Sculpture dedicated in memory of Jim Holloway

A sculpture in honor of the late Jim Holloway now stands outside the Mary Baker Russell music building.

The sculpture, designed by Kathryn Sparks, curator for visual arts at PLU, was dedicated in October. Kathryn and her husband, Dick, former director of choral activities at PLU, were good friends with Holloway and his wife, Judy Carr. Sparks designed the piece in Holloway's memory based on artwork she did for the invitation to Jim and Judy's wedding. Sparks brings her close friendship and respect for his artistry to the tree-shaped sculpture.

It depicts the life of a brilliant and caring teacher, an inspiring colleague, a trusted friend and a great and gifted servant. Beyond that, Sparks wanted her metal and glass sculpture on a brick base to show Holloway's many loves, which ranged from music and cooking to family and the Lord.

Holloway, who was killed May 17, 2001, was an assistant professor of music and university organizer.

Diverse and dynamic speakers fill Fall Lecture Series

Compelling speakers on topics ranging from landmines to the Holocaust drew crowds to the 2002 Fall Lecture Series.

Susannah Heschel of Dartmouth College opened the series with her presentation, "The Failure of Dialogue: Jewish-Christian Relations from the Jewish Point of View." Her lecture was also the annual Raphael Lemkin lecture, presented annually on a topic relating to genocide, and the keynote address for an international Holocaust conference held on campus in late September.

Gordon Lathrop, professor of liturgy at the Lutheran Theological Seminary of Philadelphia and former PLU campus pastor, presented the Lutheran Heritage Lecture with his talk, "Do Not Harm the Trees: The Ritual Care of the Earth." Per Lønning, retired bishop of Bergen, Norway and a member of the Norwegian Parliament, presented "Between Fundamentalism and Relativism."

An extraordinary witness to modern Chinese history, visiting professor Sidney Rittenberg presented "Whither China," drawing on his experiences living in China for 35 years after the Revolution of 1949.

Lectures organized as part of a series sponsored by the Students of Peace working group and the Wang Center for International Programs also were included in the series. Panel presentations and discussions were held on "Iraq: The Human Costs of Sanctions" and "Landmines: The Human Costs of War."

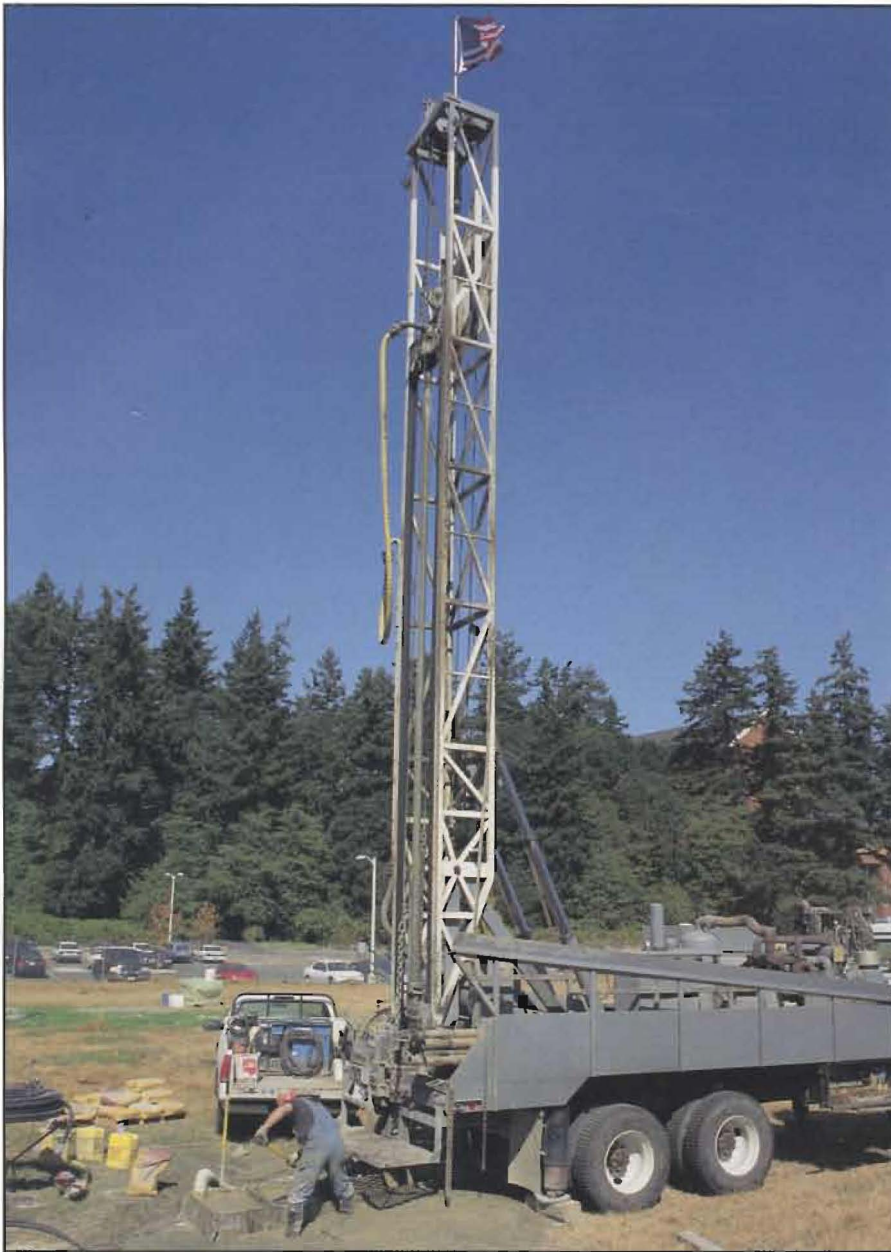
New students benefit socially, academically from program

New student orientation now lasts through January, rather than just the first four days of school.

A new component, Quest, is a series of programs running through fall and J-Term that complement the First-Year Experience (see page 8). Students attend keynote programs with discus-

sions in September, October, November and January that highlight key aspects of PLU's mission: inquiry, care, leadership and service.

"The first four days students are on campus are important," said Kathleen Farrell, director of Student Involvement and Leadership, "but it is not enough time to cover everything students need to know."

Quest is intended to take orientation a step further by presenting information when it is relevant. It will assist students in their transition and help them appreciate the support and spirit of the PLU community.

The program brings new students together more regularly, which helps socially but also offers greater access to faculty and administrative resources. PLU's support services gain more insight into student needs by increasing their interaction with them. Organizers of Quest and the First-Year Experience program will work together to encourage more participation and find ways to integrate keynote programs and courses.

The Student Life office hopes common experiences among the incoming class members will help build community with shared references, discussions and memories.

Morken Center construction starts with drilling

No, the drilling rig on lower campus that has been churning away for the past several weeks is not an attempt to enhance the endowment by striking oil. But it could mean more money for the university nevertheless.

The drilling is part of the first phase of construction for the Morken Center for Learning and Technology. Eighty, 300-foot deep vertical bores will form the working end of a ground-source heating and cooling system for the building.

The system and other energy efficiency measures included in the design of the Morken Center will save the university about \$20,000 per year in utility costs alone. Maintenance costs will also be lower.

Instead of using a chiller to provide chilled water for air conditioning and a boiler to provide hot water for heating, the system extracts heat from the ground in the winter, to heat the building, and sheds the building's heat to the ground in the summer, to cool the building.

Timing of construction of the final phase of the project, including the building, depends on fund-raising progress. To date more than \$12 million has been raised for construction of the \$19 million facility.

Norwegian art and music subject of seminar

Norwegian teachers on campus for an annual seminar in October were treated to great music and art, as well as the traditional lectures.

Following the theme "Norwegian Culture Today," the annual conference of teachers of Norwegian from the U.S. and Canada, included great performances.

Jon-Roar Bjørkvold, a popular music professor and author from Norway, presented a musical lecture. "Music and

Culture: A Journey into the Creative Powers of Human Communication,” was the annual Harstad lecture, established in memory of PLU’s founder, Bjug Harstad. His family created an endowment to fund the lecture series and help carry out Harstad’s wish that Scandinavian Americans not lose touch with their ancestral culture and traditions.

