



As July 24-30 is National Farm Safety Week, here are some opinions many people seem to share about traffic safety:

Learning is the very foundation of traffic accident prevention. In cultivating knowledge, skills and attitudes - postive changes of behavior - education becomes an indispensable part of virtually eve form of highway safety activity Broadly, education's task is to inform and inspire each individual to make civilized conduct in traffic a rule of his life. It seeks to help every young person and adult to understand and competently fulfill his legal and moral responsi bilities as a highway user.

It also aims to encourage in telligent support for officials legally responsible for providing our highway facilities and safeguard ing their use by the public. Where does safety education begin? PARENTAL RESPONSIBILITY

Learning, of course, begins a home. In infancy, parental respon sibility for a child's safety is total. Gradually protection must be replaced with training.

In the early years parents brothers, sisters, relatives all impress upon youngsters those im portant attitudes which have lasting effects upon behavior through out life. The young are taught consciously and unconsciously both by precept and by example those actions which lead to pain and injury -- as well as those which lead to healthy, happy living.




