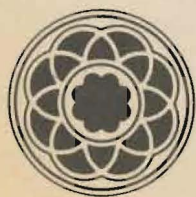

AUDIT COURSES CHARGED AT CREDIT RATE

FULL-TIME STUDENTS WHO DO NOT EXCEED 35 HOURS FOR THE ACADEMIC YEAR MAY NEED AN ADJUSTMENT TO REDUCE THE TUITION TOTAL TO THE \$8520.00 MAXIMUM FOR THE YEAR. THIS ADJUSTMENT IS CALLED THE CCP SPRING DISCOUNT AND IS APPLIED AT THE SPRING SEMESTER BILLING. STUDENTS PARTICIPATING IN A STUDY ABROAD PROGRAM DURING THE ACADEMIC YEAR ARE NOT ELIGIBLE FOR THE CCP SPRING DISCOUNT.

PAYMENT OPTIONS

1. PAYMENT BY SEMESTER -- IF THIS OPTION IS SELECTED, THE TOTAL COST OF EACH SEMESTER MUST BE PAID BY THESE DATES:

FALL SEMESTER	AUGUST 27TH
INTERIM SEMESTER	DECEMBER 23RD
SPRING SEMESTER	JANUARY 22ND

THE UNIVERSITY DOES ACCEPT VISA AND MASTERCARDS.

2. THE BUDGET PLAN -- THE PLU BUDGET PLAN IS A CONVENIENT NO INTEREST MONTHLY PAYMENT PLAN. THE COST OF THE ENTIRE YEAR IS ESTIMATED AND PAID OVER 12 MONTHS BEGINNING MAY 10TH AND ENDING APRIL 10TH. FOR THOSE STUDENTS ATTENDING SUMMER AND FALL ONLY, THE BUDGET PLAN RUNS FROM MAY 10TH TO OCTOBER 10TH. FOR THOSE STUDENTS ATTENDING INTERIM AND SPRING ONLY, THE BUDGET PLAN RUNS FROM NOVEMBER 10TH TO APRIL 10TH. PAYMENTS ON THIS PLAN ARE DUE BY THE 10TH OF THE MONTH AND THERE IS A 2% OF THE PAYMENT AMOUNT LATE CHARGE FOR PAYMENTS RECEIVED AFTER THE 15TH OF THE MONTH. PLEASE REFER TO PLU'S COST AND PAYMENT OPTIONS BROCHURE FOR FURTHER INFORMATION.

3. THE SEMESTER INSTALLMENT PLAN -- THIS PLAN ALLOWS FOR THE SEMESTER COSTS TO BE PAID IN INSTALLMENTS OVER THE PERIOD OF THE SEMESTER. THIS PLAN DOES INCLUDE A FINANCE CHARGE. FOR FALL TERM, A MINIMUM 25% DOWN PAYMENT IS REQUIRED. THE REMAINING BALANCE IS DIVIDED INTO THREE INSTALLMENTS DUE BY THE 15TH OF THE MONTH (i.e. OCTOBER 15, NOVEMBER 15, AND DECEMBER 15). FOR INTERIM AND SPRING TERMS COMBINED, A MINIMUM 20% DOWN PAYMENT IS REQUIRED. THE REMAINING BALANCE IS DIVIDED INTO FOUR INSTALLMENTS DUE BY THE 15TH OF THE MONTH (i.e. FEBRUARY 15, MARCH 15, APRIL 15, AND MAY 15). FOR SPRING TERM ONLY, A MINIMUM 25% DOWN PAYMENT IS REQUIRED. THE REMAINING BALANCE IS DIVIDED INTO THREE INSTALLMENTS DUE BY THE 15TH OF THE MONTH (i.e. MARCH 15, APRIL 15 AND MAY 15). PAYMENTS RECEIVED AFTER THE 20TH OF THE MONTH WILL BE ASSESSED A \$10.00 LATE CHARGE. PLEASE REFER TO THE PLU COST AND PAYMENT OPTIONS BROCHURE FOR FURTHER INFORMATION.

NOTE: REGISTRATION IS NOT FINALIZED UNTIL TUITION AND FEES ARE PAID; HOWEVER, WITHDRAWALS FROM CLASSES OR FROM TERM MUST BE IN WRITING TO THE REGISTRAR. UNPAID BALANCES ARE SUBJECT TO LATE CHARGES IF NOT PAID BY PUBLISHED DEADLINES. CONTACT THE BUSINESS OFFICE FOR CURRENT CHARGES IF A COMPLETE STATEMENT HAS NOT BEEN RECEIVED. ANY CURRENTLY ENROLLED STUDENT AT PACIFIC LUTHERAN UNIVERSITY WHOSE PRIOR OWING BALANCE IS PAID IN FULL AND WHO HAS AN ACCEPTABLE CREDIT HISTORY WITH THE BUSINESS OFFICE CAN APPLY FOR PAYMENT OPTIONS NUMBER TWO AND THREE.

