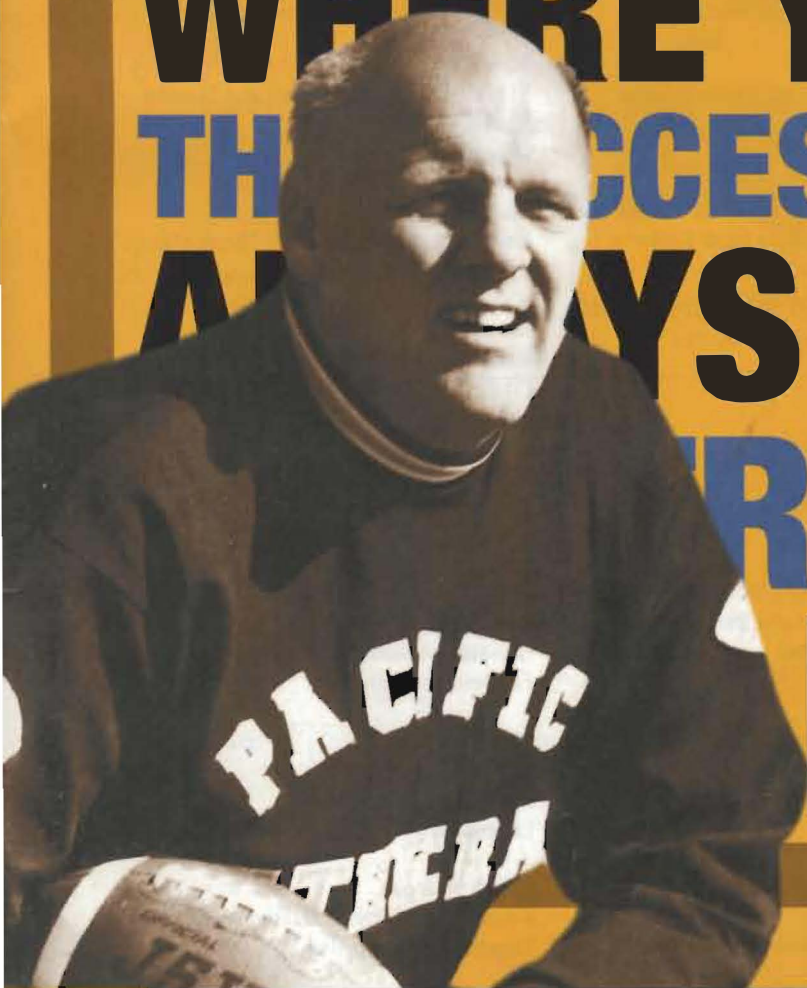

President starts off year with message of university's strength

This fall, the university welcomed an exceptionally well-qualified freshman class of 694 students, the largest class since 1988. Fall enrollment was at more than 3,400 students, well above goals.

That was among the good news President Loren J. Anderson delivered during his 12th State of the University address at the start of the semester. He opened the 114th academic year with a review of the past year, a look at the year ahead and reflections on the university's broader mission and purpose.

"The overall health of the university is strong, our mission is vital and relevant, our achievements are significant and our possibilities exciting," Anderson said.

Anderson also reported on the completion of the university's new long-range plan, PLU 2010: The Next Level of Distinction, which he called an important and clear framework that will help shape university priorities and directions over the next several years in areas such as student engagement, campus culture, academic distinction and resource allocation.

"The overall health of the university is strong, our mission is vital and relevant, our achievements are significant and our possibilities exciting."

He concluded his remarks with a report on his trip to Namibia earlier this year and a visit with eight PLU graduates who are serving their native country in key positions from foreign affairs to broadcast news.

He called them good examples of the difference PLU is making for all

students who are "preparing themselves for leadership, honing their sense of call, equipping themselves to be life-long learners, defining their goals and dreams."

Campus hosts student science research conference

Top student researchers from around the Northwest converged on PLU in November for two days' sharing of scientific research.

The Division of Natural Sciences hosted the 12th Regional Conference on Undergraduate Research of the Murdock College Science Research Program. About 450 students from more than 20 schools attended. Many of the schools, including PLU, have received grants from the M.J. Murdock Charitable Trust for summer research.

The Trust sponsors the conference at a different institution every year, so students and professors can see the results of each other's work.

Four PLU researchers were among the 16 chosen to give formal oral presentations on their projects. Kirsten Helleston '04 and Garrett Luetzgen '05 spoke on their work with biology professor Ann Auman on a project examining nitrogen-fixing bacteria in Lake Washington. Kjersta Larson '04 and Erin Hoge '04 presented their work with former chemistry professor Kristy Mardis on identifying molecules that might be used as "capsules" for delivering drugs to specific parts of the body. Other students, including those from PLU, filled Rieke Science Center with poster presentations of their work.

"It's wonderful to see student work of such high caliber, and it was an honor for PLU to host the students from the region and the Murdock trustees," President Loren J. Anderson said.

The Murdock Trust has committed \$3.8 million to PLU, mostly for student research and other programs in the Natural Sciences.

New MFA program in creative writing starts next summer

Writers who want to perfect their craft and earn a graduate degree but can't devote themselves to school full-time have an alternative with an innovative program starting at PLU.

The Low-Residency MFA in Creative Writing includes in-depth workshops during the summer, while writers work on their own and correspond with a mentor throughout the year. The program, the first of its kind in the Pacific Northwest, is scheduled to start in summer 2004.

"This is a writer-rich region," said professor Tom Campbell, chairman of the English Department. "The idea is to get a lot of great writers together here in Tacoma to bring increased visibility and energy to writing and writers."

In addition to PLU faculty, outside writers will teach in the selective program. Stan Rubin, who served as director of the Brockport Writers Forum and Videotape Library at State University of New York for 20 years and now lives in Port Townsend, Wash., will serve as director.

The program is intended for independent adults who wish to develop and pursue careers as writers, focusing on poetry, fiction or creative non-fiction. Participants will attend four intensive 10-day summer residencies consisting of workshops, lectures, mini-courses and will design a personal course of study with a chosen mentor for the following academic year.

Speakers explore issues of faith, character and peace at lectures this fall

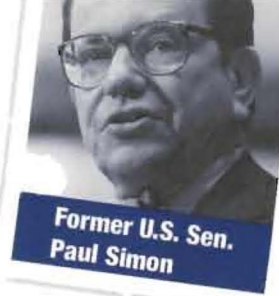
In a time when many Americans are searching for truth in government, former U.S. Sen. Paul Simon addressed the issue of character among leaders at a lecture at PLU in November.

Simon, a former presidential candidate, is professor of political science at

Southern Illinois University and director of SIU's Public Policy Institute. The institute says he leads the effort to provide objective and earnest assessments of public policy and their implications for government leaders, journalists and society at large.

Jim Wallis, executive director and editor of "Sojourners" - Christians for justice and peace - came to campus to discuss "Why and How We Commit to Peace." Wallis is recognized as the country's foremost Christian activist and is a commentator on ethics and public life and a spokesperson for faith-based initiatives to overcome poverty. In 1995, he formed Call to Renewal, a national federation of churches, denominations and faith-based organizations working to overcome poverty.

Also visiting PLU this semester was Walter Wink, who spoke on "The Myrth



of Redemptive Violence" and "God as Human." Wink is an internationally known lecturer and leader of nonviolence workshops who has worked in South Africa, the former East Germany, Northern Ireland, Palestine and other areas in crisis.

A professor who has researched language development gave the annual Bjug Harstad Memorial Lecture on the evolving Norwegian language. Lars Anders Kulbrandstad, a faculty member at Hedmark University College of Norway, presented "The Influx of English and Other Current Issues in Norwegian Language Policy." Norwegian is one of the few languages in the world that has been altered through a series of language reforms mandated by the government with the objective of creating one national language.

The annual lecture is given in honor of PLU's founder.

Campus Concierge answers questions, offers convenience

A full-service concierge catering to students, staff and visitors has replaced what was the PLU LuteCard and Information Center. And, just as it is in finer hotels, the new program serves as a clearinghouse for all things Lute.

The concierge was initiated last summer, when the LuteCard Information Center took over the services of the campus operator from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. each day. According to Valerie Seeley, who coordinates the new service, the idea was to compile a database of useful information—such as the best nearby hotels, the most popular local pizza, or a good place to take children while visiting Tacoma—and make it available to callers. This, combined with the center's usual services—PLU ticket outlet, meal-plan customization, and campus and community information center—ensures that students, staff and visitors can get the latest information on PLU and its surroundings.

