garnishes，use before com－
pletely thawed to retain
their crispes their crispness．
If you plantouse the pep－ pers in cooked dishes or
need to save space，heat
the pepper halves in boil－ utes for slices．Cool
promptly in cold water， drain and pack into freez
er containers．Leave $1 / 2$ inch headspace for expan－
