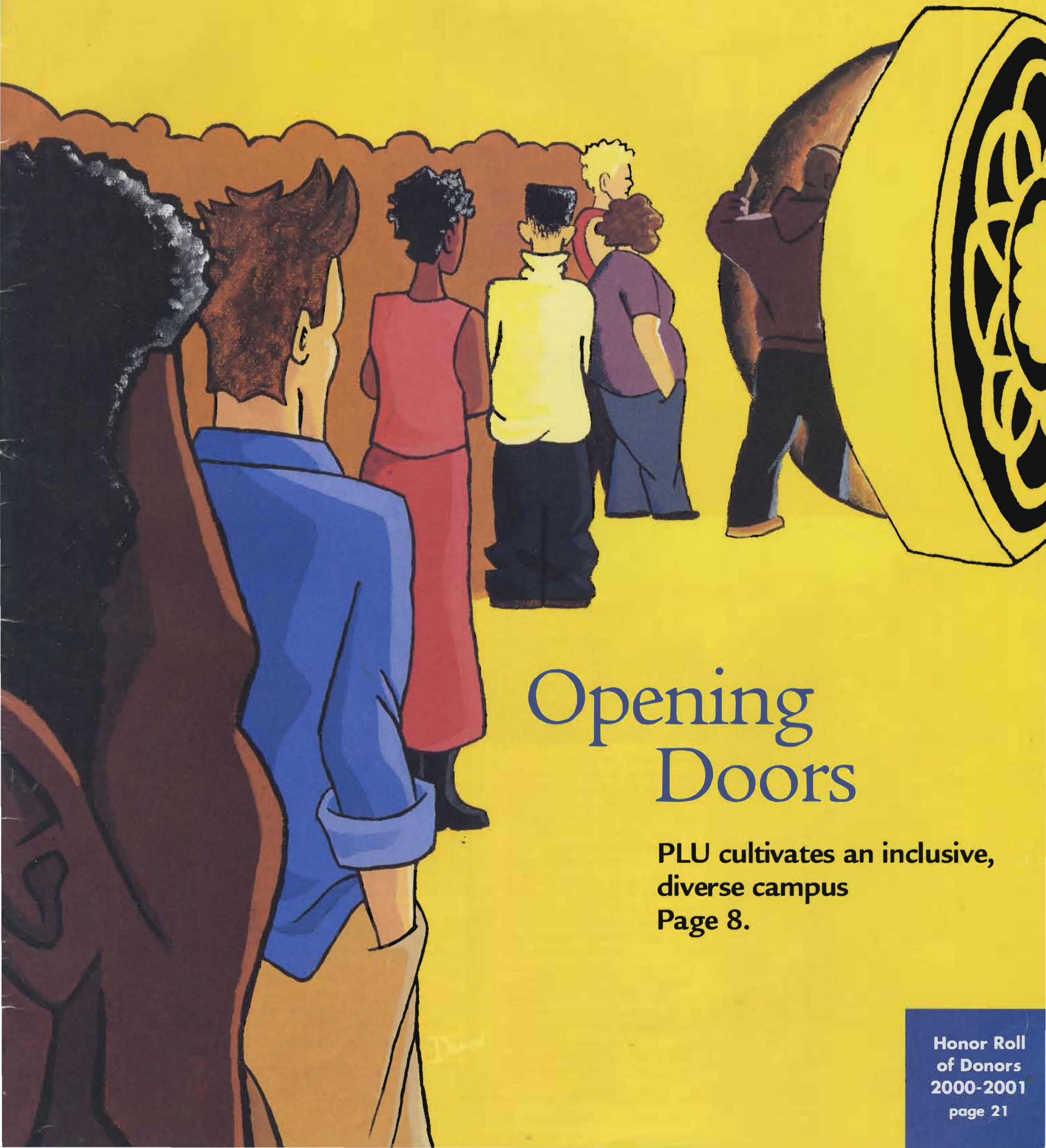

Student-run survey helps create new connections

Current PLU students are helping the university develop its relationship with alumni. A random survey of PLU alumni, developed and implemented by members of the PLU student club of the American Marketing Association, was conducted this fall to learn more about the relationship between PLU and its graduates.

"The AMA is a group of students who are interested in marketing, advertising, community service and networking, while having fun doing it," said Chelsea Goode '02, club president.

"We have a vested interest in doing the survey, as we will all soon be alumni ourselves," Goode said. "I hope that our analysis will help PLU nurture its relations with graduates and will result in improved services and new connections for everyone."

Of the 26,000 PLU alumni of record, 5,000 were asked to complete the survey. The marketing students will compile survey responses, prepare a database and then write a formal report on their findings. The project will be completed early next year.

The research is designed to determine the effectiveness of alumni communication methods, to assess satisfaction with alumni programming, to identify what factors affect alumni donation patterns, and to determine factors that influence alumni commitment to the university.

The students are conducting the research for University Communications, the Office of the President and the Office of Alumni and Parent Relations.

"This project will give us new insights into the overall relationship between alumni and the university," said Lauralee Hagen '75, director of Alumni and Parent Relations. "It will be key in helping us develop action plans, and continuing to develop the bond between PLU and their alumni."

Paul Porter remembered through art exhibit

At a special exhibit this fall, the University Gallery honored the life and art of the late Paul Porter, PLU's longtime graphic designer and publications director. Porter, who died of cancer in 1999, left behind a legacy of artwork, created for PLU projects and his own personal expressions.

"Living in Art: Paul Porter Remembered" was an especially meaningful show to many people who worked with

and appreciated Porter's keen eye and great talent. The exhibit included black and white prints, artwork from programs he designed for choir concerts, as well as posters and newsletters he created for university departments and events.

Kathryn Sparks, curator of visual resources for the Art Department, said the pieces she hung were only a small part of Porter's extensive collection.

"It was just so amazing going through all these things Paul had done and choosing which to hang," she said. "This was a really special show. It's one that I'd like to keep up all the time."

South Hall project wins architectural honors

PLU's newest residence hall is more than just a great place to live on campus. South Hall is an architectural award winner. The university broke the mold when it created this building, the first new residential facility on the PLU campus in nearly 35 years.

South Hall was selected to appear in the 2001 American School & University Magazine Architectural Portfolio, "the ultimate tribute to educational design excellence." The hall was selected as an Outstanding Building from a breadth of submitted building projects from around the country.

Landscape Architect magazine also featured a large spread on South Hall in Vol. 17, No. 6. The article, "Out With the Old- In With the New," shows a timeline of photos from the demolition of Delta and Evergreen Court to the beautifully finished new home for students. The magazine spoke directly to the smart use of sidewalks, lawns and a variety of trees.

South Hall accommodates up to 230 students, including married students in the one-bedroom lofts. The other configurations allow up to five students to share in each apartment-style unit.

