

THE CONTROVERSIAL UMBAUGH-18, a new auto-gyro aircraft which has recently become well known in aviation circles, made its first appearance at the Spanaway Airport Wednesday, March 1st. The Umbaugh, with Bud Wolcott at the controls, leaps into the air in its now famous jump take-off in top photo. Lower left photo shows the craft making its spot landing. The Umbaugh can truly "land on a dime" since it requires no forward roll after the wheels touch the ground. Crowds typical of those which appear everywhere the Umbaugh stops, gather around the craft in lower right photo. Conceived and built by Ray Umbaugh in Haggerstown, Maryland, the auto-gyro appeals greatly to real estate people, loggers, and others who desire point-to-point transportation, due to its remarkably low price of \$9,995.