The jazz of Norwegian vocalist Solveig Slettahjell also charmed audiences at Lagerquist Concert Hall. She is becoming increasingly popular with the release of her CD “Slow Motion Orchestra.”

Also, the artwork of acclaimed Norwegian landscape photographer Asle Svarverud was on display in the Scandinavian Cultural Center. His exhibit, “Norwegian Landscapes: Intense, Secluded, Majestic” included 35 mostly black-and-white photographs of some of Norway’s prettiest places.

Other presenters included Asmund Thorkildsen, director of Drammen Museum; Eva Bratholm, foreign correspondent for Dagbladet, one of Norway’s leading newspapers; and Audun Eckhoff, director of Bergen Art Museum.

The Norway Seminar is held on a different North American campus every

year. PLU’s Audun Toven, chair of Scandinavian Studies, organized this year’s seminar.

A new generation discovers the joys of knitting and crocheting

Knitting and crocheting have become the new trendy activities for students’ free time – for both men and women.

Jenne Heu-Weller, Andrea Hively and Amanda McCarty, all '04, started the PLU Knitting and Crocheting Club this fall. The three have been knitting or crocheting together for years and thought others might like to get into it. Still, they were surprised to have 35 people at the first meeting.

The goal is simply for people to have fun, learn to knit and do something productive and stress-free.

McCarty credits the interest in the club to the stress-relieving qualities of knitting and crocheting. “It’s a mindless activity that gives you something to do with your hands,” she said.

Hively said knitting is addictive. “When you see something that you’ve created and you can wear it or you can give it away, I think it makes you

want to do it again,” she said.

Lutes pay off their loans at a greater rate than national average

The U.S. Department of Education announced that for the first time in a decade the national rate at which borrowers default on student loans rose in the 2000 fiscal year, to 5.9 percent from 5.6 percent.

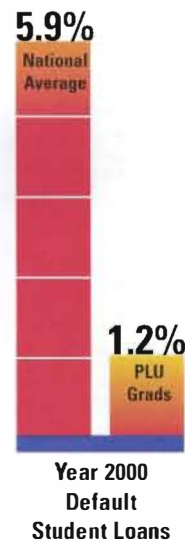
That’s far from the case for PLU graduates. The university’s loan default rate dropped to record lows for 2000, to only 1.2 percent. That’s down over a full point from the previous year.

What accounts for this counter trend? What does it say about PLU people?

“PLU graduates have consistently demonstrated that they are very responsible citizens—more than the graduates of most other universities,” said Kay Soltis, director of financial aid.

“Every year our graduates beat the national student loan default rate by several percentage points, and 2000 was a particularly good one,” she said.

Soltis also credits the job her office does to counsel graduating seniors on the realities of financial responsibility outside the Lutedome.



PLU 2010, university's long-range plan, nears completion

Throughout the summer, a writing team was charged with preparing a planning document that distilled the work of the four PLU 2010 study commissions (Academic Distinction, Community, Fiscal Strategies and Identity & Constituency). The end result will be the January final report for PLU 2010: The Next Level of Distinction.


Major topics in the final report include a framework for distinction as a Lutheran university in the Pacific Northwest; articulation of PLU's vision and aspirations; a focus on students; the cultivation of intellectually vibrant, creative and connected faculty and staff; and the understanding of knowledge and learning in carefully selected dimensions of its academic program, particularly international education and undergraduate student research and creative projects.

The 2010 draft report debuted at September's University Conference. The fall allowed for additional drafts, opportunities for departments and divisions to review the document, and two campus forums. The final draft will be completed in January and presented to the Board of Regents at its winter meeting.

"The PLU 2010 plan is so important because students are encouraged to seek their life dreams as they consider the larger issues of vocation," said Patricia Roundy, director of advising, who was on a panel reacting to the plan, at the fall conference. "This is a special place because this kind of dialogue doesn't happen everywhere."

First-Year Experience helps new students develop critical thinking skills

One of the things that makes PLU distinctive is the belief that a university education must be about more than developing a set of skills, says Douglas Lamoreaux, associate professor of education.

"It's also about learning to think and learning how to engage our critical capacities in service to the world," he said.

ics such as the consequences of poverty, drugs, gangs and war or an exploration of dreaming and the development of strategies to interpret dreams as a way of introducing the use of images in writing.

Students in Tom Campbell's writing seminar are spending the semester thinking, talking and writing about one of the most significant human relationships: fathers and sons. "In journals, letters, autobiographical narratives, descriptive essays and critical analysis we are exploring the dynamics of fathers and sons and related issues of masculinity and gender construc-

According to Lamoreaux, the new program that used to be known as the Freshman Experience is already evolving. "It's likely that the First-Year Experience program will become more closely affiliated with Quest, the year-long orientation program run by the office of Student Life," he said (see story page 4).

International scholars debate complex questions about origins of the Holocaust

Distinguished scholars from around the world debated how different religions view Jews – and whether their early teachings played a role in the Holocaust – at an international conference on campus in late September.

The conference, "Christian Teachings About Jews: National Comparisons in the Shadow of the Holocaust," drew scholars from as far as Germany, Poland and Israel. "This is the first time that these people have all come together in the Pacific Northwest," said Robert Ericksen, PLU professor of history who organized the conference.

Part of their plan was to determine which portions of the Christian tradition – if any – might have contributed to the violence and the hatred of the Holocaust, Ericksen said.

Ericksen is an acclaimed authority on the Holocaust and has authored several books about the Protestant Church and the Nazis.

The conference included panels on topics such as "Memories About Christian Attitudes Toward Jewish Survivors Speak," and "Anti-Semitism and the Vatican: A Postscript."

Dr. Susannah Heschel, who holds the Eli Black Chair in Jewish Studies at Dartmouth College, gave the keynote address, "The Failure of Dialogue:

For PLU students it all begins with the First-Year Experience. Lamoreaux is director of the program that includes a writing seminar and an inquiry seminar that are required of all first-year students. Small classes are designed to help students make the transition to college level academics.

Taught by a wide variety of faculty, the writing seminars focus on writing as a way of thinking, learning and organizing ideas. "They help students learn the skills necessary to be a better writer, inquirer and critical thinker in college," Lamoreaux said.

The seminars focus on engaging top-

tion," said Campbell, who is professor of English at PLU.

The second set of first-year seminars, known as inquiry seminars, introduce students to the methods and topics of study within a particular academic discipline. "It's a taste of academics from the heart of a discipline and a transition to the courses students will take in fulfilling their core and major requirements," Lamoreaux said.

Students learn how critical reflection functions in an academic field, they practice the skills of critical reading and effective communication, and they learn how to work in an academic group.

Jewish-Christian Teachings from the Jewish Point of View.”

Ericksen said the conference will result in the publishing of groundbreaking research on the origins of the Holocaust.

Papers from the conference will be published next year in a dedicated volume of the German journal *Kirchliche Zeitgeschichte*.

Peace Studies classes begin as talk of war builds

Across campus and the world, debate heated up this fall about what should be done about Iraq. Will sanctions work? Should the U.S. invade? If we do, what's the proper way to do it? Some questions are old, some are new, but the new Peace Studies program at PLU is working to educate people to be able to answer them all.

PLU's Peace Studies Working Group arranged a teach-in on Iraq, along with panel discussions on the human costs of landmines and an upcoming visit by Lloyd Axworthy, Nobel Peace Prize nominee and former Canadian Minister of Foreign Affairs.

Fall marked the first official Peace Studies courses at PLU. This year, introductory Peace Studies seminars (PS 101) are offered, as well as the Psychology of Peace seminar, taught by psychology professor Chris Hansvick, one of the professors who helped shape Peace Studies at PLU.

“In this seminar, our goal is to focus upon opportunities for peacemaking and peace building,” Hansvick said. “It doesn't mean there is no conflict. It means looking to find common ground.” While not yet part of a major or minor, the seminars offer the usual class credits. Hansvick adds that many courses already are offered that meet the criteria for Peace Studies; they just haven't been labeled as such.

Planning for the Peace Studies program began before Sept. 11, 2001, and its scope goes beyond national issues of war and terrorism. One important element is community service. The group

is developing local connections so students can be more involved in issues of homelessness, poverty and domestic violence. Participants in the seminars have also encouraged others to sign petitions, and more than 100 students, many for the first time, have written letters to their government representatives.

