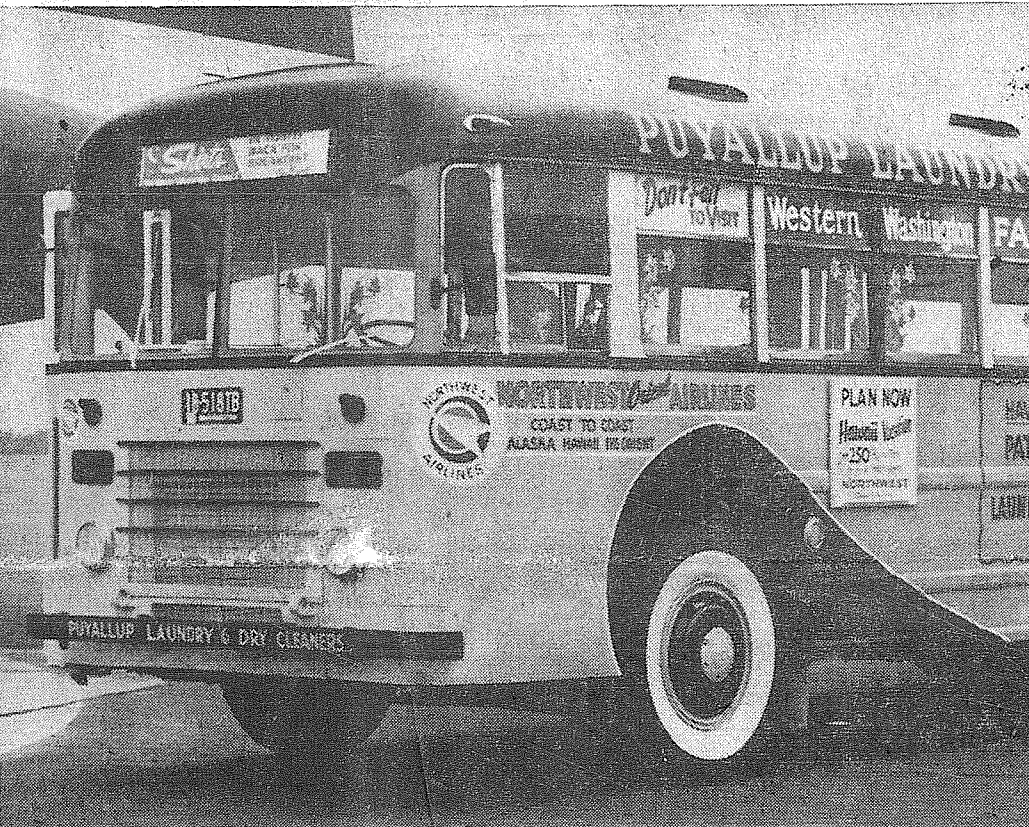
## 1959 Christmas Coloring Contest Off To Good Start

