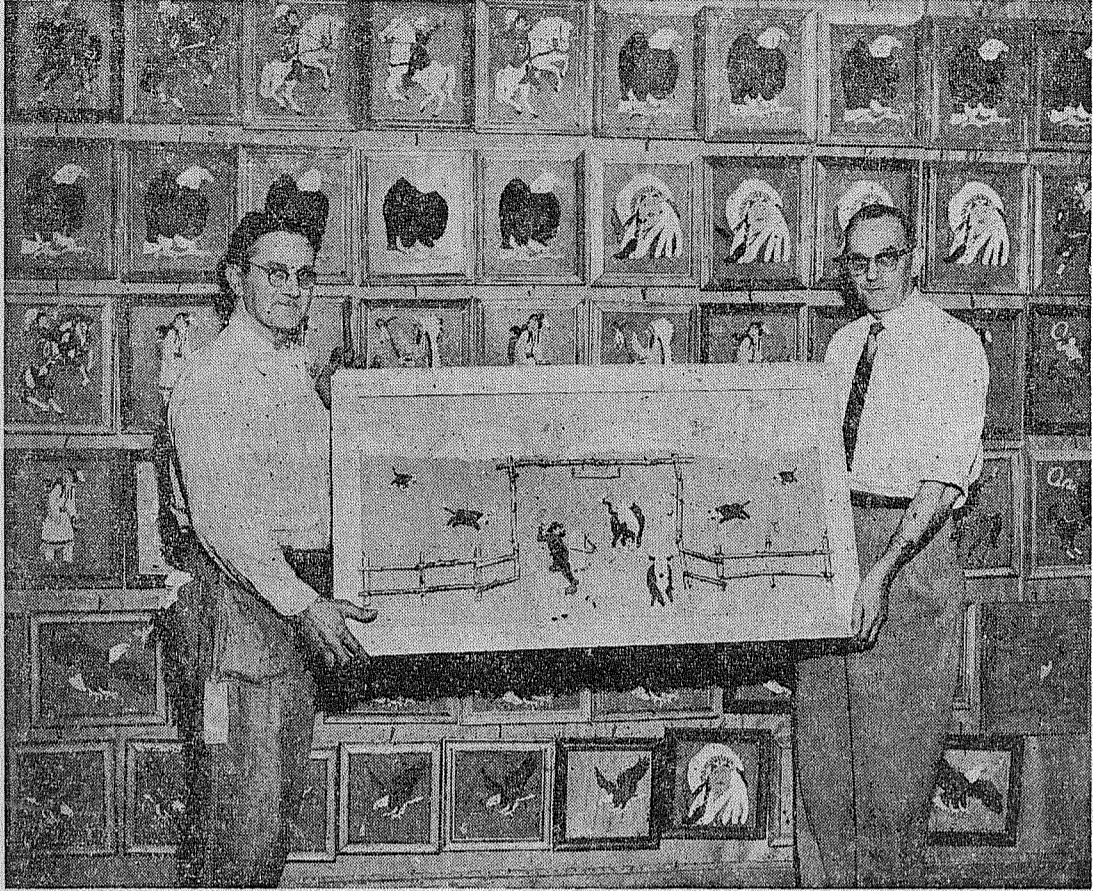

What's all this busines of UFO—Unidentified Flying Objects—"Flying Saucers" to you? What do they look like, what do they sound like? What do they do? Well, a Parkland businessman and his wife found out last Thursday night at their home, 172 East 123rd St.

Maurice Fletcher closed up his store, Fletcher's Market, about 10:30 and started home, just as he has done hundreds of times during the years he has been in business in Parkland. Everything was just routine until he turned the corner at 123rd and A streets and approached his home; right there, in a split second, "Fletch" was jolted out of the commonplace by the most amazing experience of his life. For 300 feet east of his home was a huge something—he calls it a What-Is-It—so completely enveloped in dazzling, pulsating red light that he could not look directly at it. The UFO became stationary and hovered in a vacant field, not

more than 30 feet in the air, he estimated.

Fletch ran up the driveway to his home and rapped on the window, calling his wife to come out, which she did immediately. The UFO still hung motionless and silent about 300 feet from them. As they watched, the strange craft drifted north, passing behind the Jerry Elmendorf home, 205 East 123rd. Fletcher ran to the Elmendorf home and called to Jerry but by the time he could get dressed and outside the craft had moved northward to about 121st street and circled westward in the general direction of McChord Air Force Base. The Fletchers noticed that it passed the Parkland Light & Water Co. water tanks at a level considerable lower than the signal light on the tanks.

After circling toward McChord, the craft swung back toward Parkland. It was noted that the flashing light seemed to come from all sides of the object, its pulsations making the craft ap-

pear to expand and contract. After about 20 minutes of unhurried maneuvers in the vicinity, the Unidentified Flying Object moved away into the night. After it had disappeared, Mr. and Mrs. Fletcher watched several planes pass over to make a landing at McChord field.

