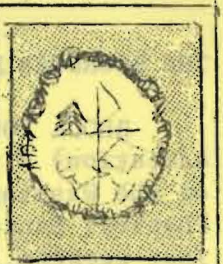

## CORONATION, ELLINGTON CONCERT HIGHLIGHT HOMECOMING ACTIVITIES

The coronation of Homecoming Queen Nancy Jurgenson and the concert by Duke Ellington highlight tonight's Homecoming weekend activities.

Miss Jurgenson will be crowned as the 23rd Homecoming Queen in ceremonies at 7:30 p.m. in the Eastvold Chapel auditorium. Mrs. Dorothy Harshman, wife of Marv Harshman, former PLU great and coach who is now head basketball coach at Washington State University, will crown the queen. Mrs. Harshman was the first PLU Homecoming queen.

The concert by Duke Ellington is scheduled for 8:30 p.m. in Memorial Gymnasium. A few tickets are still available and can be purchased at the information desk or at the door.

## FACULTY MEMBERS TO APPEAR IN TWO RECITALS NEXT WEEK

PLU faculty members will appear in two recitals next week. Frederick L. Newham, associate professor of music, and William P. Giddings, associate professor of chemistry, will present a joint recital at All Saints' Episcopal Church, 96th and East B Streets, Sunday at 5 p.m.

Newham, noted baritone, will sing arias by Handel and Bach and selections from the oratorio "Elijah" by Mendelssohn.

Giddings will play organ music of Marcello, Couperin, Dupre and Franck. Other organ numbers include chorale preludes of Buxtehude, Bach and Walcha and a chorale partita by Videro.

The recital inaugurates the new four rank pipe organ by Balcom and Vaughan of Seattle. The new All Saints' church building and organ were both completed in August.

Newham will appear in faculty recital next Friday ( Oct. 29 ) at 8 p.m. in Jacob Samuelson Chapel. Among the selections he will sing are Honour and Arms from "Samson" by Handel, "Good Fellows Be Merry" by Bach, The Dichterliebe by Schumann and Handel's O Noe del mio poten from "Rinaldo." He will end the program with some Hebridean folk songs.

Also appearing on the program will be Mrs. Calvin Knapp, member of the preparatory department, who will play several selections on the piano including Intermezzo in E Minor, Brahms, Prelude in D Flat and Etude in G Flat Major, Chopin and La Campanella by Liszt.

Calvin Knapp will accompany Newham.

Both recitals are complimentary to the public.

## KNIGHT GRIDDERS ENTERTAIN WHITWORTH IN ANNUAL HOMECOMING GAME SATURDAY

Pacific Lutheran University puts a five-game home winning streak on the line Saturday when it entertains Whitworth in the 32nd PLU Homecoming football game at 1:30 p.m. at the Franklin Pierce High School Stadium.

The Knights ran the string to five last week with a narrow 21-20 victory over Lewis and Clark. The last time a PLU team put together a quintet of home victories was in 1947. However, the PLU home victory mark stands at 17, recorded from 1939-42.

The men of Coach Roy Carlson stand at 3-2 for the season while the Pirates will bring a 2-3 record into the contest.

Both teams have met common foes in Eastern Washington and Western Washington. The Knights fell to EWSC 20-3 while defeating WWSU 27-14. The Pirates lost to both schools by respective scores of 27-14 and 14-0.

PLU's other victory came over Puget Sound while Whitworth's two wins were over Southern Oregon and Central Washington. The Bucs also lost to Weber state.

The series between PLU and Whitworth is tied at 11 games apiece. The two teams divided contests in 1964--the Pirates winning the first 35-28 and the Knights the return match 28-21.

PLU has a 15-13-3 record in previous homecoming games.

The Knights, whose pass defense has been rather porous this year, will attempt to stop the Pirates aerial duo of quarterback Don Leebrick and end George Elliott.

Halfback Larry LaBrie, a constant break-away threat, and Monty Parratt, a hard-running fullback, give the Whitworth attack balance.

"A DIFFERENT DRUMMER" TO PREMIER  
HERE NEXT THURSDAY

"A Different Drummer," a fantasy-comedy by Eugene McKinney, will make its West Coast premier at PLU Oct. 28-30. Under the direction of Dr. Abe Bassett, assistant professor of speech at PLU, the three-act drama will be presented nightly at 8:15 p.m. in the Eastvold Chapel auditorium.

The play attracted national attention when it premiered at Baylor University in 1955 and was presented on the television show "Omnibus" later in the same year.

It's a story about this little man-Royal Barnhill. He's a man with a past that he didn't make, a future that he doesn't control and a present he doesn't want.

A decidedly different comedy, the title is taken from Thoreau: "If a man does not keep pace with his companions, perhaps it is because he hears a different drummer."

Dave Richardt is cast as Barnhill. Others in featured roles are Chris McMurdo, who plays Norma Buxley, the town gossip; Joan Schooler as Nelda Lous Jenkins, who falls in love with Royal but is too shy to land him; and Linda Hansen, who portrays Royal's mother.

Also in the cast are David Monson, Dennis Beard, Tom Macready, Raeder Anderson, Tom Robinson, Dick Finch and Jim Dion.

NOTICE CONCERNING THE  
MAKING OF TOLL CALLS

If faculty need to make university business toll calls from off-campus phones (such as from their homes or from campus phones after switchboard is closed) which they want charged to PLU, they should be SURE such calls are reported to our switchboard operator next morning so that she may identify the call on the monthly billing from the telephone company. The same is true of calls from campus after switchboard is closed. A good way to report such calls is to give the toll operator your name and PLU extension at the time the call is placed and to request her to quote time and charges on the call; this means that the toll operator will report to the PLU operator the required information concerning the call.