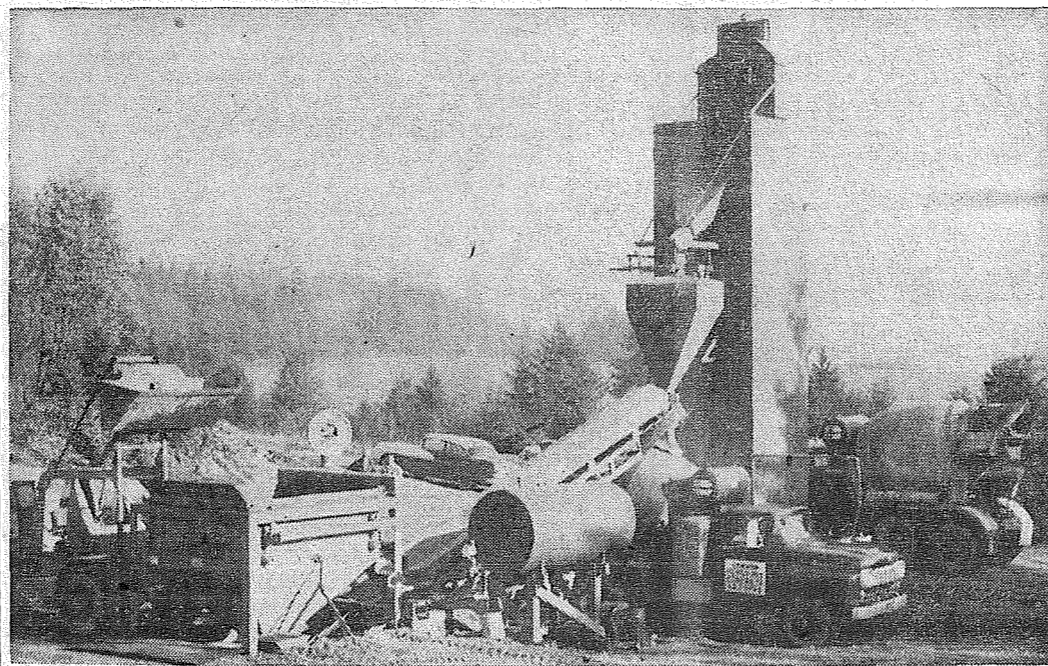

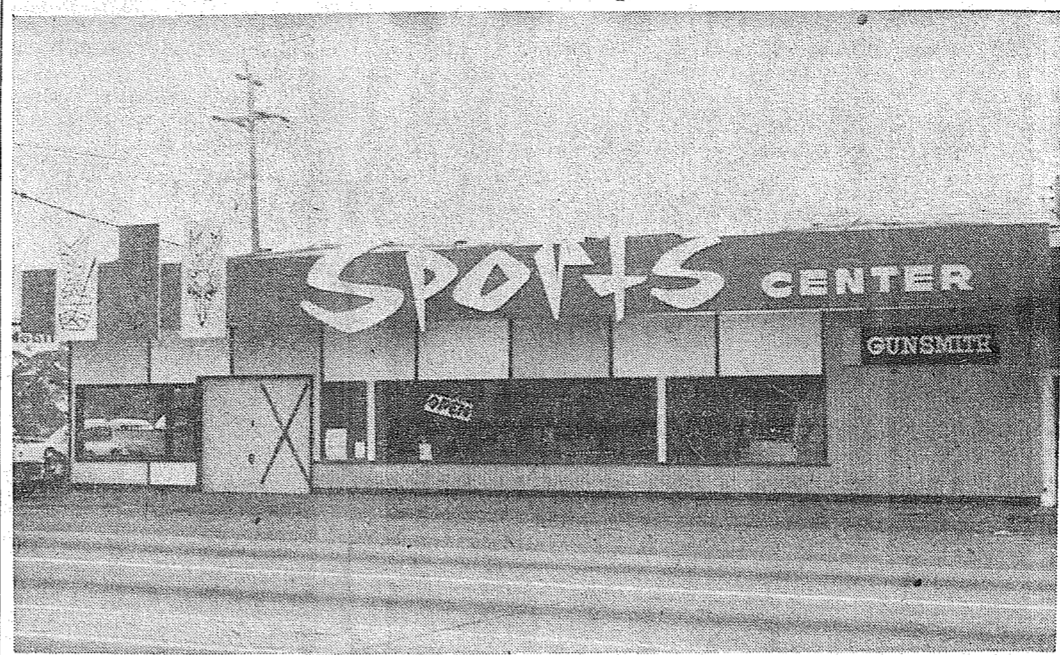

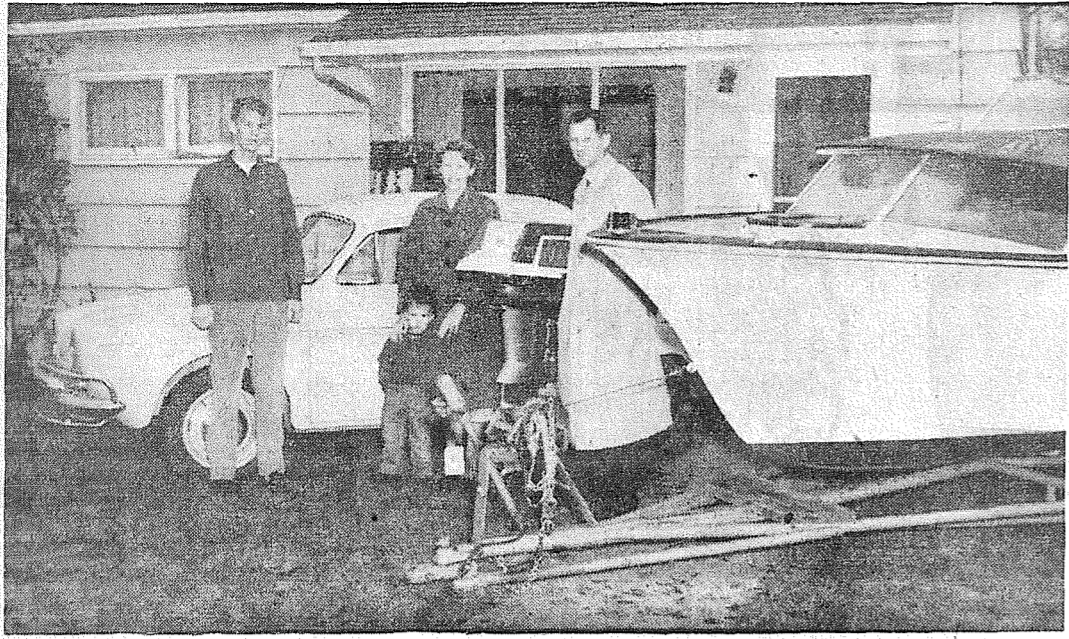
