## GENERAL REGISTRATION DIRECTIONS

## A NEW FEATURE BEING INTRODUCED WITH THIS REGISTRATION IS THE SYSTEM CODE NUMBER. THIS NUMBER WILL ENABLE THE REGISTRAR'S OFFICE TO PROCESS YOUR REGISTRATION MORE QUICKLY. YOU MUST INDICATE THIS NUMBER FOR EACH COURSE REGISTRATION.

1. All students currently in school who plan to register for the following semester (summer excepted) should register by Advance Registration.
2. Full-time new and re-entry students may advance register if a clearance has been received from admissions. Part-time students are encouraged to advance register.
3. SELECTIVE SERVICE-ATTENTION ALL MALE STUDENTS

If you want your local draft board notified of your full-time enrollment ( $2 \frac{1}{2}$ courses) at P.L.U., it is your responsibility to complete a form in the Registrar's Office. This is normally done only once a year.
4. V. A. BENEFITS

If you expect to receive any type of veteran or war orphan benefits, you must file your certificate of eligibility in the Registrar's Office. Forms and information concerning veteran benefits are available in the Registrar's Office. Make application when registering. A student must be registered for 3 courses to be eligible for full-time V.A. Benefits.
5. Obtain your registration materials at the Registrar's Office.
6. Obtain an appointment with your adviser. DO THIS IMMEDIATELY.
7. Print with a BLACK LEAD PENCIL on your official program.
A. Fill in all personal information including your Social Security Number. If you do not have a Social Security Number, you must secure one prior to registering.
B. Indicate SYSTEM CODE NUMBER for each course registration.
C. Print an " $A$ " before audit courses, " $R$ " before repeat courses, and " $P$ - $F$ " before pass-fail courses, in the column provided.
D. Check to be certain that you have the pre-requisites, as indicated in the University Catalog, for each course you select.
E. List alternate courses which can be substituted if courses on your original schedule are closed. The listing of alternate courses may prevent a change of registration in the fall.
F. Obtain permission signatures where needed as irdicated in the schedule.
G. Obtain the signature of your adviser if you are a full-time ( $21 / 2$ courses) student.

## ADVANCE REGISTRATION ONLY

A. Leave your registration materials in the Registrar's Office.

NOTE: YOU MUST INCLUDE YOUR \$75.00 ADVANCE PAYMENT CARD IOBTAINED AT THE BUSINESS OFFICE) IN YOUR YELLOW REGISTRATION ENVELOPE. REGISTRATIONS RECEIVED WITHOUT THIS CARD WILL NOT BE PROCESSED.
B. Advance registration for Fall will be processed by class in the order they are received with seniors first, then juniors, sophomores, and freshmen. Every effort is made to comply with your requests. If a course is closed, an approved alternate will be substituted.
C. You will be mailed a statement of charges including the fee payment deadline, a copy of your scheduled classes, additional instructions, and cards.
D. Return your payment and the other information requested to the P.L.U. Business Office by the due date indicated.

## IN PERSON REGISTRATION

A. Obtain the necessary cards at the Registrar's Office.
B. Complete all cards. Obtain adviser's approval if full-time (see " $G$ " above).
C. Report to the Registrar's Office to be scheduled.
D. As soon as you are scheduled and receive a copy of your program, report to the Business Office to pay your fees.

## INDEPENDENT STUDY REGISTRATION

A special independent study registration card must be submitted to the Registrar's Office with each independent study registration. These cards may be obtained at the Registrar's Office.

## PASS-FAIL OPTION for UNDERGRADUATE STUDENTS

The pass-fail option is offered so that undergraduate students will explore subject areas outside those of their known abilities in their lower division years, or to add a broader range of courses to their upper division program without forcing them to compete with majors who are specializing in those areas of study.

1. The pass-fail option is limited to a total of four courses and is limited to no more than two courses per calendar year.
2. Courses required for graduation in any degree program of the University will not be taken on a pass-fail basis. Similarly, courses needed in the student's major field, except when a first course has been taken prior to declaration of a major, will not be taken on a pass-fail basis.
3. Pass-fail grades will not alter the gpa, but credits earned will count toward graduation.
4. The pass-fail option must be indicated on the registration card by the adviser. A change in the decision regarding pass-fail will be subject to the established regulations concerning change of registration.
5. Pass-fail students will be responsible for all course work and examinations. Only " $P$ " and " $F$ " grades will be issued and recorded on the transcript.
6. An entire course will not be converted to the pass-fail basis by student vote.
7. The " $P$ " (Pass) grade will be equivalent to a grade of " $A$ ". " $B$ ", " $C$ ", or " $D$ ".

## CHANGE OF REGISTRATION, WITHDRAWALS

Any addition or withdrawal from a course must be made in the Registrar's Office. Changes in registration due to conflicts or errors in registration may be made without charge during the first week of the semester. To withdraw from a class and/or add a class, the following procedure is to be followed:

1. Obtain the change of registration form from the Registrar
2. Obtain the necessary signature and, if applicable, a withdrawal grade.
3. If after the first week, pay the $\$ 5.00$ change of registration fee at the Business Office.

## 4. Return the change of registration form to the Registrar

The student is responsible for completing the above steps within one week after obtaining the change card.
Students withdrawing officially from a class after the third week of a semester will receive either a "WP" (withdrawal passing) or "WE" (withdrawal failing).

An unofficial withdrawal from a course will be recorded as "E".
Certain General University Requirements (see page 43 of the University Catalog) must be completed by specified times during any student's degree program, and withdrawal from courses meeting such a requirement is not allowed if this would preclude meeting the requirement on schedule.

## STUDENT MOTOR VEHICLE REGULATIONS

## GENERAL INFORMATION:

Each student must complete a vehicle registration card, whether or not he is registering a vehicle.

The University suggests to all students that there is normally no requirement for on-campus students to maintain private vehicles while in attendance at Pacific Lutheran University. However, in case you are working or living off campus or if there is other special need for a vehicle, strict compliance with the following regulations will be enforced.

## REGISTRATION OF VEHICLES:

All students who bring cars or other motorized vehicles to the campus must register them with the Security Office. Fill out the automobile registration form in your packet and return it with the registration forms. Any unregistered vehicle on campus property is subject to "tow away"; the tow away fee is payable by the owner of the vehicle.

Pick up your decal at the Security Office during the week of September 7 - 11. Temporary decals may be acquired in the Security Office for replacement vehicles, loaners, etc., without charge. During registration week there will be a period of grace so students will have proper time to register vehicles. This is done in order to save embarrassment or loss of revenue to the student.
