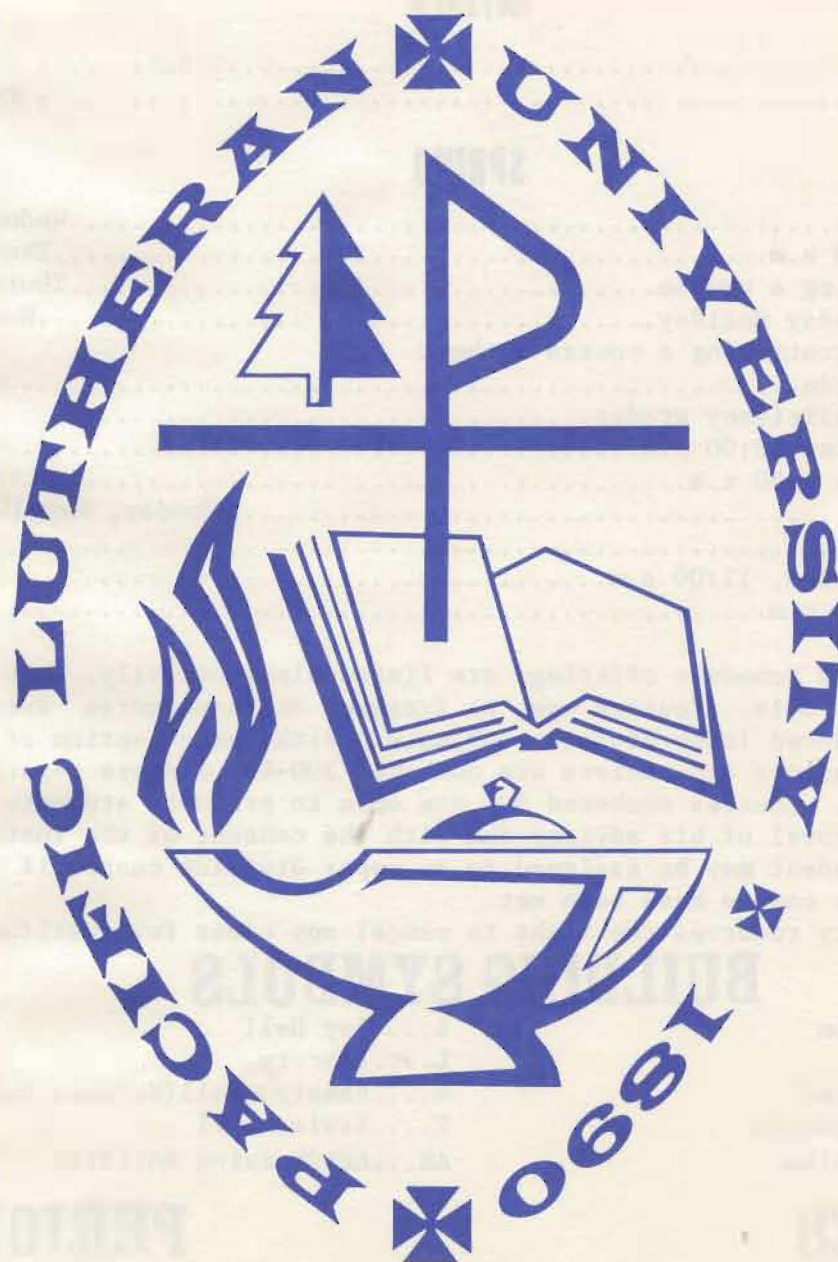

GENERAL REGISTRATION DIRECTIONS

PLEASE INDICATE THE SYSTEM CODE NUMBER FOR EACH COURSE REGISTRATION.

1. All students currently in school who plan to register for the following semester (summer excepted) should register by Advance Registration.
2. Full-time new and re-entry students may advance register if a clearance has been received from admissions. **Part-time students are encouraged to advance register.**
3. **SELECTIVE SERVICE—ATTENTION ALL MALE STUDENTS**
If you want your local draft board notified of your full-time enrollment (2½ courses) at P.L.U., it is your responsibility to complete a form in the Registrar's Office. *This is normally done only once a year.*
4. **V.A. BENEFITS**
If you expect to receive any type of veteran or war orphan benefits, you must file your certificate of eligibility in the Registrar's Office. Forms and information concerning veteran benefits are available in the Registrar's Office. Make application when registering. A student must be registered for 3 courses to be eligible for full-time V.A. Benefits.
5. Obtain your registration materials at the Registrar's Office.
6. Obtain an appointment with your adviser. **DO THIS IMMEDIATELY.**
7. Print with a **BLACK LEAD PENCIL** on your official program.
 - A. Fill in all personal information including your Social Security Number. If you do not have a Social Security Number, you must secure one prior to registering.
 - B. Indicate *SYSTEM CODE NUMBER* for each course registration.
 - C. Print an "A" before audit courses, "R" before repeat courses.
 - D. Check to be certain that you have the pre-requisites, as indicated in the University Catalog, for each course you select.
 - E. *LIST ALTERNATE COURSES* which can be substituted if courses on your original schedule are closed. The listing of alternate courses may prevent a change of registration later.
 - F. Obtain the signature of your adviser if you are a full-time (2½ courses) student.