It offers more as well, including just about anything a student or conference attendee might need in a pinch, from dictionaries and blue books to bandages and sewing kits. In addition, the Campus Concierge provides conveniences such as fax services, modem hookups and United Parcel Service drop-off and pick-up.

New savings plan lets parents buy future tuition at today's prices

A new savings plan gives students and parents another tool to ensure they get the most out of their educational dollar.

The Independent 529 Plan, named after the IRS code for college-savings plans, allows people to prepay college tuition into a tax-advantaged fund that

can be used at PLU or other private universities.

While the plan does not guarantee university entrance, it does guarantee that the percentage cost of tuition will be locked in at the time of purchase, not when the certificate is redeemed. A participant who prepays the equivalent 100 percent of PLU's 2003 tuition, for instance, will have 100 percent tuition costs covered whenever that future Lute attends school.

"This exciting new program allows families to save for college by investing in tuition certificates," said Sheri Tonn, vice president of finance and operations. "If I were a parent or grandparent hoping to send a student to PLU, I'd invest in this plan."

And if the student attends a public institution or a private university that does not participate in the plan, the money can still be used for tuition, without the locked-in cost savings, however.

New online community debuts next month; check your record now

Starting next month, alumni can update their own information through the Web and search for friends or jobs through an electronic directory. The PLU Alumni Online Community will go "live" Jan. 15, 2004.

The online community includes a searchable online directory of all alumni; career mentoring and job posting at the Career Center, a permanent PLU email address and a community Yellow Pages. That means you can find classmates easily and can use the directory to search alumni by class years, ZIP codes, employment fields, college clubs and more. In addition, you will be able to update your own record online and submit information for your alumni magazine. To protect your security and privacy, these steps have been taken:

■ **Password protection**—Only PLU alumni will have access to the system. Users will be prompted to provide specific information, including a unique personal access code. This code is the 10-digit

number above your name on the mailing label of Scene (the number begins with several 0s). After your first visit to the system, you can select your own password.

■ **Private review** before the system goes live on Jan. 15. Until then, the only record each alum will be able to see is his or her own. The record shows your business address and business phone information and home address. You will have the ability to add to that information, or reduce it, if you prefer.

■ **You control your record** and have complete flexibility over what is displayed. If you prefer, you can choose not to be listed. Only you can make changes to your record and no one can download it for spam email, mass mailings or other system abuses.

For access go to www.plualumni.org, select Online Community, and follow the prompts. Please take a look at your record between now and Jan. 15 and make any changes you would like. If your record isn't current, make any updates to the directory or call the alumni office for help. New 'Commons' bring students, services together in library and Ramstad

Some services geared toward academic and career growth have been moved and combined in hopes of creating synergy among departments with similar objectives and providing better service to students. The Mortvedt Library Commons and Ramstad Commons also have a friendlier feel.

Those associated with academic support—the Writing Center and Academic Assistance—have moved to the library, where students and advisors can take advantage of the many educational and research opportunities.

Ramstad Commons, similarly, has become a hive of activity, with Academic Advising, Career Development, the Center for Public Service, Cooperative Education, Student Employment and the Volunteer Center all moving under one roof. The premise behind the consolidation is the same—enable students to easily take advantage of the many opportunities before them, all in one place.

"The group seems to be working together very well," said Pamela Martin, administrative assistant in Career Development. "The communication has never been better."

Grant offers wild hope to students and faculty willing to ask questions

Children talk about what they want to be when they grow up. Often, college students focus on what career they'll have. But PLU wants to inspire students to think more critically about their lives with a deeper question:

"What will you do with your one wild and precious life?"

Directors of a new PLU program borrowed the line from Mary Oliver's poem "The Summer Day" because it fits: "wild" because so much is possible and unpredictable and the complexities of the world are so great, and "precious" because the life of each individual student is vital and full of promise.

The new initiative to help students find their calling has been named the Wild Hope Project. The university has always worked on the premise that each individual is a gift. With a \$2 million grant from the Lilly Foundation, this five-year project will help students use their gifts and find their meaning and purpose in life, said Paul Menzel, philosophy professor and project director.

The project will challenge the university to grapple with vocation in an intellectually rich way, to nurture students to claim meaning and purpose for their lives and to cultivate faculty and staff to help facilitate understanding by students, Menzel said. Among other things, the grant will allow the university to offer enhanced service-learning courses, a more provocative first-year orientation program, study seminars for faculty and more personnel in Advising, Career Development and Campus Ministry.

One of the core tenets of PLU's mission is to help students discover their calling – what Martin Luther referred to as "vocation" – and to find ways to use their talents to serve others.

"We wish for every student a dynamic, purpose-filled life that, regardless of

specific career or avenue of service, is charged and energized by a lively sense of calling and vocation and a commitment to action," President Loren J. Anderson said.

The Wild Hope Project was the subject of the University Fall Conference, and the consultant who helped write the grant proposal spoke about the

importance of nurturing vocation.

"You are going to be a mentoring community, a mentoring environment," Sharon Parks told faculty and staff members.

Parks is associate director and on faculty at the Whidbey Institute in Clinton, Wash. She has been an associate professor at the Harvard Divinity School and the Weston Jesuit School of Theology and served in faculty and research positions in leadership and ethics at the Harvard Business School and the Kennedy School of Government. She is the author of "Big Questions, Worthy Dreams: Mentoring Young Adults in Their Search for Meaning, Purpose and Faith" and co-author of "Common Fire: Leading Lives of Commitment in a Complex World."

Students have big questions about how poverty, crime, environment, politics, family and debt affect the world

and their lives, she says. While trying to succeed in school and preparing for the future, the core questions about what they can do and contribute can be overlooked.

Parks said students need mentors who help them examine such questions, while recognizing and nurturing their talents and dreams. Good mentoring involves recognizing not just “who I am” but “who I could be.”

Each person’s unique talents, skills and dreams make them an individual unlike any other. And when formulating their dreams, Parks said students should ask themselves,

“Will the dream ultimately bless others?”

“The biggest questions do take us deeper into the mystery,” she said.

Provost prepares academic roadmap to guide university

Academic excellence and financial strength are two core aspirations of PLU 2010. To reach them, PLU is developing an academic roadmap to provide “driving directions for the preferred route” to a strengthened, academically and financially viable academic program. Since January, various members of the faculty and administration have taken steps toward the creation of the map, with the goal of creating a new academic vision.

“We will recreate the rose window for a new century.”

“To distinguish ourselves in the competitive higher education marketplace, to build on our academic strengths, and to address the challenges we face forthrightly, we need to ‘go deep’ into ourselves - recreating a Rose Window for the 21st century,” Provost James Pence said. In comparing the academic program to the PLU logo, Pence urged a re-examination of curriculum and academic structure in light of traditional commitments.

At Fall Conference, Pence outlined several strategies for grappling with difficult changes such as the possibility of adding or removing academic programs to best meet curricular and financial needs. “Can we make a curriculum that

is distinctively us?” Pence asked.

Revising a quote from Martin Luther King Jr., he said PLU is working in the “fierce urgency of the curricular now,” and that changes will come.

The provost has asked for input on the development of the roadmap from

the Faculty Assembly, the Faculty Executive Committee, the Faculty Affairs Committee, the Educational Policies Committee, the Academic Deans’ Council, the Academic Support Council, the Graduate Council and other individuals. **S**

Anthropology professor **Laura Klein**’s book “Women and Men in World Cultures” (McGraw-Hill, 2004) was released in October.

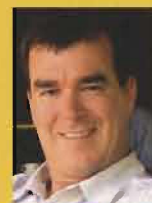


Chandra Manning, assistant professor of history, won the annual C. Vann Woodward Dissertation Prize from the Southern

"We try to use Chinese as much as possible in communication," said James Kozak '04, who returned from studying abroad in China last spring and lives in the house. "It's a comfortable environment."

The Chinese House is a pilot program for a proposed International Hall on campus. Ten students make their home there – eight are part of the Chinese studies program, one is a resident assistant and one is from China. Professor Jingzhen Li also has an office in the house.

According to Mike Sosulski, assistant professor of German who spearheaded the International Hall project for the language department, immersion in the target language is invaluable and provides the best retention.

Not everyone in the hall speaks at the same level. Some are just starting to learn the language and others are fluent. Regardless, residents have pledged to speak only Chinese in their study room – where they hang out, watch movies and do homework. Using the language in hallways and rooms is encouraged, but not mandatory.

The house is place for students to practice the language in a real way. Paul Manfredi, professor of Chinese, sees the potential for improvement in class. "I know they have a place they can practice Chinese – it serves the purpose in a fun way," he said.

Sometimes, the fun is what it's all about. "We're all classmates, so we're all friends," said Kozak. Some of the residents have been to China together and have moved through the levels of Chinese with each other.

