Marv Tommervik Named To NAIA Hall Of Fame

Hall Of Fame Nominee

Marvin Tommervik, well-known Parkland resident and former star halfback at Pacific Lutheran University, was honored this week as one of the five men selected to the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics Hall of Fame. Tommervik will receive his award at a banquet in Sacramento held by the Association on Friday.

Tommervik, a Little All-America halfback in 1940-41 with Pacific Lutheran, is one of three players to be honored this year by the Association. He set school records in passing and total offense. He was formerly athletic director and football and baseball coach at this alma mater and now operates Parkland Fuel Oil Service here.

Other players to be honored are Roosevelt Brown, now playing with the New York Giants professional team, and Jimmy Carr, playing with the Philadelphia Eagles pro team.

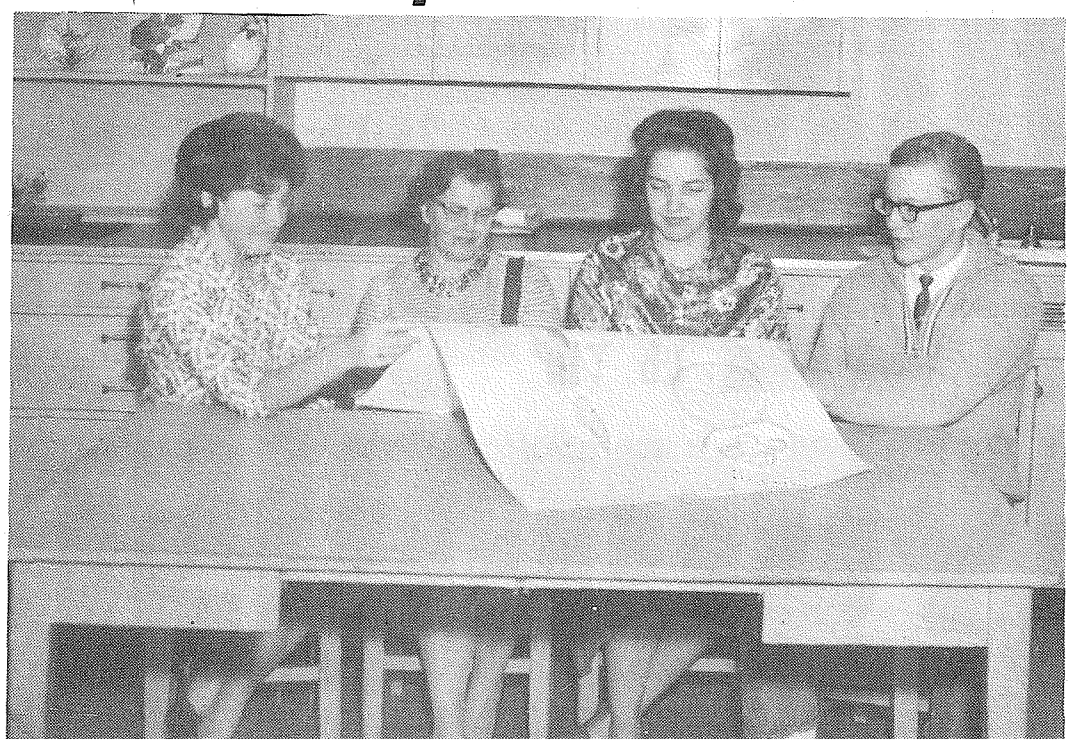

Clip 'N Save Holiday Mail Dates

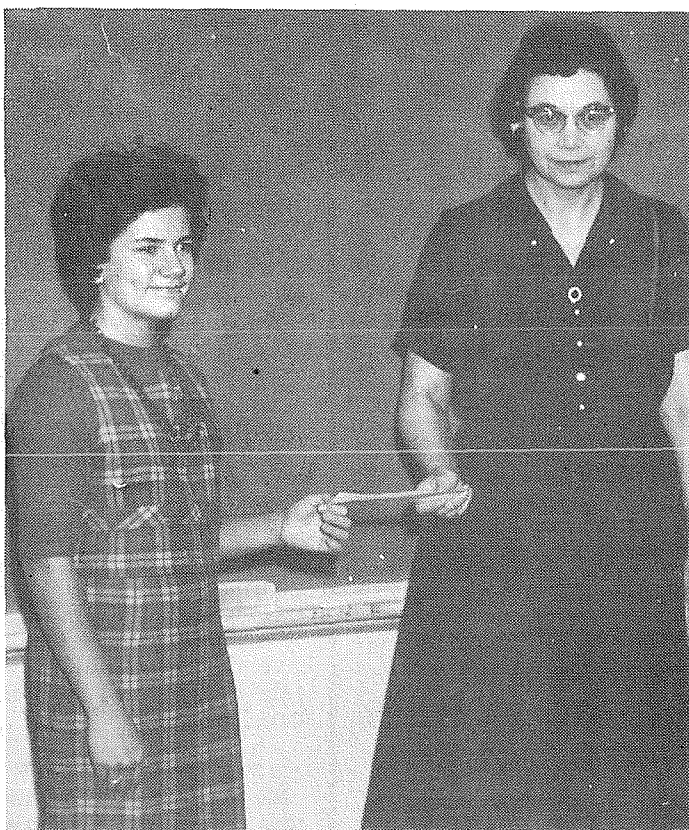
Mailing deadlines for the holiday season were announced today by Postmaster McMonagle with a request that patrons save the following information for ready reference:

Packages for Alaska and Hawaii, December 1; Other distant States, December 10; (After December

10 - Use Air Mail); Near-by States (Oregon, Idaho, Calif., Mont., North Dakota), December 13; (After December 13 Use Special Delivery); Eastern Washington, December 13; Local (Tacoma and Western Washington), December 15.

Storms of the last few days illustrate just one reason why Christmas mail should be deposited early, the Postmaster said. "Our mail from Oregon and California arrived 45 minutes late this morning," McMonagle reported. "The same kind of weather during the peak mail period would undoubtedly cause a greater delay. The safe thing to do is to mail early. Observe the above deadlines and you can be sure your letters and packages will arrive before Christmas."