ADVANCE REGISTRATION ONLY

- A. Leave your registration materials in the Registrar's Office.
- B. Advance registration will be processed by class in the order they are received with seniors first, then juniors, sophomores, and freshmen. Every effort is made to comply with your requests. If a course is closed, an approved alternate will be substituted. **Note:** Seniors will receive priority in interim courses for the first week of registration only.
- C. You will be mailed a statement of charges including the fee payment deadline, a copy of your scheduled classes, additional instructions, and cards.
- D. Return your payment and the other information requested to the P.L.U. Business Office by the due date indicated.

IN PERSON REGISTRATION

- A. Obtain the necessary cards at the Registrar's Office.
- B. Complete all cards. Obtain adviser's approval if full-time (see "F" above).
- C. Report to the Registrar's Office to be scheduled.
- D. As soon as you are scheduled and receive a copy of your program, report to the Business Office to pay your fees.

INDEPENDENT STUDY REGISTRATION

A special independent study registration card must be submitted to the Registrar's Office with each independent study registration. These cards may be obtained at the Registrar's Office.

PASS-FAIL OPTION for UNDERGRADUATE STUDENTS

A Pass-Fail Agreement form is available to all undergraduate students desiring a course on the pass-fail option. Secure the form from the Registrar's Office.

CHANGE OF REGISTRATION, WITHDRAWALS

Any addition or withdrawal from a course must be made in the Registrar's Office. Changes in registration due to conflicts or errors in registration may be made without charge during the first week of the semester. To withdraw from a class and/or add a class, the following procedure is to be followed:

1. Obtain the change of registration form from the Registrar's Office.
2. Obtain the necessary signature and, if applicable, a withdrawal grade.
3. If after the first week, pay the \$5.00 change of registration fee at the Business Office.
4. Return the change of registration form to the Registrar.

The student is responsible for completing the above steps within one week after obtaining the change card.

Students withdrawing officially from a class after the fourth week of a semester will receive either a WP (withdrawal with passing), a WF (withdrawal with failure), or a WM (Medical Withdrawal). None of these grades will be used in calculating grade point average, but they will appear on the semester grade point report and be included in review of academic status. The grade of W will replace WP, WF, and WM on the transcript.

STUDENT MOTOR VEHICLE REGULATIONS

GENERAL INFORMATION:

Each student must complete a vehicle registration card, whether or not he is registering a vehicle.

The University suggests to all students that there is normally no requirement for on-campus students to maintain private vehicles while in attendance at Pacific Lutheran University. However, in case you are working or living off campus or if there is other special need for a vehicle, strict compliance with the following regulations will be enforced.

REGISTRATION OF VEHICLES:

All students who bring cars or other motorized vehicles to the campus must register them with the Security Office. Any unregistered vehicle on campus property is subject to "tow away"; the tow away fee is payable by the owner of the vehicle.

Registration Fees are as Follows:

1st car	\$10.00
2nd car	5.00
3rd car & additional	2.00
Part-time & Night	3.00

Decal will be good from September to September.

DECALS:

Pick up your decal at the Security Office. Temporary decals may be acquired in the Security Office for replacement vehicles, loaners, etc., without charge. During registration week there will be a period of grace so students will have proper time to register vehicles. This is done in order to save embarrassment or loss of revenue to the student.

CAMPUS PARKING AREAS:

In accordance with the Student Handbook, parking of vehicles on public streets adjacent to University property IS PROHIBITED. On upper campus, resident students will park in Harstad lot and non-resident students in the Library lot. Since these lots are not adequate for all upper campus students, the remainder must park in the Olson lot and annex on lower campus. In the past, residents of 121st Street between Park Avenue and "I" Street have complained because their driveways and mailboxes were blocked. In order to maintain good community relations, we must employ all means available to prevent hardships and inconveniences to our neighbors. If there are any questions, feel free to call Security, Extension 247, at any time.

SOME GUIDELINES FOR REGISTERING STUDENTS IN MATHEMATICS COURSES:

- Math 91 (Formerly Math 101) - If a student is ineligible for either Math 133 or Math 151, he should be placed in Math 91, which is a non-credit course.
- Math 127 This course is primarily for non-mathematics majors. It is required of all business students and recommended for students in social sciences. Prerequisite: High school algebra and geometry.
- Math 133 IF a student has completed two years of high school algebra, but does not meet the rest of the criteria for Math 151 or if student has had only one year of high school algebra with "B" or better grades or has CEEB mathematics score of 600 or above, he should be placed in Math 133.
- Math 151 If a student has had two or more years of high school algebra and some trigonometry with no more than half "C" grades and no lower grades; he should be placed in Math 151. A student who has had no trigonometry should not be registered for Math 151.
- Math 152 Students who have taken a full year of calculus in high school and received a grade of "B" or better should be enrolled in Math 152 or Math 231. Consult with the Department of Mathematics.
- Math 323 (Formerly Math 318) - Acceptable for elementary teacher preparation only. This is a prerequisite for Education 326 (formerly Education 319).
- Math 324 (Formerly Math 320) - Acceptable for elementary teacher preparation only. Prerequisite: Math 323.
- Math 332 (Formerly Math 252.)