The house also serves as a place for students to prepare for studying abroad and as a transition point for students returning from overseas. It duplicates the Chinese experience as closely as possible – which also benefits students who don't get the chance to study abroad.

Kristine Keun-Ah Chang '06, an off-campus student working on her third language, said she goes there to practice her language

skills. "It's a great place to communicate in Chinese," she said.

Students who aren't part of the Chinese Studies program are always welcome as well, and Kozak said students from Chinese speaking countries visit frequently.

The Chinese House has integrated itself into Hinderlie without any problems. According to resident Kim Croft '03, the wing often participates in hall events and other Hinderlie residents wander down to try to learn a little Chinese.

One of the house members' responsibilities is to provide at least five campus wide programs a year – designed to increase knowledge of Chinese language and culture. The Chinese House raises awareness and promotes diversity through exposure. "Some people didn't even know PLU offered Chinese," Croft said. "If people know about it and get excited, houses will probably happen for other languages."

The vision for the proposed International Hall, which would either be located in one residence hall or in wings across campus, is to have a house for each language taught at PLU and an English-speaking global/international studies wing.

"Everybody feels pretty good about how things are going," said Tom Huelsbeck, director of Residential Life. "We're actively exploring possibilities for an International Hall."

Manfredi says an International Hall would make different programs more aware of each other. "I'm anxious to see it succeed."

The plans for the hall are well under way, with a task force meeting once a week to aim for its opening in Fall 2004. "It's just so exciting," Huelsbeck said. "We have students who want to use where they live as a place to learn." □

Solveig Robinson, director of the Publishing and Printing Arts program, says there has never been a publishing phenomenon like the success of the "Harry Potter" series.



Harry Potter flies into curriculum; class studies publishing phenomenon



Boy wizards, house elves and Bertie Botts' Every Flavour Beans aren't just for kids.

The Harry Potter book series, by J.K. Rowling, is so popular that the fifth book, "Harry Potter and the Order of the Phoenix," sold about 5 million copies in United States during the first 24 hours of its release.

"The numbers are mind boggling," said Solveig Robinson, assistant professor of English and Publishing and Printing Arts program director. "Nobody's ever sold that many books that fast."

The volume and popularity are so amazing that she taught a unit about the Harry Potter phenomenon in publishing history as part of The Book in Society class this fall. The class, one of three required for a Publishing and Printing Arts minor, studies the history of publishing and literacy, the role of print in culture and genres. PLU also offers a children's literature class, taught by associate professor of English Suzanne Rahn that includes a unit on Harry Potter.

So, what's the explanation for the mass appeal of these books?

"I think the popularity of them is in the storytelling," Robinson said. The books tell suspenseful tales of teenage wizards with magic powers and tools like flying cars who battle evil forces, but still have time for friendship, family and school. Harry Potter, with his lightning bolt birthmark on his forehead, has become a hero for readers of all ages.

Robinson attributes the huge volume of sales to the fact that families are buying more than one copy so they don't have to share the book and wait to read it. Also, collectors are buying all the different versions of the book such as each

country's edition, adult copies, children's copies and books on tape.

When the much-anticipated fifth book came out in June, children across the country were allowed to stay up past their bedtime and dress up like wizards for midnight release parties at bookstores. Robinson attended some of them too as part of the research for her class. "One of the best things about going to the launches was seeing people united for something so positive and fun," she said. "People really wanted to get a book in their hands."

"It was very exciting," said Jennifer Beaulac '05, a student in Publishing and Printing Arts who went to releases with Robinson. "The Harry Potter story is unique in history." She says the books have inspired children to read even though the text might be hard for them.

Difficult or not, a lot of kids finished all 870 pages of the book quickly.

"Any book that would inspire preteens to stay up all night and read solidly for 36 to 48 hours with that kind of attention to detail has got to be a pretty amazing book," Robinson said.

But the books aren't just for children. "Publishers have really acknowledged that sales are going to kids and adults," Robinson said. A campaign to market the books to adults is under way. Adult

covers have been made so that they are taken more seriously and adults feel comfortable reading them in public.

"I don't think there's anything to be ashamed of or concerned about," Robinson said. "You should read for pleasure." Her students read one romance novel and one action/adventure novel to show them that reading things other than "literature" is fun. "The idea that all reading has to be serious, good for you reading is not realistic," she said.

Beaulac says the assignments in Robinson's class, and the rest of the PPA program, have provided her with tools she'll use in the workplace. "That program is fabulous. Every class I took showed me another vista." The program was featured in an article in the Spring 2003 issue of Publishing Research Quarterly, a prominent publishing studies journal.

Robinson's animation in class inspired Beaulac. Robinson is the managing editor of the journal Perspectives in Biology and Medicine published by The Johns Hopkins University Press and uses her real world experience to teach. "She's living it and teaching it at the same time," Beaulac said. "She has one foot in the publishing world."

Robinson's first book, "A Serious Occupation: Literary Criticism by Victorian Women Writers," was published in February. She has also worked as an editor for textbooks and magazines as well as for little presses and big presses.

"That's what has been so fun about teaching in the PPA program here," Robinson said. "I get to do both the things I really love. I finally get a chance to combine them. It helps ground things. When students ask what it's like in the real world, I can be concrete." □

COLLEGE BONDS CREATE LIFELONG FRIENDSHIPS

THEY MET AS FRESHMEN at PLU nearly six decades ago.

Since then they have experienced a world war, seven marriages, 22 children and 49 grandchildren, three knee replacements and one new hip. And throughout everything life brings, they've stayed in touch, holding annual reunions for the past 25 years. These 14 friends don't know where they'll be every September, but they know they will be together.

"As we've gotten older, we do think it is remarkable we've gotten to do this every year," said Carol Storaasli '47 of Tacoma.

The rest of the group is Carol's husband, Lester '49; Dorothy '49 and Ralph '48 Gunderson of Snohomish, Wash.; Myrtle '48 and Oscar "Pete" Peterson '49 of Edgewood, Wash.; Ginny '48 and Marv Johnson '48 of Auburn, Wash.; Betty '48 and Jack '49 Ostrander of Tacoma; Lois '49 and Don Ewing of Seaford, Del.; and Ardys '48 and Raleigh Hughes of St. Maries, Idaho.

Most of them are of Scandinavian descent, and all seven couples have been married more than 50 years.

"I guess we all think marriage is pretty important," said Storaasli, who celebrated her 56th wedding anniversary in August.

All but two of them – Raleigh and Don – are PLU grads.

All retired now, the group includes former schoolteachers, counselors, coaches, principals, medical field workers, a Campbell's Soup executive and a wood products plant engineer.

"One of the blessings of this group is good health," said Myrtle Peterson.

Their first group get-together was in 1963 when they still had children at home. Over the years, there were others, and 25 years ago, the couples decided to make it an annual event. The couples take turns hosting each other, rotating by maiden name.

"We look forward to our reunion each year, and the couple who is playing host notifies the others each spring where we'll be meeting," said Ginny Johnson. "We wait with bated breath to see where we'll go next year."

This year, the choice was Pendleton, Ore., where they visited the Pendleton Woolen Mills, Underground Tours and the Wildhorse Casino.

Other meeting places have included Williamsburg, Va.; Branson, Mo.; Harrison Hot Springs, British Columbia; Big Fork, Mont.; and Sandpoint, Idaho. Next year's trip is already planned: a four-day cruise off the Washington and Oregon coast to Victoria, British Columbia.

"We don't really need a whole lot of entertainment, because we're apart all year and when we get together we just talk, talk, talk," Dorothy Gunderson said.

Some of those who live near each other see each other occasionally throughout the year, and they're in touch at the holidays. But this annual fall gathering is their big rendezvous, and they've got piles of albums full of pictures from their journeys.

All the group members maintain an interest in PLU, which was still called

Pacific Lutheran College when they attended. Their 1998 gathering was held during Homecoming and the 50th class reunion for many of the group.

The grads remember living in Harstad, then called Old Main, and seeing each other every day as students. They chuckle about sunbathing on the roof, which they really weren't supposed to do. That led to their name that still sticks: the Roof Rats.

Along with the good times, they remember harder days during World War II, when the men were away and PLU struggled financially.

"Before WW II, PLU almost went bankrupt, but the end of the war and the GI Bill brought PLU back," Marvin Johnson said.

And bringing the boys back was another benefit of the bill.

"It was heaven for the gals to have them all return to the PLU campus on the GI Bill," Ardys Hughes said.

Remembering the past and celebrating the years is a joy to this group.