“For many, this really is the first step in citizenship,” said history professor Beth Kraig, who is a key partner in the Peace Studies initiative. “Bringing these things together, from interna-

tional conflict to community outreach, gives us all a sense of connectedness.”

Plans for the future include creating curriculum for Peace Studies courses, establishing a minor, developing individualized majors around the program and creating service-oriented Peace Studies. Organizers also see increasing alumni involvement as a major focus and have set up a Peace Studies at PLU donation account.

Salishan

Former campus pastor and students minister to
and learn from residents of housing project

The sign on Suzanne Fiske's door reads "Amazing Lady Award," a tribute to her success and the way she encourages others.

Fiske '99 is the drug elimination program coordinator at the east Tacoma housing project known as Salishan. She knows what life is like for many of her clients – the mother of three has lived on the streets and battled drug addiction. Fiske knows Salishan and the programs provided there can serve as a stepping stone for others to get off welfare and out of subsidized housing. She encourages people, in any situation, to go to college. "If I can do it, anybody can do it."

Her relationship with Salishan started when she was a student at PLU and accepted a work-study position in the administrative office. She's now been there almost five years. Fiske is just one example of how PLU connects with the neighborhood, the largest federal housing project on the West Coast that is home to more than 3,500 people in 850 homes.

For Fiske, who majored in sociology focusing on race relations, Salishan is a place where she is welcomed and respected. It's also a place where she can give back. She said residents and employees do not just see it as the buildings run by the Tacoma Housing Authority.

"It's a community," Fiske says. "I just love it here. If I could live here, I would."

For years, former PLU Pastor and founder of the Eastside/Salishan Lutheran Mission Ron Vignec has ministered to that community. He is helped by his wife, Nancy, director of community and supportive service for the Tacoma Housing Authority. Their approach has been to build on the community's strengths, rather than be limited by weaknesses. Ron Vignec modeled the mission he founded in 1985 after his experiences at PLU,

where he was campus pastor from 1980-1985.

PLU aims to send graduates into the world with knowledge and power. Salishan, which he lovingly refers to as "The University of Salishan" intends to send people with self-sufficiency out into the world. "It's the same mission," said Vignec, known throughout Salishan as "Pastor Ron."

Vignec received the President's Medal from PLU this fall for his community service. In addition to providing food

Thuong Do '02 both work at the Family Self-Sufficiency Center while completing their degrees. They appreciate having a chance to offer services to families – and to learn from them.

"PLU provides education. Salishan provides the place to carry what you've learned into the world," Do said.

Her family's Vietnamese heritage and her bilingual skills and cultural understanding are key elements in the work she does. Salishan is home to many Vietnamese, Cambodian and Russian immigrants who live alongside Americans of all races, faiths and ages.

Marks and Do are a great example of how PLU and Salishan – which is derived from a multi-tribe Native American language and means people of many colors coming together – connect people. Raised worlds apart, they are partners in the office who complement one another in their work. Marks is a sociology

major from Arkansas who enjoys studying the human condition. Do is a psychology major whose family emigrated from Vietnam. She enjoys one-on-one interaction.

As Salishan grows and changes in the coming years, PLU intends to play an important role with the community. "The PLU relationship might not have been highly visible, but it has been very meaningful," said Nancy Vignec.

A new program will strengthen that connection. Several students from the spring Trinidad and Tobago study abroad program, which has an important service-learning component, will share a home in Salishan next fall. They will live and work in the community as they continue their PLU studies, an example of the university's mission of educating for lives of service and care.

Those who have already made the connection know it will be rewarding.

"I never knew what was missing until I came to Salishan," Nancy said. S

and shelter, Vignec has fostered life-changing services in the community. From English-as-a-Second-Language classes to the multicultural gatherings held across the "campus," and a beautiful community garden, the community is thriving and improving.

"He has never used a pathology of poverty to solicit support," PLU President Loren J. Anderson said, "but he has instead rebuilt Salishan on community assets, talents and gifts."

Vignec asks people to recognize the individual gifts of others, creating hospitality and openness so everyone is embraced.

Salishan draws many other PLU students as well. Markieta Marks '04 and

Erin Jones had accomplished plenty before she even started at PLU. Raised in the Netherlands, she had a bachelor's degree from Bryn Mawr College, fluency in four languages and a tryout with the WNBA. Her experience included two years substitute teaching and three years teaching at a private school in Indiana.

But she didn't have a teaching degree or certification in Washington. When she was looking to take that step, she found PLU's Alternative Routes to Certification program a perfect fit. It provides a shorter route for experienced people to become teachers. The program is mostly hands on—more teaching, less coursework.

"I couldn't afford schooling without a grant, and I didn't want to start from scratch," Jones said. She got a grant, and didn't miss a beat in her education.

Jones, like each teacher candidate in the program, spends a majority of her time in the classroom, working alongside a trained mentor. She has been working with seventh-grade teacher Justine Johnson at Tacoma's Jason Lee Middle School. Jones said Johnson has been an excellent mentor, and their similar teaching styles make for a seamless working relationship.

"I'm not just getting certification, but a wonderful learning experience," Jones said.

She's one of 44 students enrolled in programs at PLU through a \$2 million grant awarded to a consortia of school

districts and higher education institutions last year by the Professional Educator Standards Board. The board aims to find new ways to recruit quality teachers, especially for spots that are difficult to fill.

PLU's School of Education—as part of a partnership with five local school districts and Green River Community College—hopes to help fill that void. The program isn't simply a "fast track" to certification, but a different route, designed for career changers who bring experience with them into their teacher preparation.

"It really opened the flood gates to people who wanted certification, but didn't want to start back at square one in the classroom," said Lynn Beck, School of Education dean. "A program that is experience-based rather than course-based is quite unique."

The alternative routes are available to:

- Instructional aides or other para-educators with associate's degrees seeking certification in special education or English as a second language.
- Classified school staff with college degrees seeking certification in shortage areas such as math and science.
- People with baccalaureate degrees who are not employed in a school district or who hold emergency substitute certificates.

Jones is in Route III, a program designed for individuals with bachelor's degrees. She was allowed to sub-

stitute teach and teach at a private school in Indiana, but Washington has stricter requirements.

Along with their in-school experience, participants meet every Saturday during the semester to both learn new skills and talk about what they learned from their own classrooms. Students vary in age and job experiences.

"The program is very diverse," Jones said. "It all has given me a different perspective on education." Jones has also been pleased with the training given by PLU teachers.

Nestled in a cozy space along the increasingly busy Garfield Street business district off campus is a treasure of gifts and home items.

From the original, colorful Backsplash pottery by Julie Ueland '79, to traditional Scandinavian Porsgrund china, PLU Northwest and Scandinavian Gift Shop offers authentic, quality gifts and home décor. All the Northwest items are made in the area, from Alaska to Montana, and the Scandinavian items are authentic. While the store has its loyal customers, others have yet to discover it.

A branch of the PLU Bookstore, PLU Northwest opened its doors six years ago.

"We like being out here in the community," said Jeaneen Hamlett, store manager.

Originally located off campus to help with the revitalization of Garfield Street, the store started selling Northwest goods. It didn't want to compete with the longstanding Gloria's Scandinavian gift store a few blocks away, but when Gloria Pederson '42 closed her shop, PLU Northwest branched out.

"We have such a strong Scandinavian heritage, it's fun to be able to offer people some of that," -Hamlett

The store works closely with PLU's Scandinavian Cultural Center to offer traditional items, and SCC members

receive a discount at the store. Alumni also earn a discount.

"We have such a strong Scandinavian heritage, it's fun to be able to offer people some of that," Hamlett said.

The store offers books, cooking supplies, Christmas ornaments (year-round) figurines by Montana's Big Sky Carvers, photographs, artwork, candles and more. There are many one-of-a-kind items, and others that are commonly found in homes with Scandinavian heritage.

Hamlett takes orders over the phone from those who don't live near the store, and some of the Scandinavian items can be special-ordered. Many people stop in to shop when they're visiting campus. Others call to place orders, especially around the holidays when they're looking for a lefse roller (to prepare the traditional Norwegian treat made like a thin potato pancake)


or a Swedish angel Advent candle (whose flames cause the angels to turn and chime).

"Alumni call from Massachusetts, Texas, all over," Hamlett said.

