The court held that a car is a 'dangerous instrumentality,' and it is the duty of the driver to know of any defect which makes it unsafe to operate under certain conditions.

Since she had a duty to know that the car couldn't be coasted safely with the motor not running, she was negligent in failing to know that fact and her neglience caused the accident. She was required to pay for the damage inflicted by her automobile.




