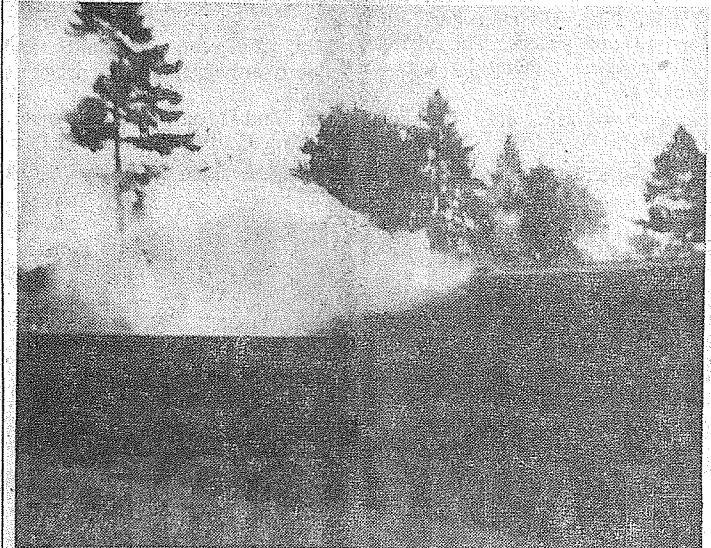

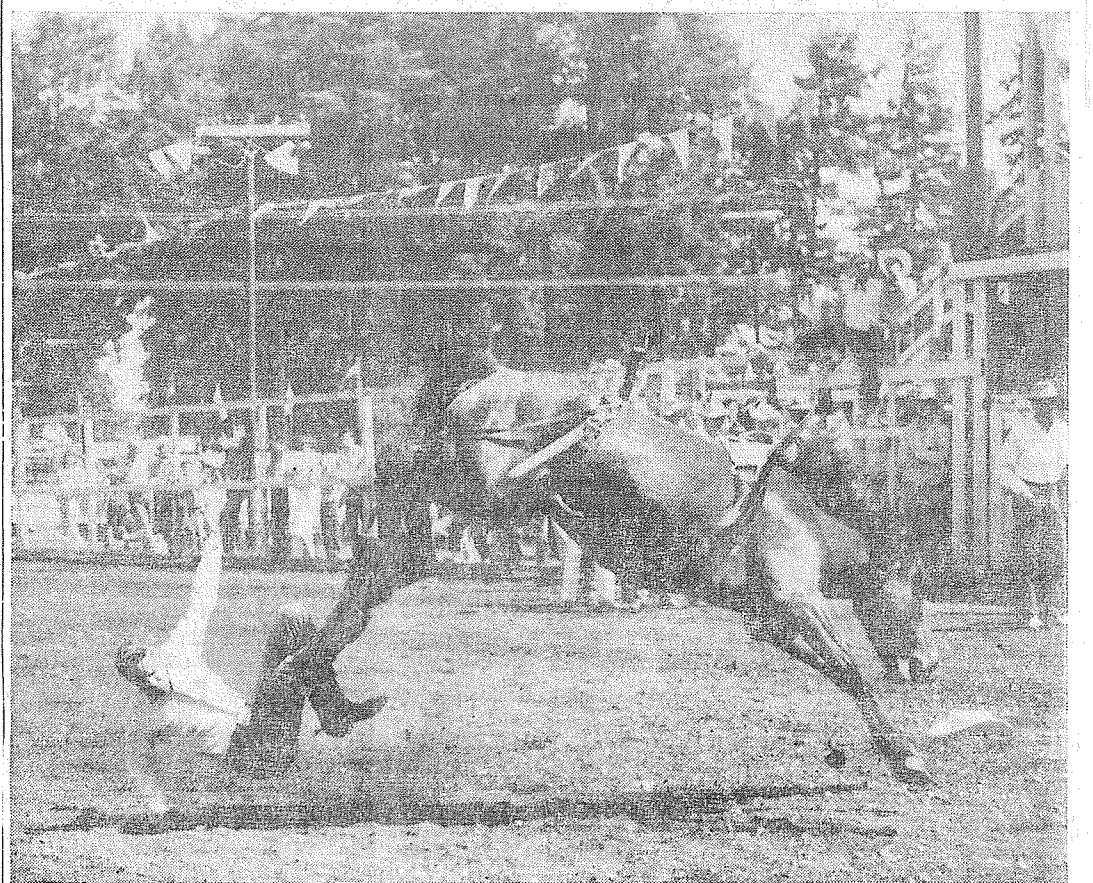

## New Parkland School Damaged by Fire



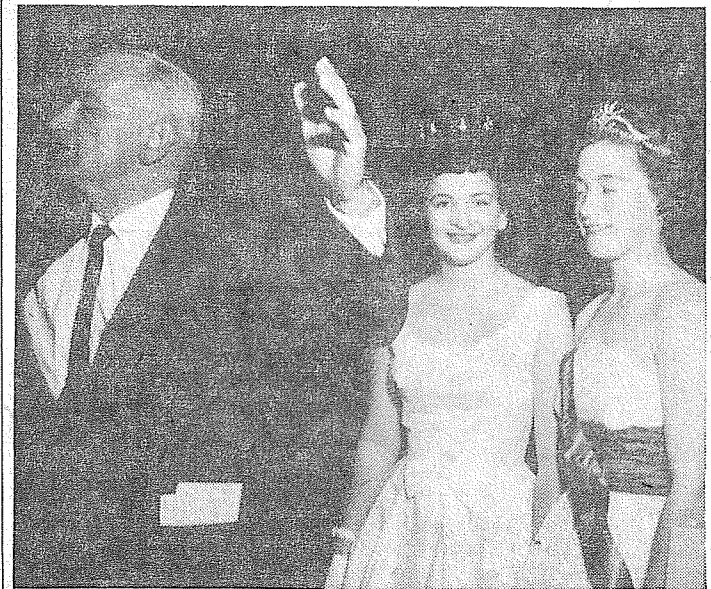

## Skin Diving School Offers Free Movie

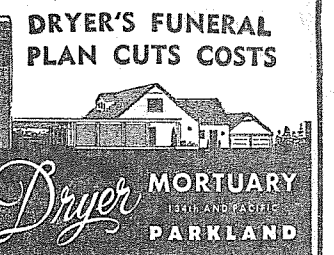

The new tank being erected by the Parkland Light & Water Co. at 142nd and Yakima is nearing completion and is expected to be in service sometime in July. Steel work on the tank is now 95 per cent done. The new addition to the mutual company's service is of 500,000 gallon capacity and is designed to serve the rapidly growing area in which it is located for at least 10 years. It augments the present water supply of Parkland Light & Water Co. of two tanks with 750,000 gallon capacity on East 119th street. Tied together in one system, the new supply will assure better pressure for fire protection and an ample reserve for any situation.

**a-Wondering . . .

A lot can be said for hogs — those roly-poly fellows who spend most of their time lying around in the mud and eating garbage. They furnish an ample supply of pork chops and bacon and they don't cause a lot of trouble. They're the type who are content to just rest in the mud and eat what's given them.

But it seems to me they furnish more than just food to several people I've met. I have, on more occasions than I'd like to count, come in contact with citizens who have adopted the hog's philosophy to their own way of life.

It's not so hard to do when you stop and think about it. In fact, it's almost the easiest way out according to some.

The hogs of our community just sit there, day after day, making footprints in the sands of time. That's a pretty good trick, too — making footprints while sitting down, but in their easy going manner they manage it.

The world changes, new laws are passed, things change. But you would never know it by talking to the hog-citizen. He's not concerned with things unless they affect his daily diet of garbage and he probably wouldn't get too excited about that either. He's the fellow that decided long ago that his one vote didn't matter so there was no use to concern himself with such things. He's also the fellow who decided one time that it was easier to go along with the gang than to go to a lot of trouble and voice his opinion.

He's such an inconspicuous fellow that we probably wouldn't notice him except for one fact — he's literally adopted his hog-hero's living habits. It's his one claim to fame; the thing that puts his name on the tip of every neighbor's tongue.

