AUDIT COURSES CHARGED AT CREDIT RATE

FULL-TIME STUDENTS WHO DO NOT EXCEED 35 HOURS FOR THE ACADEMIC YEAR MAY NEED AN ADJUSTMENT TO REDUCE THE TUITION TOTAL TO THE \$7760.00 MAXIMUM FOR THE YEAR. THIS ADJUSTMENT IS CALLED THE CCP SPRING DISCOUNT AND IS APPLIED AT THE SPRING SEMESTER BILLING. STUDENTS PARTICIPATING IN A STUDY ABROAD PROGRAM DURING THE ACADEMIC YEAR ARE NOT ELIGIBLE FOR THE CCP SPRING DISCOUNT.

## **PAYMENT OPTIONS**

1. PAYMENT BY SEMESTER -- IF THIS OPTION IS SELECTED, THE TOTAL COST OF EACH SEMESTER MUST BE PAID BEFORE CLASSES BEGIN. THE UNIVERSITY WILL ACCEPT VISA AND MASTERCARD BANK CARDS. INDICATE CARD TYPE, ACCOUNT NUMBER, AND EXPIRATION DATE IF REGISTERING BY MAIL.
2. PLU BUDGET PLAN -- THE PLU BUDGET PLAN IS A CONVENIENT, NO INTEREST, MONTHLY PAYMENT PLAN. THE COST OF THE ENTIRE YEAR IS ESTIMATED NOW AND PAID OVER TWELVE (12) MONTHS, BEGINNING MAY 10TH AND ENDING APRIL 10TH. FOR THOSE STUDENTS WHO WILL BE HERE FALL TERM ONLY, PAYMENTS BEGIN MAY 10TH AND END OCTOBER 10TH. FOR THOSE WHO WILL BE HERE SPRING TERM ONLY, PAYMENTS BEGIN NOVEMBER 10TH AND END APRIL 10TH. THERE IS A 2% LATE CHARGE FOR PAYMENTS RECEIVED AFTER THE 15TH OF EACH MONTH AND BUDGET PLAN APPLICATIONS RECEIVED AFTER THE FIRST PAYMENT DATE (MAY 10TH OR NOVEMBER 10TH) ARE CHARGED A 2% LATE CHARGE AND ALSO PAY THE BACK PAYMENTS AT THE TIME OF APPLICATION. CONTACT THE BUSINESS OFFICE FOR FURTHER INFORMATION.
3. SEMESTER INSTALLMENT PLAN -- THE SEMESTER INSTALLMENT PLAN REQUIRES A 25% MINIMUM DOWN PAYMENT AND THERE IS A FINANCE CHARGE. THE BALANCE REMAINING (PLU FINANCE CHARGE) IS DIVIDED INTO THREE (3) MONTHLY PAYMENTS, DUE BY THE 15TH OF THE MONTH (E.G., FALL -- OCTOBER 15, NOVEMBER 15, DECEMBER 15; AND SPRING -- MARCH 15, APRIL 15, MAY 15). IN ORDER TO QUALIFY FOR THIS PLAN, ALL PRIOR BALANCES WITH PLU MUST BE PAID IN FULL. APPLICATIONS FOR PARTICIPATION IN THE PLAN SHOULD BE MADE BY THE 10TH DAY OF THE SEMESTER, AND THE 25% MINIMUM DOWN PAYMENT IS REQUIRED WITH THE APPLICATION. CONTACT THE BUSINESS OFFICE FOR FURTHER INFORMATION.

NOTE: REGISTRATION IS NOT FINALIZED UNTIL TUITION AND FEES ARE PAID. UNPAID BALANCES ARE SUBJECT TO LATE CHARGES IF NOT PAID BY PUBLISHED DEADLINES. CONTACT THE BUSINESS OFFICE FOR CURRENT CHARGES IF A COMPLETE STATEMENT HAS NOT BEEN RECEIVED. PAYMENT OPTIONS #2 AND #3 ARE SUBJECT TO APPROVAL OF CREDIT.

