Lila Moe Concert marks 20th anniversary

Richard Farner (piano) and **Kathleen Vaught Farner** (horn) perform Mozart's Sonata in A minor and Debussy's "Estampes," both for solo piano, and Beethoven's Sonata for horn, and works by Koetsier, Zintner and Poulshock for horn and piano in the Lila Moe Memorial Concert at 3 pm on Oct. 19. The concert was founded 20 years ago by Richard Farner in memory of **Lila Moe**, wife of **Dick Moe**, dean emeritus of the School of the Arts. Lila died tragically in 1977 at the age of 48. Dick and their two daughters, **Cynthia** and **Suzan**, endowed the Lila Moe Scholarship because Lila's unanticipated passing left them with an appreciation of how difficult it would have been for someone in Lila's shoes to have been left behind. Proceeds from the concert benefit the scholarship fund which is awarded to a female student who has a strong interest in the arts, and who is either returning to PLU or attending PLU for the first time after having been out of college for a period of time.

Wellness Clinic in tip-top shape, says review

The PLU Wellness Clinic is feelin' fine. On Sept. 24, the clinic passed a credentialing survey conducted by Regence Washington Health. The survey, performed in accordance with standards set up by the National Commission for Quality Assurance, included a site visit and review of medical records, policies and procedures. The clinic passed the survey with scores of 91% for office operations and 95% for medical record review, which translate as flying colors. The clinic's success in the survey -- plus individual provider approval -- will allow it to participate in HMO Washington, the health maintenance organization sponsored by Regence Washington Health.

Date-rape survivor discusses sexual assault

Katie Koestner was a student at the College of William and Mary in Virginia when she was date raped in 1990. She went public with her story, but received an inadequate response from her college. Outraged, she took her case to the media, and spoke to Oprah Winfrey, Larry King, the Journal of Higher Education and TIME magazine, among others. On Oct. 14, the outspoken date-rape survivor and sexual prevention advocate talks about her experience with "the crime of silence" at two events at PLU. First, she presents her 1993 project with HBO, "No Visible Bruises: the Katie Koestner Story," and leads a discussion from 5-7 pm in The Cave. Koestner also presents the keynote address "No/Yes" from 8-10 pm in the CK. Special guest Brett A. Sokolow, J.D., will present with Koestner.

Shadel will show undercover FBI tapes of con artists abusing older victims, and teach audience members to be fraud fighters.
