

Another initiation ceremony was held late this spring at which the debators who had earned their membership during the past year were admitted to membership.



When the PLC debate squad entered its 1949-50 season of competition it stood upon a banner record that was compiled during the previous year when the student speakers aggregated 16 first place wins in five tournaments. Two of those first place wins were national championships. The prospects for the new season were hopeful, but many a doubt plagued the contestants as to whether that sort of record could be upheld two years in a row.






Science Club






Student Handbook

Basketball

With High Harry McLaughlin leading the parade for the fourth consecutive year, the Pacific Lutheran College basketball squad wound up the season with a half-interest in the City College Championship, a tight grip on fourth place in the Evergreen Conference standings, and a campaign record of 19 wins and 8 losses.

The Gladiator maplemen racked up an impressive record in the non-conference slate, winning nine out of ten pre-season contests, but the Harsh-men found the going increasingly rough in actual league play.

Outstanding for the Lutheran quintet were ace pivot-man Harry McLaughlin, whose uncanny ball-handling constantly befuddled the opposition and enabled him to break the Pacific Coast four-year scoring record with a total of 1,785 points; Gene Lundgaard, steady forward voted inspirational award winner by his team-mates; Del Schaefer, diminuitive senior guard; and Bert Wells, one of the closest checking guards in the circuit.

Glen "Moose" Huffman, Duane Berentson, Dick Bergesen, Bob Macready, Jack Johnson, Gerald Hefty, and several other newcomers have caused smiles to replace the furrowed lines of worry on Coach Harshman's face by virtue of the excellent performances, and prospects for next season are very good.

Lost to the team by graduation will be McLaughlin, Schaefer and Fritz Rapp, reserve guard. Thus ends the college career of one of the most colorful competitors in basketball history, High Harry McLaughlin, who, in addition to breaking the existing Coast record, also set a permanent season's scoring mark in the now defunct WINCO league, and chalked up a new individual game record by dunking 34 points through the twine in the second game of the P. L. C.-Western Washington series this season.

When the Western division of the Evergreen conference closed the 1949 baseball season the Lutes were in second place, a game and a half behind the College of Puget Sound. Final standings were as follows:

In inter-city rivalry the Glads and Loggers both gained two victories. Wayne (Buck) Brock pitched a five hitter against them in the city finale to win the game 4-3. All of the Logger runs were unearned.

Sixteen men were awarded letters in the diamond sport by coach Marv Tommervik. Jim Turman, Jim Rediske. Darrell Pearson and John Hagenson were the letter winning outfielders. Wes Saxton. Gerald Hefty, Wayne Brock and Lowell Knutson were the varsity mound staff. The regular infield was Paul Reiman at first base, Howie Davis at second, Vern Morris at shortstop and either Walt Sahli or Harold Snow at third. Bill Stringfellow and Roy Skibo also earned letters as infielders. Bud Hatley did iron man duties behind the plate during the season and was the only catcher to earn a letter. Pete Williams earned a manager's award.

Gerald Hefty and Wayne Brock were the usual starting pitchers for the Glads with Saxton and Knutson turning in some fine relief performances. Saxton also played at first base in a few games.

In the Evergreen play-offs the Central Washington Wildcats defeated Puget Sound two straight games to give the championship to the Eastern Division.

April eight of this year was a great day for the PLC diamond forces. Dr. Eastvold dedicated the new baseball field just before a double header with Seattle University. This marked the first time the baseball team could play on their own field. Many of the players had put in long hours of work on the field and the backstop to insure its readiness for the 1949 opening game.

During the season the Lutes accumulated eleven wins while losing eight. In non-conference games they defeated Seattle University three times while bowing to them once. Central Washington defeated the Lutes at Ellensburg, taking both ends of a double header. When the Wildcats came to Parkland they were greeted rather rudely both by the team, which won the first game, and by the weather. A heavy rain came up and rained out the final game of the scheduled double header.

Turman, Snow, Rediske and Davis were the seniors on the squad. This left twelve lettermen that will be eligible for competition in 1950.

The first game of the season was an 8-7 win over the Seattle University nine. Glen Huffman, freshman from Tacoma, went the distance. Jack Johnson. Everett freshman, and Paul Reiman, the veteran first sacker, led the hitters.

Don Loete could break in at either short or third Bud Hatley will be behind the plate. The outfield will have Hagenson in center, Jack Johnson in left, and Gene Reiber in right field.

The Lutes opened the 1950 Evergreen campaign with a 10-2 victory over the College of Puget Sound. Glen Huffman was the winning pitcheir. He allowed only five hits while striking out nine.

The team's hitting and fielding has been fair, with pitching being the main worry. Huffman's performances have given rise to new hopes for a winning season as Knutson and Saxton give the Lutes two proven competitors to round out the mound staff.
