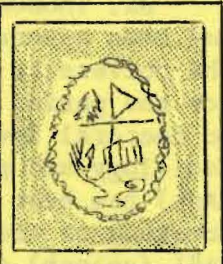

The second series of pre-registration sessions will be conducted by the Registrar and Admissions offices this week end in Seattle and Spokane.

A total of 95 high school seniors will pre-register in Seattle Friday and Saturday at the Americana Motor Hotel while another 24 will register Saturday at the Davenport Hotel in Spokane. Some 16 faculty members will assist in the program.

This will bring the number of freshmen pre-registered to 269, more than 100 over last year's 165 total.