Some items, like Ueland's popular hand-painted tableware, will always be on the shelves. Her colorful mugs, plates, bowls and other dishes – distinctively painted with fish or flowers – are a big seller.

But Hamlett said she's continually looking for ways to expand and enrich the inventory.

"There's something for everyone here," she said.

BEHIND THE MIKE

KPLU's award-winning news and jazz keep station at the top of the industry

AT KPLU

Listen up.

KPLU, the radio station discreetly housed in a corner of the Eastvold Auditorium building, has grown into a broadcast powerhouse, with a loyal and expanding audience tuning in worldwide over the Internet for jazz and news only KPLU provides.

Found at 88.5 FM or www.kplu.org, the station is the region's pre-eminent public radio system, providing National Public Radio programming, local news and real jazz and blues.

"There's an audience for jazz worldwide," Program Director Joey Cohn said.

But it takes a lot of work that listeners never see to provide the high-quality music and news they hear. And the station is looking to the future: digital radio, increasing high-technology equipment and other changes will again alter how KPLU operates.

"Going back to when we really began to develop in 1980, we've been at the forefront of our industry," General Manager Martin Neeb said. "By any measure, we're one of the best jazz stations in the world – and one of the best NPR stations."

Kerry Swanson '89, assistant manager for operations and public media who has spearheaded development of the Internet arm of KPLU, says the station is looking ahead.

"We're not just in the radio business anymore. The Internet for us is beyond our expectations. In the future, KPLU will be more than just a radio station," he said. "It used to seem the early days of radio were the most interesting, but this really is one of the most exciting times in radio. These are the pioneer days."

Station looks hard for melodious, rhythmic 'real jazz'

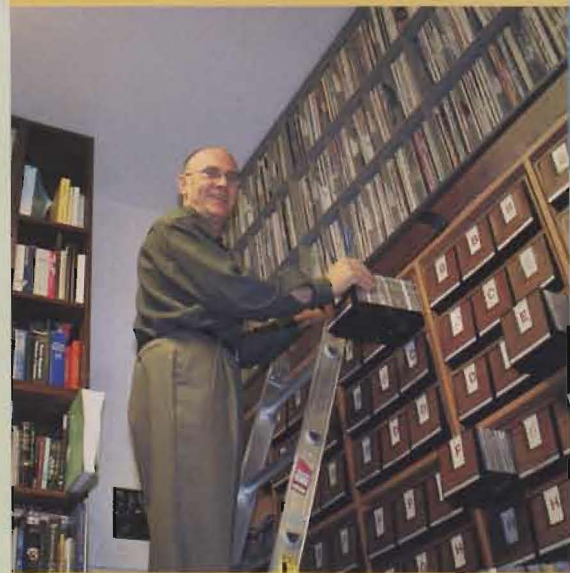
With a unique dual format of news and jazz, the station appeals to different kinds of listeners.

The station undertook a rather unorthodox research project for a public station: it surveyed listeners to see what they want to hear. Managers wanted to find ways to capture the news listeners during jazz hours, and get jazz fans to turn into the talk portion.

"All the other radio stations are one format: country, news, classical..." Neeb said. "We're the only station that has two formats. That makes us special."

The research has shown that jazz and news draw much of the same audience.

KPLU consistently ranks in the top 10 stations in the market, with an average audience of 333,000 people per week. The radio audience has nearly doubled in the last decade.

177,000 people listen to the station online every month, making it one of the highest rated Webcasts. Evidence of its widespread appeal: KPLU receives donations from every state and eight foreign countries.

The station has several translators that allow it to be heard throughout Western Washington, and even on the Oregon Coast. Public radio stations are allowed wider coverage areas than commercial stations.

General Manager Martin Neeb has been with the station since before it was affiliated with NPR or played only jazz.

Among the awards the station has won are the Marconi Award of Excellence from the National Association of Broadcasters. It was the first time a public radio station received the national award. Other honors include Gavin Awards for the Top Jazz Station in the country four times. Program Director Joey Cohn has twice been named Gavin's Jazz Radio Person of the Year, and the American Marketing Association named General Manager Martin Neeb to the Media Hall of Fame as the Radio Person of the Year.

The news department won a national Edward R. Murrow journalism award for a documentary by reporter Keith Seinfeld on the controversial Makah Whale Hunt. The station consistently wins regional journalism awards for its news coverage.

KPLU started as a tiny station in 1966 broadcast only to PLU and Parkland. The station expanded to more of Pierce County in 1972 but really took off in 1980, when it acquired a new tower allowing it to broadcast at 100,000 watts. Moving the transmitter to Tiger Mountain outside Issaquah, Wash., in 1989 expanded the coverage area even more. It became an NPR station in 1983 and changed its format from classical to jazz the same year.

"It has worked," Music Director Nick Morrison said. "We have seen greater crossover from news into jazz."

KPLU has an international audience of fans who tune in for the "real jazz" the station plays. The station's play list includes authentic, acoustic and improvisational jazz.

"Our focus is for the jazz to sound melodic," Cohn said.

A lot of work goes into selecting the music, and KPLU keeps the standard hits playing while being at the forefront of finding new talent.

"We have a new music rotation, so you'll hear a certain number of new songs throughout the day," Morrison said.

Morrison, sometimes with the help of Cohn and other hosts, goes through hundreds of CDs. He estimates he receives 30-50 every week from artists and record companies, and he gives each at least a listen, hoping to hear distinctive music.

"Sometimes it doesn't take very long to say, 'This doesn't work,'" he said. "We're lucky to get one really great CD a month. But sometimes we find the gems."

That was what happened with Norah Jones, a jazz singer gaining popularity on pop and rock stations. Morrison heard a track of hers on someone else's CD and was impressed.

"We were playing Norah Jones before her CD came out," Morrison said.

The same was true for the up-and-coming Karrin Allyson. And several years ago, Cohn suggested to the owner of the popular Dimitriou's Jazz Alley in downtown Seattle that he bring a newcomer named Harry Connick Jr. to his club. Today, Connick is a top-selling artist and an actor.

"I think we had a lot to do with the growth of their audiences," Cohn said. "We were instrumental in the success of many artists."

News department offers in-depth perspective on issues

The news department came into its own in the 1990s and now has one of the largest reporting staffs of any NPR station. Its state-of-the-art Northwest News Center opened in downtown Seattle last year.

In public radio, a staff of five in the news department is considered large, and KPLU has had a bigger news staff than that for years. The reporters cover regional news, putting together stories for the morning and afternoon news shows. KPLU also airs regular NPR programs like "All Things Considered" and "Car Talk."

"When I started here 15 years ago, we had one full-time reporter," said Morning Edition host Dave Meyer said.

Research also helped the news department determine what kind of stories people wanted to hear.

"It showed us now much people really do want local news," News Director Erin Hennessey said. "Their interests were very much in line with our coverage areas: education, the environment, health and science, law and justice, business and labor and the arts."

"They care about their communities and they want a radio station that cares as well and is keeping tabs on it," she said.

Hennessey said KPLU focuses on issue-driven stories of regional interest, in addition to event-driven news.

"We have the ability to explore stories in-depth, to look at the bigger issues," she said. "Because we have more time on air, our coverage has more in common with newspapers than with commercial radio."

News stories that might run 30-45 seconds on another station get twice that much time on KPLU. And features can run several minutes. Listeners get the benefit of hearing NPR stories on the air, and KPLU sends stories to NPR. That means KPLU and its reporters receive a national audience - and that Northwest stories find their way into the homes and cars of people all over the country.

"We really take the broadcasts and our own stories seriously," Hennessey said. "Everyone in this newsroom is just really committed to news that provides context

and perspective. We don't just do who, what, where," she said, quoting the quintessential journalism questions. "We really get to spend more time on the why."

KPLU has formed partnerships with other non-competing media for in-depth projects. The station is currently working with KCTS Channel 9 on a long-term series examining education reform in Washington called "The Learning Curve." In the past, KPLU reporters worked with the Seattle Times and public broadcasting on a civic journalism project on politics and growth, and last year put together a criminal justice series with The News Tribune of Tacoma and KCTS called, "A Duty To Protect," examining what can be done to protect the community from dangerous parolees.

Such projects allow the station to share resources and information, to promote each other and to reach larger and different audiences.

"It's really satisfying to do this kind of work, and we hope it translates into useful information and good storytelling for the listeners," Hennessey said.