New pictorial history of PLU debuts in Archives

Pacific Lutheran University has a new way to look into the past. A pictorial history of PLU was created by Danielle Koenig '02 with content provided by Kerstin Ringdahl '82, university archivist. Another PLU alum, Gavin Jensen '01, designed the layout.

Images for the University Timeline were chosen from the more than 500,000 images preserved in the university archives—the selected pictures provide a creative, colorful and informative glimpse at PLU, from as early as 1890 to present day. See treasures of PLU's history including Louis Armstrong's 1966 visit for the Homecoming concert, groundbreakings for campus buildings and even a program from the original dedication of the school.

Historical content was selected from the many primary sources in the archives and from PLU's two published histories, including "Educating for Service" by campus historian and history professor Philip A. Nordquist '56. The Timeline will be continually updated. People can



Archives photo of Harstad Hall, circa 1894.

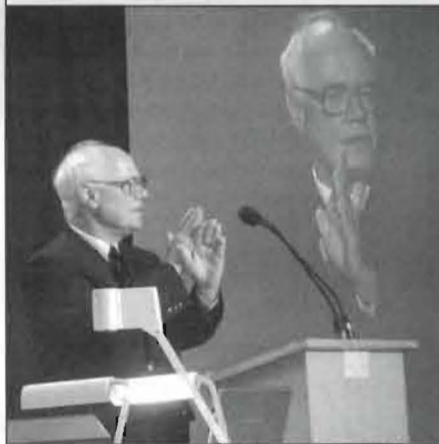

Global issues dominate Fall Lecture Series

Distinguished speakers at this year's PLU Fall Lecture Series discussed issues ranging from the massacre in Rwanda to the search for God in science and the unusual bond between chimps and people.

"This was an outstanding lineup of amazing speakers," Provost Paul Menzel said. "The variety of backgrounds, perspectives and topics created a compelling series that had something to teach everyone."

Dr. Robert Bellah, eminent professor of sociology emeritus from the University of California-Berkeley and the recipient of the 2000 National Humanities Medal, started the series with his lecture about the role of a Christian university in a globalized world. He touched on the societal reactions to the Sept. 11 terrorist attacks and the responsibility of individuals and society as a whole.

Sir John Polkinghorne, a renowned scientist and an Anglican priest, delved into issues behind religion and science. His lecture was part of the 2001 Conference on Religion and Science, held jointly via video by PLU and Princeton Theological Seminary. Polkinghorne, author of several books, also spoke at chapel and met with faculty and students during his campus visit.

Dr. Mahmood Mamdani, a native of Uganda and professor of anthropology

MATH AND BUTTERFLIES

Math professor Mei Zhu specializes in mathematical biology—a field that involves using math to help solve biological problems. Over the summer, she supervised two of her students in ambitious research projects to develop mathematical formulas to determine how cells form patterns on butterfly wings and how bacteria can cause problem pregnancies. The final papers, "Cell Pattern Formation in the Development of Butterfly Wings" by Ted Buzzelli '02, and "Mathematical Modeling of the Behavior of Bacterial Infection of the Chorioamniotic Membrane" by Emily Yates '02, both under the supervision of Zhu, can be found on Encore!

and political science at Columbia University, detailed his theories about the Rwandan massacre of one million Tutsi by the Hutu. Author of a controversial book, "When Victims Become Killers: Colonialism, Nativism and the Genocide in Rwanda," he presented his theory that a kind of colonial apartheid in Rwanda led to postcolonial racial hatred and ultimately, mass violence that took one million lives. That counters the more prevalent view that the genocide was orchestrated by elites who used propaganda and political maneuvering to recruit ordinary Hutus into violence.

Dr. Kathleen Woodward, director of the Walter Simpson Center for the Humanities and professor of English at the University of Washington-Seattle, spoke on "The Faces of Shame." She is the author of numerous books, including "Aging and Its Discontents: Freud and Other Fiction" and the forthcoming "Circulating Anger and Other Feelings."

Dr. Roger Fouts, professor of psychology and director of the Chimpanzee and Human Communication Institute at Central Washington University, presented his research about interaction between chimps and humans. His book, "Next of Kin," was named one of The 100 Best Books of 1997 by both the Los Angeles Times and Publishers Weekly.

A lineup of equally impressive speakers will be announced for the Spring Lecture Series.

PLU ranks sixth in latest U.S. News "America's Best Colleges"

Pacific Lutheran University is the sixth best master's university in the west, according to U.S. News and World Report's 2002 guidebook "America's Best Colleges."

PLU was evaluated along with 572 other universities that provide a full range of undergraduate and selective master's level programs. The rankings are based on several factors, including academic reputation, class size and graduation and retention rates.

"We're proud to be recognized for our academic distinction," Provost Paul Menzel said. "More than half our classes have fewer than 20 students. This is just one indicator of how PLU values close interaction between students and faculty."

A large full-time faculty provides PLU with a student-faculty ratio of 13-1.

PLU is also among the best on the magazine's list of "Best Values," which rates the amount of debt students have after graduation. Sixty-two percent of PLU's students receive grants based on need.

PLU remains the only Northwest university to be listed in all of the U.S. News best college surveys since they began in 1983. The rankings are available in the magazine, and at www.usnews.com.

LuteWorld launches with great success

LuteWorld—PLU's official online store (luteworld.plu.edu) opened for business on Aug. 1 and has been off to a quick start. The goal of the first two months was to help students get their books for their courses—and get 5 percent of the student body to use LuteWorld during the process. The response was even better than anticipated: one in 10 PLU students bought their books online this fall.

"It was spectacular," said Mark Mulder '93, director of auxiliary services. The students loved the convenience, and the bookstore staff really rose to the occasion to make this happen." One of the unique features for students is LuteWorld's QuickSearch. Students can log in using their PLU ID and password, and their course information and textbook information is immediately displayed.

"That's really convenient—we are one of only a handful of schools in the nation to offer this," says Angela Zurcher, Bookstore Director.

LuteWorld is owned and operated by PLU, and all of the store's proceeds benefit the campus. Many customers cited this as a great benefit to shopping online—direct support of PLU and convenient service.

Nance, Choral Union will head to Geneva

PLU music professor Richard Nance and the PLU Choral Union (which he directs) have been invited to perform his Mass for a New Millennium at the 8th World Harp Congress in Geneva in 2002. The work, scored for oboe, harp, percussion, organ and mixed chorus, was premiered by the Choir of the West on May 13, 2000.

The composition of Mass was the focus of Nance's sabbatical during the 1999-2000 school year. The Credo of the Mass was a preexisting work that Nance wrote for the Lakes High School Concert Choir, which was first performed in 1996. He decided to write a concert mass that would be built around the Credo. The result was his largest work to date.