McChord Pilot Logs 500 Hours In F-106 Jet

McCHORD AFB, WASH. (special) Capt. Donald L. Bauer, Flight Command-

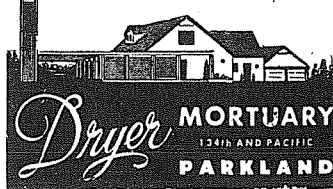
Captain Bauer is being reassigned to Tyndall AFB, Florida, as an instructor in the Combat Crew Training School for F-106 pilots.

Here's First Hand Account Of Typhoon By Local Girl Who Witnessed Guam Storm

(Ed. Note: Following are excerpts from a letter received by Mr. and Mrs. Sidney Bennett of Spanaway, from their daughter, Margie, who reports on the typhoon that struck Guam. Margie and her sailor husband, Carl Rehberg, their two children, Buddy, 13 and Lisa, 1, rode out the storm in their government quarters. The Bennetts learned they were safe thru a report from a Ham radio operator prior to receiving their daughter's letter.)
"Dear Family,
Tues: ".....There is no describing the feeling when winds exceed 240 mph! The eye passed the island about 11:30 and the winds changed directions -- then our two double doors tore off and our living room was exposed as well as the dining area and part of the kitchen. The doors flew off two at a time, so in between doors flying off, Bud and I got the furniture against the walls in the hall, dashed for the bedroom and grabbed Lisa and the dog and got into the large storage locker until 2:30 a.m. when winds decreased enough so the house didn't vibrate.....we lost two sets of dishes and most of our glassware and all my odds and ends like extra platters and fruit bowls and relish dishes I'd had for years.... The broken dishes were ankle deep.... Sheet metal flew all over the island from the many quonset buildings here....our six-foot palm was bent flush to the ground.
Saturday: ".....We are still without power. The town and village is starting to clean up, but it will be a long, tough haul. They say about 95% is destroyed or terribly
