And it describes the popular MIPs meaning Monthly Investment Plan-whereby one can buy stocks of one's choice out of income in amounts ranging from \$40 a quarter to \$1,000 a month.

Basically, the reason for the Exchange's issuance of this booklet is to try to persuade investors, large and small, to get the facts before they commit their money. The worst possible way to invest is on the strength of tips and rumors-or, most fatal of all, in answer to the blandishments of boiler shop operators who use high-powered phone and wire solicitations to dupe the unwary, meaning guys like me. There's no such thing as a sure-fire profit in stocks-or, for that matter, in any other form of investment. No one should buy stocks until he has adequate emergency reserves in the form of savings, insurance, and so on. Then if you wish to buy yourself a second income, and you've built these safeguards, learn all you can about what you're buying!


