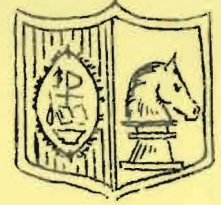

FALL ENROLLMENT FIGURES SHOW SEVEN PERCENT INCREASE

Enrollment figures released by Mrs. Linka Johnson, registrar, indicated 1,992 students are enrolled at Pacific Lutheran University this fall.

The total, an all-time high, is an increase of seven percent over last fall's enrollment.

A breakdown of figures show 515 freshmen, 408 sophomore, 376 juniors, 353 seniors, 216 graduates, 15 special and 109 extension.
