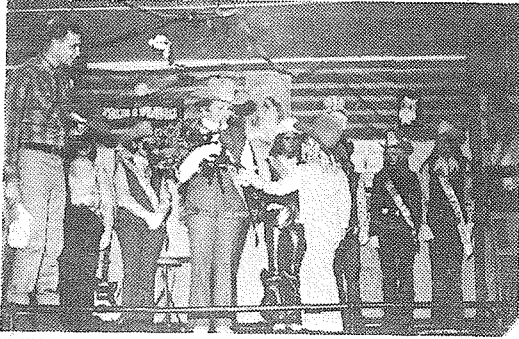

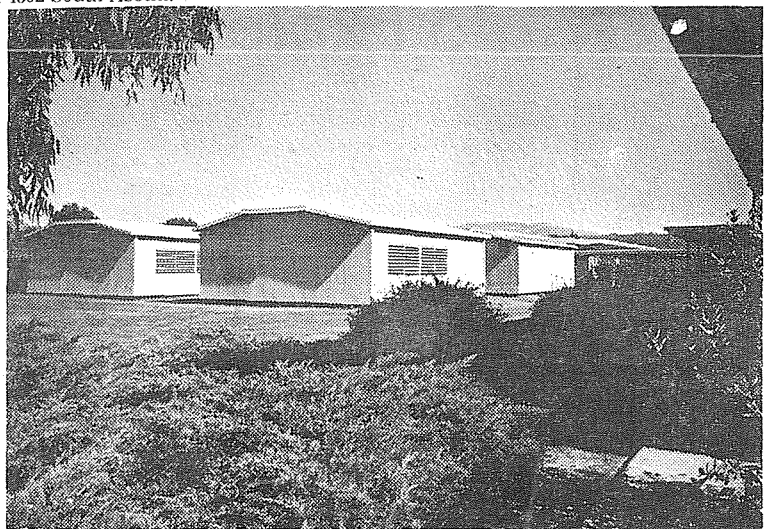

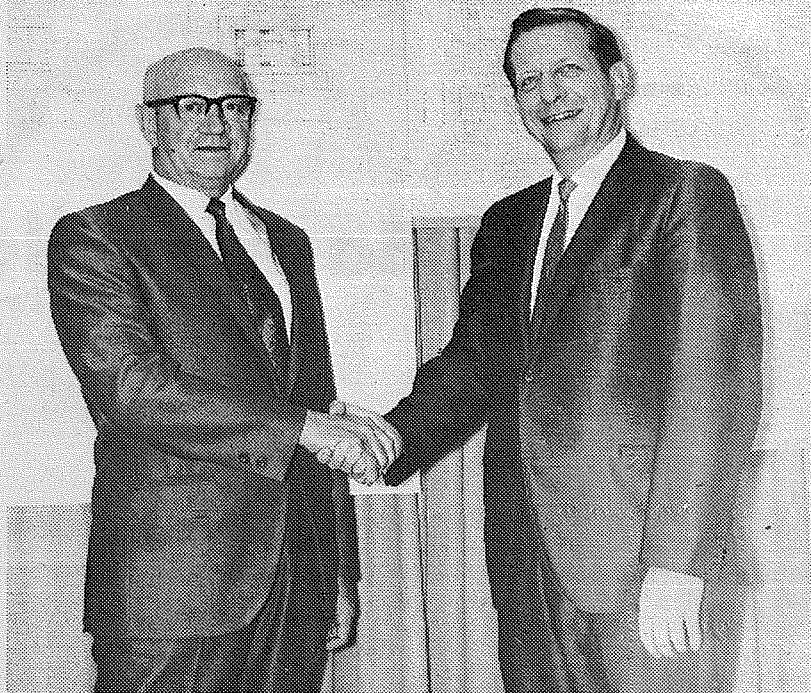

## Amend Joins Bethel Schools Planning Commission Agenda Published

The appointment of Dr. John Amend to the position of Administrative Assistant to the Superintendent was approved by the Bethel School Board, at the meeting held June 30. Bethel Superintendent, Dr. Fred Gramann, outlined Dr. Amend's qualifications for the position.

Dr. Amend attended Central Washington State College and the University of Washington before he received his doctorate in Education at New York University. His teaching experiences have included five years in the elementary school as a teacher and fourteen years as an elementary school principal. For over eight years he was the Curriculum Director of the schools of King County. He also served five years as Assistant Superintendent of the Highline Public Schools.

For four years Dr. Amend was the dean of the School of Education at Pacific Lutheran University. That position included both administrative and teaching duties. Follow-

ing his work at PLU Dr. Amend was the Director of the Tacoma-Pierce County Community Action Program (Anti-Poverty Program) for one year. He currently is the Assistant Superintendent of Intermediate School District XI. This district encompasses Pierce County. Dr. Amend also is the Director of Federal Projects for Intermediate District XI.