The World Harp Congress is a private nonprofit organization, founded in 1981 as an outgrowth of the International Harp Weeks, held in the Netherlands for 20 years. Past congresses have been held in various locations around the world, the two most recent being Tacoma in 1996, and Prague, Czech Republic, in 1999. Concerts, workshops and seminars concerning all aspects of harp musicology and performance are offered at these triennial eight-day music festivals.

"This was truly a pleasant surprise," said Nance, when asked about his reaction to the invitation. "It is always gratifying to be recognized for what you do, but doubly so when the recognition is from a group of international, professional musicians."

"The choir is recognized as one of the nation's finest community choruses," Nance said "Performing at this type of international event is a logical next step for the Choral Union."

Murdock summer research: Butterfly wings, bacteria and mathematical biology

When mathematician Mei Zhu first took a course that applied formulas to biology, she was immediately fascinated. Many of the difficult biological terms were new to Zhu, whose first language was Chinese.

"I stayed up late learning all the words," the PLU math professor said. "I was just totally, totally in love with the subject."

Zhu went on to specialize in the fairly new field of mathematical biology, and now she's instilling similar passion in her students, two of whom produced ambitious research projects over the summer. Both students won summer research awards grants from the Division of Natural Sciences M.J. Murdock College Science Research Program.

Zhu had already done research modeling how cells form to create patterns in butterfly wings from a view of how groups of cells interact with one another. Ted Buzzelli '02, became interested in how those cells interact with each other individually. Under Zhu's supervision, he developed a computer model that simulates how these cells interact to form parallel rows in butterfly wings observed in nature.

Emily Yates '02, a biology major and math minor, was interested in tracking how bacteria can cause problems in pregnancy. One-third of all premature labors are caused by infection, and there has been no change in that number in the last 30 years, despite medical advances. Detecting bacteria has been difficult, and it's usually too late to prevent problems once bacteria is found in the amniotic fluid.

So Yates decided to track how those bacteria move, and when it poses a risk. She developed a model that traces how bacteria cross the chorioamniotic membrane and eventually get into the amniotic fluid, causing fetal problems. In her model she studied how bacterial infection causes membrane inflammation and how inflammation triggers the immune system to fight bacteria. She also studied the importance of treating infection with antibiotics.

"We're trying to understand the spatial pattern of how bacteria grow in the membrane and the critical conditions of bacteria causing premature labor," Zhu said.

Zhu was gratified by her students' enthusiastic research, and she hopes to expand it even more to have their papers published.

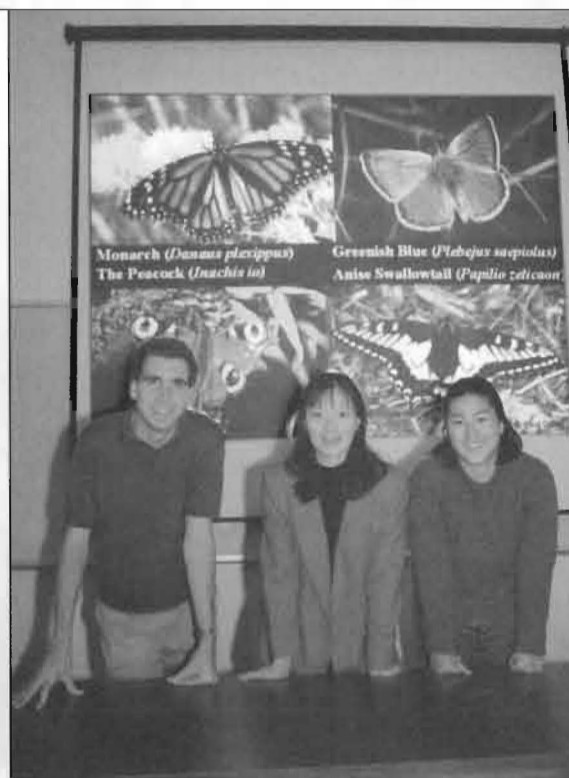
"I just felt really happy to see them enjoying it so much," said Zhu, who has been on the faculty for three years.

She continues her own research as well, simulating skin cancer cell formation and looking at other cell patterns that one day could answer questions like why a zebra has stripes or a leopard has spots.

Mathematical biology started gaining attention in the '80s.

"Even when I came out of graduate school in 1994 and I would go to job interviews, people did not know what it was," Zhu said.

She likes being part of a wide open field – biology is such a large discipline that there are countless ways to apply mathematical models to biological problems.

"It's good for a school like this, because you can find good problems that undergraduates can work on," she said.

There was only one rule for the final exam in Richard Spillman's Computer Science 490 class, Computer Security—wear your T-shirt. Working in teams, and wearing official class shirts, students were given encrypted information that when decoded, would send them on their next campus mission. To pass their final exam, students had to break all the codes.

Students were learning an essential in modern technological education—the security of our information. Spillman's students, like many others in Computer Science & Computer Engineering (CSCE) department courses, are learn how computers can be compromised—and protected.

"It's important for students to understand encryption system weaknesses," Spillman said. "Part of the 'war on terrorism' has to involve defending against cyberterrorists." PLU CSCE is one of the few Computer Science departments in the area to emphasize in its curriculum understanding the most contemporary computer security issues.

The department is taking responsibility for maintaining its own standards for excellence in all areas of computer technology. Starting in 1989,

CSCE made the rare choice to maintain professional accreditation for its BS program. PLU is the only private university in the state of Washington accredited. Last fall, the Computer Science Accreditation Commission of the Computing Sciences Accreditation Board visited PLU for their four-year review and the response was again positive.

"It signals to students that we're in the mainstream—that we keep up with the latest information, how we teach and what we teach," Spillman said. "It also helps students when they go look for a job, to have the backing of an accredited program."

The Center for Learning and Technology (CLT), which has come to the forefront of university planning, will build an even stronger CSCE department. Spillman is one of the department's professors now stationed in Rieke, while others are in the math and computer science building. When the CLT is complete, CSCE will have all its faculty under the same roof, as well as state-of-the-art technology in offices, labs and classrooms.

"It will obviously have a major impact on how we grow, and how we teach," Spillman said. "It's going to be great."

Standing at the threshold: President Anderson's thoughts on Xavier Hall

EXCERPTS FROM PRESIDENT ANDERSON'S ADDRESS AT THE REDEDICATION OF XAVIER HALL, OCTOBER 14, 2001

"Today we stand together at a threshold. We can look forward and back. At once we are at a time of beginning when we can see ahead to the many possibilities for teaching and learning in this marvelous building, now as good as new. And we can look back with true admiration to the visionaries who, over 60 years ago, built a structure that would endure.

It was a real struggle in the early 1930s to find the funds needed to build a much needed library on campus. More than abundant wealth, our predecessors had abundant faith that this building would be built. So much faith, in fact, that they built the new library in stages. It was almost as if a little more money came in and another wall went up. It wasn't until the late 1940s that the project was completed.