REFUND POLICY

IF YOU DROP A SINGLE CLASS OR COMPLETELY WITHDRAW FROM THE TERM DURING THE FIRST TWO WEEKS OF THE FALL OR SPRING SEMESTER, A FULL TUITION REFUND WILL BE GIVEN. THE ADVANCE PAYMENT IS NOT REFUNDED. A TEN PERCENT PER DAY CHARGE WILL BE ASSESSED FOR COMPLETE WITHDRAWALS DURING THE THIRD AND FOURTH WEEK. NO REFUNDS ARE AVAILABLE AFTER THE FOURTH WEEK FOR COMPLETE WITHDRAWALS OR AFTER THE SECOND WEEK OF THE TERM FOR DROPPING INDIVIDUAL COURSES.

NOTICE OF WITHDRAWAL MUST BE MADE IN WRITING TO THE REGISTRAR OF PACIFIC LUTHERAN UNIVERSITY AND RECEIVED BEFORE THE DEADLINES GIVEN ABOVE. ORAL REQUESTS ARE NOT ACCEPTABLE.

COMPUTER USAGE FEES

THE COMPUTER CENTER CHARGES FEES FOR THE USE OF A VARIETY OF EQUIPMENT AND SERVICES PROVIDED TO THE UNIVERSITY. PLEASE CHECK IN THE USER ROOMS OR WITH THE COMPUTER CENTER FOR AN UPDATED FEE SCHEDULE. STUDENTS WILL BE BILLED MONTHLY BY THE COMPUTER CENTER.

IF A CLASS REQUIRES THE USE OF A COMPUTER, THE INSTRUCTOR MAY OBTAIN ACCOUNTS FOR THE CLASS. CHECK WITH THE INSTRUCTOR BEFORE REQUESTING AN INDIVIDUAL ACCOUNT. ANY STUDENT MAY OBTAIN AN ACCOUNT FOR THE VAX SYSTEM AT THE COMPUTER CENTER OFFICES BETWEEN 8:00 AM AND 5:00 PM, MONDAY THROUGH FRIDAY. TO USE THE PERSONAL COMPUTERS, PRESENT A VALID ID CARD AT ANY OF THE USERS ROOMS. USE OF THE FACILITIES ARE RESTRICTED TO CURRENTLY ENROLLED STUDENTS.

Literature

200-LEVEL COURSES: these meet the GUR in literature. Though open to all, they are designed for freshmen and sophomores. 241 & 251 are required for the English major.

217: SHORT STORY (Paul Benton) T F 8-9:50

Reading short stories and short novels to discover how scene and character, image and plot, create miniature worlds that reveal important truths about our big world and those who live in it. The focus is on American writers, but we include British, Continental, and Third World authors too.

230: CONTEMPORARY LITERATURE (Dennis Martin) T R 10-11:50

Through a reading of the most original fiction and poetry of our time, we discover how literature sounds in the late 20th century, learning its conventions, its tones, and its values. Emphasizes close attention to major works by authors such as Joseph Heller, Sylvia Plath, and Margaret Atwood.

231: EUROPEAN LITERATURE (Gloria Martin) MTW F 12-12:50

Classic traditions from the Thebes of Oedipus to the enchanted universe of Don Quixote, including Homer, Dante, Shakespeare, and others. We speculate about why these texts have endured and we study the world views of ancient Greece, the Middle Ages, and the Renaissance in relation to our own.

241/01: INTRODUCTION TO AMERICAN LITERATURE (Paul Benton) M R 8-9:50

A survey of major authors, themes, and forms to the 1940's. Emphasizes first the romanticism that peaked in the 1850's--Poe, Emerson, Thoreau, Whitman, Hawthorne (The Scarlet Letter), Melville (Moby-Dick)--and then the rise of realism, naturalism, and modernism in Twain and James, Dickinson and Frost, Eliot and Williams, Hemingway and Faulkner.

241/02: INTRODUCTION TO AMERICAN LITERATURE (Greg Johnson) T F 1-2:50

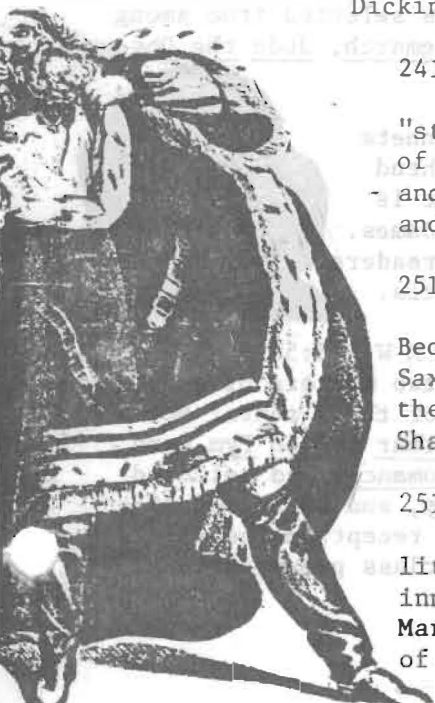
When does Huck Finn tell the truth? Where does Emily Dickinson "stop for Death?" How does Whitman transcend time? These are a few of the questions we'll ask in our study of major authors, themes, and styles to the 1930's. Required: a penchant for story problems and a suspicion of familiar answers.