Dr. Amend will begin his duties in the Bethel District in September. He is replacing Mr. Francis Olson, who is retiring after 41 years of service in the Bethel School area.

### Day Care Mothers

Members of the recently organized Pierce County Day Care Mothers Association met Thursday evening to complete organizational details and to suggest topics for the programs to be presented at each meeting next year.

After 22 years under the ownership of Mrs. and the late Ethan Nelson, the Bargain Basket Market has new owners.

Taking over management of the popular Spanaway market is Mildred and Bob Dudley. He has been in the grocery business both as a retailer and wholesaler in the Pierce County area since 1942.

The Dudleys' have three children, 2 boys and a girl. The eldest son is a 1969 graduate of the University of Washington, while the youngest will return to Western Washington for his senior year. Their daughter will be a junior at Mount Tahoma High School next fall.

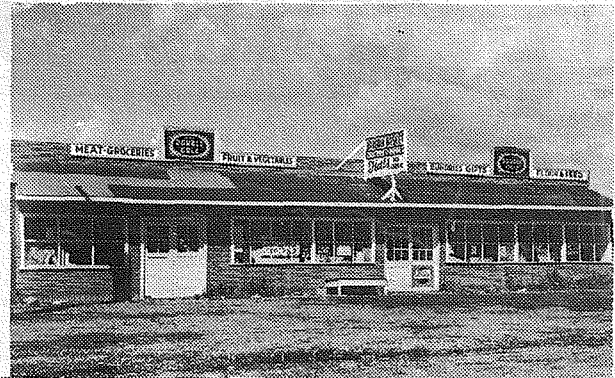
For Mrs. Nelson it will be a long-overdue vacation. She plans to attend her son Dennis's wedding in California then do some traveling before returning to Spanaway. The store was officially turned over to the new owners July 1.

"I've been swamped with telephone calls of congratulations from friends all over the area," Dudley told the Journal. He pledges to continue the friendly service customers have always experienced at the market. "This is vital to a home-owned, home-operated store," he stated.

The Nelsons' took over management of the Bargain Basket April 4, 1947 and during the past 22 years it has doubled in size. The store originally occupied only the north part of the present building, but over the years has grown to be recognized as a landmark in Spanaway.

During their span of management, customers will long remember the horse contest, carnivals, dog sled rides, and other promotions that built the market that is now at 167th and Pacific Avenue.

## Realtor Course At Clover Park

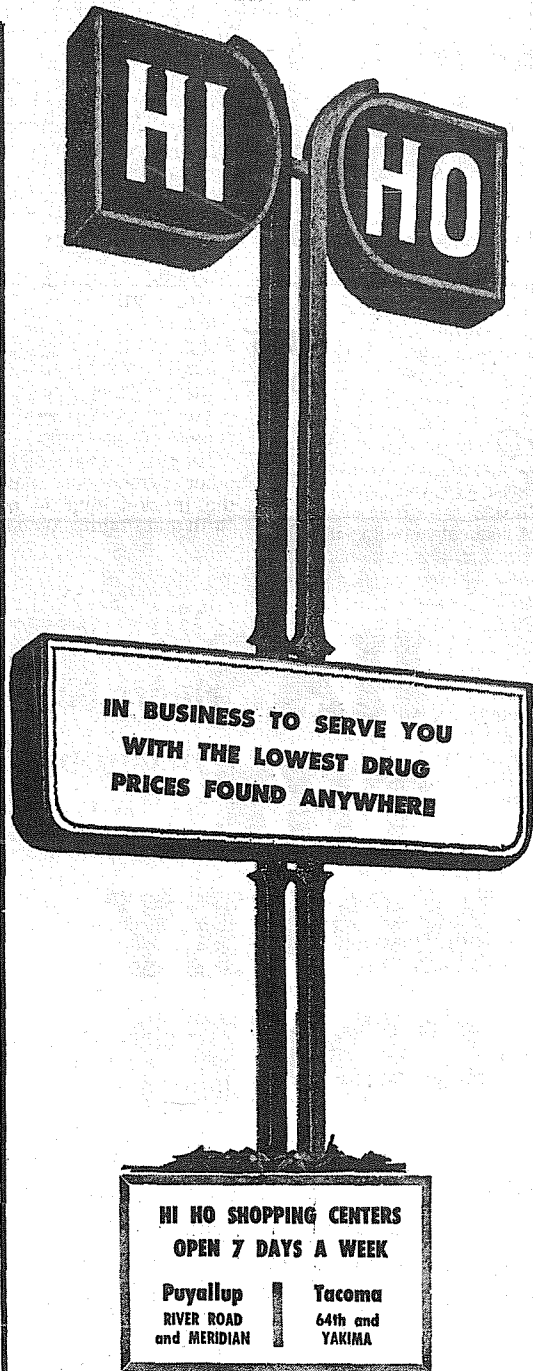

**PERIODIC HEARING LOSS**

Warsaw, Poland (WMNS) — Women suffer a marked hearing loss just prior to and during their menstrual periods.

