Language and Identity in the Americas

"The Politics of Language and Identity in the Americas" is a conference that will take place on April 3 and 4 as part of the Americas Semester at PLU.

Art: The conference begins with an exhibition of the works of renowned Peruvian artisan Nicario Jimenez Quispe, master of the retablo -- a brightly painted wooden box with three-dimensional figures from scenes of life in Peru -- at 6:30 pm in the Regency Room. Jimenez Quispe will also present "Art and Cultural Resistance in Peru." Free.

Music: Native American flautists and drummers, Brazilian percussionists and vocalists and an Andean folk troupe perform "Music at the Crossroads in the Americas," a celebration of a variety of musical traditions. The concert begins at 8 pm in Lagerquist. Tickets are \$5 for adults and \$3 for students.

Lectures:

9 am, Scandinavian Cultural Center "The Politics of Language and Identity in the Americas," presentations and panel discussions, begin at 9 am in the SCC. The discussions explore the role that language and culture play in shaping social, political and economic reality in the Americas. Free.
