LOCATION AND BUILDING

Young men and women yearning for an education will probably not be so particular in regard to the surroundings of a school, as to its facilities for imparting knowledge. And, yet, everything else being equal, beautiful surroundings are always preferred. In regard to location, our school is indeed fortunate.

The vicinity of Parkland is, as the name implies, a natural park, i. e. open prairie with groves and clusters of

trees at short and irregular intervals.

The ground is such that it is neither dusty in the

summer nor muddy in the winter.

The school being located a few miles south of the city of Tacoma is far enough from town to insure absolute quiet, so necessary for students, yet so near that students can avail themselves of the opportunities afforded by a larger city to hear the best of music, good lectures, etc.

The building is 190 feet long and 82 feet wide. In the main part the distance from the extremity of the front steps to the outside of the toilet rooms in the rear, is 125 feet. From the floor of the basement, to the top of the

flagstaff the height is 132 feet.

The tower on the main building, as well as the small ones on the wings, are ventshafts for the escape of foul air from all rooms in the building. Through openings in the brick wall fresh air is admitted to the heating radiators, each room being thus well supplied with fresh air.

The building is equipped with all modern convenien-

ces, heated by steam and lighted by electricity.

AIM AND OBJECT

The aim and object of this school is, by thorough instruction and Christian discipline to prepare young men and women for some useful work in life.

DEPARTMENTS

Preparatory, Collegiate,

Commercial,

Musical,

Normal,

Primary.

Preparatory Department

This includes a three years academic training, preparatory to entering the Collegiate department.

Collegiate Department

The main object of this department, is to impart a thorough classical education to young men and women.

Commercial Department

This department will give to the students a complete course in single and double entry Book-keeping, together with Penmanship, Business Correspondence, Rapid Calculations and drills in writing up the various classes of commercial papers, such as notes, deeds, mortgages, leases, bonds, bills of exchange, etc. Also Commercial Law, Shorthand, and Typewriting.

At the end of a two years course a diploma will be granted.

Music Department

Music is indeed one of the most glorious gifts of God.

The culture and development of musical talent will therefore be treated with due attention.

Arrangements have been made with Prof. Carlo A. Sperati to give instruction in music both vocal and instrumental.

Normal Department

This department is for the especial benefit of students who want to fit themselves for the work of teaching, and embraces a three years course at the end of which a diploma will be granted. Five of our students in this department, secured a teacher's certificate last spring after having attended our school for only two winters.

Primary Department

This department, besides giving instruction in the branches taught in the common school, also afford a fine opportunity for instruction in Religion, either in the Norwegian or English language, such as the Catechism, Biblehistory, singing of hymns, etc.

The pupils in this department are under the direct supervision of Miss Hannah Jahr, who occupies apartments near the rooms of the little folks.

Religion

This school is under the auspices of the Lutheran Church.

In addition to the regular religious instruction throughout the course, which all students are required to take, unless excused by the president at the request of parents or guardians, all students are required to be present at the daily devotional exercises in the chapel, and all students are expected to attend divine services every Sunday.

Discipline

No institution can attain a high measure of success, unless there be that order and propriety of deportment which obedience to well considered regulations secures. The government of the school may be characterized as parental. Patience and forbearance toward the weak and erring will not hinder the swift justice to the willful wrongdoer. A student who neglects his work, who persists in disobeying the regulations, or whose influence is pernicious, is not wanted and will not be retained in the institution.

Conditions of Admission

Each student must furnish satisfactory evidence of good character, and undergo an examination before being admitted into any of the advanced classes.

Donations

All who are familiar with the establishment and progress of educational institutions, will know that donations are always welcome.

We would especially submit for your careful consideration, endowments for the establishment of additional "professorships" in our university, as soon os our classes are sufficiently advanced.

Specimens of birds, fishes, animals, minerals, indian relics, etc., etc., will be thankfully received, and exhibited in our museum with due credit to the donor.

Scholarships

As an extra inducement to friends of the school to assist us and benefit themselves we make the following offer:—

Upon the payment of \$100.00 you are offered the choice of the following scholarships

(a.) Free school and room for three years. Can also be utilized by three students in one year or three different students in three different years. (b.) Free board, room and school for one year. Offer (b.) can be made use of only after a lapse of five years from the date of the issuance of the scholarship while offer (a.) can be used at once.

Expences

Tuition \$1.00 per week. This includes instruction in all branches, except instrumental music, shorthand and typewriting, which is extra. By instrumental music is meant private lessons on the piano, organ, violin, cornet, etc. But there is a chance to receive instruction in the cornet band or orchestra free of charge.

Room from 50 cents to \$1.00 per week, Board \$2.00 per week, For medical attendance \$1.00 per term.

PRIMARY DEPARTMENT.

Tuition 10 cents per week, Room 35 cents per week, Board for children under 12 years of age \$1.25 per week, Board for children over 12 years of age \$1.50 per week, Medical attendance \$1.00 per year.

All payments in advance at the beginning of each term.

The rooms are heated by steam, lighted by electricity, and furnished with chairs, tables, bedsteads, matresses and wardrobes, so that students need furnish only towels and bedclothes.

Hints to Students

To reach Parkland from Tacoma take Jefferson avenue electric car to Center street depot from which a steam motor makes a limited number of trips a day.

Trunks had better be left at the depot or wharf, and the management of the school will see to it that they are brought out to the University for about 50 cents a piece.