## JUNIOR<sup>S</sup> WITH 70-89 CREDITS COMPLETED MUST DO JUNIOR REVIEW BEFORE PREREGISTRATION

About 400 junior students, those who have already completed between 80 and 89 credits for graduation, have been sent letters instructing them to complete a junior review before they preregister for Interim and Spring terms. The junior review does not affect other juniors.

Students included in the review group who have not yet submitted their reviews to the Registrar will not receive preregistration appointments until their reviews are received.

Students who do not submit reviews before preregistration begins will have to request a new appointment time after the reviews are received. For a few juniors this may mean that they will register after the freshmen.

## INTERIM, SPRING REGISTRATION NOVEMBER 17-21 DROP/ADDS BEGIN NOVEMBER 24

Interim/Spring preregistration for continuing, full-time students has been set for November 17-21. Registration for part-time students begins November 24.

Preregistration appointment cards have been sent to local addresses. Students who have not yet received theirs should contact the Registrar.

ANTH 370 First Civilizations (4) Why, where and how did the first civilizations arise? Surveys origins of agriculture, writing, cities and the state in Mesopotamia, Egypt, India, Asia, Mesoamerica, and South America.

\*ANTH 401A Rediscovering Alaska (1) Interface course. Contact department for details

\*ANTH 401B Early Man and the Sea (1) Interface course. Contact department for details.

\*ANTH 401C The Ancient Past (1) Interface course. Contact department for details.

\*ART 260 Drawing II (4) Individual investigation of form, content and style; use of color media; some work with live models, on site architectural drawing, etc.; preparing work for exhibit; attendance at special events required. Prereq: Art 160

\*ART 382 The House: Design (4) Study of human habitats from a practical viewpoint with emphasis on contemporary developments; evolution of residential architecture, interior design, and furniture; projects in design and planning; use of color, pattern, texture, etc. No prerequisites, no art experience required.

\*BIO 210 Genetic Technology (2) Basic science underlying genetic technology, applications of genetic technology; possible environmental and human effects; governing policies and agencies.

\*CHIN 380 Chinese Literature in Translation (4) Introduction to major Chinese writers and works from early to modern times, including poetry, prose, drama, and vernacular fiction. Emphasis on historical and cultural background. Taught in English; no Chinese required.

\*COMA 351 Stage Make-up (4) Techniques for using makeup to enhance theatrical productions. Fundamental design and application, as well as special effects, included. Lecture-discussion format.

\*COMA 432 Criticism of Broadcasting (4) Explores relationship between American broadcast media and culture; how broadcast media operate and why, and the consequences for society and

individual. Intended for senior-level broadcast students.

# English 1987 FALL SCHEDULE

**LOWER DIVISION LITERATURE:** All these courses fulfill the GUR in literature. Though open to all students, they are designed for freshmen and sophomores who are beginning their college-level study of literature. Both surveys (241, 251) are required for an English major.

217: THE SHORT STORY --Richard Jenseth MWF 10:40-11:50 am

This is not so much a course in the history of the short story as it is a course in reading (perceptively, creatively, aggressively) in order to answer our own questions about fiction. Some of our questions are lofty and imponderable--questions about love, death, truth, beauty. But others are fairly practical: How do short stories do what they do, and why do they do it that way and not another? All these questions assume no particular background in fiction, but only a healthy curiosity about the endlessly imaginative ways people use language.

218: DRAMA --David Clark\* MWRF 9-9:50 am

We study great plays, both classic (Greek tragedy, Shakespeare) and modern, from Ibsen and Shaw to Arthur Miller and Tom Stoppard. We learn how dramatists use conventions of language and action to explore the enduring human condition with its passion and ambition, duty and freedom, quests for love, for power, for understanding. Though the emphasis is on written texts, what you learn will enrich your appreciation of film, television, and, of course, live theater.

230: CONTEMPORARY LITERATURE --Dennis Martin MTWF 12-12:50 pm

Through a reading of the most original fiction and poems of our time, we discover how literature sounds in the late 20th century; we learn its conventions, its tones, and its values. Writers studied include Joseph Heller, Sylvia Plath, John Barth, and Margaret Atwood, among others. Students use both formal and informal writing to record their reactions.