There was no shortage of celebration during construction. There were groundbreaking, cornerstone layings and dedications. Many of these celebrations were very much like our celebration here today. Construction workers beamed with pride, the president and other dignitaries spoke, friends who helped fund the project were thanked, the Choir of the West sang. Thanks went to God for watching over our fledgling campus.

Yes, it took some time but—as all good Norwegians would—they built the new building well, they built it to last, and it served our college and university well in several incarnations. First known simply as Pacific Lutheran College Library, the building initially housed our small collection of books and a few classrooms. As other campus buildings were built, classrooms eventually gave way to the expanding library, growing under the direction of J.U. Xavier, campus librarian.

With the dedication of the Robert A. L. Mortvedt Library in the late 1960s, the old library was renamed in honor of J.U. Xavier and was remodeled to house classrooms and faculty offices of the Division of Social Sciences. Another celebration. More speeches. More thanks. More singing. And another tribute to those who had the vision to first build.

Since then, until last year, Xavier Hall has served us well. A building at the heart of the campus housing many of the departments that are at the heart of our curriculum. But time did not stand still. And with new resolve our friends and supporters have made possible the restoration of Xavier Hall for future generations as part of the current Campaign for Pacific Lutheran University: The Next Bold Step.

So now, standing at a threshold, we can look to the future and see that this latest version of Xavier Hall will help us take that next bold step. Continuing to serve faculty and students in the Social Sciences, Xavier Hall is now a gracious and contemporary teaching-learning space that will optimize collaborative learning while embracing new technologies."

"Dreams" and The Freshman Experience

"Iwant their imaginations engaged and trained," said English professor David Seal, summing up what he wants his freshman students to get from his writing course called "Dreams."

"Reason and faith are complemented by active imaginations," Seal said. "It's good that first-year students begin to understand that, and begin by seeing the power of the imagination in their own psyches."

"Dreams" is a Freshman Writing Seminar—one of three courses required as part of The Freshman Experience, a program that prepares students for life in college and beyond.

The Freshman Experience classes focus on a variety of questions: How can you get off to the best start in college? How do we cope with the emotional and physical realities of life? How can you learn to best balance a professional life based on a lifetime of service? The main question asked in Seal's class is: What do dreams and images mean, and how can I use them to power my creative and intellectual imagination?

"I like a lively class, one that moves into unexpected areas at times, because that keeps the students interested and intrigued," Seal said.

The key to PLU's program is to prepare students for the four-year journey that will have them learning and thinking critically, serving as active participants in the community, traveling abroad to study, putting their skills to practical use in internships, and summing up their learning in senior Capstone projects.

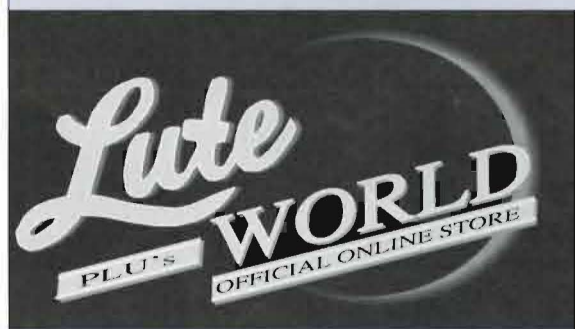
In Critical Conversation seminars, students learn through leading a group discussion, making formal and individual presentations and engaging in public debates.

Freshman J-Term courses, students work closely with their peers on a specific topic—some take "hands on" courses like "January on the Hill."

The Writing Seminar component, which Seal's "Dreams" course is a part of, students learn to think like a writer in various disciplines, and how to look at issues from multiple perspectives.

"In class, we have a lot of fun. We start by listening to dreams and interpreting them," Seal said. "Gradually, they begin to see how powerful images are. And, by extension, how important the imagination is to all of us."

Campus community responds to terrorist attacks with reflection, compassion, and study

Television screens that usually remain black drew groups of stunned students and staff Sept. 11 as the campus tried to cope with and comprehend the worst act of terrorism in American history.

The administration recognized immediately that though the acts occurred on the other side of the country, students and staff would be greatly affected.

The offices of Campus Ministry and Counseling and Testing provided refuge and help for students who were in fear and pain. Student Life and Residential Life reached out to those who needed assistance and helped students contact family members and friends, especially those with connections on the East Coast.

The Office of International Programs immediately made contact with each international student at PLU and every one who is studying abroad to ensure their safety. Three students from the United Arab Emirates chose to return to their home country, while all other students on campus and abroad chose to continue their studies as planned.

On campus, classes—which began just a day before the attacks—took a different tone in many ways, as professors found ways to integrate current events into their curriculum and students grasped for understanding of all that occurred.

In the following days, an ASPLU teach-in drew hundreds to the Chris Knutzen Hall to hear five professors share their thoughts—professionally and personally—to the attacks and America's reaction to it. The Young Democrats and the Advocates for Social Justice sponsored a forum to encourage understanding of Islam.

"This has caused people to pay attention to issues that they haven't even had on their radar screens before," said Ann Kelleher, a political science professor who is an expert in Mideast relations.

Kelleher chose to teach a J-Term course on terrorism for freshmen in the International Core program. She offered the course once years ago, but it wasn't on the schedule until after the recent terrorist attacks. Now the curriculum will include the recent events, as well as terrorism that has struck other countries throughout history.

Kelleher is one of several professors who have been interviewed, spoken at campus or community events or written commentaries in the wake of the Sept. 11 events.

President Loren J. Anderson and Provost Paul Menzel encouraged all faculty and students to open their minds to the views and beliefs of Muslims and those of Mideast descent—in order to foster the understanding on campus that is needed throughout the world in order to achieve peace.

All-campus teach-in clarifies misconceptions about Islam

Members of the PLU community joined with local Muslims last month to debunk myths and stereotypes about Islam and its people at The Cross-Cultural Islamic Teach-In, sponsored by Young Democrats of Washington and Advocates for Social Justice.

"I think we have a responsibility to try, as educated students, to not buy into stereotypes, and to educate others so people don't get hurt," said Beth Hughes, co-president of Young Democrats.

Hisham Farajallah, a volunteer for the Sheikh Abdull Idriss mosque in Seattle, stressed that education can overcome misunderstandings and lead to peace.

"Without communication we are not going to go anywhere," he said.

Lara Price, co-president of Young Democrats, expressed concern that broadcast news has not given an accurate or complete picture of the Islamic faith or its followers. "We need to realize there is a lot of diversity within the Islamic world," she said.

Farajallah agreed "the media has not been kind to Islam" since the Sept. 11 attacks.

Contrary to some reports, Muslims support freedom, he said. "We came by choice, and we became citizens by choice," said Farajallah, who has lived in Washington for 16 years and is an engineer for The Boeing Co. "I am here because of freedom."