"We feel blessed, we really do," Storaasli said, echoing the sentiment of every member. "We get together and enjoy each other and have fun." [S]

FROSTY'S PHILOSOPHY GUIDES PEOPLE TO BE THEIR BEST, ON AND OFF THE FIELD

To some people, football Coach Frosty Westering's legacy at PLU will be all about wins. The numbers speak for themselves:

Four national championships (1980, 1987, 1993 and 1999) in eight title game appearances.

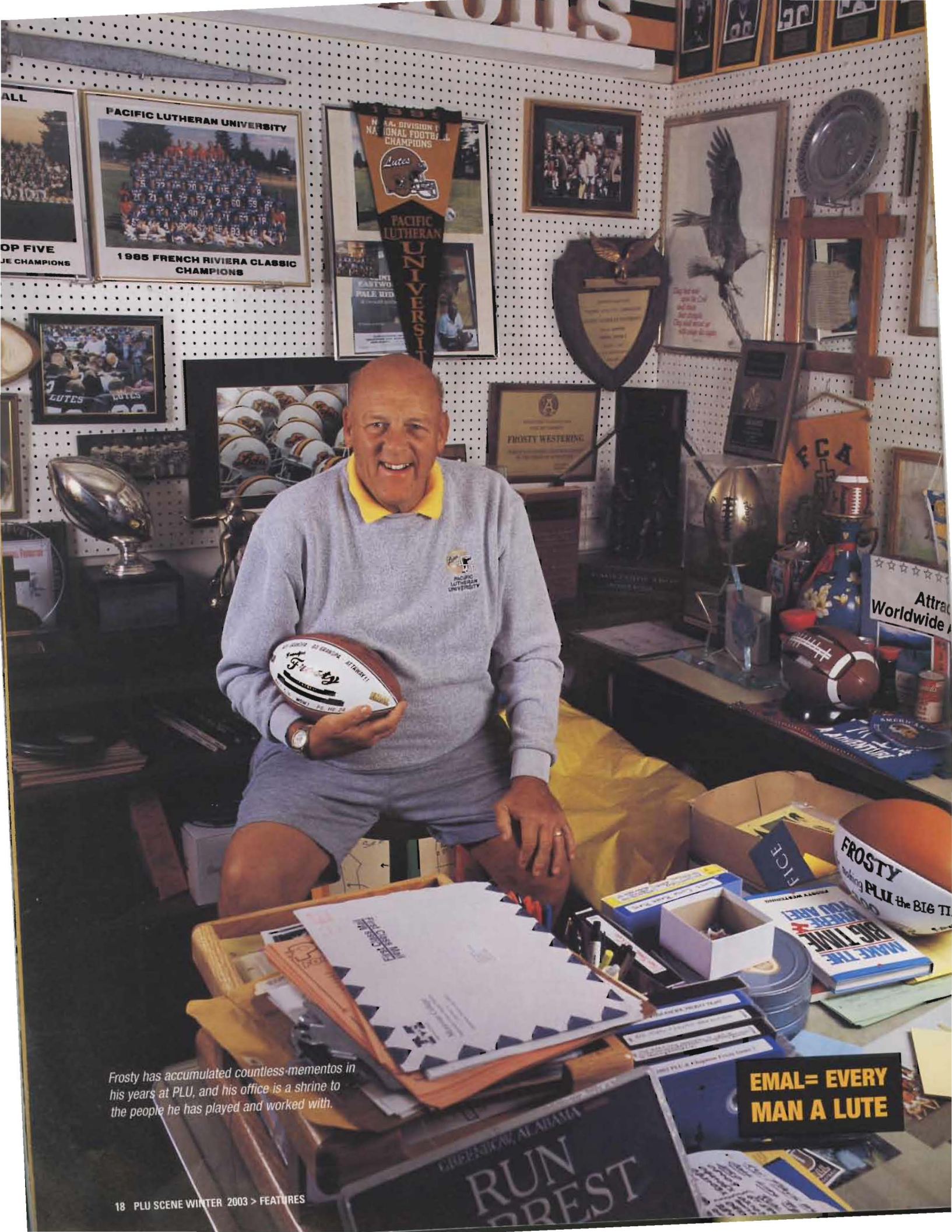
Nineteen national postseason appearances. And 32 consecutive winning seasons at PLU.

A 305-96-7 win-loss record in 39 total seasons, including a 261-70-5 win-loss record in his 32 years at PLU. And he holds the distinction of being one of only 10 college coaches with 300 career wins.

To Frosty, as the affable coach is known everywhere, the championship trophies and winning seasons serve a bigger purpose. Success on the field gives him a platform from which he can pass on meaningful life lessons to those who rub up against the football program, particularly players, but also parents, cheerleaders, coaches and students. He is also a respected professor who has influenced countless non-athletes in the classroom. >>>

"A championship, in the world, gives you authenticity that you did it," says Frosty, admitting that most people wouldn't listen to him if his teams finished 0-9 or 1-8. "The championships just validate that you can coach. But that really doesn't say anything until you ask, 'What was the trip like?' The trip was the greatest thing in life whether we won or not."

It's the trip—the journey through 39 years with thousands of different lives to touch—that drives this man. Now, following 32 winning seasons at PLU, the legendary Lute coach with two artificial hips has walked off the field. For a man who has lived his life and titled his book with his motto, "Make the Big Time Where You Are," this will be not so much a retirement as it is a sidestep into others areas where he can influence the lives of others. He plans to finish a second book, visit his grandchildren and lend a hand to a national coaches association that wants to learn more about his philosophy.

"From a legacy standpoint it's really not the wins and losses, although those are important," said Paul Hoseth, who coached alongside Frosty for more than 20 years and is now athletic director and dean of the School of Physical Education. "But I don't think that's really too important in the big scheme of things from his perspective. It's an attitude of how to play the game, how to coach the game, that I think will live on.

"The impact that he has had on students who both played and didn't play football here has been amazing, and not only at this institution but many

others. I just can't imagine people not being impacted in some way."

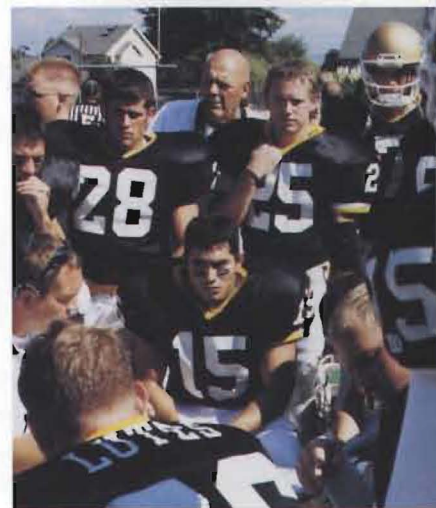
Frosty's son Scott, who was an All-America tight end at PLU and has been the team's offensive coordinator since 1984, agrees with Hoseth about his dad. "He's one of those unique guys in life that you come across that can make anybody feel good about themselves regardless of their walk in life. One thing I've learned is living the saying, 'Your true character shows in how you treat people that can do nothing for you,' and that's how my dad has lived."

FROM SMALL TOWN TO SMALL COLLEGES, FROSTY DEVELOPED HIS WINNING WAYS

Forrest Westering's coaching philosophy, which is more a life philosophy, got its start in the small eastern Iowa town of Missouri Valley. Frosty, whose father owned a pharmacy and whose mother was an English teacher, spent a good portion of his childhood on football and baseball fields.

It was in Missouri Valley that the three most significant parts of his life began to gain focus.

First was his faith in God. Late in his high school years, Frosty accepted an invitation to play for a local fastpitch softball team. He was impressed by the pitcher, an outstanding athlete who played an aggressive game. Turns out the pitcher was a pastor. "I didn't know pastors could be good athletes," says Frosty. "I got to know him as an inspirational man of God. He was such an influence on me that I gave my life to Christ." >>>

SINCE 1972, PLU FOOTBALL HAS BEEN KNOWN MORE FOR THE UNCOMMON:

- Preseason practices start with a three-day Breakaway where team-building games, skits and songs are in and where footballs and pads are out.
- "Attaway" cheers for a laundry list including Mt. Rainier, alums and other PLU athletic teams.
- When a Lute player knocks down an opponent, he is the first to offer a hand to help him up.
- Trash talking or posing for the crowd result in a seat on the bench.
- "Afterglow," following all games, a gathering in the hundreds including players, coaches, parents and friends where hugs, compliments, love, laughter and tears flow in equal portions.
- The double-win, which emphasizes the satisfaction of playing to one's personal potential over the final result on the scoreboard.
- Frostyisms such as "The real measure of me is not what I can do compared to others, but what I can do compared to my best self," "Character: Our best piece of equipment," and "The longer we play the better we get."