What about UFO? Well, as far as the Fletchers could make out, they look BIG, they are absolutely noiseless whether hovering in the air or in flight; they apparently don't DO anything unless somebody is curious about us earthlings and just drops by occasionally for a look-see.

Naturally Mr. and Mrs. Fletcher are seeking explanations of what they both saw so clearly Thursday night. If others in the area observed anything of this nature at the time, or on other occasions, they welcome the chance to pool experiences and promise to pass on to the public anything they may learn.

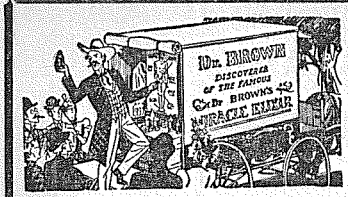

Shotputter Bob Stanley, also a senior, has as his best performance a heave of 49'2 3/4", also a school record. This is better than any conference weight man has done this year.

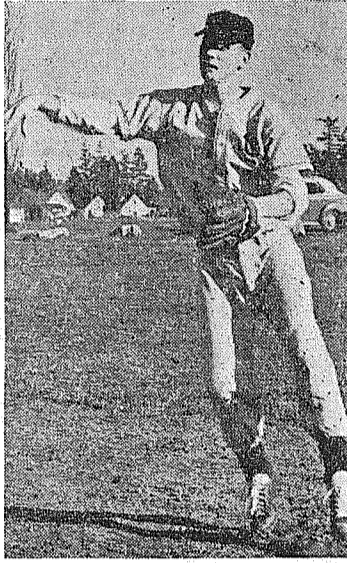
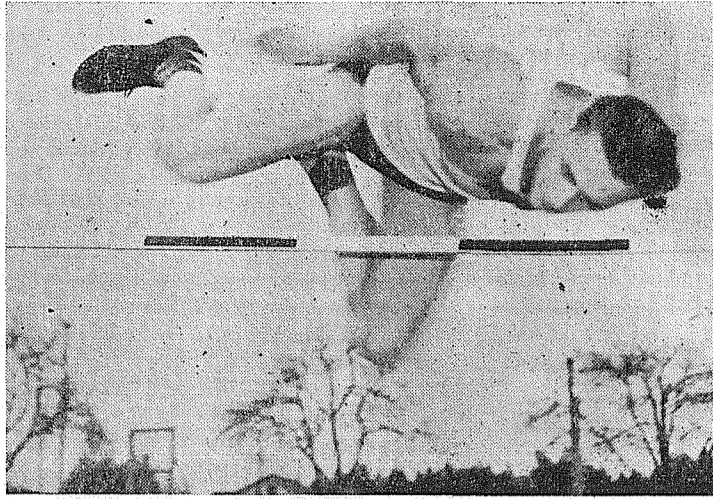

Alexander is playing his first season of baseball and has already become one of the Cards' leading hitters.

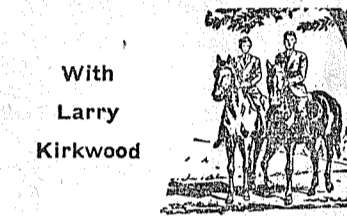

## Hart's Lake Grange News

The Grange Annual Go-to-Church Sunday was observed by the Harts Lake Grangers, who in a body attended the well planned Easter program given by the McKenna Community church and Sunday school.

Some time ago the Harts Lake Grange wrote to the President and to our Congressman, Thor C. Tollefson, urging the Federal Government "to give up the idea of acquiring the site of the National Grange Headquarters, giving two reasons (1) building is being used for worthwhile purposes, (2) fear the price would not be enough so that the Grange can purchase another building in as good a location as the words "just compensation" intends in the Constitution of the United States. Reply from Congressman Tollefson in part says, "Our office has obtained considerable information on the subject from the Grange office here in Washington. As a consequence, we have expressed opposition to the Government's proposal. As we view it, the proposal is not justified."

Our Grange approved a resolution "Learn more about our form of government." There is need for a better understanding and a better valuation of our form of government. "A good place to begin is with officers, lawyers and social science teachers." The resolution asks that a law be enacted requiring every person elected to governmental office, all lawyers, and every social science teacher to pass an examination on the State Constitution before they cash their first pay check. The examination includes the questions and the Articles and Sections where to find the answers. Fifteen questions are suggested, thirteen of them referring to the state constitution and two to the Constitution of the United States.

A letter was written and sent to our representative in Congress, Thor C. Tollefson, urging him to work, from the Federal angle, for a Cascade Tunnel using parts of the Old Naches Trail Route to make a short route to the central part of the state and to the east and southeast.

Our next Grange meeting will be May 25 at which time the men are to serve lunch.

Our Grange visits, as a body, the DesChutes Grange Friday evening May 10. The program for the Lecture Hour will be furnished by our Grange.
