Workers dive into pool repairs

Rehabilitation of the pool is going swimmingly and it should be open by Oct. 21, according to Dave Wehmhoefer, capital projects manager. Workers began an aesthetic upgrade of the building -- painting and so forth -- in August, but found much more serious damage to the main structural supports of the building due to leakage and condensation. Those repairs, as well as painting of the exterior, should be done by the end of October. During Christmas break, the interior walls and the pool will be repainted and restained. If there are contingency funds left over, Wehmhoefer says, the locker rooms may be upgraded.