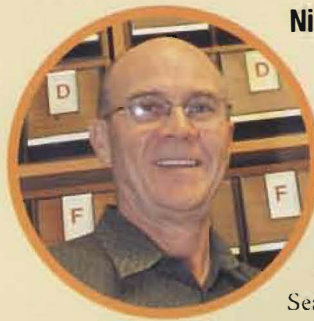

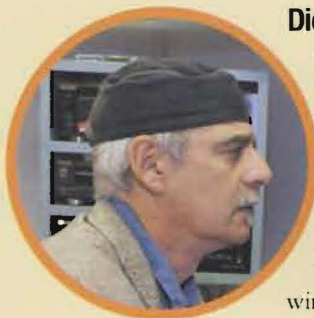

Public radio requires public support

In order to do all this, the station depends on support from listeners. KPLU runs on a \$4 million annual budget, with \$3.5 million coming from the community. Of that, \$2.3 million came directly from listeners this year, and \$1.2 million from underwriting – support from corporate donors. Regular fund drives, in which donors are urged over the air to give during dedicated weeks, bring in many of the dollars, and special events – like the popular Jazz Cruises on Puget Sound – make up the rest of the budget.

Thousands of people sail on the brunch cruises, now in their 12th year, to hear live music from performers like Greta Matassa and Pearl Django.

University and station support each other

While PLU holds the license for the radio station and all KPLU staff members are also university employees, the station operates nearly independently. PLU supports the station with infrastructure, allowing it to operate without any daily overhead, but the station is otherwise self-supporting.


“The infrastructure is provided by the university, and that is a great gift,” Neeb said.

Both entities have signed an editorial integrity statement, so the station holds authority over what it broadcasts and how it portrays stories, without interference from the university.

KPLU also has a commitment to PLU students, and has employed dozens over the years. The station has become home to several PLU alums and has helped launch the broadcast careers of many PLU graduates. Years ago, Cohn started an overnight shift for a student that continues today.

Assistant Station Manager Swanson started work at KPLU as a student in 1985 and worked his way up the ranks over the years. He serves as adviser to the student station KCCR/K103, and has recruited talent from there to KPLU. Other graduates who stayed on at KPLU include evening jazz host Abe Beeson '93 and Craig Coover '00, who manages Web resources.

Other successful KPLU alums include Kevin Ebi '95, business editor at KIRO in Seattle; Dale Comer '02, who is an assistant producer for Jones Radio Network, which produces the syndicated evening “Delilah” show; Stephen Kilbreath '92, who is on the air at KUBE in Seattle; Greg Schieferstein '88, news director of Evening Post Television, KPAX-TV in Missoula, Mont.; and Adrienne Wilson '99, a Morning Edition host for an NPR station in Wichita. David Christian '59 worked as chief engineer at PLU for more than 40 years before his recent retirement and was instrumental in the founding and expansion of KPLU.

The university believes KPLU is a huge benefit. “We’re proud that KPLU is an integral part of the university,” President Loren J. Anderson said. “It showcases for the entire region our commitment to quality, excellence and lifelong education and our dedication to community service.”

Trainer Gary Nicholson worked with the pros but prefers the Lutes

For Gary Nicholson, there have been a lot of years and thousands of rolls of tape between Chicago Cubs shortstop Ernie Banks and PLU shortstop Chris Ullom.

Nicholson, PLU's longtime athletic trainer, has been taping ankles and setting broken bones—and teaching how to tape ankles and set broken bones—since coming on board on a part-time basis in 1973.

Athletes, and the athletics program, are better for his involvement.

“Few people, in my experience, better exemplify the meaning of true servant,” says Dr. Paul Hoseth, athletic director and dean of the School of Physical Education.

Ironically, Nicholson never intended to be an athletic trainer. Growing up in the small southern Idaho town of Jerome, he dreamed of a career in medical law. He attended College of Idaho (now Albertson College) in Caldwell as a pre-law major who also happened to be a center on the basketball team.

“My second year there (the coaches)

brought in a bigger and better player,” recalls Nicholson. In fact, that bigger and better player was a scoring wonder named Taft Jackson, who set a school record by averaging 33 points per game. Nicholson was left with a couple of options. Either learn how to handle the ball better as a forward, or become the team's athletic trainer, which the school didn't have.

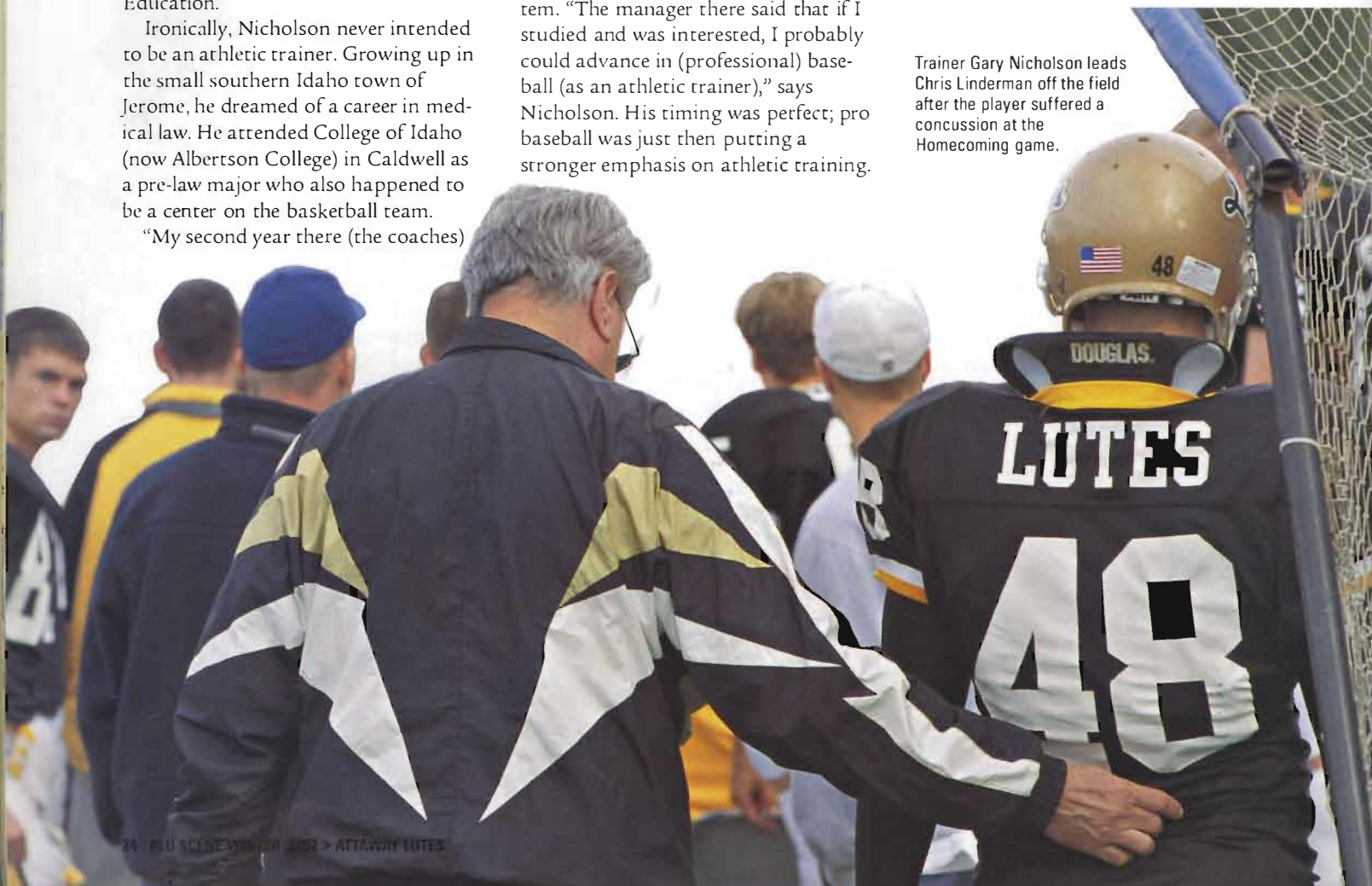
The latter option was presented only because Nicholson had been taking some medical-related classes as part of his emphasis in medical law. He decided to take the first step down the path that led him through major league baseball and eventually to PLU.

