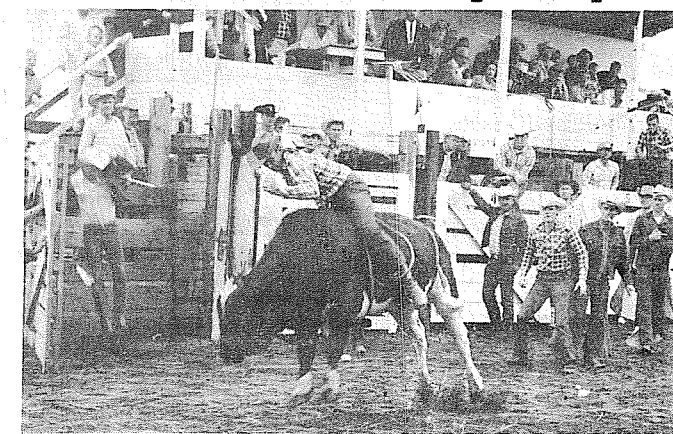

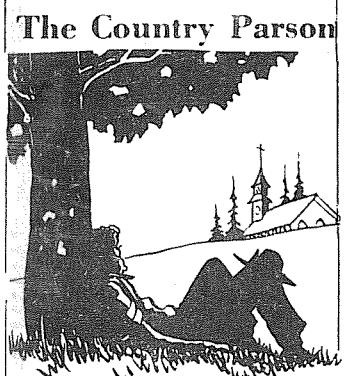
Monday morning, beginning at 6:30 a.m., the ladies will serve a hearty cowboy breakfast. Everyone is invited to attend.

Your editor was fortunate to hitch a ride with the lead jeep in the caravan, driven by Bruce Cole, with help from his wife Reena and two small daughters.

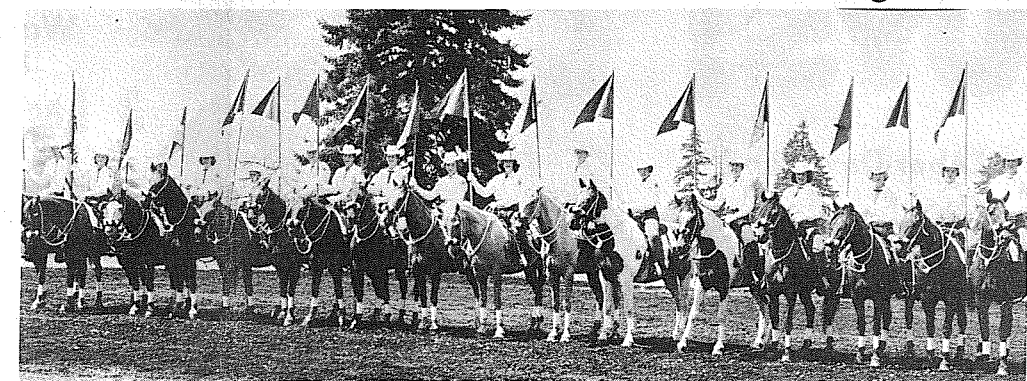