When asked what he thought led the terrorists to act as they did, Farajallah said Islam does not

condone killing. "I'm afraid to kill a bird; how they kill a human, I don't know."

When Muslims commit acts that are not in accordance with Islam, he said, it is not a shortcoming of their religion, but of the human being.

Farajallah clarified some confusion about the term "jihad," which has been widely defined as a "holy war," even though Islam is a peaceful religion. He also addressed misconceptions about women's roles in Islam. According to Farajallah, the sexes have equal rights but different roles. He said the mother is the most important person in a Muslim man's life.

Farajallah outlined the five pillars of Islam: declaration of faith, prayer five times a day, pilgrimage to the first mosque in Mecca at least once in a lifetime if physically and financially able, mandatory almsgiving and fasting during the Islamic month of Ramadan. The Arabic word "Islam" means complete submission and obedience to Allah.

"Islam is a practical religion," he said. "We have a saying, 'the heavens will not rain gold and silver,' so go out and work."

When Jodi Maeda was looking at colleges, she entered the characteristics she wanted into computer searches: a small school, strong academics, close enough that she could return to her Hawaii home but far enough away that she could be independent.

"I wanted to expand my horizons," said Maeda, a senior. "PLU just kept coming up." She was impressed by the admissions counselor she met at her high school, and she chose to become a Lute.

Maeda, a Japanese American, feels like she belongs on the Parkland campus, which strives to include students of different racial, ethnic and religious backgrounds, as well as nontraditional age students, students with disabilities and sexual minorities.

"This is something that's been a part of our soul and character from the start," PLU President Loren J. Anderson said. "A Lutheran university understands that each and every person is important and precious. None of the false walls that can be built around gender, race, sexual orientation or ethnic background have any place here."

Opening PLU's doors to students who bring different perspectives and experiences enriches the university community. And that reflects the spirit in which the university was founded more than a century ago.

"Think about the community we can build here if we all live out the simple commitment that each person is precious," the president said. "Think about the community we can build if we accept the idea that 'precious' includes difference, for it is the one different from me whose fresh perspectives and unique experience can truly stretch my envelope and help me grow."

"I chose Pacific Lutheran because it has a good business school, a good music department and a small size," said Anderson '03. "It's a great school, but there is a lack of diversity."

Students say having more people from underrepresented groups will make everyone feel more included.

"You look and you don't see anyone who is really like you," said Roxanne Badillo '02, a Hispanic student from Bellingham, Wash., who serves as ASPLU's diversity director. "It needs to be a place of inclusiveness, and it's getting there."

Maeda '02 is willing to help people understand, but as a Japanese American from Hawaii, she has had uncomfortable moments.

"When I first came here, people asked me if I lived in a grass hut," she said. She has explained repeatedly that she is from Hawaii, but not Hawaiian.

Knowing that a diverse inclusive campus is a gift, administrators and faculty intend to foster a climate that encourages students from different backgrounds to embrace PLU.

"By having a diverse campus, PLU can be powerful," said Bill Teska, as-

sociate provost. "Each of our histories are different, so collectively we can be reflective of the society in which we live."

PLU has not set any specific goals regarding enrollment of minorities, President Anderson said, except this: "Keep working."

PLU ranks No. 2 among Lutheran colleges in the number of American minority students and is first in the number of international students. Still, administrators acknowledge the demographics could be improved—to everyone's benefit. To that end, the university has focused on attracting a diverse population of students and employees by supporting student groups and programs, creating a task force to explore the climate on campus and looking critically at its own mission.

The numbers of minority students have gone up. Students classified as "multi-ethnic" number 451 this year, making up 13.2 percent of the student body, up from 8 percent in 1991. Asian-Americans are the largest group, followed by African-Americans, Hispanics, Native Americans and those who identify themselves as

multi-racial, a category the university began tracking in 1999. Diversity is also enhanced by students of different faiths, students with disabilities, older students and sexual minorities.

In addition, there are 195 international students enrolled this year, coming mostly from Scandinavia and Asia.

By contrast, minorities make up more than 22 percent of the population in Pierce County, about 26 percent in Parkland, more than 30 percent of Tacoma and 18 percent of the state, according to the 2000 Census.

Work to enroll and retain more minority students should continue at a fast pace, said Beth Kraig, a history professor and member of the University Diversity Committee. The university can't simply be pleased with progress.

"The positives should never be taken as a sign that we've come far enough," Kraig said. "It should be seen as a sign that we can do this."

Minority students want a sense of ownership

Darius Alexander '02 and his friends want to reach out to the PLU community and beyond. They and other motivated students who belong to B.L.A.C.K.@PLU volunteer off-campus, giving speeches at middle schools and talking to youngsters about preparing for college and accepting people of all backgrounds. He also organized a step show on campus, featuring the rhythmic dancing and stomping made popular in the black community, to bring people from the community to PLU.

Students are forming more organized groups to spotlight their cultures and introduce them to PLU. Clubs now include the Korean Club, Hawaii Club, Asian Pacific Islander Club, B.L.A.C.K.@PLU, Puentes for Latino students, Harmony for gay and lesbian students and their supporters, the Feminist Student Union, the Diversity Coalition, Norwegian and other international student groups and social activists. Programs run throughout the year to bridge the gap between groups and get people talking to each other.

The establishment of the new Diversity Center, which opened on the lower level of the University Center last fall, went a long way in showing the university's commitment to multiculturalism and giving students a campus home of their own.

Most minority students say they haven't experienced any overt discrimination but say some PLU students – and teachers – could be more sensitive. Students don't want to be singled out in class to speak from a presumably different point of view simply because of their race. They want to be seen and heard on campus, but they don't want to be made into token minorities for photos or events.

"If there are racist people, they're under the table, because they know it's not accepted," said Travis Anderson, who is taking a semester off to focus on his music. "I just think they're uninformed. People just need to learn."

Alexander has had several classes where he is the only person of color.

"I think I've opened my mind to a lot of other cultures, and hopefully I've helped some other people open their minds," Alexander said.

The faculty and administration have taken a strong stand on increasing understanding by requiring students to take two diversity courses focusing on alternate perspectives or cross-cultural perspectives, pursuing a diverse faculty and working with different departments to improve conversations between faculty and students.

Religion professor Samuel Torvend '73 says one of the core values of a Lutheran education is recognizing that a diverse community is a gift, and that we honor the dignity and difference in others.

"From the Lutheran intellectual perspective, nobody has to justify himself or herself," he said. "There's no place at a Lutheran university for discrimination."

The university aims to recruit faculty and staff from different backgrounds while appreciating those with long service to PLU and the church. Provost Paul Menzel is thrilled with the hiring of Deborah Miranda, a Native American English professor who brings a wealth of knowledge and important perspective to campus. And President Anderson said the university has been successful in creating a much more diverse staff.

