



Constant conflict and split authority are among the worst things that can happen in a home. No wonder Junior feels like a football. It would be much better if his parents would talk things over freely and calmly so Junior would know exactly what is expected of him.

## a-Wondering ... and a-Wandering . . .

They're speaking a new language in the woods here in the West. It's a language as far removed from the forest jargon of 75, 50 and 25 years ago as the methods employed by loggers to get trees from woods to sawmills.

The speech of the rough-and-ready logger of bygone years was as colorful and unique as that of any occupation. It was descriptive and to the point. It spoke of the high ball (full speed ahead and the devil take the hindmost), hot logging (cut as fast as possible), 90,000 timber (easy cutting area)—and the quick lick, candy show and others less printable.

Not that today's logger is any less rough-and-tough than his cut-and-get-out- predecessor, and woe betide the city slicker who thinks that chain saw muscles are softer than those of the crosscut.

But today's logger speaks of reforestation, tree thinning and pruning, stand improvement, perpetual harvests and complete utilization of the forest crop. Tree farming has become the new woodland watchword. With it has come a multiple use forest era—an era of tree management that provides new benefits in watershed, soil, wildlife and outdoor recreation. Like the woods words, the heedless, give're snoose

language has lost a little of its flavor. But the philosophy of orderly forest practices which is responsible has substituted its own promising new language of conservation, just as shopping malls have replaced skid roads.

If you can recall the fun you had at an old-fashioned taffy-pulling party you have a remarkable memory for your age.

Editor & Publisher says: "It will be argued, of course, that 1958 was an unusual year, that too many other factors enter into automobile sales, and that these figures are meaningless. We disagree.

"It seems to us that the coincidence—the manufacturer placing the largest percentage of his advertising appropriation in television and having the largest percentage drop in sales together with the fact that the only manufacturer who spent no money in TV but had the only increase in sales—is too great to ignore."

TV is a great medium but nothing can supplant the newspaper. If this sounds like a commercial for the Times Journal, that's fine. I intended for it to.