241: INTRODUCTION TO AMERICAN LITERATURE

Section A: --Paul Benton MWRF 8-8:50 am

Section B: --Gloria Martin MWRF 1-1:50 pm

Benton: A survey of major authors, themes, and forms of American literature up to the 1940's. The first half concentrates on the romantic movement that peaked in the 1850's: Poe, Emerson, Thoreau, Whitman, Hawthorne (The Scarlet Letter), and Melville (Moby-Dick). The second half traces the rise of realism, naturalism, and modernism in Twain and James, Dickinson and Frost, Eliot and Williams, Hemingway and Faulkner (As I Lay Dying). Two essays are required, one explicating a text, one using library research.

Martin: We read major American literary works, from early histories of the colonial period to books written between the two World Wars. We study the rich tradition of our own past, the foundation of contemporary American literature, and the individual poems, short stories, and novels of first-rate American writers. In the first half, we read authors of the American Renaissance, including Poe, Thoreau, Whitman, Hawthorne, and Melville. The second half includes Dickinson, Twain, James, Frost, Hemingway, Fitzgerald, and Faulkner. A reader's journal, two exams, and two analytical essays are required.

251: INTRODUCTION TO ENGLISH LITERATURE: BEGINNINGS TO 1750

Section A: --Sharon Jansen Jaech MWRF 9-9:50 am

Section B: --Rick Jones MTWR 3-3:50 pm

Jansen Jaech: A survey of British literary history from Beowulf to Dryden. Along our route we meet heroes and villains, knights and monsters, philosophers and fools. Through great works of literature we face fundamental and enduring human questions: What is justice? What should be loved? What is courage? What is evil? What in life deserves to be preserved and defended? Representative works by Chaucer, the Pearl poet, Spenser, Marlowe, Shakespeare, Milton, Bacon, Hobbes, and Dryden, among others.

Jones: An exploration of the origins and development of English--one of the world's primary languages and great literatures--from the Anglo-Saxon beginnings of Beowulf, through the inventions and innovations of Chaucer's Middle English and the powerful Modern English of Marlowe, Shakespeare, Donne, and Milton, to the self-conscious and worldly formality of Dryden. Though this is a course in reading, it is taught from a writer's point of view, emphasizing what contemporary authors can learn from the masters of our language.





UPPER DIVISION LITERATURE: These courses are open to all serious and mature students, though they are designed for juniors and seniors and they generally require more reading and more substantial writing than lower division literature courses. 363 & 365 are introductory to their fields. 389 & 392 are "historical period" courses, while 383 & 440 are devoted to "major authors." (English majors are required to take at least one of each type.) It would be reasonable to take the appropriate survey course first (241:440, 251:383,389, 252:392), but these are not strict prerequisites; seriousness of purpose is more important. If you have doubts, talk with the instructor.

363: CHILDREN'S LITERATURE --Suzanne Rahn TR 4-5:50 pm

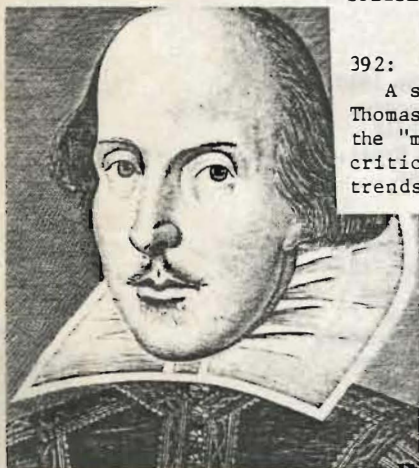
This fall we examine children's literature of the last three decades. We consider developments since 1950 in fantasy, science fiction, and family stories, and we study how these developments relate to changing concerns and mores of society. Authors include E. B. White, Philippa Pearce, C. S. Lewis, Ursula K. LeGuin, and Robert Heinlein. Requirements: extensive assigned reading (averaging two books a week), in-class discussion and analysis, tests, and a research paper. A tally card is required for registration.

