

While businessmen are waking up to the formidable task that lies ahead others in our midst should wake up to the fact that businessmen are not public enemies.

This past week I received in the mail a copy of an unsigned letter addressed to the P-TA at one of our local schools. This letter made note of the deplorable lack of maintenance and cleanliness in one of our newer school buildings. Attached was a note asking me what I thought about it. I've checked into the matter and agree with the writer. The situation needs immediate attention and correction. I've always believed in the old adage that a word to the wise is sufficient. Let this and the letter be the word. Otherwise, it's been said that I have a big mouth and don't know enough to keep it closed.

An editor down Texas way has this to say:
