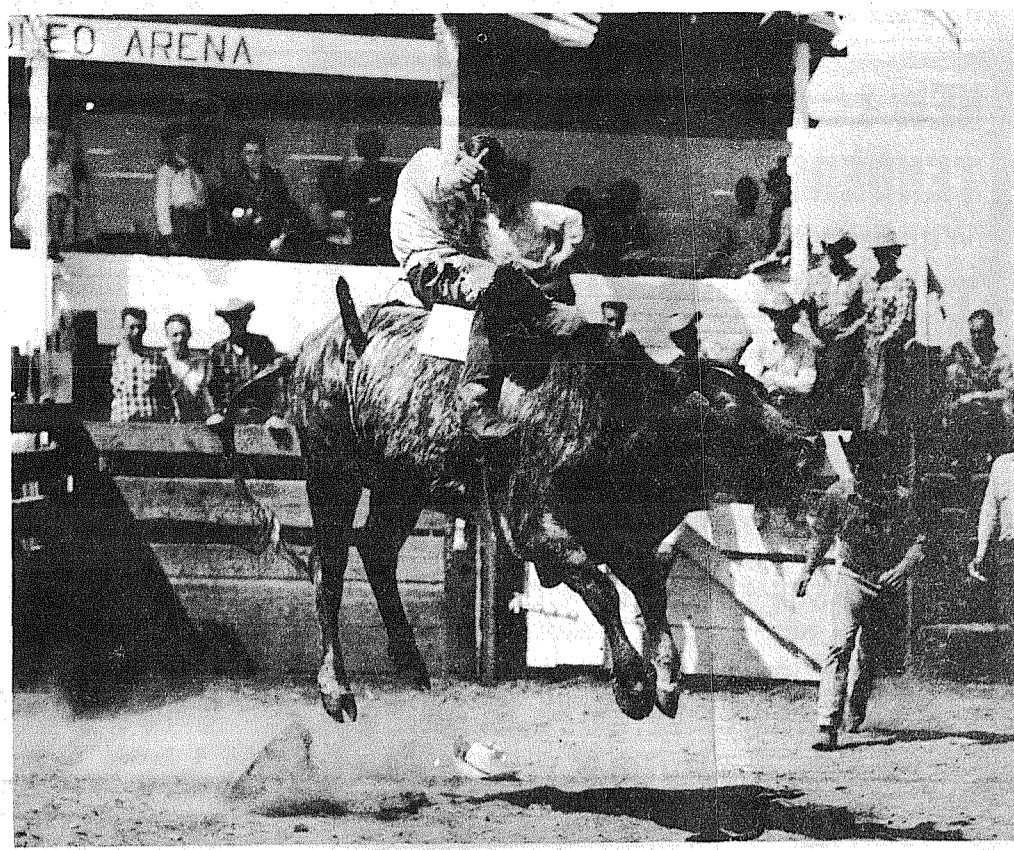

According to Senator Bennett of Utah, U. S. government programs already authorized will cost the taxpayers a trillion dollars in the next 40 years. A trillion, in case you're interested in seeing it in figures, is a thousand billion — \$1,000,000,000,000 (OK so I had help figuring this out.)

No one save a celestial mathematician is capable of visualizing such an amount. One illustration, however, may help: In cash, it would take a stack of \$1,000 bills 88,000 stories high! Remember — Senator Bennett was speaking only of already authorized programs. New and expanded programs could vastly increase the costs. And one thing is sure — if the welfare state philosophy prevails and grows, as it has been prevailing and growing, a trillion ultimately will look rather like petty cash. Then the value of the inflation-eroded dollar will move right on down toward the vanishing point — along with both security and freedom.

Along the same lines as the above, it always strikes me as funny to hear the comments made about some of our departed businesses. In every case the thinking seems to be that the person heading the organization just was no business man. Well maybe so, but as far as I am concerned to survive in today's business climate you have to be a regular Houdini.

Take a look at our government which is in effect the biggest business in the world today. If I operated my business like our leaders operate the government you would be reading your last Times Journal right now.

No, I don't feel it is quite fair to criticize every business man who fails and set on your duster without opening your mouth while our government goes further in debt by unbelievable figures, using business methods far below those of any existing outfit in the U.S. today that still has its doors open.

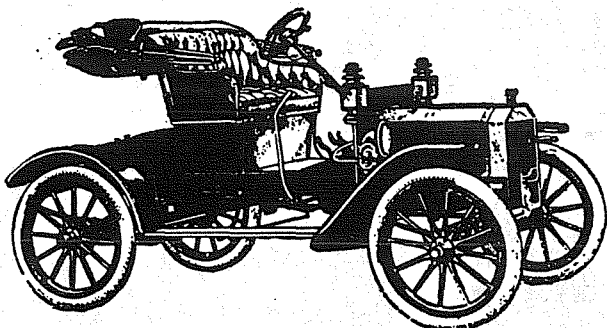

Sky Diving Meet June 10-11

Pacific Northwest sports parachutists will pit their skills against each other June 10-11, at Thun Field, Puyallup, for trophies and for funds for child welfare.

A Puyallup service organization, Active 20-30 International is sponsoring the First Annual Rainier Sky Divers Spot Jumping Competition to earn cash for its Sunshine Kids Fund. The meet is a non-profit amateur sports competition but the service club will earn money for its child welfare projects by handling parking programs and concessions.

Competition chairman Ed Barber of Tacoma expect 30 to 40 entries from clubs in British Columbia, Seattle Portland, Fort Lewis and the host Rainier Sky Divers. On the basis of records, the favorites are the Seattle Sky Divers, who could take both team and individual competition. A Seattle jumper, Ron Herzog, won an April sky diving meet his club held at its Snohomish base.

Exhibition jumps are scheduled for both days, including a 100-second free fall from 20,000 feet on Sunday by Lee Huston of Tacoma. Huston will carry smoke flares so that on-lookers can watch his 3 1/2-mile drop from its beginning.

Barber, club president Larry Spears of Tacoma vice president Bob Alred of Puyallup and George Mitchell of Paine Air Force base will pair off for one 60-second delay each day from 12:500 feet.

The club will also demonstrate an automatic opener used on parachutes worn by student jumpers. Activated at 1,000 feet by barometric pressure, the safety device electrically ignites a small explosive charge which opens the reserve parachute in case the novice loses track of altitude, freezes, or simply gets rattled.

The device will be worn by Oscar, a dummy used in mountain rescue work which the club is borrowing from Pierce County Sheriff Frank Stojack.

Competition jumps will be made from 2,500 feet. Each jumper will leave the plane, pull his ripcord then steer his sports parachute toward a circular target on the ground. Scoring is awarded by points given for the distance in feet or inches - and the lack of it - between the jumper's landing place and the center of the target, or spot. A jumper who hits the spot earns 200 points. One lands 200 feet away gets a single point. Each sky diver will make three jumps.

Sports parachutes can be steered because panels are cut from the canopies; the umbrella-shaped nylon "air anchors" that let the jumpers down. Air rushing out the open gore pushes the chute forward. When the jumper collapses one side of the canopy by pulling on the shroud lines air is deflected and the parachute turns to the right or left.

Sports parachutists buy either Armed Forces surplus equipment or civilian made parachutes. Many dye their canopies in brilliant hues.