365: FAIRY TALES & FANTASY --David Seal MW 7-8:50 pm

Selected fairy tales are told and interpreted, with an emphasis on psychological interpretations. Fantasy is studied as a genre, with an emphasis on kinds of fantasy, such as the detective novel, horror fiction, science fiction, and pure fantasy. This course is lecture-oriented, with a major essay, essay tests, and short papers required.

389: RESTORATION & 18TH-CENTURY ENGLISH LITERATURE --Tom Campbell MWF 10:40-11:50 am

An introduction to the august literature and literary personalities of the years 1660-1800. Explore a colorful and contradictory age, an age at once teeming with the energy of a Hogar print and poised with the elegance of a Gainsborough portrait. Trace the cultural currents that led to the collapse of a Neoclassical world and the birth pangs of a Romantic one. Read drama that's bawdy or sentimental, satire that's gentle or vindictive, and fiction (the emergent novel) that's always exuberantly experimental. Selections from Dryden, Swift, Pope, Johnson, Fielding, Goldsmith, among others.



392: 20TH-CENTURY BRITISH LITERATURE --David Clark\* MWF 2-2:50 pm

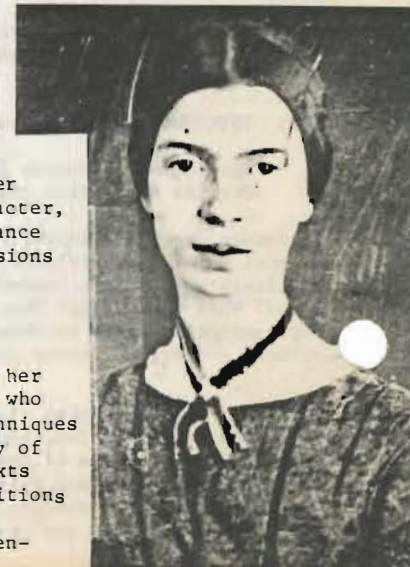
A study of major British authors, including dramatists (Shaw, Beckett), poets (Yeats, Thomas), and especially novelists (Joyce, Lawrence, Woolf, Lessing), with an emphasis on the "modernism" of the first half of the century. Some attention is given to the memorable critics of the time (Richards, Leavis) and to the literary movements as they relate to parallel trends in the U.S. and on the Continent.

383: SHAKESPEARE --Chuck Bergman TR 10-11:50 am

We read ten plays by one of the world's greatest dramatists and the sonnets of the premier English poet. I want you to learn to read the plays carefully and to comprehend plot, character, and language as elements of drama. We also place Shakespeare in the context of the Renaissance and of English society in the age of Elizabeth and James I. In class I use frequent discussions to explore ways these plays come to have meaning for modern readers.

440: SEMINAR: EMILY DICKINSON --Dennis Martin MW 4-5:50 pm

Dickinson is arguably the first modern American poet (a full generation or more ahead of her time) and perhaps the best and most intriguing woman poet ever. This course gives students who are already experienced in the formal analysis of poetry a chance to learn and practice techniques of research and criticism while reading the whole body of Emily Dickinson's poetry--and many of her wonderful letters. We place the poems in the social, scientific, and theological contexts of late nineteenth-century America out of which Dickinson emerged, and we consider the traditions of scholarship--textual, psychological, feminist, linguistic--that have grown up around the Dickinson canon. Students work up individual poems for presentation to the class, read extensively in background studies, and write a substantial seminar paper.





LOWER DIVISION WRITING: These are courses for students who have successfully completed English 101, typically sophomores. (Students with high AP scores or other evidence of exceptional skill may go directly to 201 or 225.) Students interested in imaginative writing usually take 227 before 327 or other 300-level writing courses. 201 & 225 meet the GUR in writing; 227 does not.