251/01: ENGLISH LITERATURE TO 1750 (Tom Campbell) MWF 10:40-11:50

A thousand years of British literary history, from the epic of Beowulf to the elegantly sophisticated Pope. Includes the Anglo-Saxon period, the chivalric 14th century, the Elizabethan age, and the transitional 17th & 18th centuries, emphasizing Chaucer, Marlowe, Shakespeare, Donne, Milton, Dryden, and others in their times.

251/02: ENGLISH LITERATURE TO 1750 (Rick Jones) MTWR 3-3:50

An exploration of one of the world's primary languages and great literatures, from the Anglo-Saxon beginnings of Beowulf, through the innovations of Chaucer's Middle English and the powerful lines of Marlowe and Shakespeare, Donne and Milton, to the worldly formality of Dryden. Emphasizes what contemporary writers can learn from these masters of our language.



LITERATURE

THESE UPPER-DIVISION COURSES are open to all students, but they are designed for juniors & seniors and require more reading and writing than most 200- lit courses. 363 & 365 are introductory to their fields. The others could reasonably be prefaced by the appropriate survey course (251 for 381 & 383, 252 for 391, 241 for 440), though these are not strict prerequisites; seriousness of purpose is more important. See the instructor if you have doubts. 381 & 389 are "period" courses, while 383 & 440 are devoted to "major authors"; majors are required to take one of each type.

363: CHILDREN'S LITERATURE (Suzanne Rahn) M R 4-5:50

A historical survey emphasizing study in depth of the classics of children's literature--Hans Andersen, Lewis Carroll, Treasure Island, The Wind in the Willows, Beatrix Potter, The Borrowers, and much more. Includes comprehensive tests and a substantial independent project. Students should have a serious interest in children's literature and be prepared to read widely in the field.

365: FAIRY TALES & FANTASY (David Seal) M W 6-7:50

Selected fairy tales are told and interpreted, with an emphasis on psychological interpretations. Fantasy is studied as a genre, including the detective novel, horror fiction, science fiction. Includes both lecture and discussion, with a major essay, essay tests, & short papers.

381: STUDIES IN MEDIEVAL LIT: WOMEN (Suzanne Rahn) MWF 10:40-11:50

What were the images and what was the reality of being a woman 600 or 1000 years ago? Literature by and about women reveals an astonishing variety of answers. Includes plays of the 9th-century nun Hrotswitha, Christine de Pisan's City of Ladies (the first major work of feminism), & mystical visions of Juliana of Norwich, plus Chaucer's Wife of Bath & other classics about women. Includes comprehensive tests and a major research paper.



391: VICTORIAN LITERATURE (Audrey Eyler) M W 2-3:50

The rich variety of 19th-century Britain--its imperialism and growing democracy, curiosity and conscience, pride and doubt, materialism and exoticism--is reflected in writers as different as Charlotte Brontë and Oscar Wilde. Includes poetry (Tennyson, Browning), prose (Carlyle, Ruskin), and the novel, with independent projects selected from among Jane Eyre, Our Mutual Friend, Vanity Fair, Middlemarch, Jude the Obscure.

383: SHAKESPEARE (Chuck Bergman) T R 10-11:50

Ten plays by one of the world's greatest dramatists plus the sonnets of the premier English poet. The plays are read carefully to comprehend plot, character, and language as elements of drama, while Shakespeare is placed in the context of Renaissance English society of Elizabeth & James. Discussion explores how these plays come to have meaning for modern readers. An optional trip to Ashland is included; see the instructor for details.



440: SEMINAR: POE & HAWTHORNE (Richard Jenseth) M W 4-5:50

Close reading and thoughtful comparison of two masters of American Romanticism, articulating our own understanding of their texts: Poe's stories and poems, including The Narrative of Arthur Gordon Pym, and Hawthorne's The Scarlet Letter, The Blithedale Romance, and selected tales. Also involves biography, literary history, and an introduction to recent theories of criticism: deconstruction, reception theories, Marxism. Includes independent library research, class presentations, and a substantial paper.



