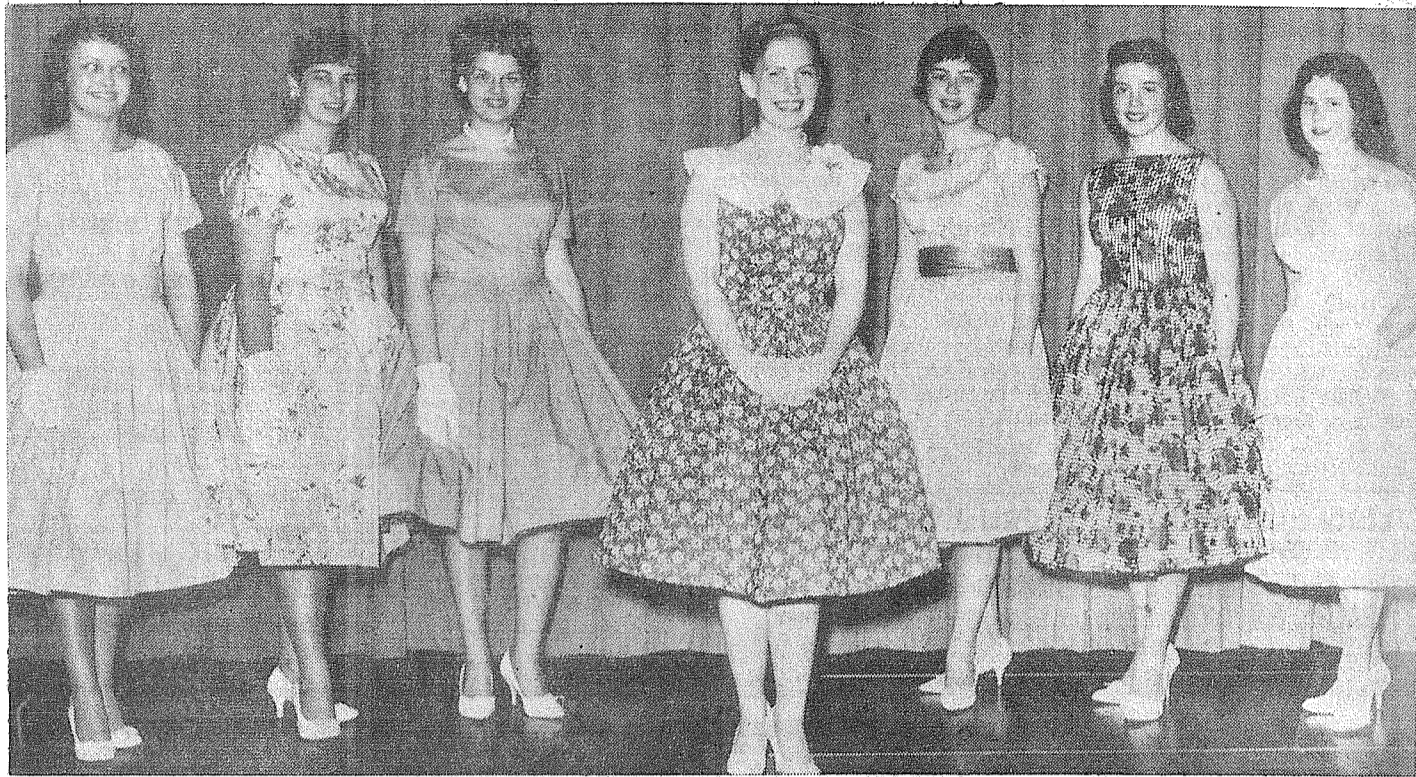

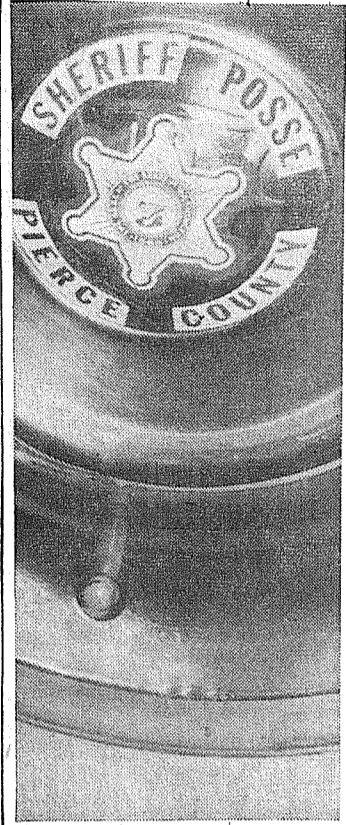
All Republicans who vote at Clover Creek school are urged to attend and meet fellow Republicans. Five delegates to the Pierce county convention will be elected.

