Hunter' Safety Course Due 10th

What may prove to be the final "go round" of the Hunters' Safety Course at Spanaway is scheduled for three two-hour sessions, March 10, 11 and 17, in the Spanaway Park Community building, 7 to 9 p.m.

Teachers, all certified NRA instructors, will teach the proper use and care of firearms, plus many procedures of safe hunting. A certificate showing that the course has been completed is required before a hunting license can be issued to any boy or girl under 18 years of age.

John Newell, chairman of the Spanaway Recreation Committee, which sponsors the course, points out that the safety course in no way replaces the responsibility of parents, who still must keep a close check on how their children handle guns, at home or in the field. Summit Firemen and Auxiliary to Sponsor Sunday Dinner



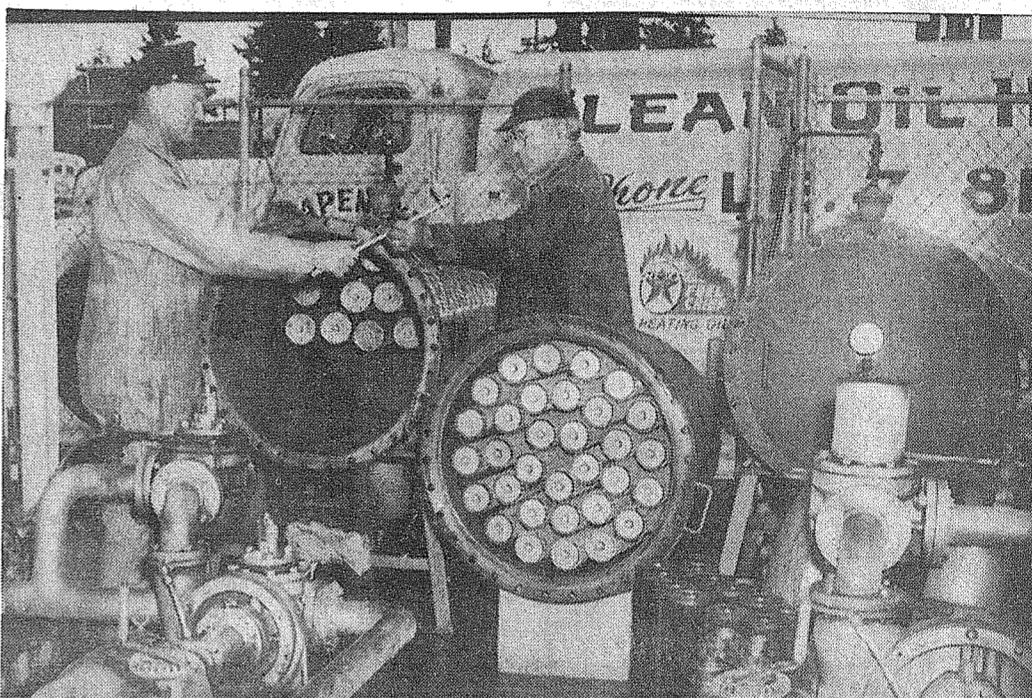

a-Wondering . . . and a-Wandering . . .

With JACK BROWN

Who do you work for — and why do you work? The obvious answer, of course, is that you work for your employer or for yourself, and that the reason you work is to provide the wherewithal of living.

However, that answer is an oversimplification nowadays. If you are an average joker like me, more than a quarter of your 8-hour working day is done on behalf of government. In essence, government is your employer during that period, and takes all of your earnings.

Here are the figures, as issued by the Tax Foundation. Taxes take 2 hours and 16 minutes of your working time each day. By way of contrast, food and tobacco together demand only 1 hour and 28 minutes, household and household operations 1 hour and 24 minutes, and so on down the list.

If you think that taxation and government spending aren't of top importance to you and your family, think again!

The so-called "fair trade" laws — which make it legally obligatory for retailers everywhere to sell branded articles at an identical price — established by the manufacturers — have been a subject of controversy for years. Some states have passed them, and in a number of cases they have subsequently been repealed or been thrown out by courts.

Now it is proposed that a federal "fair trade" law go on the books. And this has brought an important editorial observation from the Denver Post:

"The manufacturer would fix the retail price high enough to give the inefficient retailer a pleasing margin of profit . . .

"The inefficient retailer would be insulated against the natural consequences of his inefficiency, with the public paying the bill.

"The efficient retailer would be prevented by law from cashing in on his merchandising skills."

Going on, the Post listed a number of things that will happen if a federal "fair trade" law is passed. There will be another spurt in the cost of living. The free, competitive enterprise system will take a serious setback. And "demands for government price-fixing for all industries will become increasingly insistent and appealing."

Here is one of the roads leading to a "managed" economy, based solidly on the all-powerful state principle. This we can live without. As far as I'm concerned, there is entirely too much price fixing now.

Last week, as many of you remember, I was shooting off my big mouth about inflation. Since then I'm happy to report, I have discovered that others are rapidly taking stock of our situation.

For example the Saturday Evening Post recently ran a full-page editorial entitled "We Can Stop Inflation if We Have the Courage to Try." In the course of its discussion, it said this: ". . . inflation is inevitable unless there is patience and restraint on the part of the public. If every slight increase in prices is to mean a strike-enforced demand for higher wages, we might as well kiss stability good-by."

In substantiation, it quotes a striking statement made by L. Robert Driver, a leading statistician and tax expert. Says Mr. Driver: "If the pay of all employed persons in the United States had been raised by forty cents an hour, as the pay of the steelworkers was raised, the costs of goods and services in the country would rise by \$45,800,000 a year, or \$270 for every one of our 170 million people." To quote the Post again, "Leaving out the effect on our precarious competitive position vis-a-vis foreign producers, even a fiscal ignoramus can see the effect of such an addition to our already top-heavy costs on the value of the dollar."

The number of dollars that labor or any other group gets is not the big thing. What really counts is what those dollars will buy. And the surest way to further degrade the dollar's buying power is through wage increases not accompanied by increases in productivity.