"It's important to welcome faculty and staff from a wide variety of backgrounds to give richness and texture and lifelikeness to the place," President Anderson said.

Sexual minorities gaining wider acceptance

For some, it's not race, but sexual orientation that makes them feel disenfranchised. For gay and lesbian students and faculty, being recognized as a minority is an important step. Anytime someone is reduced to a stereotype based on one character-

istic, it's hurtful, said Tom Campbell, English professor and co-adviser to Harmony. In the "robust tradition of academic freedom and the Lutheran tradition of open inquiry," he encourages people to open their minds to see sexual minorities as more than sexual beings and to start conversations.

Campbell said conversations about gay rights are taking place on campuses across the country as sexual minorities make their voices heard. "Like with any oppressed minority group, if they don't speak up, it's about silence and invisibility," Campbell said.

Campbell said much progress has been made since he and history professor Beth Kraig helped form Harmony in the early '90s. Students have learned to speak out, the campus appears more accepting of openly gay staff and students, and harassment of sexual minorities is specifically prohibited in university policies.

The university created a Commission on Campus Climate to assess the atmosphere and recommend ways to foster an inclusive and affirming

community marked by care, mutual respect and an ability to engage in civil discourse.

President Anderson formed the commission after anti-gay graffiti was spray painted on the administration building last fall. The university condemned the act, reiterating its belief that all people are welcome and worthy. Many students also were outraged, which got people talking about the importance of a diverse, open-minded campus. The university policy states that PLU "holds as basic the integrity and well being of every person in the community. It is committed to providing an educational environment that is fair, consistent, caring, and supportive of intellectual and personal growth."

"What we're trying to model is what the Lutheran Church would have us do," President Anderson said, "that is encourage conversation and discussion about gender identification and sexual identity."

Others support PLU's ongoing efforts.

"I think it is so strong of those people who do say they're gay," said Badillo, the ASPLU diversity director. "It is difficult for a lot of us minorities to see the sexual minorities having to deal with that discrimination."

assess the current climate and come up with ways to improve it.

"PLU students, faculty and staff agree that this is a remarkable community whose potential is not yet reflected in our reality," the commission concluded. "They share a vision of a community grounded in both faith and reason and yearn for these ideals to be lived more intentionally through stronger connections with each other and visible support for inclusion and diversity."

The commission recommended more clearly articulating the university's mission, revising new student orientation programs, revis-

more concordant atmosphere on campus," the president said. "Now it is up to all of us to accept their challenge."

Many who have already taken that challenge are excited about the direction PLU is headed.

"It's been a really good year in terms of people taking a stand," said LeAnn Jones '02, who was ASPLU's diversity director last year and is active in many issues on campus. "There have been really solid programs this year in getting the message of diversity out. Everyone's kind of stepping it up a little bit."

Jones, who attended a Lutheran high school in Portland, Ore., and graduated with only 28 people, knew what it was like to be in the racial minority. But she was still surprised when she arrived to find that most of the 80-100 African American students she had been told attend PLU were older students who don't live on campus.

"I didn't have anyone to really connect with," she said. "There are some times you just don't feel like you fit."

Retaining minority students through graduation is an important goal. A few African American students did not return to PLU for second semester last year. Kraig said she urges ambivalent or disillusioned students to stay, to make a difference.

"I tell them, the only way it's going to change is if you are here," Kraig said.

Jones said she has seen the commitment, and she tells prospective students of color to take a chance at PLU.

"If you want to be lackadaisical and just fit it, this isn't the place for you. But if you want something to challenge you, if you want a great faculty and opportunities for leadership, if you want a place that will grow and change and you can see that growth, then PLU's the place for you."

Continuing to foster the environment that creates growth and encourages inclusiveness will benefit the whole PLU community.

"We're called to prepare people to function in a world that is increasingly diverse, and that means we need to expose students to that," President Anderson said. "Our campus world needs to be a diverse place in order to carry out its educational task. I think we do a pretty good job of that."

Projects aim to improve climate, keep students

Students have produced a video, "Conversations About Diversity," to increase understanding. In it, students — some minorities, some not — discuss how they feel about diversity at PLU and their personal experiences. Teska, the associate provost, finds the video remarkable and moving. He and Eva Frey, associate director for multicultural affairs, are playing it for faculty members in an effort to provide them more insight from students' perspective.

The Commission on Campus Climate also had in-depth conversations with students, faculty and staff to

President Anderson said work started immediately to clarify the university's mission, to increase student understanding of the nature of a Lutheran university, to restructure student activities and encourage conversations. Among other things, the Provost's Office is reviewing the academic advising program and Student Life is working to promote greater interaction among student groups.

"I am grateful for the work that the Commission on Campus Climate has done to define a course toward a

If you referred to it as “Gulsrud University” probably half the people you talk to would know you meant PLU. There are more Gulsruds and friends of Gulsruds with a PLU connection than you can count.

Peter and Mary Ellen were high school sweethearts who went their separate ways to college. After a visit to see Peter at PLU, Mary Ellen realized that the California state school she was attending was the wrong choice. She soon transferred.

“I was amazed. There was a real strong sense of support and caring for each other at PLU. It just felt right,” Mary Ellen said. “And it's still

true. Natalie is experiencing the same atmosphere, the same combination of challenge and support that we did.”

“I graduated feeling fully prepared for the world of nursing,” said Mary Ellen, a registered nurse in IV therapy

now studying for a credential as a legal nurse. “My education has never let me down and I am proud that Natalie will feel the same.” The Gulsruds say that is the reason why they are staying involved at PLU as volunteers.

WHAT IS THE PARENTS COUNCIL?

Sponsored by the Office of Alumni and Parent Relations, the PLU Parents Council is comprised of parents or families of full-time undergraduate students at PLU. Their objective is to generate and maintain the goodwill and support of parents of the university. Members serve as a vehicle to inform other parents about all aspects of the university, strive to promote the welfare and advancement of the university, and to encourage participation in PLU activities. Activities include serving as hosts in residence halls and hosting question/answer session for parents during orientation, phoning new parents to the university in the parent-to-parent calling program, and serving as resource persons in local communities.

They attend all of the PLU activities held in their hometown, Spokane. At recruiting, alumni or fund raising events, they answer questions and relay their and Natalie's experiences at PLU.

When recruiters from PLU come to the high school where Peter teaches science, he meets with students who have shown an interest and gives them his insider's perspective.

“On the Parents Council we are able to support other parents and offer the university advice on how things might be improved from a parent's perspective,” Peter said. “Mary Ellen and I can also bring the perspective of a long affiliation with PLU to the council and that is something the other members appreciate.”

The Gulsruds have served on the PLU Parents Council for three years.

