County Agent

Homemaker's clubs in Pierce County have chosen projects for their meetings for the next eighteen months. These projects are in nutrition, home improvement and home management. Leader Training meetings and workshops will be held for the groups.
Program chairman will meet with Mrs. Everett Robertson to discuss meetings where crafts will be taught. Many of the homemaker members have hobbies that other members will be interested in and so pooling talent will help all members.
Mrs. Francis Huschek of Midland who is County Council president for Pierce County Homemakers and the Executive Board are looking forward to many busy days as the State Conference of Homemaker's Clubs will be held in Tacoma in 1960.

How much concern do our laws have for your welfare as a meat and milk consumer? In prevention of transmittal of animal diseases to the consuming public? Quite a lot.

What's the law about livestock health regulations? This is a frequent question put to county agents. Much credit should go to our State Department of Agriculture, Division of Dairy & Livestock, and our general veterinary practitioners. It seems their regulations made up after consultation of producers' associations are very fair in their protection of the consuming public, as well as the producers and buyers. For example, one of their recent regulations adopted states: "for the purpose of this order 'official calfhood vaccination' means vaccination of animals under Federal or State supervision between the ages of 4 and 8 months in calves of the dairy breeds and between 4 and 12 months in calves of the beef breeds."

"It shall be unlawful to sell or offer for sale any cattle or goats over 6 months of age, for other than immediate slaughter, unless they are negative to a Brucellosis test within 30 days prior to sale or are negative animals from a herd in which all animals were tested within one year prior to date of sale and no reactors (other than official vaccine reactors with a positive blood agglutination in dilutions of 1 to 100 or higher) were found: Provided, that official calfhood vaccinations under 30 months of age need not be tested."

"Any herd of cattle or goats in which Tuberculosis or Brucellosis reactors (other than official calfhood vaccinates) are found will be quarantined and the sale or removal of any animal out of such herd, except for immediate slaughter, is prohibited. The quarantine will be released without reactors; the first test to be not less than 30 days or more than one year following the date of the previous test."

"All stables, corrals and barns where Brucellosis or Tuberculosis reactors have been held must be thoroughly cleaned and disinfected as soon as the reactors have been removed."

These are just a few of the numerous laws for everyone's protection.
