"For with God nothing shall be impossible." — Luke 1:37.

The birth of Jesus is a divinely-directed drama: it is far beyond the comprehension of man. When the angel first came to Mary she was filled with awe and wonder. She had questions too. "How can this seemingly impossible event take place with me?" The angel gave her quick assurance and these words can have deep significance to all of us today — "For with God nothing shall be impossible."

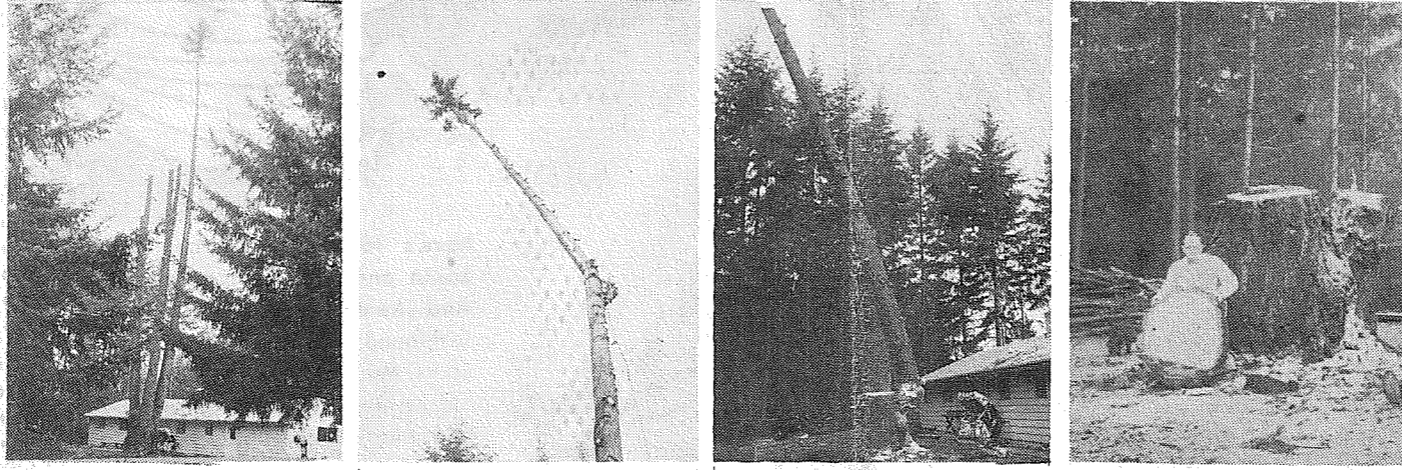
In humble submission, Mary put her trust in God — "Behold the handmaid of the Lord, be it unto me according to Thy word."

It is perfectly legitimate for us to lift this famous phrase and have it make an application to our own present needs and problems—"For with God nothing shall be impossible."

