sent position at Langley, where he is the superintendent of the South Whidbey school district, to take over the Bethel job on July 1.

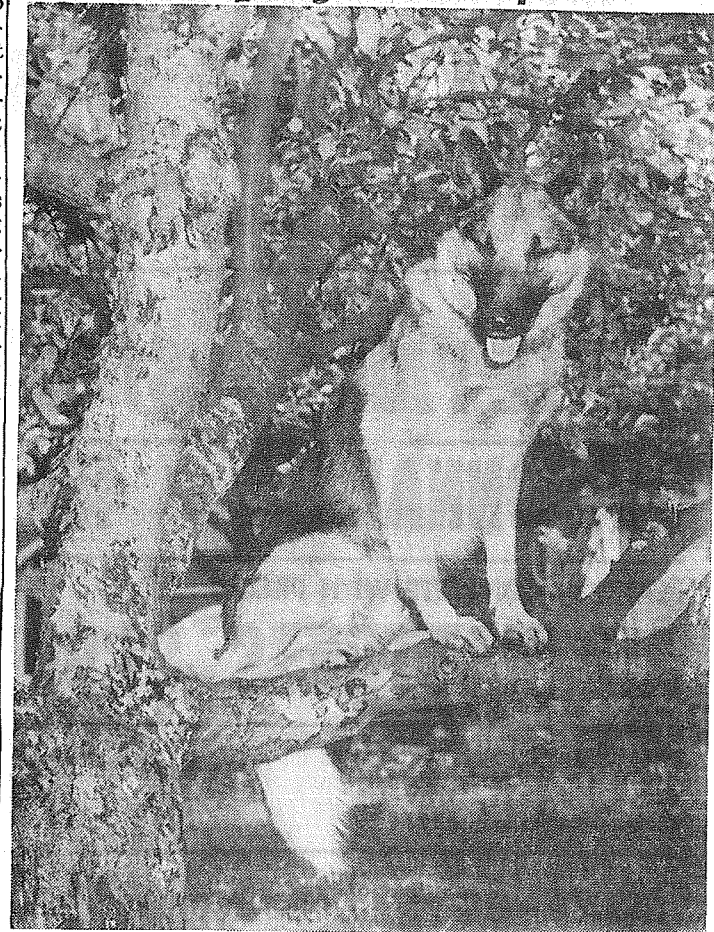
Milroy has been superintendent of the South Whidbey school district since 1951. He has also taught school at Toledo, Twin City and the Everett Junior High School, and served as principal at Langley High School from 1947 to 1949. The new superintendent is married and has four children; all girls, aged 10, 8, 6 and 4. He attended Roosevelt High School in Seattle; gained his Bachelor of Arts degree at the University of Puget Sound in 1938; a Master's degree in Education from Columbia University in 1946; and attended the University of Washington and Seattle Pacific College for graduate courses. His teaching career was interrupted in 1942 when he joined the United States Navy and served four years as an Athletic Chief and a Gunnery Officer.

The out-going superintendent, Dewane Lamka, has served the Bethel district for the past five years, during which period the enrollment of the district has nearly doubled, three schools have either been added to already or are now under construction, a junior high school has been opened, an administrative building erected and a general upgrading of curriculum begun. I see where a New York publisher proposed submitting a bill to Congress to authorize the government to buy and store all overprintings and unsold copies of books from all publishers, at public expense.

Why not extend the law so that the government will buy all unsold cars, radios, newspapers, and everything else that is produced in excess of demand? Sounds kind of nutty doesn't it? I don't claim to be very bright and I'm positive I am not, for the above proposal doesn't sound any worse to me than for our government to spend billions for farm surplus.

The other day a friend and fellow businessman stopped me and gave me some news releases that he had gathered which played up the sale to India of 587 million bushels of surplus wheat and 22 million bags of surplus rice. The price agreed on was 1 billion, 300 million dollars.

My friend asked me two questions: What did the grain cost us? Was this a sale for profit or a huge loss? I told him I'd look into it.

I finally turned up some figures on the subject and if I had any hair it would probably be standing straight up now. I found out that the farm surplus program is costing \$1,000 per second in taxpayers money. I could find no breakdown figures but taking the overall surplus program and projecting it out at \$1,000 dollars per second for 60 seconds and \$60,000 per minute for 60 minutes and \$360,000 per hour for 24 hours and \$8,640,000 for one day, what do you get? I don't know about you but I get sick. This takes care of question No. 1. The answer is—plenty!

To top off this giant surplus food sale news I find that the U.S. is getting paid in Rupees. So what do we do with Rupees? This you'll love. We are going to loan them back to India. What do we have left? Empty storage bins, empty pockets and holes in our heads as far as I am concerned. That answers question No. 2.

Don't turn a page yet folks. Things are just getting interesting. It is estimated that it will cost 195 million dollars to tote all this grain across the pond to India. Now who do you think is going to pick up the tab for that? As I get it the steamship companies like the feel of good old American green stuff and to heck with Rupees.

I sure wish I was smart enough to make sense out of a deal like that. I know one thing. If I ran my business like some of these knowheads are running our government I'd last in business just about as long as it takes you to read this article.

Just remember this: There is an election coming up and somewhere in this great land of ours there must be someone we can find who will run for office that has some brains and good business sense. Find him and party be damned. I'll vote for him if he belongs to the Ku Klux Klan.

One of the most urgent problems this country must deal with is the growth of juvenile delinquency.