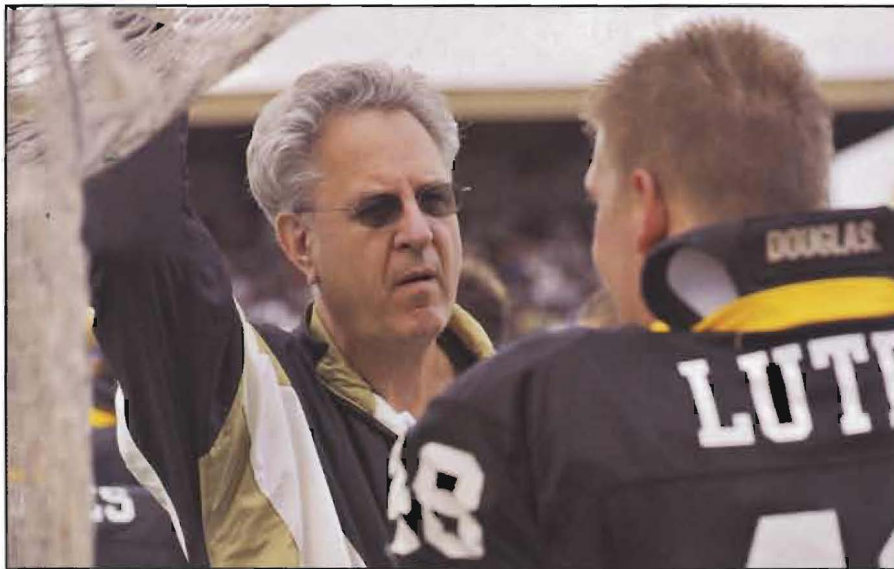
During the summer months between his final two years at College of Idaho, Nicholson hooked on as athletic trainer for the Caldwell Cubs, a rookie league team in the Chicago Cubs' system. “The manager there said that if I studied and was interested, I probably could advance in (professional) baseball (as an athletic trainer),” says Nicholson. His timing was perfect; pro baseball was just then putting a stronger emphasis on athletic training.

Nicholson pursued his new dream in graduate school at Indiana University, then the only school in the country offering a master's degree in athletic training. At Indiana he worked with a Rose Bowl football team, a top-ranked men's soccer team, and a swimming team that included seven-time Olympic gold medalist Mark Spitz.

After graduation, Nicholson's connection with the Chicago Cubs paid off in a position with the team's Class AAA minor league team in Tacoma. Not only was the newly married 23-year-old responsible for the health and well-being of the Cubs' top-level minor league players, he was placed in charge of all of Chicago's minor league trainers and of the Cubs' players at winter instructional league in Arizona. He became the assistant athletic trainer for the Cubs three years later. A year after

that, in 1972, he was the head trainer.

This was the Cubs team of shortstop and later first baseman Ernie Banks (he of the famous "It's a great day to play two" line), slugging third baseman Ron Santo, hitter extraordinaire and outfielder Billy Williams and feisty manager Leo "The Lip" Durocher.

That summer of 1973, Nicholson served as the athletic trainer for the National League All-Star team, managed by Sparky Anderson. Among the players he worked with were home run champion Hank Aaron from Atlanta, Cincinnati Reds legends Johnny Bench and Pete Rose, New York Mets pitching ace Tom Seaver and San Francisco Giants slugger Willie McCovey.

Nicholson eventually moved back to the Pacific Northwest as trainer for the fledgling Seattle Mariners, where he stayed until 1982. While with Seattle, he served as the American League's athletic trainer for the 1979 All-Star game at the Kingdome, earning the distinction as the only person to serve as head athletic trainer for both leagues in the "mid-summer classic."

His life in baseball gave Nicholson an opportunity to meet baseball stars, two presidents (Richard Nixon and Gerald Ford), and a smattering of movie stars such as Jonathan Winters, Dean Martin and Frank Sinatra. For the first 10 years of their marriage, however, Gary and his wife, Laura, lived in 23 different houses or apartments as they traveled from one location to another for Gary's work. As the season started, there were

weeks in the Arizona desert for spring training, followed by long months in either Chicago or Seattle, then trips back to Arizona for winter instructional baseball.

Add in the long days on the road, including an 18-day road trip with the Mariners that he recalls ruefully, and Nicholson saw the need for a more stable life. "With the kids in school, you just weren't able to be involved in their activities," he says. Besides, "baseball was changing and going a direction I wasn't enjoying with the high-priced players."

When given a chance to become the full-time trainer at PLU, where he had worked from 1973 through 1982 during the baseball off-season, Nicholson jumped at the opportunity.

In addition to doing the hands-on work of an athletic trainer, Nicholson started an athletic training specialization. Though the specialization no longer exists, the victim of the squeeze between National Athletic Trainers Association regulations and the school's budget, 51 students graduated

from the program. Many of those graduates work in college or high school athletic departments. Devin Dice '89 works on the professional rodeo tour. One graduate who stayed close to home is Jen (Thompson '98 '99) Thomas, now assistant athletic director and assistant athletic trainer at PLU. She has been associated with Nicholson for nine years, first as a student, now as his assistant.

"He helped foster my interest in athletic training as a potential career," says Thomas. "I really enjoyed the injury prevention class that he was teaching." That led to her working in the athletic training room starting as a sophomore. Other than a brief time at Puyallup High School, Thomas has been a fixture at PLU. "We had one of the best programs in the conference in terms of being able to have hands-on experience and have him help us," says Thomas. "We were allowed to actually experience doing things and figure it out along the way, and Gary was there with guidance."

Nicholson also started a weekly sports medicine clinic in 1973, with doctors evaluating student athletes and their injuries. The doctors help at PLU football games and at other championship events as needed. The program started with Dr. Stan Mueller, Dr. Dale Hirz, Dr. Art Ozolin and Dr. Wouter Bousch. In the intervening years, Dr. Steve Teeny and Dr. Peter Krumins have stepped in.

Hoseth says Nicholson's role goes well beyond his title. "Beyond the expected work of athletic trainer and teacher, Gary is constantly looking for ways to help make this place better. No task is too small. My greatest fear is that at some point Gary will retire. His contributions, on many fronts and for decades, have been immeasurable."

While Nicholson has given a lot to PLU, he appreciates what he gets in return.

"In the college setting, you influence kids more than you do in the pros. A lot of these players will come back and see you at alumni games or Homecoming, or they may phone or email wanting information about something," says Nicholson. "You would not see that in professional sports. Part of you goes with the student when they leave." □