Those uncommon elements, magnified by phenomenal success on the field, have brought both local and national prominence to the coach and the program. It explains why, approximately 10 years ago, a stamped envelope addressed simply, "Frosty, Tacoma, WA," arrived at the PLU athletic department. It also explains several articles in the large national magazine, *Sports Illustrated*. In its 2000 college football preview issue, *SI* dubbed Frosty's program as "The Nicest Team in Football."

Second was a commitment to family as he and grade school sweetheart Donnabelle Jones continued a courtship that eventually led to their marriage in 1951.

Finally came his love for coaching football. While still in high school, Frosty first felt the satisfaction of coaching, leading Missouri Valley grade school football teams.

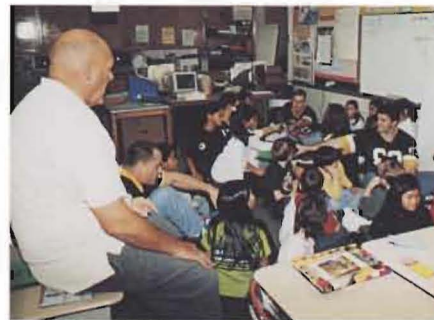
After one semester at Drake University, Frosty, then 18, joined the Marine Corps, spending time in Guam and China as part of post-World War II occupation forces. He later returned stateside, where he played football for the El Toro (Calif.) Marines.

Frosty left the service to attend Northwestern University, where for two years he practiced but saw little playing time on the gridiron. When his dad was diagnosed with lung cancer, Frosty returned to Missouri Valley, at the same time transferring to the University of Omaha, 28 miles away. He played one season at the Nebraska school, earning honors as a defensive end and tight end.

"We played both ways then. One thing I learned to do was block punts. These are all phony teeth here," Westering said with laugh while pointing to his top front teeth. "You see, in those days there were no face masks."

Frosty finished his degree at age 25 and declared himself ready for his own program. "I was so excited. I had all these coaching ideas and I didn't know how I was going to put them together. I knew this, all the coaches I'd had believed that football was war and winning was it. They didn't know there was another way or they didn't believe in another way. I had this idea that I wanted to coach like I'd like to have been coached but never was."

Frosty immediately put his philosophy to good use, turning struggling Iowa high school football programs at Elkader and Fairfield into winners. The Fairfield job led directly to his first college head coaching position at Parsons College, located in Fairfield. He also turned that program into a winner, including an unbeaten 10-0 record in 1962, his first season. After two years

he moved on to Lea College in southern Minnesota, where for five seasons his teams won nearly 60 percent of their games.

In the middle of all this, Frosty worked on his master's and doctorate at Colorado State College, now the University of Northern Colorado. It was there that he was first exposed to a fledgling organization called Fellowship of Christian Athletes. "All of a sudden Donna and I realized, this is it, this is what can tie my faith directly into athletics," says Frosty. "My mission is to share Christ through football without forcing it on anybody. (FCA) really solidified my mission as a coach."

Frosty says he shares the philosophy of Amos Alonzo Stagg, one of the greatest coaches in college football history, who finished his 57-year coaching career with 314 wins, ranking him eighth on the all-time coaching victory list. Stagg had studied for a life in Christian ministry before realizing that football was his passion. The coach, after whom the NCAA Division III national championship game is named, made coaching football his ministry, serving God by leading young men to success on the gridiron and in life. "I feel exactly the same way," Westering said.

FROSTY'S ENTHUSIASM WOWS COACH SEARCH COMMITTEE

In 1972, Frosty came to a PLU program that had enjoyed a modicum of success with three consecutive winning seasons under Roy Carlson.

The 32-year marriage between Frosty and PLU, however, almost didn't happen. ❖❖❖

The committee assigned the task of finding a new coach named three finalists, all with college-level coaching experience, including the head coach of a national championship program. After interviewing each candidate, "the decision was we didn't feel comfortable with the people that we had interviewed," Hoseth said.

Westering wasn't on that list. David Olson, then PLU athletic director and a former assistant football coach at Wartburg College in Iowa, remembered Frosty from his days at Parsons College. "I got to know and respect his football coaching ability and the discipline his teams showed," Olson remembered. He called Frosty to see if he was interested in the position, and an initial meeting in the Twin Cities between the coach and then PLU financial vice president Dean Buchanan went well.

Frosty was invited for an interview. Toting a couple of briefcases loaded with films and papers documenting his years at Parsons and Lea colleges, Frosty, then 44, came for a visit.

"It was no different than it is now. He was excited," Hoseth said. "After the weekend people thought, wow, what is this all about? He was not only enthusiastic, but he approached things a lot differently than many other coaches."

As PLU's assistant coaches, Hoseth and Joe Broeker got their first glimpse of the man who would soon become their boss on the field. Hoseth recalls asking Frosty during his interview about his thoughts on how to treat people and how to respond to students. That provided the first insight into the depth of Frosty's feelings about football and what really matters in life.

Frosty and his Lutes have touched thousands of lives over the years.

Airline pilots and flight attendants are appreciated with a PLU football T-shirt and an "Attaway" cheer. For nearly 30 years, the lives of Tacoma area grade and middle school students have been touched by football players who serve as mentors.

"One of the great things in this idea of a legacy, my dad's never really stubbed his toe, blackened his eye," Scott Westering said. "Not that he hasn't made some bad choices and stuck his foot in his mouth, but he's been true to who he says he is and what he values and who he is as a man and as a coach and a person."

While such praise is common, Frosty points out with a laugh that he does not walk on water. "Well, I know where a few rocks are, so I can stand on the rocks."

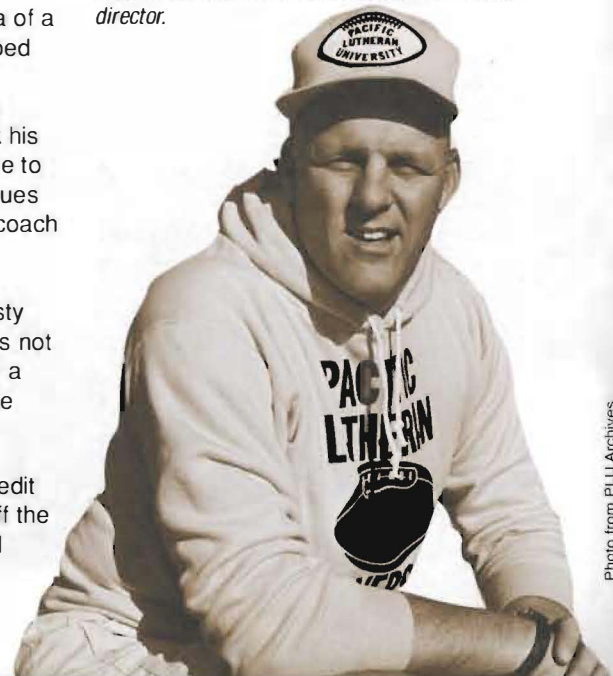
Players from across the country credit Frosty with their success on and off the field. Steve Ridgway '76 graduated

from Puyallup High School in the early 1970s. An outstanding prep football player, he chose a scholarship from the University of Colorado over Notre Dame University. After one semester, realizing that the Division I program wasn't for him, he transferred to PLU at the suggestion of a family friend, then University of Puget Sound head coach Bob Ryan. "That recommendation by an arch-rival of PLU," said Ridgway, "was to my benefit."

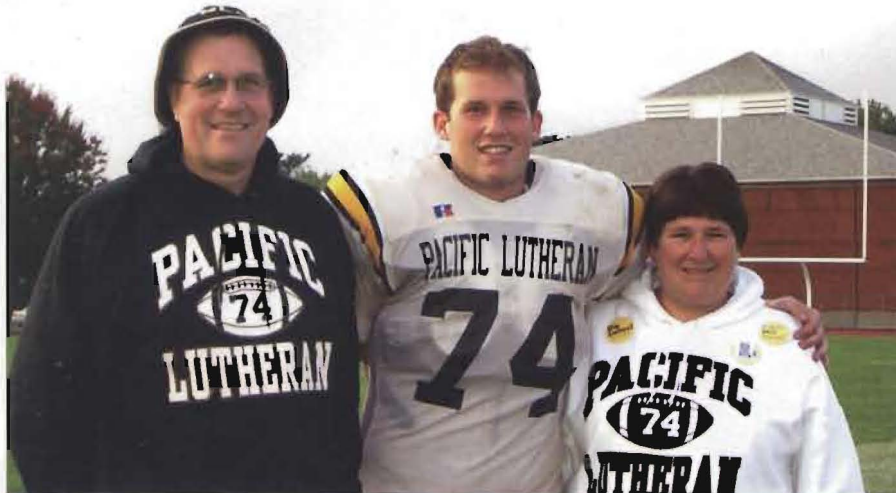
Ridgway, an All-America linebacker in 1976, remains involved in the program as a mentor to team captains. He owes much, he says, to his college coach.