Writing



LOWER-DIVISION (200-) WRITING COURSES are for students who have completed 101. Students with high AP scores or other evidence of special skill or experience may go directly to 201 or 225. Students with an interest in imaginative writing usually take 227 before 327 or other 300-level writing courses. The GUR writing requirement may be met by 101, 201, or 225, but not 227.

201/01 INTERMEDIATE WRITING (Greg Johnson) T RF 3-3:50

De-emphasizes grammatical concerns in order to focus on strategies for generating, organizing, and revising essays in a variety of personal and public forms. Through exercises and discussions, the course will introduce students to classical as well as contemporary authors and, most importantly, to members of their own audience, their classmates.

201/02 INTERMEDIATE WRITING (Rick Jones) T R 4:30-5:50

An opportunity to practice and develop writing with special emphasis on journals and rewriting to focus material and adjust style for different audiences. Includes an introduction to word processing.

225: AUTOBIOGRAPHICAL WRITING (Charles Bergman) M WR 2-2:50

For students who want to understand themselves more deeply: we will treat the act of writing as itself one way in which we discover and create a sense of self. We will ask who we are, how we know who we are, and how we know we aren't fooling ourselves. Includes reading some published autobiographies, but the focus is on writing and sharing portions of our own.

227: IMAGINATIVE WRITING I (Jack Cady) TR 2-3:50

Emphasis on fiction and the creative essay. Work with the basic techniques all storytellers use and with the importance of experience, each person's own experience. The aim is to produce one perfectly written piece; this is not easy but the effort is worthwhile.

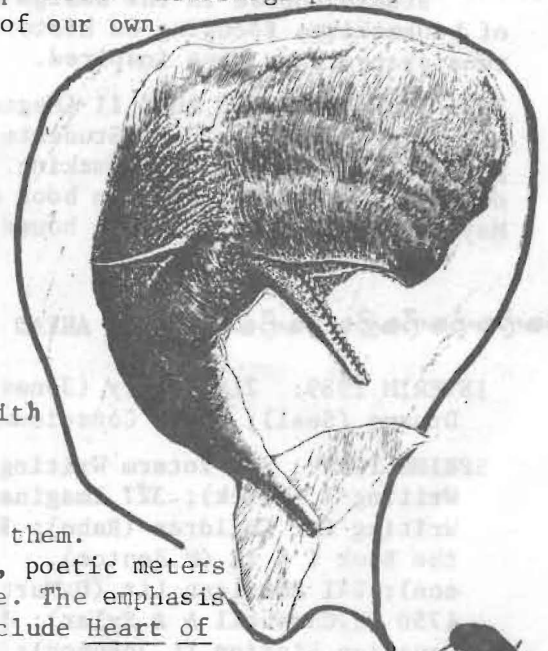
UPPER-DIVISION (300-) WRITING COURSES are for juniors & seniors with writing experience beyond 101. Others with exceptionally strong interest may also enroll, with consent of the instructor. 328 meets the GUR.

327: IMAGINATIVE WRITING II (Jack Cady) TR 6-7:50

We learn how to spot opportunities, then use them. Attention is paid to word choice, story structure, poetic meters in prose lines, leading toward an individual style. The emphasis is on rewriting and perfecting material. Texts include Heart of Darkness and The Grass Harp.

328: ADVANCED COMPOSITION (Tom Campbell) MWR 1-1:50

A workshop focusing on the contemporary essay to get a sense of the strategies professionals use. We will experiment on our own in essays ranging from the personal to the academic.



LANGUAGE



403: MODERN GRAMMAR (Richard Jenseth)
T & Th 6-8:00

We ask what language structures are, how they work, and why these structures matter in such contexts as philosophy, psychology, sociology, anthropology, and the sciences. We explore both traditional & transformational grammars, and we learn something about the history of the English language.

PUBLISHING & PRINTING ARTS (A brochure on the program is available.)

These PPA courses are open to any student and may be taken alone as electives. Note that all three courses are for 2 credit hours.

321: THE BOOK IN SOCIETY (Megan Benton) Th 4-5:50 (2 credit hours)

How books have been created, used, feared, and revered throughout history. Topics include the medieval book, the impact of the printing revolution, the commercial pressures facing today's publishing industry and their effects on texts, authors, readers, and society, issues of censorship and manipulation.

331: THE ART OF THE BOOK I (Megan Benton) M W 4-5:50 (2 credit hours)

Studio course in the design and mechanical arts at the heart of a rich tradition of bookmaking, focusing on historical models and methods, and on the contemporary renaissance they have inspired.

332: THE ART OF THE BOOK II (Megan Benton) TBA (2 to 4 credit hours)

Prerequisite: 331. Students develop individual projects to explore further possibilities of fine bookmaking. Students may produce a small edition of an original text or sample the book arts of papermaking, marbling, and bookbinding. May be repeated for up to 4 hours total credit.