201: INTERMEDIATE WRITING --Tom Campbell MWR 8-8:50 am

This course offers extended practice in expository and persuasive writing. We write a lot, take the writing apart, and talk about ways to reassemble it. We play with language and experiment with structure in order to write more comfortably and convincingly for different audiences and different purposes. Essays by professional writers give a sense of the linguistic and structural choices these pros make; and we see what happens when you try out some of these strategies in your own writing.

225: AUTOBIOGRAPHICAL WRITING --David Seal MTR 4-4:50 pm

Writing about the self, at the intermediate level. You bring the content, I teach the form. We not only write autobiographically, we read some autobiographies. In-class writing and revising are emphasized, as well as multiple drafts and peer review.

227: IMAGINATIVE WRITING --Jack Cady TR 6-7:20 pm

This section deals with fiction and with the creative essay, which means your personal experience is important. We examine methods story writers use, then take those methods to our own work. Our reading is sporadic, but our writing is continual. The aim of the class is for each member to produce one perfectly written story or essay during the semester. It is not easy to create something perfect, but a perfect work makes the time and effort worthwhile. Text: Between Timberline and Tidepool.

UPPER DIVISION WRITING: These courses are designed for juniors and seniors who have had experience writing beyond 101. Less experienced students with exceptionally strong interest and ability may also enroll, though consultation with the instructor is advised. 328 meets the GUR in writing; 327 & 403 do not.

327: IMAGINATIVE WRITING --Rick Jones TR 4-5:50 pm

We review basic forms and techniques of contemporary poetry while focusing our attention and energies on writing, revising, and rewriting. The standing assignment is to "keep writing." The main text is the manuscripts submitted for discussion on worksheets. Our goal will be collections of poems suitable for publication.

328: ADVANCED COMPOSITION --Sharon Jansen Jaech MW 6-7:20 pm

An intensive workshop for experienced writers, focusing on the contemporary essay. We analyze and appreciate some of the best in current non-fiction writing, and we experiment, succeed (and, sometimes, fail) together. Prerequisites include a sense of the playfulness of language, the desire to find out how good writing works, a willingness to share what you have written, and the ability to give, take, and profit from tough criticism.

403: MODERN GRAMMAR --Richard Jenseth TR 6-8:00 pm

We ask what language structures are, how they work, and why these structures matter in such contexts as philosophy, psychology, sociology, anthropology, and the sciences. We explore both traditional and transformational grammars, and we learn something about the history of the English language.

\*\*Our Distinguished Writer in Residence (DWR) for spring 1988 is Noelle de Chambrun, a Parisian writer and professor of English.



PUBLISHING & PRINTING ARTS: Though these are part of the PPA program (see Megan Benton for details), all are open to any student and may be taken alone as electives. 321 is an especially valuable complement to writing or literature courses, as well as to other liberal arts disciplines, business, or education. Note that they are 2 credit hour courses.

321: THE BOOK IN SOCIETY (2 hours) --Megan Benton T 6-8:00 pm

This course examines how books have been created, used, feared, and revered throughout history. Topics include the medieval book; the impact of the printing revolution; the commercial pressures facing today's publishing industry and their effects on texts, authors, readers, and society; issues of censorship and manipulation, particularly in books for children; and other ways in which books reflect and shape our world.

331: THE ART OF THE BOOK: I (2 hours) --Megan Benton MW 4-5:50 pm

This studio course explores the design and mechanical arts at the heart of the rich tradition of bookmaking by focusing on historical models and methods and on the contemporary renaissance they have inspired. Students learn the fundamentals of book design and typography--both classical and innovative--using fine materials and hand processes to create a variety of printed texts, ranging from a 15th-century titlepage facsimile to a modern illustrated poem.

332: THE ART OF THE BOOK: II (2 to 4 hours) --Megan Benton TBA

Prerequisite: 331. Students develop individual projects to explore further possibilities of fine bookmaking. They may inaugurate private presses of their own by producing a small edition of an original text--one selected, edited, designed, illustrated, printed, and bound by one or a team of students. Or they may sample a broader variety of book arts workshops in papermaking, marbling, and bookbinding. The course may be repeated for up to 4 hours total credit.