"Frosty Westering showed me how to play the game the right way, what athletics really was all about: that it was bigger than just stepping on the field, making tackles, interceptions, winning games," Ridgway said. "In the time that I was at PLU Frosty gave me a faith to build my life on, he gave me a hope for the future and a sense that love never fails." [8]

Tradition and camaraderie draw athletes to crew – even at the break of dawn



From early morning workouts in the dark to team breakfasts and bus trips to regattas, crew at PLU is all about tradition and working together.

"There is a rich tradition," said Doug Nelson '90, who was head coach from 1991 to 2000 and now assists with the program.

Rowers credit those who came before them, including current head coach Tone Lawver '95, with inspiring them. Alums come talk to the team about the early days of the Lute Rowing Club and the efforts to make it a varsity sport.

"We definitely admire the alumni," said Amy Hildebrandt '05, co-captain of the women's team. "Without them we wouldn't have a program."

Team members appreciate the camaraderie of the sport. All rowers have to be in sync for a boat to do well.

"We're working together to achieve a goal," said David Bentsen '06, who rows on the varsity men's eight and lightweight men's four boats. "Every little thing that happens affects everyone.

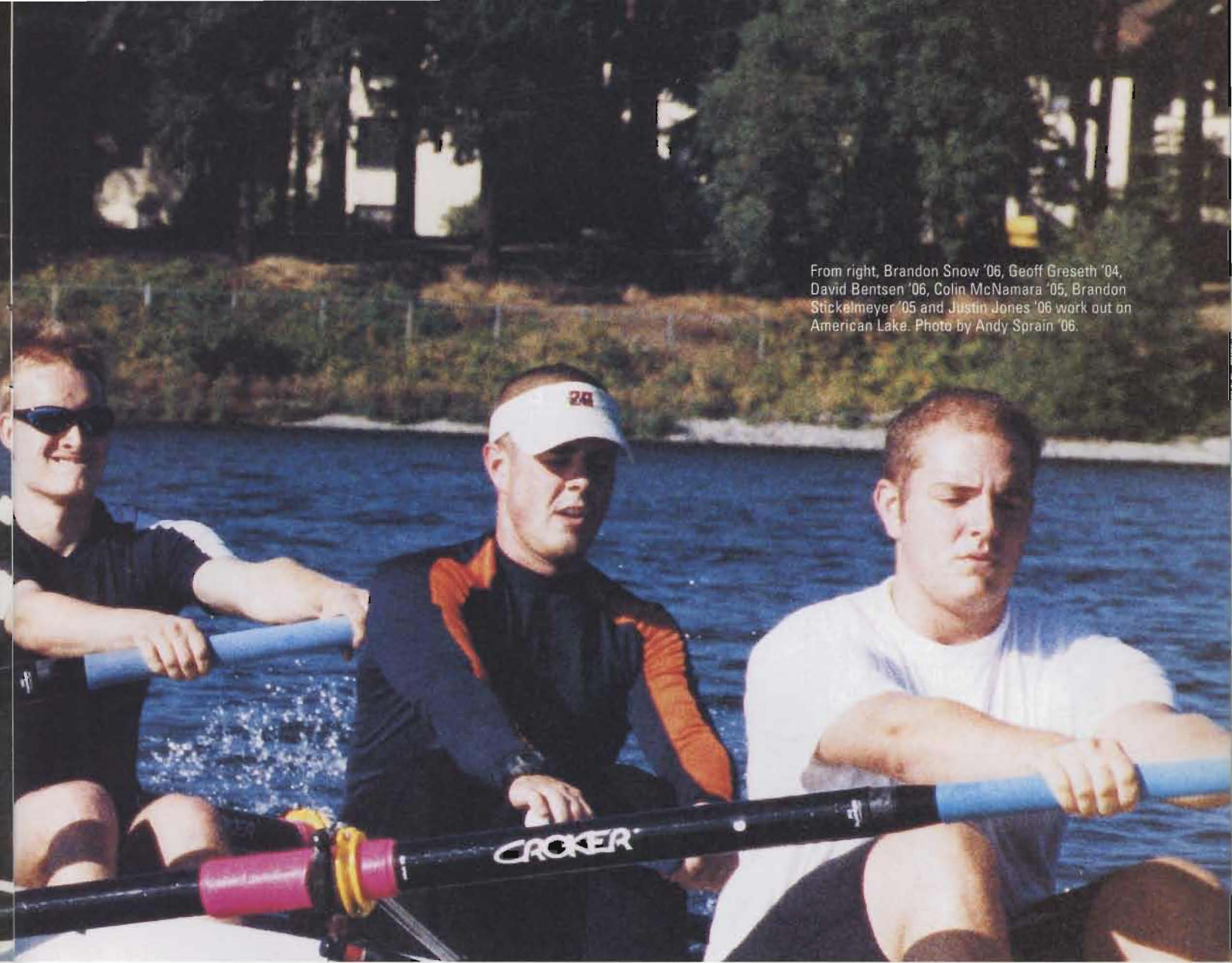
You have to be in tune with the other athletes."

Hildebrandt said team members put all differences aside when it comes to competing.

"When we're on the water together we click so well," she said. "I have never been in a sport that was so team focused."

The varsity teams typically arrive at American Lake – which has served as PLU's home since the program began – by 5 a.m. weekdays. The teams warm up around the boathouse then carefully take the racing shells they will use that day off their racks and down to the shore, about 150 yards away. The varsity teams practice until 6:45 or so, when they go to breakfast together then head to class.

Rowers get used to the early morning workouts and plan their study, sleep

and social schedules around them.

"It's a sacrifice, but it's a priority for us," Bentsen said. "It's something we all want to do."

Team members make a point to eat meals together and socialize. Crew members don't have downtime on a field to get to know each other like in many team sports.

"When we're on the water we're really focused," Bentsen said. "Off the water we're a little more kicked back."

Both the men's and women's teams have represented the university well at the conference, regional and national levels. In 2002, the women's team finished fourth at the NCAA Division III national regatta, and in 2003, the women won the conference championship for the second straight year.

The men's team won the national small college championships in

Philadelphia in 2002. Both teams have consistently performed well at regionals.

The men's program started in the winter of 1964. The women took to the water six years later. Because the Northwest Conference doesn't sponsor crew as a sport, PLU competes in the Northwest Collegiate Rowing Conference along with the University of Puget Sound, Willamette University, Lewis & Clark College and several schools along the West Coast.

This year's varsity teams consist of 16 women and nine men rowing in boats with four or eight members. In the novice program "the numbers are huge," Lawver said. "We recruit heavily from the incoming freshmen to fill the novice ranks."

But because it's a sport new to many, the numbers drop as the season progresses.

Many rowers have achieved success after graduation. Three former rowers have been inducted into the PLU Athletic Hall of Fame: Doug Herland '73, who became PLU's only Olympic medalist when he won a bronze as a coxswain in the 1984 Los Angeles Games; Pam Knapp Black '84, who became the first PLU rower to win a gold medal at nationals and went on to compete for the U.S. National team; and Dave Peterson '74, a rower from 1971-74 and coach from 1975-85.