Big Crop From One Stump

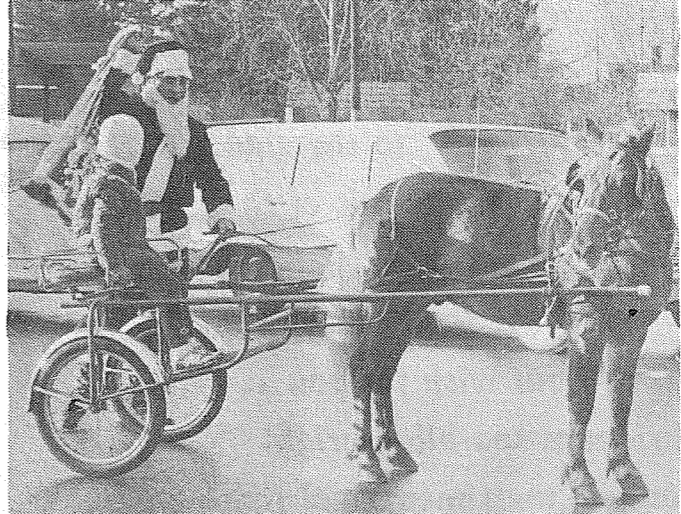

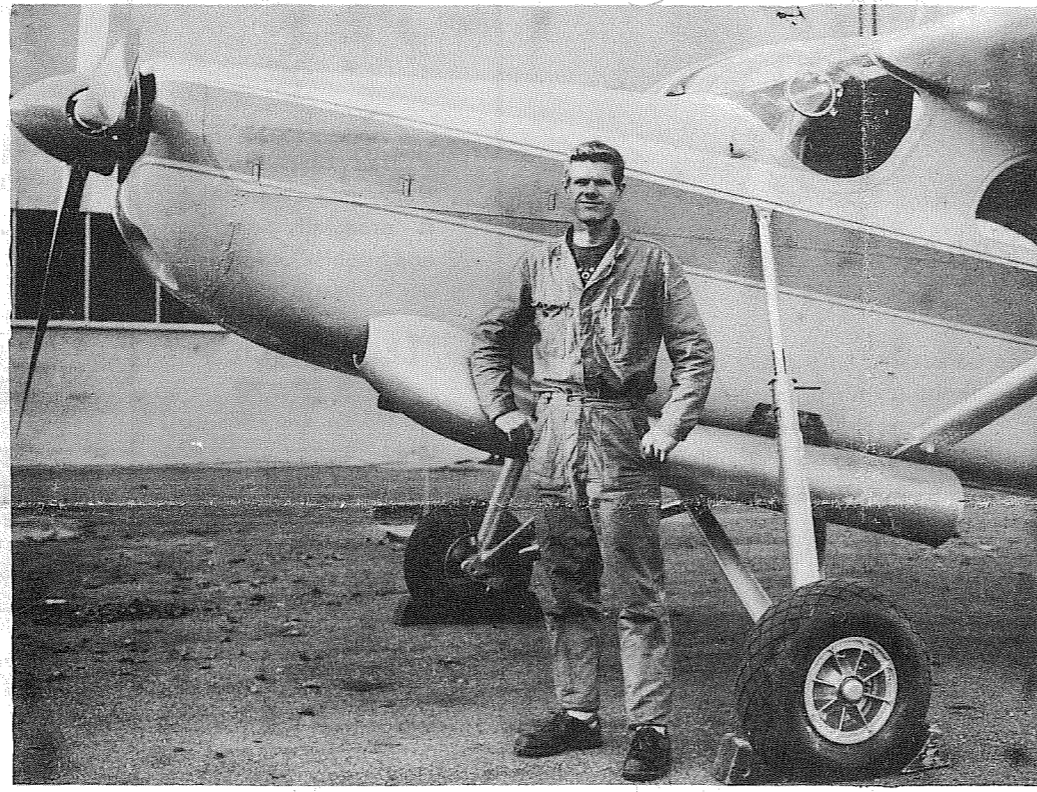

Park Dept. Gives Schedule For Recreation

Winter recreation schedules for the Bethel schools have been announced by the Pierce County Park Department.

Gymnasium sports will be conducted from 7 to 9 p.m. on Monday at Clover Creek and Roy. Bethel High School will have open gymnasium on Tuesday and Wednesday nights.

The following Saturday schedules will prevail in all elementary schools, starting January 4th and ending February 29th. Participants must be of 5th or 6th grade level, and will be provided with two hours of instruction skills and fundamentals of basketball.

The following schools will open their gymnasiums Saturday, January 4th at 10 a.m.: Clover Creek, Elk Plain, Kapowsin, Roy and Spanaway.

Bethel Junior High will run a Saturday Intramural program for 7th and 8th grade students. The same Saturday schedule will prevail as in the elementary schools, starting Saturday, January 4, and running for a period of eight weeks.

Each participant will be required to pay a \$2.00 entry fee, of which \$1.00 will provide insurance in case of injury.

Bethel Senior High will offer recreation facilities and instruction in gymnastics, weight lifting, basketball, volleyball, badminton, and other games, depending on the demand for each activity. In addition to the above recreational activities, we are starting a women's exercise class, which will also include group games and dancing.

Women's Exercises: Tuesday Night, 7:00 to 9:00. Adult Recreation: Wednesday Night: Jr. Sr. High Girls, 7:00-8:00; Jr. Sr. High Boys, and Adults, 8:00-9:00.

Puyallup Man Builds Planes, Sees Europe

When Judy and Bud Blancher, Puyallup sister and brother, abandoned arm chair traveling they did it in a big way and ended up as employees of Swiss nationals amidst the Alps.

It all started with a National Geographic magazine showing enticing pictures of Europe. The travel bug bit them and they left Puyallup bound for New York via the Trans-Canadian highway in Judy's 1939 pickup truck.

From New York they flew to Glasgow, hitch-hiked to London and bought a tandem bicycle to tour the Isles. However the wrong-sided driving, rain, fog and monetary system encouraged them to see other parts of Europe.

Abandoning the bicycle in favor of a motor scooter, they toured 7,000 miles through Holland, Norway, Denmark, Germany, Austria, Liechtenstein and Switzerland. After seeing Italy's famous sights, the young people decided to return to Switzerland and visit the "Pilatus Flugzeugwerke," a small factory which builds the "Pilatus Porter," an airplane widely used in Alaska.

There Bud found his cash getting low and demand for workers high, so he climbed into coveralls and is still helping build airplanes week days and skiing from his back door every weekend. Judy found a job as "Zimmermädchen" in a Swiss hotel. The pair are something of a novelty to the Swiss people who, as Bud says, "are more used to serving than being served by Americans!"

On these cards beneficiaries must report all income received during 1963 and that expected in 1964. Income means everything including Social Security payments, except, of course, the VA pension payments themselves. Law requires the VA to

use the reports to determine continued eligibility of pensioners and in some cases to make adjustments on the basis of increased or decreased outside income. Prompt and accurate reporting can prevent any hold-up in pension payments.

Initial applications must be made as soon as possible. Those selected receive 17 weeks of training at the Officer Candidate School, Yorktown, Va. The training is in navigation, seamanship, gunnery, law enforcement and military orientation.

Clover Park Offers Duplicating Courses

Offset Duplicating, a new career training course offered by Clover Park Vocational Technical School is the only one of its kind available in the Puget Sound area. This course is designed to train students for employment with large and small companies which operate in-plant offset duplicating and reproducing departments and with small job-shop establishments, using the offset method of duplicating.

The course offers instructions and practical experience in three different areas which include composition, photographic, and duplicating machines.

In the composition department the students are taught

how to use the I.B.M. executive typewriters, Standard and D.S.J. Vari-Typers, and the Headliner. This phase of the course includes typing offset masters, composition of forms, brochures, etc., layout work, and pasting up composition for the camera department.

In the third phase of the course students learn how to operate, adjust, and maintain A. B. Dick mimeograph and offset duplicators, and the Addressograph - Multigraph Models 1000 and 1250. Machine operation includes black and white, colored inks, direct image master, photographic masters and systems duplicating.

The course is open to adults and has the approval of both the Veterans Administration and the State Rehabilitation office. Classes meet daily from 8:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. in the new administration building at the Clover Park Education Center.

The instructor, W. B. Jones, has stated that due to the use of individual instruction and the rapid progress of his present students, he is able to accept registrations now from anyone interested in enrolling in any one or all
