Dr. H. L. Foss, Seattle, chairman of the board of regents and president of the North Pacific District, the American Lutheran Church, will dedicate the Tacoma-Pierce Administration building.

As many of you know, Cliff was promoted to assistant manager of the Parkland Branch of the National Bank of Washington only two months ago. Later, when someone was needed to head the Parkland Youth Progress and Development Committee, Cliff volunteered.

The father of three children, Cliff well realized the youth problems that need to be overcome, yet he never had a chance to remedy them.

### Living Christ Series Will Continue

The Living Christ full-color motion picture series continues Sunday, October 16th, at 6:00 P.M., with the showing of "Men of the Wilderness" at the Immanuel Baptist Church, 94th & Pacific Avenue.

The Rev. Ed Coy, Pastor, will elaborate on the cultural background of the times in connection with the film.

### Fire Department Issues Advice

The Parkland Fire Department reports that fire prevention is everybody's business and should be practiced on a year round basis. Many things can be done by the home owner to make his place safer from fire. If you do have a fire keep some equipment on hand for first aid fire fighting such as garden hose used for fire, or one of the many good extinguishers on the market. Do not try to combat fires that are large and beyond your control. Learn how to contact the proper fire dept covering your area. Remember, your home and property are as safe as you make it.

Richardson pointed out that the excess millage to be voted on in this election would not show on citizens' tax statements until 1962 because the excess levy request is only a continuation of present levies, not an addition.

Both school propositions are scheduled for discussion at PTA meetings to be held in the individual schools during October. The Education Council asks that each voter look carefully for the school issues on the ballot, since they require 60 per cent of the voters to vote Yes for passage.

As if the Russians, the Chinese and "Fido" Castro, Khrushchev's pet, didn't give us enough villains, some "liberal" political quarters are trying to make a villain out of advertising.

Some kinds of advertising may be offensive — like the ones on TV that graphically explore ailing alimentary canals as you watch at dinnertime — but this isn't what the politicians are talking about. They have fallen for two untruths about advertising, and have overlooked the ways in which it is truly useful.

One of the false objections is that it adds to the prices of things. This is not so, because low prices can only result from volume production and volume distribution. This can result only from volume sales, which are impossible without advertising.

The other untruth is that advertising is so sinister-clever that Americans are persuaded to buy things they don't want against their will. This is an insult to every housewife, who competently stretches her smallish budget to cover the needs of her family.

In reality, advertising's services are many. Today, a new product can become known all over the nation overnight through advertising. If it has appeal and usefulness, customers appear at the stores next morning, and a new industry is born to give employment to many and contributes to our economic growth.

From day to day, advertising helps the careful housewife to find the bargains in goods, clothing and other necessities that enable her to stretch her budget to cover all the needs and have some left for savings and luxuries.

The very existence of advertising forces competing companies to remain on their toes, developing finer products, new products and lower prices. Customers exposed to advertising soon become aware when a company's products fall behind its competitors.

Advertising serves as a directory in every kind of need.

And not the least of the services of advertising is its function in supporting fine publications and radio and TV stations. Without advertising, newspapers could not be sold for nickles or given away free as in our case. Most newspapers cost up to four times their selling price to produce and the story is similar in periodicals. In our case the paper you're reading cost nearly 14 cents to produce. All the gratis entertainment and information that comes over the air is provided free by the advertisers.

Those who attack advertising in general, rather than some limited abuses in advertising, must be suspected of either speaking in vast ignorance of the subject, or of deliberately seeking to deprive the free press and the broadcast media of their foundation of support.

What are they seeking? Could it be a government press to replace our free press?

**Q** Mr. Andrews, what could you do, as governor, about providing more jobs for people in the State?

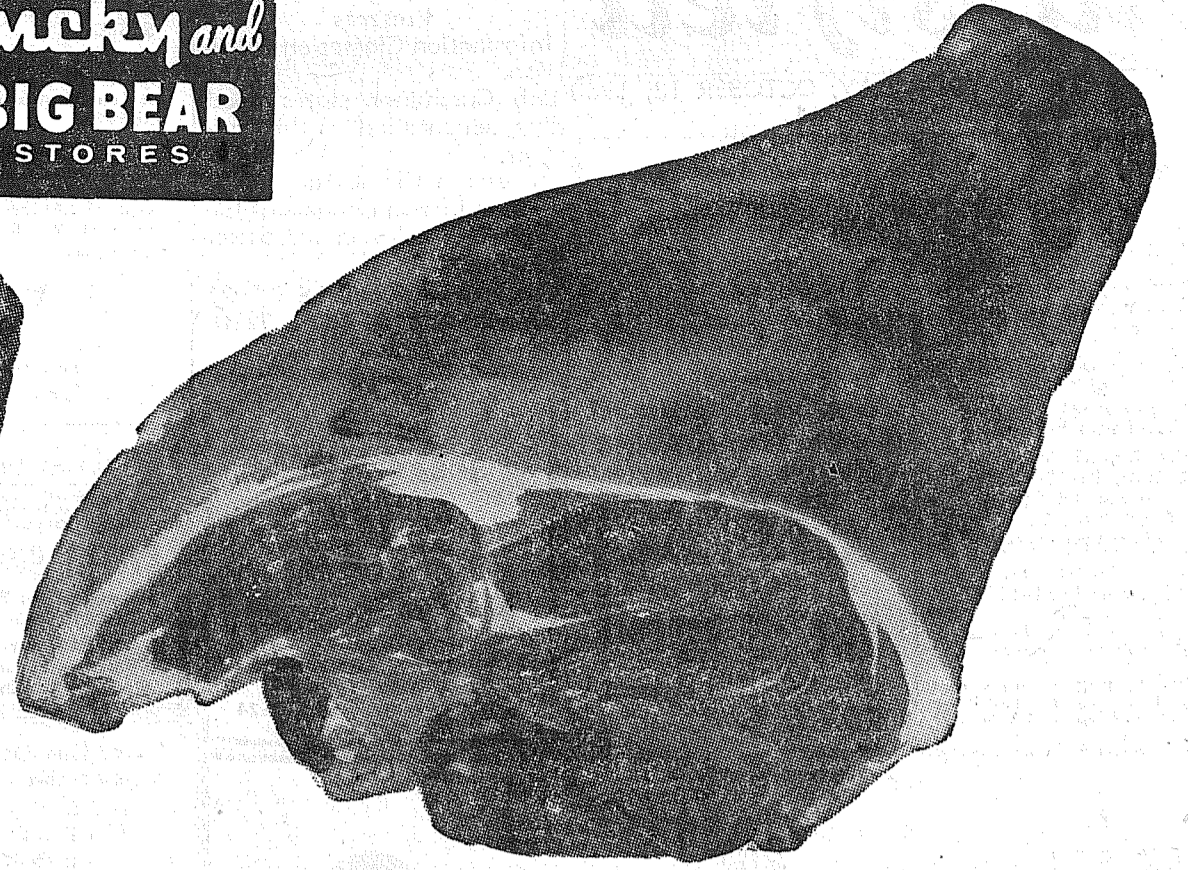
