- The Interim and Spring registration will be combined into one registration card and packet. Advance registration for the Interim only, the Interim and Spring, or Spring only will be accommodated at the same time.
- All students currently in school must advance register.
- Full-time new and re-entry students may advance register if a clearance has been received from admissions. Part-time new students are encouraged to advance register.
- Selective Service - Attention All Male Students**
If you want your local draft board notified of your full-time enrollment (2 1/2 courses) at P.L.U., it is your responsibility to complete a form in the Registrar's Office. This is normally done only once a year.
- V. A. Benefits**
If you expect to receive any type of veteran or war orphan benefits, you must file your certificate of eligibility in the Registrar's Office. Forms and information concerning veterans benefits are available in the Registrar's Office. Make application when registering. A full-time student must be registered for 3 courses to be eligible for full-time V. A. Benefits.
- Obtain your registration materials at the Registrar's Office.
- Secure an appointment with your adviser. DO THIS IMMEDIATELY to avoid a rush at the end of the semester.
- Print with a **BLACK LEAD PENCIL** on your official program.
 - Fill in all personal information including your Social Security Number. If you do not have a Social Security Number, you must secure one prior to registering.
 - Enter course(s) in space provided for the Interim Registration.
 - Print an "A" before audit courses, "R" before repeat courses, and "P-F" before pass-fail courses, in the column provided.
 - Check to be certain that you have the pre-requisites as indicated in the Interim Catalog or Spring Schedule for the courses you select.
 - On the reverse side of your registration card, list 2 alternate Interim courses which can be substituted for your first course choice. You are also strongly advised to list alternate courses for the Spring registration.
 - Obtain permission signatures where needed as indicated in the Interim Catalog and Spring Schedule.
 - Obtain the signature of your adviser if you are a full-time (2 1/2 courses) student.

Advance Registration Only

- Obtain housing clearance from the Office of Student Affairs.
- Leave your registration materials at the Registrar's Office.
- In Advance Registration for the Interim, seniors will receive preference until November 14. After that date, registration will be completed on a first-come, first-served basis.
- Advance registration for Spring will be processed by class in the order they are received with seniors first, then juniors, sophomores, and freshmen. Every effort is made to comply with your requests. If a course is closed, an approved alternate will be substituted.
- You will be mailed a statement of charges including the fee payment deadline, a copy of your scheduled classes, additional instructions, and cards.
- Return your payment and the other information requested to the P.L.U. Business Office by the due date indicated.

In Person Registration

- Obtain the necessary cards at the Registrar's Office.
- Complete all cards. Obtain adviser's approval if full-time (see "g" above).
- Obtain housing clearance from the Office of Student Affairs.
- Report to the Registrar's Office to be scheduled.
- As soon as you are scheduled and receive a copy of your program, report to the Business Office to pay your fees.

Pass-Fail Option for Undergraduate Students

The pass-fail option is offered so that undergraduate students will explore subject areas outside those of their known abilities in their lower division years, or to add a broader range of courses to their upper division program without forcing them to compete with majors who are specializing in those areas of study.

- The pass-fail option is limited to a total of four courses and is limited to no more than two courses per calendar year.
- Courses required for graduation in any degree program of the University will not be taken on a pass-fail basis. Similarly, courses needed in the student's major field, except when a first course has been taken prior to declaration of a major, will not be taken on a pass-fail basis.
- Pass-fail grades will not alter the gpa, but credits earned will count toward graduation.
- The pass-fail option must be indicated on the registration card by the adviser. A change in the decision regarding pass-fail will be subject to the established regulations concerning change of registration.
- Pass-fail students will be responsible for all course work and examinations. Only "P" and "F" grades will be issued and recorded on the transcript.
- An entire course will not be converted to the pass-fail basis by student vote.
- The "P" (Pass) grade will be equivalent to a grade of "A", "B", "C", or "D".
