## Certification Requirements in the State of Washington

"No one may teach in the public schools of Washington unless he is in possession of the proper Washington certificate."

Pacific Lutheran College offers courses for the preparation of teachers and principals in schools having grades 1 to 8 and grade 9 if that grade is a part of an accredited junior high school. Recommendations are made to the State Superintendent of Public Instruction who issues the required certificates. The teachers are required to possess either a three-year elementary certificate or a standard six-year certificate. Principals are required to possess the principal's credential.

*Applicants for the three-year elementary certificate* must have a degree from an approved teacher training institution. Pacific Lutheran College is such a school.

*Applicants for the six-year standard elementary certificate* must have taught successfully for at least two years upon a three-year elementary certificate.

*Applicants for the elementary principal's credential* may qualify either under a or b:

a. Two or more years of successful experience as principal of an elementary school of six or more teachers prior to September 1, 1936.

b. At least two years of successful teaching experience in the elementary school or the junior high school plus eight semester hours of professional courses relating to elementary administration and supervision taken subsequent to at least one year of teaching experience. Not less than four semester hours of the required number of credits must be from List A below covering at least two of the enumerated fields. The remaining credits may be from either list. Other courses within the field of elementary education may also be offered subject to evaluation. All courses presented toward satisfying the requirements for an elementary principal's credential must have been completed within ten years prior to date of application.

*Applicants for the junior high school principal's credential or the superintendent's credential* may receive information respecting requirements from the Dean.

## Renewal and Conversion of Three-Year Elementary Certificate Issued Prior to September 1, 1942

The three-year elementary certificate based on a three-year curriculum may be renewed once for an additional three-year period upon completion of ten semester hours of credit earned subsequent to the three-year curriculum. Upon expiration of the second three-year elementary certificate it may be converted into the six-year standard elementary certificate by the completion of the four-year elementary teacher-training curriculum and two years of successful teaching experience.

**For information respecting the renewal and conversion of the three-year elementary certificate based on a four-year curriculum or for the reinstatement of lapsed certificates, write the Dean.**

## WAR EMERGENCY CERTIFICATES

The State Board of Education, in recognition of the teacher shortage in this state growing out of war conditions, will issue a War Emergency Certificate to elementary teachers on the basis of three years of training including practice teaching in an elementary school. Such a certificate will remain in force during the manpower emergency as determined by the State Board and for a three-year period following the termination of the emergency, provided the teacher is employed and continues to teach uninterruptedly on the certificate. War Emergency Certificates are issued on a year-to-year basis and for specific teaching positions.
