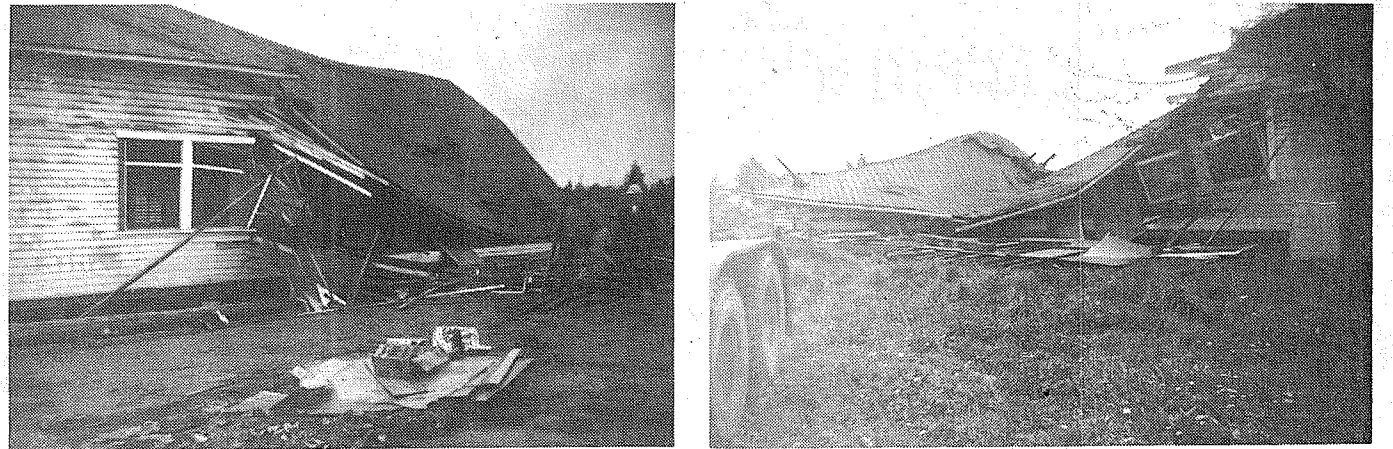

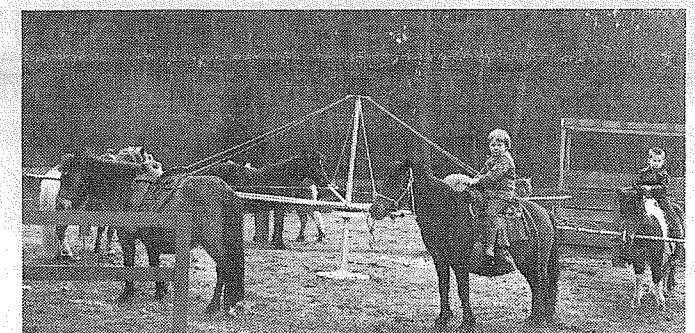

a - Wondering . . . and a - Wandering . . .
with JACK BROWN

I haven't had time to do any serious research this week, so let's just wander around a little and see what turns up.

Seems I have been sailing under some false colors unbeknownst to me. The other day a fellow told me he heard I had been interested in sports and wondered where I had fought or wrestled. This sort of floored me, because although I sport a cauliflower ear I am not one of the greats or even near greats. It seems that some of the younger generation has just taken too much for granted, so now is a good time to set the record straight and perhaps give some of them a little something to think about.

To start with, let me say that as a youngster I picked up a habit that I have carried through the years. I like to eat. Now, when a person has this habit and food is not in abundance you're apt to do most anything to obtain some. When I was in my teens there came several such times. I found there was always a few dollars to be made at some smoker or working as a sparring partner in some gym. There you have it. I never fought a legitimate fight nor wrestled a legitimate match in my life. I received my cauliflower ear getting the heck beat out of me so I could sit down to a square feed. Now that brings me to the crux of the matter. Here in America today very few teenagers ever grow into manhood knowing the gnawing pangs of hunger. This is as it should be, for so long as we continue to feed the world then surely our own should never go hungry. This fact also shows a steady course on the right road for it has not been so long ago that many teenagers occasionally went hungry.

I remember a lot of times when the situation was far from funny. I remember sitting on the curb in Sacramento one Christmas day, along with many others of like age, and all we had to eat was oranges we had picked up off the ground in orchards near town. I remember 3 of us teenagers living in the back of a truck on the shores of Lake Chelan and making a bum's stew with carrots, potatoes and a scrawny old cottontail. We even added the carrot tops to the mess to make it go farther. I remember roasting a jack rabbit over a sage brush fire on a cold morning out in Wyoming. These and dozens more are far from pleasant memories, and I'm thankful that my children will very likely go through life without experiencing this sort of hardship.

The only thing wrong with the situation is that it is impossible to impress upon their minds how fortunate they are to live in a country such as ours. They take the good things American life has to offer for granted, and there is little we can do about it. I for one would rather have them take it for granted than to have them ever have to walk shoulder to shoulder with those who are hungry, watching people groping through garbage cans, begging on the streets or standing in the soup line.

I've been there, and I know a lot of you have also. I say to you that knowing what we do, it is all the more important that we make every effort to preserve our present way of life and fight any movement that will push us back to the dark days of the big depression.

As long as I have rambled on this far I might as well get another matter settled. I have reached the place in life where occasionally I meet resentment on the part of those less fortunate in life. It seems that someone is forever throwing remarks my way about being rich, owning a plane, a fleet of cars, etc. etc. After a while this can sort of become irritating for the simple reason that those making the remarks have had an equal opportunity to do as well or better than I.

On the surface it may seem to some that I have a lot, but believe me I miss the mark of being rich by one heck of a long way. What I do have I am proud of, for no one gave me a hand to obtain it. I have worked hard for what I have while many who make a habit of making snide remarks about me and other business men in the area have sat around on their dead ends waiting for some one to give them something.

Just for the record, when the war was over I came home to Seattle with my wife, my daughter, my dog, a few bucks of mustering out pay and everything we owned in the world in an old car. I used the money for a down payment on a house and sold the car for a down payment on some furniture. That was my start on October 15th, 1945. Every thing I have gained since then I have worked for steadily and I feel I owe no man an apology for having managed to get ahead a little in life. Above all else, what I have, I came by honestly, so the next time you get ready to make some remarks about me, at least give the above some thought and engage your brain before you engage your jaw.

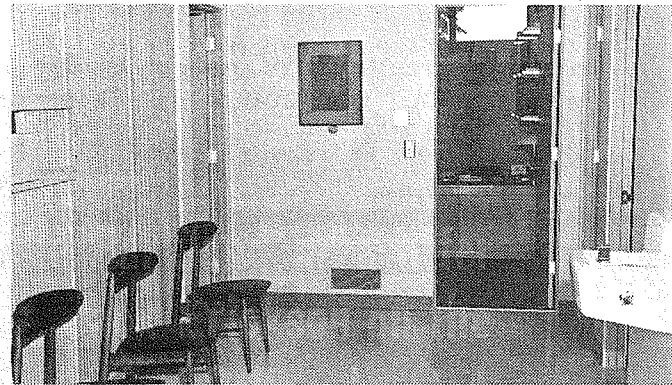