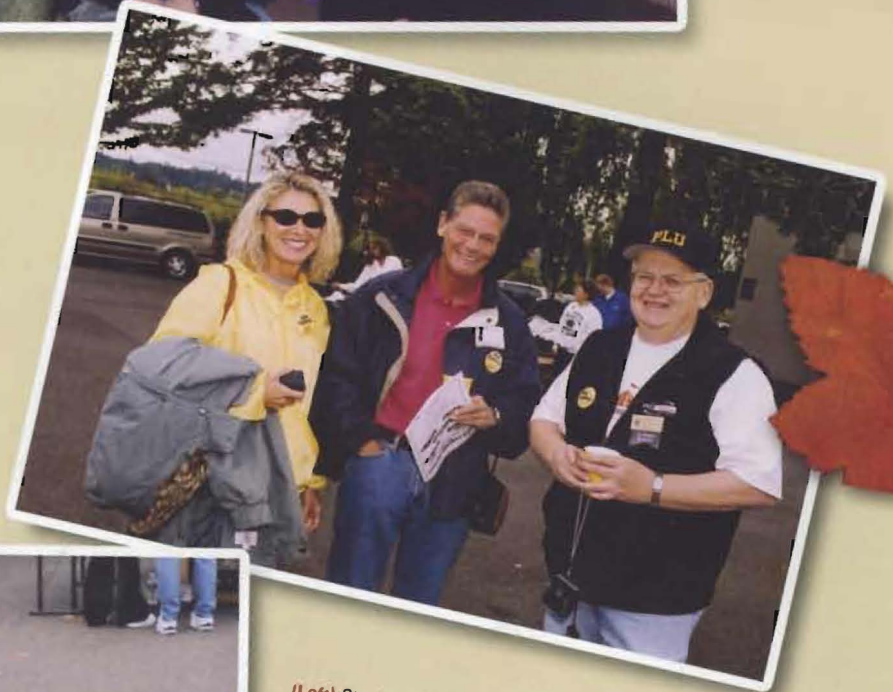

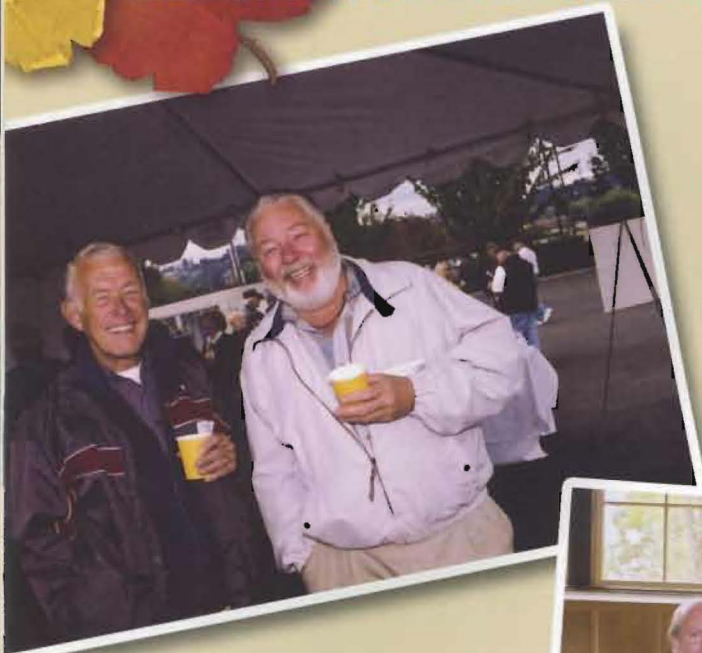

Teacher uses Fulbright to bring South African experience home

Spanaway Lake High School social studies and English teacher Meredith Barnes '97 proves that studying abroad doesn't end after college. Her interest in civil disobedience took her all the way to the other side of the world.

Barnes was selected as a Fulbright-Hays recipient to journey to South Africa last summer. The prestigious Fulbright-Hays Seminars Abroad Program provides short-term study and travel seminars for social sciences and humanities educators. Barnes, along with 15 teachers and professors from around the United States, spent August studying in South Africa, focusing primarily on that country's indigenous tribes.

"It was a dream come true," Barnes said. "There's no better way to get the sense of South African culture, tradition and history than actually being there."

Barnes learned up close about indige-

nous cultures in South Africa and their role in community life. Studying both the spiritual and material aspects of the society, she gained understanding of the complex relationships between the two.

Barnes interacted with South African artists, traditional medical practitioners, educators and scientists who work toward raising the social value and status of indigenous knowledge and its integration into modern society.

"Our society doesn't realize how much we can learn from indigenous cultures," Barnes said. "I learned several skills I can use as a teacher."

Barnes also focused on the history of passive resistance. South Africa was her first choice for study, mainly because of her interest in Mahatma Gandhi and Nelson Mandela. Mandela was jailed for 26 years for his resistance movements against apartheid, and Gandhi spent more than 20 years fighting for Indians in South Africa.

Barnes visited the Phoenix settlement in Durban where Gandhi lived and Robben Island in Cape Town, where Mandela was locked up for 18 years. Another personal highlight was meeting Albie Sachs, a justice on South Africa's new constitutional court and a white anti-apartheid activist who was permanently injured in a car bomb attack in 1988.

"The experience in South Africa gave us a greater sense and appreciation of who we are as Americans," Barnes said.

This term, she is interning for the Washington Education Association. She has made presentations to teachers about indigenous cultures and created curriculum on South Africa for the Educational Resources Information Center (ERIC), the world's largest database of education information. Barnes plans to teach about apartheid, non-violent resistance, and post-apartheid South Africa, when she returns to the classroom in January. [S](#)

Teen graduate took the fast track through law school

Nathan Schlicher '00 had a great college experience at PLU: He enjoyed residence hall life in Stuen Hall, played intramural sports, met his girlfriend his freshman year, attended Homecoming dances and worked as a telemarketer seeking donations from alumni.

He finished college - with a double major in biology and political science - in only three years. By then, he was only 17, believed to be PLU's youngest graduate.

Now 19 - an age when many college students are just settling on a major, Schlicher has a law degree from the University of Washington, a job with a downtown Seattle firm, and he's on his way toward a medical degree. Schlicher was the law school's youngest graduate and the first student ever to complete his courses in two years rather than the standard three-year course.

"I just skipped four grades along the way," he said modestly when explaining his accelerated academic course. "I'd catch up to my class, then get a little bit ahead. I do work hard, but things do come a little easier to me."

He says his memory allows him to remember things, even if he's only heard or seen them once or twice. That makes learning - and retention of that knowledge - much simpler.

While he was still in elementary school in Silverdale, Wash., Schlicher would walk up the hill to Ridgetop Junior High School for certain courses. He graduated from Central Kitsap High School in 1997 at age 14.

"It always seemed normal to me, but in retrospect, it is a little weird," he said with a smile.

Unlike many others with his advanced learning capabilities, he didn't skip high school altogether.

"I went to high school, the senior prom, PLU dances," he said. "I did all those things so I didn't lose any social growth and development."

He admits some people found him an oddity when he appeared at college at age 14, but he never really had any problems. Clearly bright and driven, Schlicher is also personable, friendly, articulate and funny. He possesses maturity beyond his years but doesn't have any superior air about him.

"I always had fun with people who tried to make a point of it," he said.

While researching colleges, Schlicher was drawn to PLU, where his mom, Carol '75 earned her nursing degree. He wanted a smaller school, and one where he could live on-campus and enjoy a traditional college life. Some colleges place restrictions on where younger

students can live or group them together.

He enjoyed reaching out to the PLU community. "It's a close-knit group - it's a family," he said.

After PLU, Schlicher went on to the more competitive atmosphere of law school. It took some persuasion, but his hard work and high marks convinced administrators there that he could handle a fast track through law school. Schlicher is an associate at Johnson, Graffe, Key & Moniz, a firm that specializes in medical malpractice defense. He's been working there three years and though he spends 26 hours a week in class, and hours more studying, he plans to keep working part-time at the firm throughout

medical school, also at the UW. Completing this part of his education will take the next four years, followed by a medical residency - it's one part of school he doesn't plan to speed up.

"But I do find time to do something other than study," he said. Most of his spare time is spent with his girlfriend, Shonda Hoyt '01, a teacher in the Auburn School District.

He hopes someday to work in an emergency room or have a family practice and represent doctors in malpractice cases at the same time.

Schlicher cautions he's not an expert on everything. Writing doesn't come as easily to him as math and science, he said.

Lifetime Giving Society (L)

Lifetime giving includes the total recorded gifts and current pledges of cash, securities, real estate and appreciated property, and includes the charitable value of irrevocable planned gifts. These totals do not include revocable deferred gifts or gifts to KPLU.

Heritage Society (H)

Heritage Society is a group of donors committed to securing PLU's future by making provisions for the university in their estate plans. The most common estate gift involves donating a portion of estate proceeds to PLU as part of a will. By using current assets to establish a charitable trust or gift annuity, donors can receive an income stream for the remainder of their lives, with the remaining trust assets going to PLU upon their deaths.

Q Club (Q)

With a minimum contribution of \$300 annually (student giving levels begin at \$60 a year), one can join this gathering of dedicated friends whose mission is to provide assistance to deserving students as they prepare for lives of service through a Pacific Lutheran University education. Q Club is the "giving club" of PLU's annual fund, and the more than 2,000 members provide the core of scholarship support.

Matching Gift Program (M)

The Matching Gift Program recognizes companies and foundations that have contributed to PLU by matching the gifts of their employees. This support is either designated to a particular fund identified by the employee or given to the unrestricted fund.