In addition, Bjorn Larsen '03 won three gold medals at the U.S. Nationals last summer as a member of the Pennsylvania Athletic Club in Philadelphia. Sarah Jones '93 is entering her fifth national team appearance and is shooting for her second Olympic appearance in 2004. [S](#)

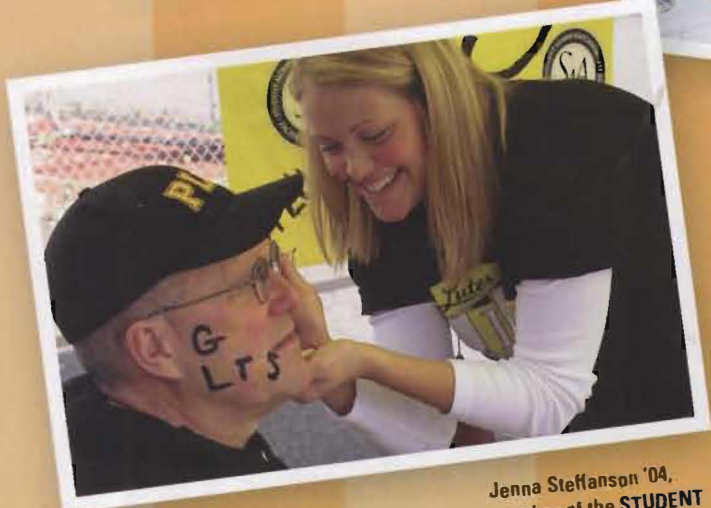

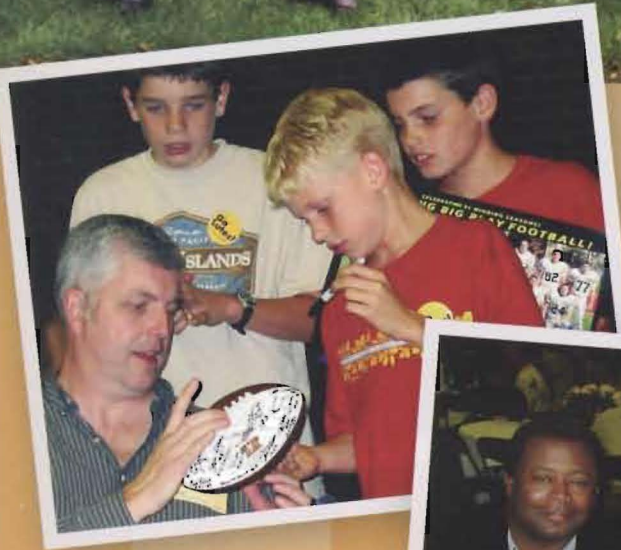

Mountain climber learns more after his descent

Curt Peterson '81 has climbed Mt. McKinley and almost made it up Mt. Everest twice. But he had more uphill battles after trying to conquer the world's highest peaks.

The Kirkland, Wash., businessman learned from his climbs that getting to the top of the mountain wasn't his only goal. Driven and determined, on his 2000 trip to Everest, Peterson reached 20,000 feet with a broken ankle before being forced to abandon his quest for the summit. He later learned he had broken the record for the highest altitude reached while injured.

His second attempt earlier this year had to be called off when he suffered potentially fatal cerebral edema caused by high altitude. He stayed on the mountain longer than doctors wanted, hoping to complete his climb, but finally admitted he had to get medical care. He continues to recover. He says he's not affected daily, but calls himself "permanently compromised," meaning he'll always be susceptible to altitude sickness and likely cannot climb again.

But his trips to Everest were still successful, as they raised money and awareness of causes important to Peterson and made him more resolute in his goals of outreach.

"When you've seen God pull you through on that last hurdle time and time again, you're determined to give it that final effort," he said.

After reaching the summit of McKinley in 1999, Peterson made his first Everest ascent a chance to raise money and awareness about Asperger's Syndrome, a condition related to autism that affects social interaction skills and afflicts his 18-year-old son, Kurt. Peterson raised

\$10,000 for the Asperger's Foundation, which indirectly led to a \$10 million donation from the Gates Foundation for the Autism Research Center in Seattle.

His last climb garnered pledges of \$10,000 for the McFadden-Willis Children Memorial Foundation (www.mssmfoundation.org/). His cousin, Christine McFadden of Merced, Calif., started the foundation in memory of her four children who were murdered by her ex-husband in 2002. She has started scholarships, given money to build a reading room at a library and hopes to build a pediatric wing and children's playroom at Mercy Medical Center.

"It's proof that good can come from evil," Peterson said.

He credits PLU for much of his drive. He says football coach Frosty Westering, and former crew coach Dave Peterson, were instrumental in forming his confidence and ambition. He rowed to the Northwest Championship on the crew team.

"They were formidable in my development, and PLU has always been supportive of community service," he said.

After PLU, Peterson studied international relations at Stanford University, then owned and operated several commercial fisheries partnerships in Alaska. He and Arne Einmo '62 founded IFQ Brokers, and Peterson continues to lead the company that brokers fishing grounds for Bering Sea anglers.

He says his fund raising and outreach efforts show a hobby can turn into much more.

"People can be creative and have great enthusiasm for something they have a passion for."

Woman leaves Egypt in order to return better prepared to teach there

She didn't exactly commute from Alexandria, Egypt, to Tacoma, but Randa Shoeb '03 did spend 14 months almost half a world away from her husband and two young children to earn her M.A. in education.

A certified teacher, Shoeb began her career at Schutz American School in Alexandria—a private American international school—as registrar and as an admissions counselor. But soon she found her calling in the classroom.

"After moving from administration and spending three years in the classroom, I knew that I wanted to make teaching my career," Shoeb said. "I also knew that in order to teach and teach well, I needed the proper training."

When Shoeb was a child her family lived in Tacoma, so returning to Washington, where she had many family friends, was a natural. And PLU's program was a perfect fit.

"I researched all of the master's in education programs in Washington and found PLU's to be one of the best," she said.

Beginning at PLU in June 2002, Shoeb took courses and practiced student teaching for a year at the middle school level at Charles Wright Academy.

While Shoeb found her studies rewarding on many levels, the time away from home was not easy.

"One of the hardest things for me was being away from my family. I had a lot of support at home and my family encouraged me to pursue my dreams.

"If it wasn't for their support, I could never have done this," she said.

Shoeb's husband, Abbas Zaher, is an orthodontist in private practice and is a professor at the University of Alexandria dental school. Her son, Rafik Zaher, 12, is in seventh grade. Her daughter, Nada Zaher, 9, is in fourth grade.

"We kept in touch daily online, and were able to talk for hours, so that was a lifesaver. I also visited home several times during my stay, and they were able to come and see me. In the end it all worked out," she said.

At commencement in August Shoeb was one of four graduates to receive Graduate Studies Achievement Awards, which recognize students' exemplary academic performance, collegial relationships that stimulate the learning and dedication of others and special contributions to profession or community.

She returned to the Schultz American School to teach seventh- and eighth-grade English and social studies. □

All contributors are listed once, in alphabetical order, with a key for the different giving organizations.

Lifetime Giving Society (L)

The Lifetime Giving Society recognizes an extraordinary group of donors who have given faithfully and consistently over time to sustain and support Pacific Lutheran University. Lifetime giving includes the total recorded gifts and current pledges of cash, securities, real estate and appreciated property, and includes the charitable value of irrevocable planned gifts. These totals do not include revocable deferred gifts or gifts to KPLU.

Heritage Society (H)

Heritage Society is a group of donors committed to securing PLU's future by making provisions for the university in their estate plans. The most common estate gift involves donating a portion of estate proceeds to PLU as part of a will. By using current assets to establish a charitable trust or gift annuity, donors can receive an income stream for the remainder of their lives, with the remaining trust assets going to PLU upon their deaths.

Q Club (Q)

With a minimum contribution of \$300 annually (student giving levels begin at \$60 a year), one can join this gathering of dedicated friends whose mission is to provide assistance to deserving students as they prepare for lives of service through a Pacific Lutheran University education. Q Club is the "giving club" of PLU's annual fund, and the more than 2,000 members provide the core of scholarship support.

Matching Gift Program (M)

The Matching Gift Program recognizes companies and foundations that have contributed to PLU by matching the gifts of their employees. This support is either designated to a particular fund identified by the employee or given to the unrestricted fund.

Independent Colleges of Washington (I)

Norwegian immigrant aims support toward global understanding

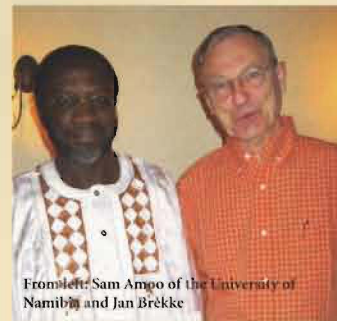
JAN BREKKE emigrated from Norway to the United States as a young man, bringing with him only a suitcase. For him, giving to PLU is giving back to America.

Brekke, who is in property management, is part of a group of business people—all from Norway—that will donate \$20,000 every year to PLU for the next five years. Most will go to scholarships. "America has been awfully good to us and because we are grateful to America, it is time to pay back some of the things we have so richly received," Brekke said.

Brekke also donates with an international focus. He is on the Norway/Namibia Project Advisory Board and traveled to Namibia in January 2003 as part of the PLU presidential delegation. The project with PLU, Hedmark University College and the University of Namibia is designed to advance democracy, development and peace.

To Brekke, the project is important because he believes democracy cannot be allowed to fail in Africa. "That's why PLU is important in Namibia," Brekke said. "More and more, we need to reach out to other nations."

Giving students the opportunity to seek new and different perspectives is important to Brekke. "The motto of PLU is to serve, and I was very inspired by the people who have come out of PLU."