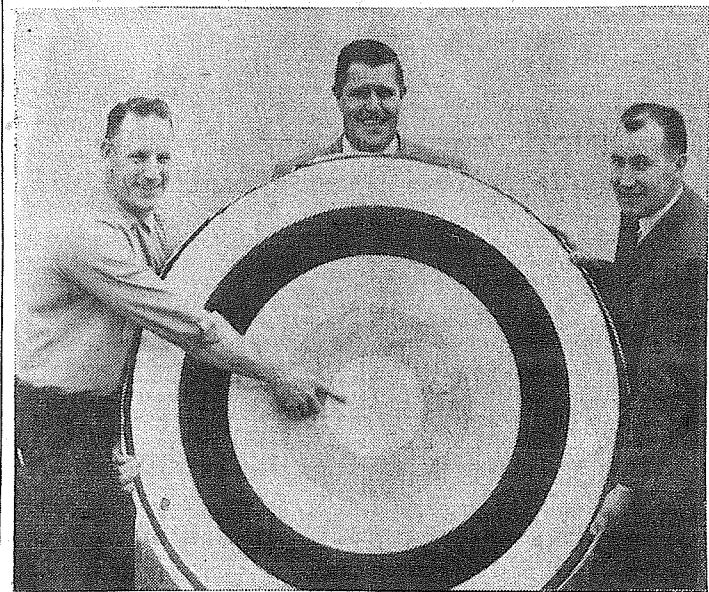

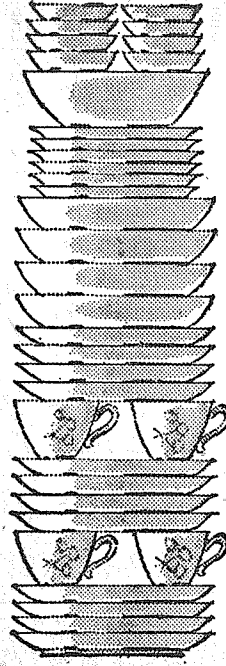

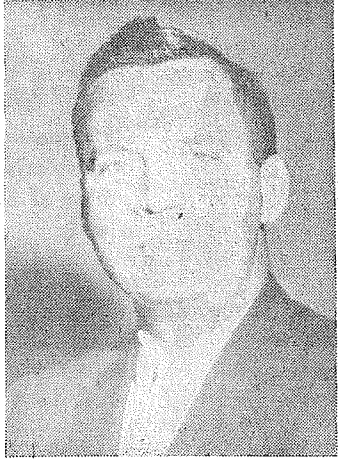
Announce Decision On Administrator

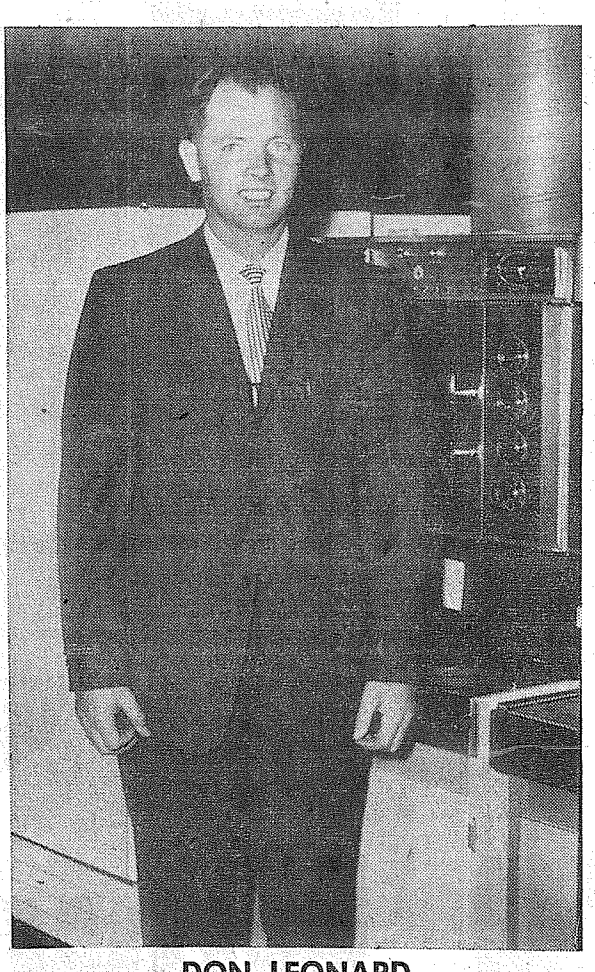

**a-Wondering . . .
and a-Wandering . . .**

We have all heard comment recently about the "softness" of American youth. If such a condition exists, what is the cause?

Could it be the result of us, thru government, assuming greater and greater control over our youth — his schooling, his work, his income, his savings, his death and his estate — in other words, cradle to the grave supervision?

I recently read that the New York City Board of Education plans to sanction a short course for junior and senior high schools next year, the purpose of which is to teach how to have a happy home. The course will include "group dating, double dating, single dating, steady dating" and the development of "qualities that make one popular".

The assumption that normal young people need such instruction is virtually an insult to their intelligence, but it is a good example of state direction of the individual.

If such public instruction doesn't produce "softness" and lack of self-reliance in our young people, I'll be a monkey's uncle.

* * *

This week as I sat down to write this editorial, discarding idea after idea like John D. discards soiled shirts, I couldn't keep my mind off an editorial I'd read in the Weekly Bulletin. I've read it and re-read it and I believe it needs repeating, so for the balance of this article I present the following editorial which appeared in the Community News of Merchantville N.J. on 3-28-60. It was titled "These nice delivery men couldn't be our enemies" and follows verbatim:

"I pledge my allegiance to Jimmy Hoffa, and to the power he holds, One union indivisible — and to heck with Freedom."