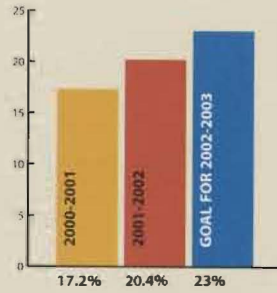

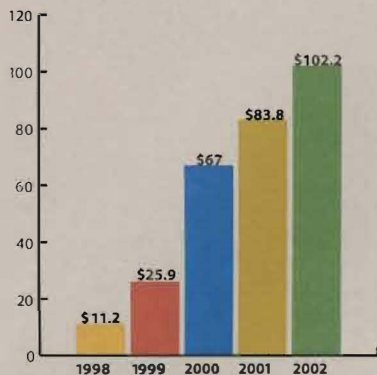

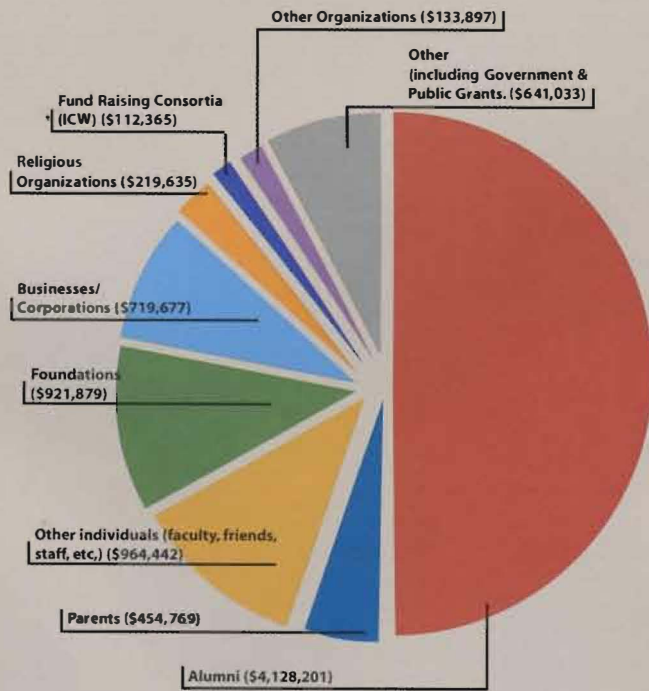

The couple provides constant support to the PLU community and in their own Federal Way community, where they have opened their home to troubled teens and exchange students.

Now, they are arts supporters who envision the Gintz Family Theatre in the new Eastvold Auditorium. As primary donors, the family will see their vision become a reality when the Eastvold remodel is complete. This will be the first time that a "black box" style theatre of this caliber will be available to the program and a meaningful contribution to the future for students at the university.

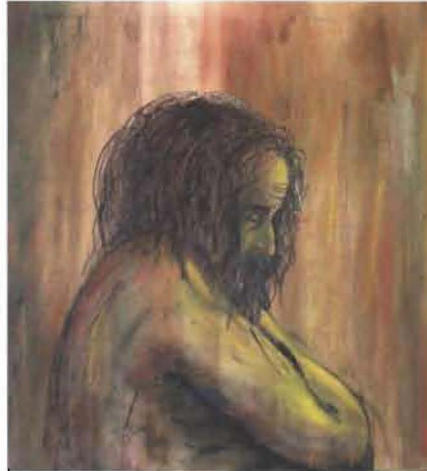

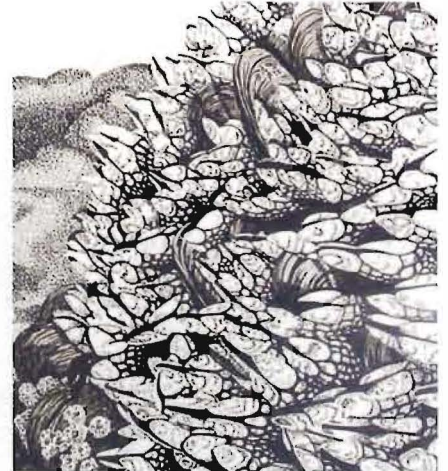

exercises and peak performance principles she uses with the team and as a consultant to corporations.

Here is just one of them:

COLLEEN'S TEAM-BUILDING EXERCISES

Wrong-Way Wiffle Ball

Objective

To layer peak performance strategies into everything the players do, including training sessions and competitive games. As a sport psychology consultant, I provide outlines of principles and techniques to the players as a group and then follow up with the athletes individually.

I advise players about a three-part reframing process they can use after failing or making errors, which is termed the three I's: Fudge, Fix and Focus.

1. Fudge: When there is an error, the player first reacts with, "Oh, that's a bummer!" Or maybe she says the word "fudge." It never feels good to make an error, so the first thing the player needs to do is to acknowledge it emotionally.

2. Fix: Often, the first emotionally based reaction is an automatic response, usually anger, frustration, disappointment or fear. But a player can't let herself get stuck in that emotional phase. The next step, which requires thought, practice and effort, is to progress forward to task-oriented thinking. The athlete learns to ask herself: What was the error? What should I have done? What can I do now? This is rational analysis.

3. Focus: There are only three points in time for an athlete: past, present and future. Wherever you focus, that's where your energy goes. Does it do any good to focus in the past or in the future? No. The focus must be in the here and now. So the final step is the combination of a focus or cue word to bring the person back to the immediate performance. The focus should be on this play, this moment. It's right-now thinking and awareness. That's where maximum control is for

athletes: Right now!

Here's a concrete illustration you can use to show your group how this process works in reality. Perhaps a player missed a shot on what clearly should have been a goal-scoring opportunity. Of course that's disappointing. Of course the player made an upsetting mistake and so her first reaction is to acknowledge it and take responsibility for it. So the fudge portion becomes, "Doggone it, I blew it." But very quickly the player has to analyze the reason for the error and attempt to fix it. In this case, she may say, "I have to keep my head down and knee over the ball

longer. That will help keep my shot low and on the goal frame." Then, the final step is to focus on the present. Focus on this play, this moment and this particular game responsibility. Players can't perform when their attention is focused on the past or the future. So the player now focuses on hustling back to the proper defensive position to try to win the goal kick being sent by the keeper.

Wrong-way Wiffle ball is an exercise that will have your team dealing with and learning from failure while also having a lot of fun.

Equipment

Wiffle bat, Wiffle ball, and four bases.

Number of Players

Two teams of 6 to 10 players.

Space

Large enough for a small-to medium-size softball field.

The Game

Most softball rules apply, although the game is played backward. In each inning, everyone on the team bats once. The other team is in the field. People pitch to their own team. You must bat on your nondominant side (that is, lefties bat righty and vice versa). Batters run the opposite way, to third instead of first, and continue around the bases in that direction. You can accumulate people on bases, that is, more than one player on a base at a time. A fly ball is an out. A ground ball must be touched by everyone on the fielding team before they try to get the opposing player out. In other words, if the ball is hit toward the third base, everyone on the team would run to that spot. The ball would then be fielded and touched by everyone on the team before the attempt to get the runner out. You may only throw the ball with your nondominant arm. Runners may keep going around the bases until they are stopped at one or are tagged out. You may round the bases as many times as you can. The team that scores the most runs wins the game. Adjust the number of innings played to the interest of your players and the time available.

Lesson

This game is fraught with failure: Runners forget to run or they run the wrong way. Fielders forget to touch the ball or they throw it to the wrong base with the wrong arm. But as the game goes on, players learn from their mistakes and they improve. The lesson? If you're demoralized, you're done. If you stick with it, failure can eventually breed success. [5]

Catch Them Being Good: Soccer coach, professor and motivator Colleen Hacker offers keys to success in new book

The Women's U.S. National Soccer team is credited with re-energizing women's soccer and raising interest in the game.

And much of the credit for the success of the team goes to PLU's Colleen Hacker, who has served as the team's sport psychology consultant since 1996. Hacker, assistant dean of the School of Physical Education, professor, the winningest women's soccer coach in NAIA history and an internationally recognized authority of peak

performance and team building, helped motivate and build confidence among teammates. She offers tips for others in a new book, "Catch Them Being Good," written with head coach Tony DiCicco and the assistance of writer Charles Salzberg.

Though the book is aimed at learning to successfully coach girls, Hacker – who coached the Lutes to five consecutive national championships and three titles and is now one of the assistant coaches of the national team – said it's

accessible and useful for anyone.

"These are really principles for success in life," she said. "They transcend sport, they transcend gender. They are techniques that can be used in coaching, in your family life, your personal relationships and in the workplace."

The book includes real-life stories of working with soccer greats including Mia Hamm and Michelle Akers, and Hacker offers several team-building