He's the fellow who lives down the street in the pig-stye; his dog is the one that always manages to turn over other people's garbage and do other favors for the neighbors. He's the fellow who likes to keep his front lawn about knee-deep in weeds (so it will hide the discarded junk and trash that reposes there until it blows into somebody else's yard). He's quite a guy, but he's happy. If the sun sets in the West it's fine with him, if it drops in the East, he'll worry about that some other time.

But animal husbandry experts tell us that it's getting so even the hogs are going to have to improve their living habits. They get along better, we're told, when their food is boiled and they live in a cleaned-up pig pen. The hogs probably don't like it that way—but they are changing.

Maybe the word will filter down to some of our hog-citizens, too.

Mondays drill consisted of laying large lines to remote areas of buildings, also taking large lines to roofs and upstairs and moving around all the obstacles found around large buildings.

This type of operation has extreme value as this type of operation needs great amount of man power which is the greatest problem facing all fire depts. today.

The next class to be given at the fire station is hydraulics which will be held July 11th. If you are interested in becoming a volunteer fireman call LE 7-8530 as we do have need for more men.

**TECHNICS AND LAW**  
A good legal system needs to do its everyday job well, of course. But the real test comes with the new technic of our changing world, like today's "rainmakers."

Twenty years ago people would think a person a bit off who would go to court to sue somebody for dumping a cloud full of rain on the wrong valley or failing to put snow on the right mountain range. For then, as Mark Twain said, everybody talked about the weather, but nobody did much about it—or could. But it may be different tomorrow.

Even earlier, nobody knew what law apply to the mile high which "trespassed" a mile high over your farm scaring your hens out of a year's eggs, or mechanical cave-droppers offered in testimony in court, or buz the wagon that scared Old Dobbin off the road.

Today each new advance, from insecticides spewed from airplanes to atom power houses, must work out through courts or legislatures how it fits into our system of law.

Any way you look at it, technology puts our legal system as well as our scientists to a severe test.
