Taxpayers Plan **Second Meeting**

The Concerned Taxpayers Committee of South Pierce County will hold its next meeting at the Eatonville High School Gym 8 p.m. Tuesday Evening August 26. Congressman Floyd Hicks

has accepted the Committee's invitation to answer taxation questions

The meeting was originally scheduled to be held in the Ohop Grange Hall. The site was changed to the Eatonville High Gym because of the tremendous response to the first meeting. Many were unable to find standing room in the building, and Committee members report that those attending will be accommodated by the larger auditorium.

Senators Magnuson and Jackson have been invited along with representatives from the various levels of government.

"The Ohop Grange was filled to overflowing at our last meeting, and this is an indication to us that something must be done to reduce the tax burden," a spokesman for the group told the Journal. "We must have answers and action. This tax confiscation cannot continue.'







Sparks Fly At **Loveland Meeting**

An overflow crowd of members of the Loveland Mutual Company met Tuesday, August 19 at Bethel High School to question the dissolution of the company. The meeting was open only to members of the Mutual and representatives of Tacoma City Light, which is at present offering to purchase the company. At what often became a shouting match, members attempted to have clarified some of the issues involved in the proposed sale.

Many members were disturbed because representatives of Puget Sound Power and Light were not present at the meeting. Puget Sound has been suggested by members as a possible buyer. When a member asked if Puget Sound had been invited to attend, John Hansler, attorney for Loveland Mutual, replied, "Puget Sound Power was not invited because they are not a member and they have not yet been proposed as a purchaser.' Mr. Frank Dworsky, a long time resident of the area, asked Mr. Fred Erickson, president of Loveland Mutual, if he had been approached on or about July 7, 1969 by representatives of Puget Sound Power and Light. Mr. Erickson replied that such representatives had talked to him and he stated, "I brought the question to the board the board did not feel this was the proper time" for such

Representatives of the Spanaway Water Company, which is proposing to continue the operation of Loveland Mutual as a mutual, were present because Spanaway Water Company is a member of Loveland Mutual. Mr. Paul Boyle, and attorney for the water company, stated that the company desired to see the continuation of Loveland Mutual as a mutual because of "a belief in the idea of co-operatives . . . you have the right to have a say in the running of Loveland Mutual . . . There is no reason

why this company can not go forward.'

Mrs. Joyce Emery asked the Board if they had "ever considered another management" to continue running the company as a mutual. She continued to say that "a great deal of our money is being buried in the ground in undergraound installations and the people involved are not being charged for it." Attorney Boyle asked if the "Loveland Mutual polices for installing laterals or underground lines were different than other mutuals,' referring to the fact that Loveland Mutual does not at this time charge for such special services. He did not receive an answer to this question. Later Mr. Cliff Erdahl, Director of Public Utilities of the City of Tacoma, stated that if Tacoma purchased Loveland Mutual, Tacoma would "have to be fair to new customers and customers on the line. I can't give a specific answer to that question" (of whether or not free installation would be guaranteed to all new customers.)

Since no other power company had been invited to attend the meeting members were not always able to get satisfactory answers to questions about rates and service available from other sources. Members were also disturbed to hear that the only appraisal of the value of Loveland Mutual was made by engineers of Tacoma City Light. Stated Mr. Stevenson, a member, "the Board should be entertained to accept other proposals." In his opening remarks to the members, state Senator John T. McCutcheon remined people that they "should have all the facts and should study the facts alternatives" before


coming to a decision on dissolution.

Members also wondered if difficulties in expanding Loveland Mutual to provide adquate service to its members could not in part be due to the slowness of Tacoma City Light in providing necessary equipment. Asked Mrs. Emery, "has City Light installed the substaions required for Loveland Mutual?" Mr. Erdahl replied that City Light has "every intention to live up to our contract with Loveland Mutual" but that the substation had not been installed because Tacoma Light had not been able to agree on a suitable price for the purchase of necessary land.