**Hair Today**

Dear Miss Brookfield:

I ordered a wig by mail. Well, it finally arrived and what a disappointment! I be riding a broom on Halloween night, but the manufacturer won't take it back and give me a refund. I thought of ordering another one in a different color. But my husband is against it. What have you got to say?

Dear A.D.:

Here's some advice to paste in your wig band: in buying a wig, always deal with a local wig maker or dealer, department store or beauty salon. The best way to choose a wig is to try on many different ones, for style and color. When you buy a wig by mail, according to a spokesman for the National Better Business Bureau you do so at your own risk. Among the drawbacks is the customer's inability to discern whether the "real" hair advertised is human or animal hair. Also, color can only be matched approximately, even if a sample is sent.

A leading wig manufacturer advises that a wig closest to your natural hair color - or a shade lighter - and styled similar to your most flattering hair-do is frequently the most becoming. He also advises women to curb their desire for a drastic color change until they buy their second or "fun" wig.

However, for the sake of marital harmony, I would suggest you avoid any mention of a second or "fun" wig when you discuss this subject with your husband.

**Second Menopause**

Dear Miss Brookfield:

I am a 45-year-old widow with three grown children. About 10 years ago, I had a hysterectomy. Afterwards, I went through an artificial change of life, requiring medical care and the hormone, estrogen, to combat the effects. However, I now think I am undergoing the same symptoms. Is this possible? If it isn't a second menopause, could it be a mental disorder?

Dear M.T.:

Even with a hysterectomy,

medical authorities tell us that you may be going through the symptoms of the menopause for the second time. These symptoms can and do recur, up to the age of 70 or 75, in women with or without your surgical history. Talk it over with your physician. If your complaints are menopausal, estrogen replacement therapy, as you know from experience, can relieve them.

**Long-Haired Teenagers**

Dear Miss Brookfield:

Help! I am the mother of a teen-age son whose hair is beginning to look like Robin Hood's. He refuses to get a hair-cut, claiming that all his friends are now wearing their hair long. I like a boy to look like a boy. My husband tells me to ignore the subject and eventually our son will "outgrow this stage." Maybe he will but I will be climbing the walls by that time. How do other mothers solve this problem? Any suggestions?

Dear M.R.:

Yes, calm down. If all your son's friends are avoiding the barber, you're fighting a losing battle. Your husband may be right. Meanwhile, console yourself with this thought: your son will outgrow the teen years and, undoubtedly, the need to assert his growing maturity with his present hair style. You say that you like a boy to look like a boy, but before you climb the walls, look at some old history books - men wore their hair long and wigs were even fashionable. Remember George Washington?

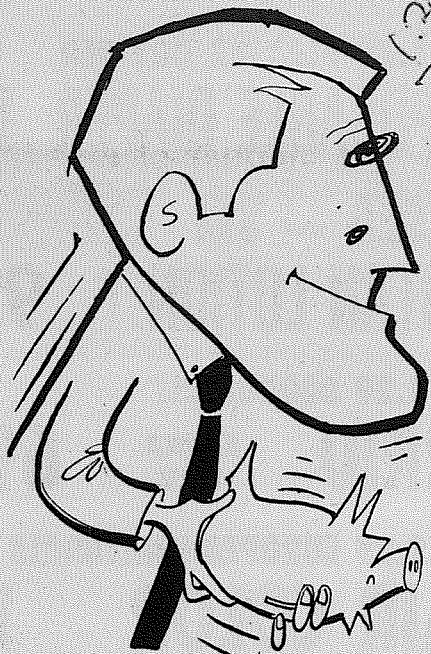

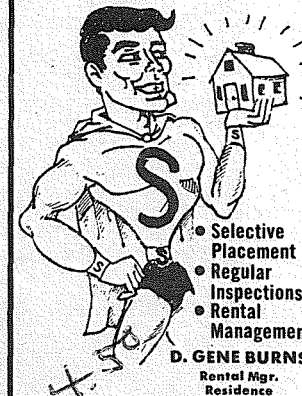

**Parkland Cardinals Blank Out Mayfair**

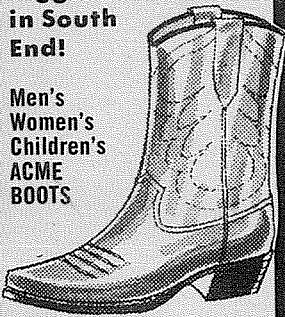

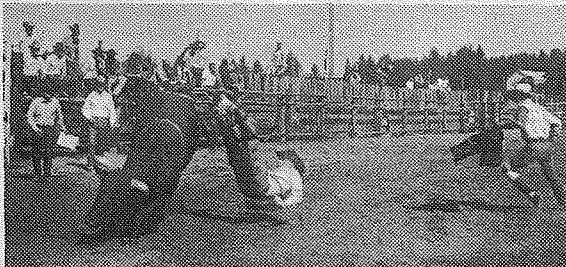


