Wondering why you didn't get a ticket to the Rose Bowl this year? Well, here's the answer. For one thing, the University of Washington is obligated to reserve tickets to all students, faculty, and alumni requesting them, in addition to all season ticket holders. This year. there were 6100 more requests, due, no doubt, to the Huskie's recent rise in football prominence. Unfortunately, this means 6100 less to the public.

As if that weren't enough, the Rose Bowl committee in Pasadena decided this year was a good time to inaugurate a new "season ticket" program for the benefit of all those living within reach of the Pasadena ticket office. This new program consists of 8100 tickets enabling purchasers to visit the Rose Bowl for the next 10 years. Thus, (if you happen to live in Pasadena) you can buy one ticket and make the Rose Bowl a permanent thing, almost.


This, of course, means that each year for the next 10 years 8100 less tickets will be distributed to the two schools involved.

This makes it tough all around. It is tough on the University of Washington. It is perhaps toughest of all on Ivan Travis, ticket manager at the U. In spite of 1,700 tickets given to the U. by Minnesota, Mr. Travis still found himself with 3,300 less tickets to distribute to the university, with increased demands therein causing the amount available to the public to be reduced by 6100.