Mr. Hansler reviewed the legal status of the suit brought to restrain Loveland Mutual from dissolution. The court, at a hearing earlier that day, had ruled that Loveland Mutual and its trustees could proceed with all the steps in the dissolution except the final "exchange of money between Loveland and the City of Tacoma and the exchange of property to the City of Tacoma." This final step cannot be carried out until the court hears the full trail. The date for this trial has not been set but can be no sooner than this fall. Mr. Hansler continued to state "if anyone desires to change their minds" and vote against dissolution they could write to Loveland Mutual stating "I desire to hereby revoke my vote of dissolution." Changes in the signed votes are acceptable up until the time the votes are filed with the State.

Attorney Boyle stated that as soon as the Spanaway Water Company received a list of members of Loveland Mutual the company would mail statements of their position to all Loveland members. When asked if members would be able to hear representatives of Puget Sound Power and Light at a future meeting called by Spanaway Water Company, Mr. Boyle replied, "Yes, we would hope so" and indicated that the water company wished members to be able to hear all sides and proposals regarding the dissolution.

Loveland Board members listed loss of the Crate home as an office, low voltage, bad service complaints, needs for capital outlay, and higher cost of operation as reasons for selling the mutual. In order to maintain the company, the board reported they would have to borrow money, or increase membership fees and rates. Only other option available is to sell the company

Photo Licenses Start In Sept.

OLYMPIA - Merchants and law enforcement agencies are expected to welcome the new color photo driver li-censes and identification cards which the Washington Department of Motor Vehicles will begin issuing next month.

"It will be virtually impossible to falsify or counterfeit these documents," according to Motor Vehicles Director Doug Toms, "and the addition of the photograph will greatly enhance the value of a driver license for identification pur-

Washington is the 21st state in the union to adopt the photo driver license, which was authorized by the 1969 legislature to provide "a standard and readily recognizable means of identification of each person living in the

Police agencies will have access to the central negative file in Olympia to assist in criminal investigations. They also supported the photo identification cards as a means of identifying injured or ill per-

Businesmen see the photo cards as a safeguard in such transactions as cashing checks and selling liquor to

youthful-appearing cutomers.
The color photo licenses will be issued to each driver as his current license expires during the next two years. The picture adds 50 cents to the biennial \$5 cost of a driver license. For a \$3 fee, non-drivers may obtain identification cards which are valid for five vears.

Every Department of Motor Vehicles examining station and travel unit will be equipped with a camera, to be operated by the license exam-

Applicants for driver li-censes and identification cards should submit two documents bearing their photo and / or signature and proving their identity. Otherwise the card will be marked "not valid for identification.'

Teenage Sex almost-successful plots to get rid of unwanted husbands by confining them to mental hos-**Analysis**

Chicago (WMNS) -By high school graduation, one out of 10 suburban middle-class boys has lost his virginity. By the end of the freshman year in college, three out of 10 boys are sexually experienced.

This emerges from an in-tensive study of typical adolescent boys by Dr. Daniel Offer, a psychiatrist, who believes that his finds accurately mirror the experiences of about one-third of the middleclass teenage population.
"The normal adolescent

does not experiment much with sexuality," Dr. Offer found. Most boys waited until their junior year of high school to begin dating and, even then, their dates were infrequent.

Since many students are apparently dismally ignorant about birth control methods, the sexually inexperienced equate intercourse and pregnancy. They also worry about being mature enough to handle sexual intimacy.





Bethel Board Awards Contract

Pilots Attract

Tourists To Area When it comes to attracting

tourists to the Puget Sound area the Seattle Pilots are leading the league.

As a result of recent surveys conducted in Sicks' Stadium, home of the American League Pilots, statistics show that the Seattle expansion team has been luring tourists to its home base by the thousands.

The poll, along with mail ticket orders and inquiries, has indicated to club officials that not since the halcyon days of the 1962 World's Fair has so much attention been focused on the Puget Sound region. The Pilots Newsbureau, which has been receiving clippings from all parts of the nation, reports that Seattle is receiving exposure comparable to, if not in excess, of the World's Fair

The survey was conducted by passing out cards to fans as they entered the Stadium and most were later collected by ushers and many returned by mail. Compilations of the cards showed that better than one third of the cards were returned and provided some revealing figures.

For instance, on the evening of August 2, with the Pilots hosting the New York Yankees, the survey revealed that 75 percent of those in attendance were from outside the city limits of Seattle; 55 percent were from outside the Greater Seattle area; and 19 percent were from outside the State of Washington.