Imagine, if you can, that pleasant, friendly family man who delivers your domestic needs joining in this chorus at the opening of his Teamsters' union meetings. It's hard to believe that these men who seem friendly and law-abiding can be enemies to our country, forming a greater threat to our traditional freedom than the Communists. We don't want to believe it but we had better realize that our security and that of our Government may depend upon their loyalty to their country as opposed to a loyalty to Jimmy Hoffa

Nearly every man who drives a delivery or service truck to our front doors is a Teamster, with no choice to be otherwise. His employer has a contract — often if not generally made for protection of his business. The driver gets better pay, protection against injustice. Undoubtedly, there is some fascination in belonging to a power that can disrupt the national social machinery by cutting off its supplies.

We are not going to campaign against the power of Jimmy Hoffa by discussing the subject with the driver on our doorstep. He knows the story. And he has or is going to decide if he is a free American or one of Hoffa's legion.

The order by Hoffa to his Philadelphia Teamsters to get busy in this year's campaign to help re-elect the city's congressmen, all friendly to his and unions generally, brings a reminder close to home of the Teamsters' power. The order, of course, makes certain the victory of a political organization reeking with rascality, and the moral weakness of the authorities who fail to prosecute.

What an outraged public may be able to do — if the public ever feels outraged — is anybody's guess. But anybody with an ounce of intelligence must concede that Jimmy Hoffa has made the Communist threat a minor matter we can at this time dismiss from our worries.

These friendly men who come to our doors must decide whether Hoffa and his powerful Teamsters or our Federal Government shall rule our country.