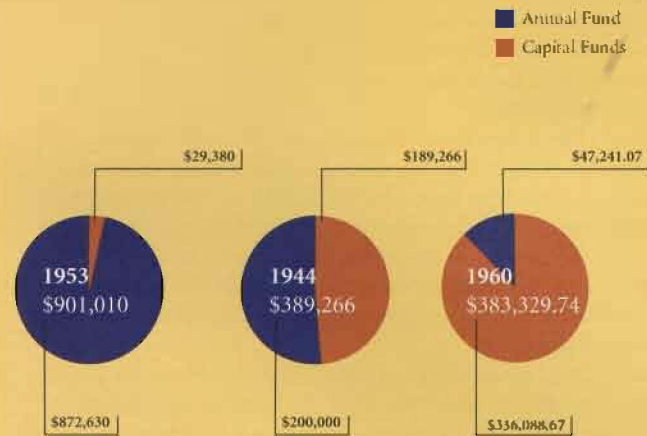

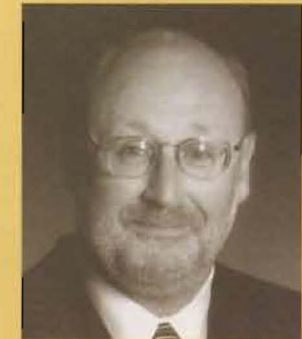

Businessman credits success to PLU, donates to Morken Center

ANDY TURNER '74 credits PLU with his accomplishments. And because he learned so much as both a student and a professor, he donated \$100,000 to the Morken Center for Learning and Technology.



Turner, who joined the Board of Regents in the fall, said he chose to attend PLU because of the open and friendly environment. He says the faculty—specifically his mentor, professor of business Stuart Bancroft—contributed to his success. "If it wouldn't have been for the faculty, I wouldn't have gone to grad school and I wouldn't have accomplished the things I have," Turner said. He

received a master's in finance from the University of Pennsylvania.

Turner, who is now the managing director in investment management and research at Russell Investment Group, taught finance at PLU for six years, beginning in 1976. He said he learned a lot as a professor.

"And I had a great time with the students." The feeling was mutual. Twenty years later, some of his former students said they wanted to learn more from him. The School of Business and the Development Office organized "An Evening With Andy Turner" in March. He spoke about the economic shift in the information economy and predicted the next economic shift will be to what he calls a "bioeconomy." Donations received at the event went to the Morken Center.

By donating to the Morken Center, which will house the School of Business and the Departments of Mathematics and Computer Science and Computer Engineering, Turner is helping to ensure students have the tools and knowledge to find success in the business world.

"I decided to donate in a sizable way to PLU," Turner said. "I wanted to give something back. I had a good education."

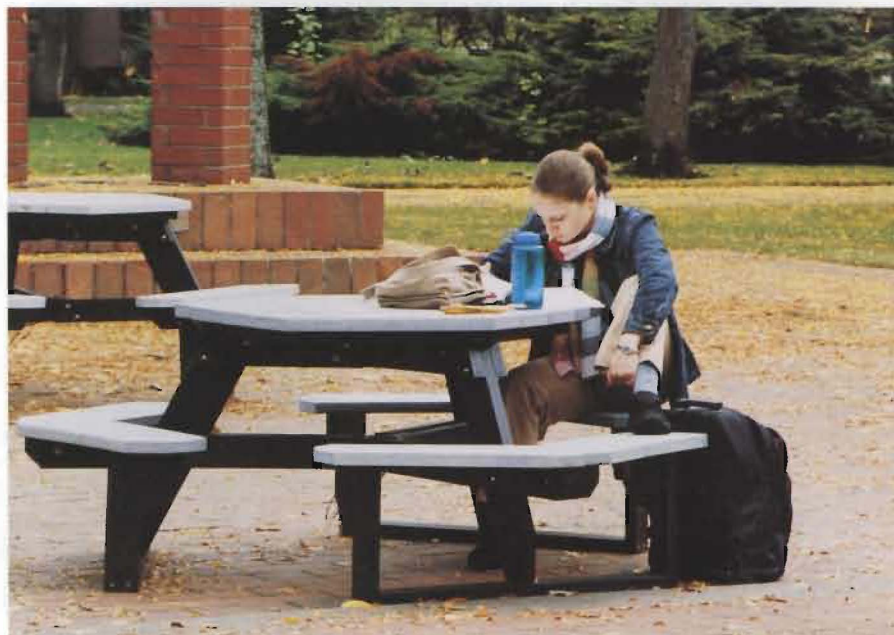

“thoughtful inquiry” (that is, the cultivation of curious and questioning minds through deep and broad learning) is consistently linked to “service and care” (that is, advocacy for human and other life forms that are vulnerable or at risk on the planet). Thus, the free space in which unhindered intellectual exploration takes place empowers professors and students alike to ask a difficult question or think a new thought that might actually transform “the way things are” in the world of daily life.

Such probing or unsettling inquiry can provoke a society to imagine an alternative perspective beyond the “conventional” wisdom of the day. If you find this hard to accept, consider the Quaker women of New England who promoted both the abolition of slavery and women’s rights in the 19th century, or the Freudian and Jungian psychologists of the early 20th century who ventured into the previously unknown territory of the human psyche, or Martin Luther King, Jr., that brilliant and tragic prophet of the mid-20th century, who called Americans to imagine their nation marked by an inclusive yet difficult integration of diverse races and creeds. Each of these groups or persons met with initial suspicion if not terrible opposition simply because they questioned the status quo or fearlessly explored realms of thought that appeared dangerous to the intellectually timid.

It goes without saying that such bold questioning of the status quo rightfully takes place at a Lutheran university. After all, the founder of the Lutheran educational project began his public career by criticizing both the religious and social assumptions of his age. Indeed, he, too, met much opposition and the threat of exile or death because he refused to stop writing and speaking about what he had discovered in his research. Was he living in an “ivory tower”? Hardly. Was this professor of theology oblivious to the plight of ordinary people? Not for a second.

Of course the great irony is that while Martin Luther was hiding from imperial agents in the tower of a German castle, he wrote 10 works and furiously

though steadfastly translated the New Testament into German, thus promoting widespread literacy among a previously illiterate population, a notion many of his peers considered odd if not downright subversive. “Why should ordinary people be able to read when their leaders can just as easily tell them what they need to know?” asked some of Luther’s critics. Wouldn’t the ability to read actually give the masses access to knowledge they didn’t really need?

Wouldn’t they begin to think for themselves or begin to think that they knew as much as the privileged elites of their day? Thus, it should come as no surprise to anyone that the educational, religious, and social revolution of the 16th century was cultivated among lawyers, historians, philosophers, and artists who labored in great beehive of

the Renaissance university, that place where the very notion of academic freedom was hammered out amid much strife and controversy.

If anything, we know that to work in the force field of intellectual freedom is dangerous business. The commitment to serious study and research – what PLU names “thoughtful inquiry” – is not for the faint of heart or those who want everything to remain safely the same. Such work can afflict the comfortable, resist the impulse to conformity, empower the voiceless, enlarge the imagination, frighten the fundamentalist, and create entirely surprising ways of seeing and caring for humanity and this earth, our home.

Many of our students wear baseball caps to class. To paraphrase Annie Dillard, one of my favorite authors, I wonder if we should be wearing metaphorical crash helmets in the classroom, for the sleeping giant of a new or startling idea might awaken within us and haul us off to places and hopes we never imagined possible. At work in the force field of intellectual freedom



Samuel Torvend, assistant professor in the Department of Religion, says questioning and thinking critically about higher education come naturally to a Lutheran university.

At the beginning of each semester, I talk with the students in my classes about the invisible boundary that surrounds the university, a boundary they cannot smell or taste or touch yet one they walk through every day as they enter a classroom or the library. I suggest that they have entered a force field, as it were, that is hidden from ordinary sight yet sustains and directs much of what we are about in a university. Indeed, for hundreds of years, scholars have had to defend this force field with their intelligence and even with their lives.

In protecting this rare treasure, academics and their students often have been shunned, exiled, persecuted, and even put to death because they would not relinquish this singular privilege: calling into question or scrutinizing what everyone else around them might think “normal” or set in stone. This privilege is nothing less than the search for truth or beauty without fear of being silenced or punished by one’s colleagues, government officials, religious leaders, or powerful business interests. In liberal arts universities, we call this rarest of treasures, this invisible force

field that makes our work possible, intellectual or academic freedom.

Perhaps you have heard some wags refer to professors as people who live in “ivory towers,” blissfully cut off from the “real” world. Accepting such a skewed stereotype, these are the kind of people who insist that education is valuable only to the degree that students acquire “skills” to “make it” in the world, as if a college were simply a technical training school. Clearly, such people have not visited PLU. Here,