“We have discovered that the Parents Council really does make a difference,” Peter said. “In the past we have raised concerns about lighting on campus and Mary Ellen has requested changes in health care information provided by the university. In every case the university has followed up.”

The Gulsrud family makes it a point to visit campus about twice a year. “Homecoming has become a real family tradition for us,” Mary Ellen said. “We attend the game, stop by Afterglow, and stop by the bookstore to pick up PLU hats and shirts for our boys. They love coming to campus.”

It seems that sons Philip, 12, and David, 10, are getting an early taste of “Gulsrud University.” Look for them in the classes of '10 and '12.

A century of hoops history at PLU

November 16, the start of the 2001-02 PLU men's basketball season, marked the beginning of the second century of Pacific Lutheran University basketball.

The school played its first basketball game in November of 1901, according to evidence uncovered by Dr. Philip Nordquist '56—PLU history professor, the university's historian and great basketball player in his own right (with 1,139 career points, he ranks No. 16 on the all-time PLU scoring list). Nordquist presented his findings at the annual Heritage Lecture as part of the Homecoming 2001 celebration.

According to Nordquist, Pacific Lutheran University had a national scoring leader, and it was neither of the Pacific Lutheran court legends, Chuck Curtis '59 or Tom Whalen '66. You would have learned about a member of the Sioux Indian tribe dubbed "The Court Magician" for his savvy with a basketball. And you would have learned about the 10 greatest years of PLU basketball. Following are some of the highlights from PLU's first century of hoops:

The Early Years

The players could not have known, but when Pacific Lutheran Academy played the Tacoma YMCA in the school's first basketball game, it would start a sport that would continue more than a century later. PLA lost that game to the Tacoma 'Y', 33-10, with the promise in the student newspaper, *The Hurricane*, that "it will be a different story" when the teams played in Parkland. The result was the same, however, PLA losing, 27-18.

The team's first victory came some months later in March, a 15-12 triumph over a team from the University of Washington. A week later, PLA defeated the Tacoma YMCA, 16-9. The win was heralded with a six-verse poem in *The Hurricane*.

The 1906 team won the regional championship, beating all comers, including the University of Washington. Clarence Webster, a Native American from Kapowsin, was the star of that team. Other basketball standouts in those early years included Tony Brottem and Theander Harstad, who would go on to play major league baseball.

POLLY LANGLOW '28

Interest in basketball at Pacific Lutheran in the 1920s was primarily for the women's team, not the men's. Polly Langlow, a scoring machine from Long Beach, Calif., was mostly responsible for the interest in the Pacific Lutheran College "Maidens." The 1925 PLC women's team outscored its opponents, 240-137, with Langlow accounting for more than half the points. In a 47-4 win over American Lake, for instance, she poured in 33 points.

In 1926, the PLC "Dianas" compiled a 10-3 record that year, and Langlow scored 270 of the team's 431 points. A campaign was staged to inform the country about Langlow, and to declare her as the national scoring leader.

The advent of the College Female Athletic Association, which believed that women would be damaged by too much exercise, put intercollegiate athletics for women pretty much on hold until the '60s.

HARSHMAN AND LUNDGAARD

The 1955-64 teams, says Nordquist, accomplished a "level of achievement not reached since." During that 10-year period, Pacific Lutheran won nine of 10 conference championships and seven times made the trip to Kansas City for the NAIA national tournament. Three of those teams were coached by Marv Harshman '41, who ranks second only to the legendary Cliff Olson in winning percentage among Pacific Lutheran men's basketball coaches.

"Harsh" is himself a legend, having a 236-116 record in 13 seasons at the helm. Harshman, who would later go on to coach at Washington State and Washington and win more than 600 games as a college coach, is a member of the College Basketball Hall of Fame.

Harshman's 1956-57 team rolled into the national semifinals with only one loss in 30 games. They were within nine seconds of moving into the title game when Tennessee State's Dick Barnett, who would go on to a long NBA career, hit a long jumper to give his team a 71-70 victory. Harshman's next Pacific Lutheran team, his last, lost 92-91 to Georgetown (Kentucky) in the second round at nationals.

The next year, Harsh was replaced by Gene Lundgaard '51. During a spectacular four-year playing career from 1947-51, he scored 1,456 points, a number that still ranks No. 8 on the all-time Pacific Lutheran scoring list. In his first year as coach, Lundgaard took the team all the way to the NAIA title game, where they lost a 97-87 decision to Tennessee A&I. When he retired in 1975 after 17 years of coaching, Lundgaard had accumulated 270 victories and a .617 winning percentage. The first Pacific Lutheran team to earn a trip to nationals, incidentally, was the 1951 team coached by Harshman. The team's star player was Lundgaard.

The "Big Three"

The stars of Harshman's final three teams and Lundgaard's first squad were Chuck Curtis '59, Roger Iverson '59 and Jim Van Beek '60. This trio starred together from 1955-59, leading the Lutherans to a 106-20 record and national prominence. Curtis established scoring and rebounding records that remain today. Curtis scored 2,173 points and hauled down 1,470 rebounds in 110 games, and in 1997 was inducted into the NAIA Hall of Fame. Iverson, a guard, is second in career scoring with 1,820 points and in 1971 was selected to the NAIA All-Time National Tournament Team. A year later, he was inducted into the NAIA Hall of Fame. Van Beek, a forward, finished his career with 1,207 points, at the time joining his two teammates as three of only five Pacific Lutheran players to score more than 1,000 career points. Twice he earned national all-tournament team honors.

917-669

PLU starts its second century of men's basketball with a cumulative 917-669 record. Among the remarkable achievements of the first century were 25 consecutive winning seasons from 1948-72 and six consecutive Evergreen Conference championships from 1955-60.

Bruce Haroldson began this, his last season, with a 236-236 overall record. Those 236 wins match him, exactly, with Marv Harshman for No. 2 on the Pacific Lutheran career coaching victories list.

