PRELIMINARY REPORT ON GOLDEN JUBILEE CAMPAIGN RESULTS AS OF JUNE 27, 1942

In response to many requests, Pacific Lutheran College herewith makes public the results of the Golden Jubilee Campaign up to June 27, 1942, in terms of number of pledges secured, amounts pledged, and payments made.

The Campaign got under way in the Pacific District of the Norwegian Lutheran Church of America immediately after Easter, in spite of shortage of man power, rationing of tires and gas, and other difficulties.

By resolution of the Pacific Lutheran College Association, in annual corporation meeting assembled at Minneapolis, Minn., on June 12, 1942, Vice President Mikkel Lono will continue in charge of the Golden Jubilee Campaign Follow-Up till the Fiftieth Anniversary date, October 14, 1944.

THE UNFINISHED TASK

The Golden Jubilee Campaign has not resorted to "high pressure" and has not set up regional or congregational quotas. The support given the national Church budget through the past dozen years or so may, however, offer an index to the regional (and congregational) interest and ability, on the basis of which a relatively fair array of quotas may be set up. If we assume that interested congregations and friends outside of Pacific District may provide enough support to take care of the *expenses* of the Golden Jubilee Campaign, the minimum goal of \$150,000 net may be apportioned among the six circuits of the Pacific District as set forth in the table below.

STATE CONFIRMS ACCREDITATION

On June 19, 1942, the Washington State Board of Education adopted the following recommendation of its inspection committee, which had visited Pacific Lutheran College on June 11, 1942: "The committee, therefore, recommends that the State Board of Education approve Pacific Lutheran College as a four-year teacher-training institution to prepare teachers for the elementary schools. The committee suggests that an additional inspection be made on or before June 1, 1945, for the purpose of insuring further progress on the part of the College toward those goals which it has set for itself."

CHURCH DELEGATES POWER TO ACT

On June 13, 1942, in biennial convention assembled at Minneapolis, Minnesota, the Norwegian Lutheran Church of America adopted the following resolution in regard to Pacific Lutheran College:

Whereas the Pacific District of the N. L. C. A. has petitioned the N. L. C. A. in convention assembled at Minneapolis, June 11, 1942, that it approve a four-year Liberal Arts status for Pacific Lutheran College as of June, 1942, and

Whereas Pacific Lutheran College is already a four-year College of Education, and

Whereas there has been a growing sentiment in the direction of the establishment of a full Liberal Arts College at the Institution, and

Whereas the Intersynodical Pacific Lutheran College Advisory Committee has recognized the need of the expansion of Pacific Lutheran College into a four-year Liberal Arts College, and has expressed its sympathy with the efforts of the College in such expansion when the proper financial support can be assured from the three cooperating bodies and other sources,

Therefore Be It Resolved, That the N. L. C. A. herewith, in recognition of the request of the Pacific District for the establishment of four-year Liberal Arts status for Pacific Lutheran College, expresses its sympathy with the plan and does hereby refer the petition of the Pacific District to the Board of Education and the Board of Trustees of the Church, in consultation with the four college presidents, representatives of Pacific Lutheran College, and representatives of the two cooperating bodies, with full power to act."
