Enrollment

The enrollment has not decreased. Last year's total of 262 was reached on February 10. The prospects for the coming summer session are better than ever.

Morale

The hard times have made for increased seriousness. The spirit of youth remains undefeated. The teachers have made great sacrifices willingly. Harmony and cooperation prevail.

Good Will

Good will in the home community of Greater Tacoma is constantly on the increase. The good reputation of Pacific Lutheran College is spreading into wider and wider circles.

Increased Synodical Cooperation

Beginning with 1933, the Augustana Synod, particularly its Columbia Conference, joins with the American Lutheran Church and the Norwegian Lutheran Church of America in actively supporting the College and in sharing the responsibility of its control.

Development Program

The depression removed the need of immediate action, but progress has been made on dormitory and campus plans. The whole program is at present tied up with the Freus-Elvestrom Plan, which will, we believe, become effective as soon as financial conditions begin to improve.

Finances

Because the College received no emergency appropriation to cover last year's deficit of \$14,581.35, the Emergency Committee of Fifteen Hundred is working to raise this sum. We still need \$11,000 of this sum, urgently. We ask you to help us avoid a deficit this year. We must plan to incur no deficit next year.
