The pickers love to pick these berries in the

single hill system. All these things add up to what a grower is looking for. The Matlocks look with great favor on considering changing over to this ystem. However, ivan tells me they are going to do some more experimenting regarding the interval of plant spacing and the development of machinery to handle the runner cutting.

The variety used in this planting is Northwest.
