### PTA Council Set Up By Franklin Pierce

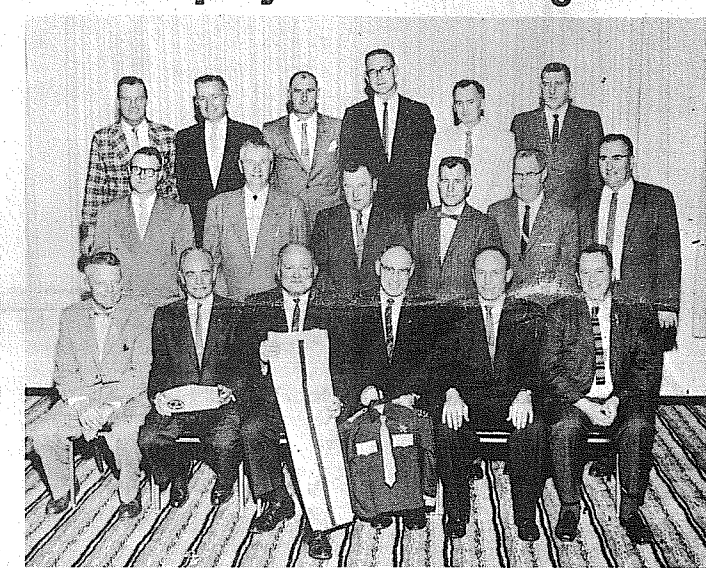

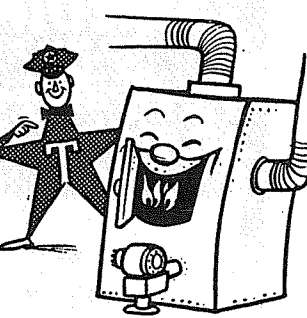

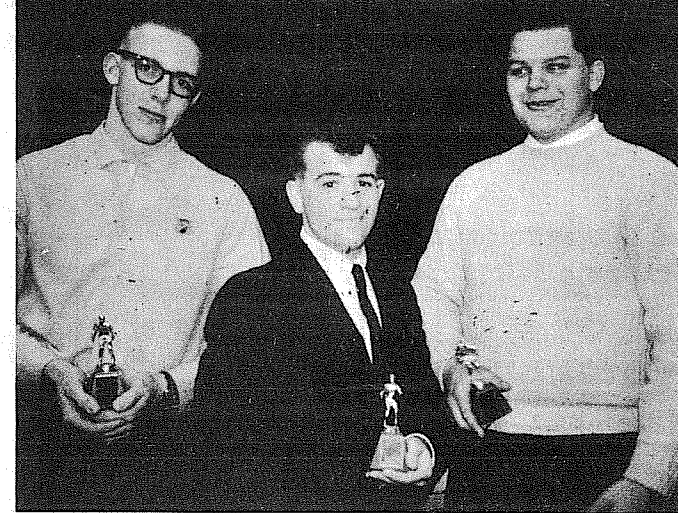

Dear Sir:

In the March 9, 1961 issue of the Times-Journal in the last four paragraphs of the article, "a-wondering and a-wandering" by Jack Brown, there is something of vital importance to this nation that is too little understood by the general public.

Since 1926 when Congress provided for the licensing of airplane pilots this country has been getting into worse conditions in the various stages through which it has passed.

1929 saw us go into the worst depression in history, although economists agreed that an invention would bring us back to prosperity just like radio did in the early 1920's. We had the invention, but were not allowed to use it. Men who were familiar with private flying, knowing the almost universal desire to fly, knew that the private flying industry had such vast potential that if unnecessary restrictions were wiped out the country

would quickly rise to new heights of prosperity.

However, our government tried dealing with the effects of this infringement of human liberty by raiding the Federal treasury instead of removing the offensive parts of the laws governing private flying.

The worst provision was the compulsory exam. Very few people will submit to it. It goes against human nature.

I argued this point some years ago with the head of the International Truck Branch in Tacoma. He thought the medical exam was a good thing. I proposed having a state law enacted placing the same restrictions on truck owners and drivers that aviation laws place on pilots. He got his eyes opened quickly and said: "That won't work."

I replied: "Are you telling me? It will not work in private flying either." The fact is that those who pass the best medical exams have the most accidents, the young men under 25.

Unless we get such laws corrected, we will continue on our way down to the condition described by Isaiah in Chapter 6, verse 11: "Then said I, Lord, how long?" and he answered: "until the cities be wasted without inhabitant, and the houses without man, and the land be utterly desolate, . . ."

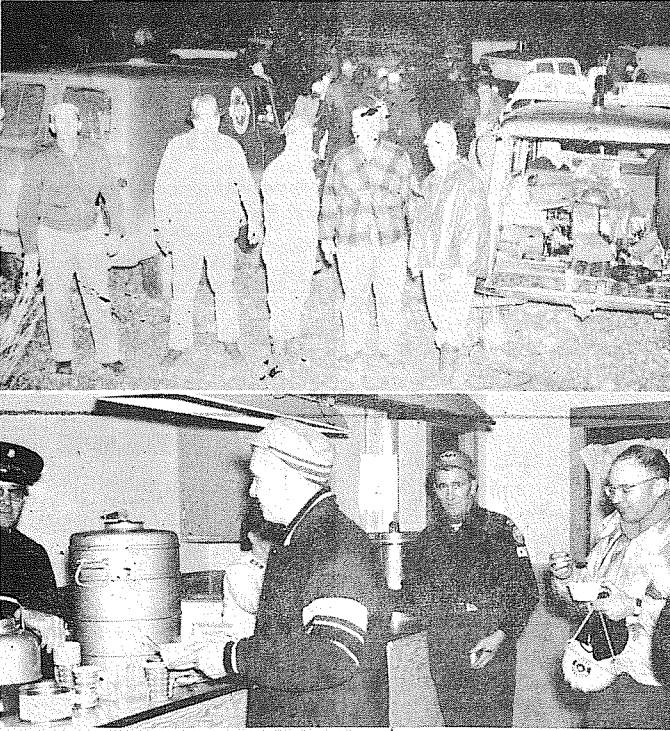

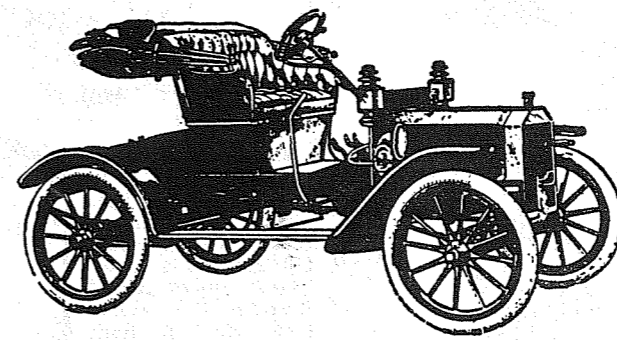

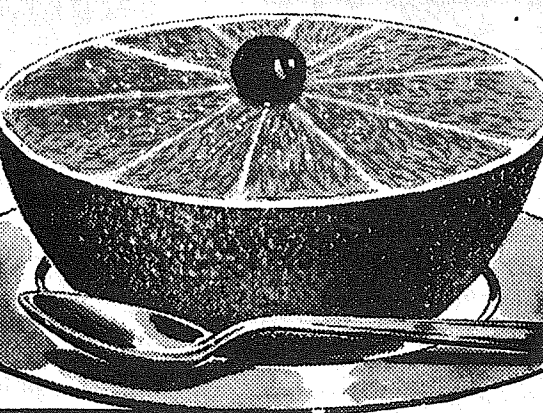
