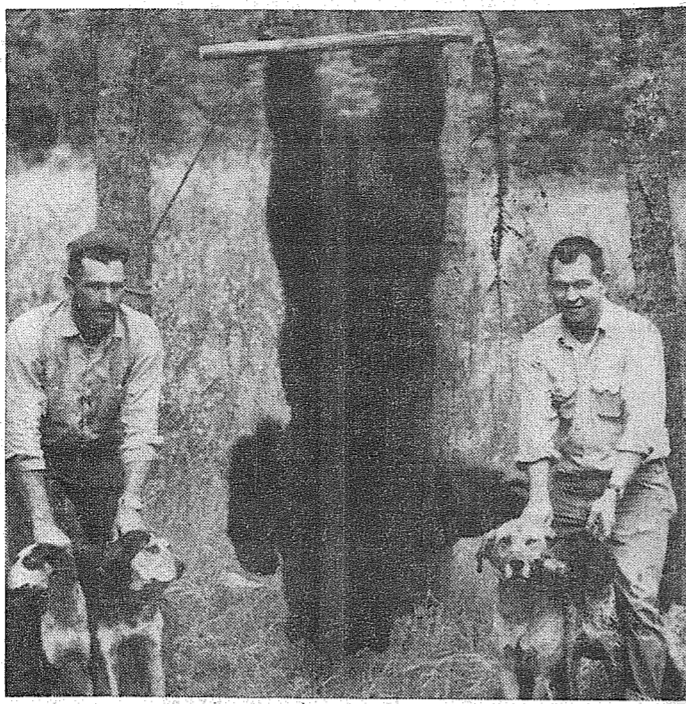

### County Agent's Corner

By Ernest I. Hopp  
Most people are aware of the accumulation of farm surpluses. Accumulations seem to be getting larger each year. I was very interested in a recent farm magazine editorial which indicated that we have an even bigger farm development than surplus accumulation. The development is the trend toward bigger and fewer farms. This may have even more impact on consumers than paying the storage bill on accumulated agricultural surpluses.

Over a long period of years this could very well turn out to be a more expensive proposition for consumers than the surpluses have. This could come about by higher prices for foodstuffs.

Many government and private experts estimate that by the year 1970 — or earlier — there will be no more than 500,000 farmers producing most of the food and fiber in this country and getting at least 90 per cent of the farm income from sales. This would be a tremendous concentration of power. It would be much easier for 500,000 farmers to organize than for 4 million. The next step could be

Pruning young Douglas fir trees promises a more valuable forest crop when harvest time arrives.

The difference in value can be readily observed by comparing the price of number 2 and 3 Douglas fir sawlogs at \$39.00 to \$46.00 per thousand board feet versus the price of number 2 and 3 Douglas fir peels at \$72.00 to \$89.50. Pruning will make peels out of many logs that would otherwise go for a lesser grade.

It takes but 10 to 15 minutes to prune a tree. The difference in value of the pruned tree versus the unpruned is substantial as can be noted from the above figures. The new Extension Service leaflet "Pruning Increases Forest Tree Quality" contains the facts and figures on how to do the job right. The leaflet is available now in the County Agents' office.

Dropped in at the Matlock strawberry farm at Alderton this week and Ivan told me they had picked 10 tons of strawberries that day — to accomplish that it takes top producing fields and good pickers, both of which the Matlocks have.

It has been the practice for years to develop matted rows of strawberry plants — the Matlock fields being no exception. However, I noticed some new plantings that had been set close together in the row. I asked Ivan if they were going to try out the single hill planting. He then showed me a small planting they had put in a year ago in single hills. The fruit yield per plant is tremendous, the size is considerably larger — the fruit clusters are out where they can easily be picked and there is much less fruit rot. The pickers love to pick these berries in the single hill system.

All these things add up to what a grower is looking for. The Matlocks look with great favor on considering changing over to this system. However, Ivan tells me they are going to do some more experimenting regarding the interval of plant spacing and the development of machinery to handle the runner cutting.

The variety used in this planting is Northwest.

farmers control of production — not only to raise surpluses but to raise prices. This would be in addition to effective bargaining power farmers might have if they acted in association. It could eventually mean that farmers would be in a position to pass along costs and share more equitably in the national economic prosperity. This more equitable sharing would result in higher food prices to consumers. It could very likely mean that government price supports would not be needed. This would mean that consumers would be paying for products based on equitable value rather than in the form of taxes.

There are many factors involved in this long term development. It is not my position to offer an opinion on this but rather to state possible future trends. The important point to remember is that many people are discouraged about the government price support program. This includes both farmers and consumers. At the present time farmers in general are not receiving their equitable share of the national economy. One alternative is that consumers pay more for the food they buy. This is a long term development that could take place as farms become larger and fewer.

Pruning young Douglas fir trees promises a more valuable forest crop when harvest time arrives. The difference in value can be readily observed by comparing the price of number 2 and 3 Douglas fir sawlogs at \$39.00 to \$46.00 per thousand board feet versus the price of number 2 and 3 Douglas fir peels at \$72.00 to \$89.50. Pruning will make peels out of many logs that would otherwise go for a lesser grade.

It takes but 10 to 15 minutes to prune a tree. The difference in value of the pruned tree versus the unpruned is substantial as can be noted from the above figures. The new Extension Service leaflet "Pruning Increases Forest Tree Quality" contains the facts and figures on how to do the job right. The leaflet is available now in the County Agents' office.

Dropped in at the Matlock strawberry farm at Alderton this week and Ivan told me they had picked 10 tons of strawberries that day — to accomplish that it takes top producing fields and good pickers, both of which the Matlocks have.

It has been the practice for years to develop matted rows of strawberry plants — the Matlock fields being no exception. However, I noticed some new plantings that had been set close together in the row. I asked Ivan if they were going to try out the single hill planting. He then showed me a small planting they had put in a year ago in single hills. The fruit yield per plant is tremendous, the size is considerably larger — the fruit clusters are out where they can easily be picked and there is much less fruit rot. The pickers love to pick these berries in the single hill system.

All these things add up to what a grower is looking for. The Matlocks look with great favor on considering changing over to this system. However, Ivan tells me they are going to do some more experimenting regarding the interval of plant spacing and the development of machinery to handle the runner cutting.

The variety used in this planting is Northwest.
