The bladder was thrown down and the free-for all was on. The object of the game was to kick the ball into the center of the rival town. When the yelling horde descended on the town, pedestrians ran for their lives and shopkeepers bolted their doors.

Eventually the players were ordered to play in some Dozen Bottles for \$2.39 vacant area or give up the sport. The teams retired to a field marked off with boundaries similar to those of a soccer field. And the towns — and football — were saved.

If nothing else, writing this column has caused me to read more and think more than ever before. Now if some of the philosophy from the learned men I read of will just rub off it will all be worth it.
