ADMISSION—Students desiring academic credits leading to a degree or certification must meet the general University requirements for admission or must present evidence of being prepared for college work. Transcripts or a letter of good standing may be required.

TUITION—Tuition for late afternoon and evening classes is \$38.00 per semester hour. A matriculation fee of \$5.00 is charged to students who are registering at the University for the first time.

REGISTRATION—The Registrar's office in the Administration Building will be open for registration in these classes on January 31, from 6:00 to 9:00 p.m. Part-time students may also register by mail upon written request to this office. The University reserves the right to cancel any class for justifiable cause.

CHANGE IN REGISTRATION—All changes in registration must be officially made in the Registrar's office and completed in the business office. The change of registration fee is \$2.00. An unofficial withdrawal from a course will be regarded as a failure.

COURSE NUMBERING—Courses open to freshmen and sophomores are numbered 101-299 and are considered lower division subjects. Courses open to juniors and seniors are numbered 300-400 or above and are regarded as upper division subjects. Courses numbered 500 are open to graduate students only.

THE SCHEDULE—The number in parenthesis following the course title is the number of hours (semester) credits allowed for the course.