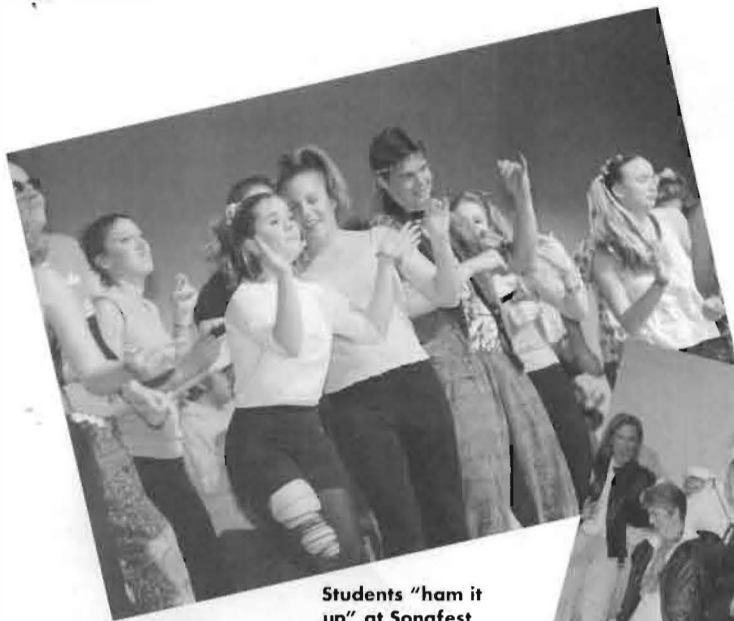
Faculty/Staff Songfest Skit

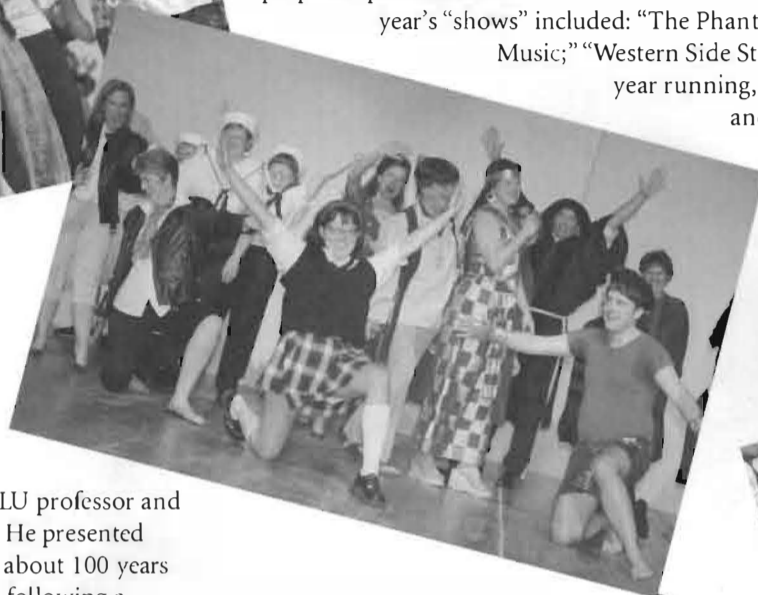
year running, the faculty and staff skit wowed the large and enthusiastic crowd in Olson Auditorium.

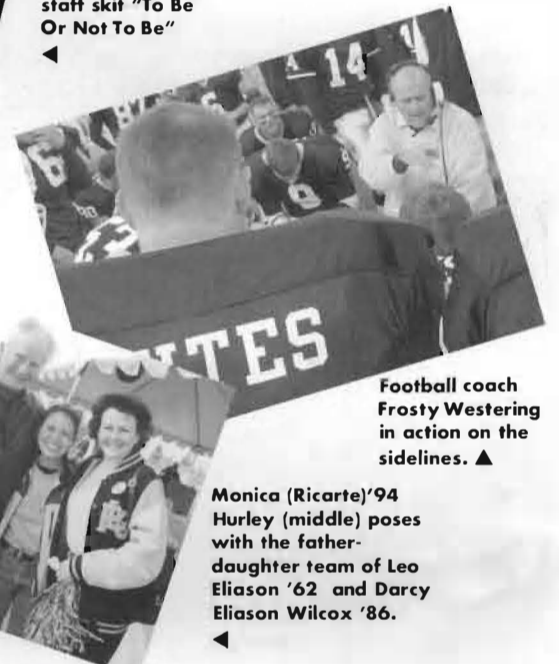

Teacher takes on Mt. Everest—over and over again

Jason Edwards '84, '89 has achieved two of his dreams. One was to teach—which he currently does at Puyallup's Stahl Junior High School. The other was to climb the summit of the 29,028 foot Mt. Everest—a dream he has achieved four times, spending 14 months of his life on the mountain.

Edwards began dreaming of Everest in junior high school, when he first came to learn about and admire Luther ("Lute") Jerstad '58, a member of the first American team to summit Everest. He read National Geographic and the book "Banner in the Sky," by James Ramsey Ullman. Edwards also admired Chris Chandler '70, who summited in 1976 and died of a cerebral and pulmonary edema in 1985, trying to climb Mt. Kanchenjunga. Edwards was inspired by the two display cases of Jerstad and Chandler in Mortvedt Library.

At 17, Edwards was guiding people up mountains around the world. After graduation, he began intense trips as a climber and a guide. After getting his second PLU degree, he stepped into the role of Everest climber. Between his 1991 and 1994 summits, he was a substitute teacher. Edwards turned his attention to teaching full-time in 1994. He ultimately felt that he needed to put equal time and effort into both climbing and teaching.

"It turns from avocation to a vocation, at least for me," Edwards said "I need things to look forward to, and I need things to share with my students." He journals his experiences and regularly reports back to his students at Stahl through the Stahl Web site. One of his ninth graders recently told him, "I want to climb Mt. Everest."

Whether it is taking other climbers up Everest through his company, Mountain Experience or sharing knowledge and adventure with his students, Edwards tries to inspire others.

"Dreams can be attained," Edwards said. "By turning

dreams into goals, and then 'plugging away at them' over time, someday they will likely come true like they have for me."

He believes that PLU creates people who go out into the world to capture those dreams—inspired by professors, the campus or even library displays. Edwards, whose next adventure is an expedition in Antarctica this winter, believes the dreams that PLU alums have achieved "really speak to the spirit of the university." With three alumni who have reached Everest's summit, it can be called a remarkable spirit. Edwards plans to donate a third display to the collection, inspiring the next generation of Lutes.

Home business becomes Web success

Looking to make a little pin money, Byron '69 and Gail (Morseth) '69 Bitar lined up some vendors, threw together a homemade catalog and started a mail order cookware business out of their basement.

That was 20 years ago. Today their company, A Cook's Wares, carries a comprehensive collection of the finest gourmet cookware, cutlery, pans, appliances, bakeware, porcelains, utensils and ingredients. They have a carefully maintained mailing list of more than 100,000 active customers and new prospects. Their Web site, *cookswares.com*, serves a worldwide clientele and features detailed product information, articles, recipes and secure Internet ordering.

When they started the company, Byron Bitar was beginning what would become a 27-year career as professor of philosophy at Geneva College in Beaver Falls, Pa. Gail Bitar was a full-time mom.

"We were just looking to make some extra money each month. We had no experience in mail order, no experience in business at all," she said. "We settled on selling cookware because we had a newfound interest in gourmet cooking and Byron just loved the tools involved."

With a \$5,000 family loan they contacted vendors and began buying products they liked. "Byron has a real knack for knowing what a good product is. We bought nice, useful, high quality tools and then developed a small catalog. We wrote descriptions and Byron did line drawings of the items," Gail said.

Their first advertisement was a one-inch display ad in *Gourmet Magazine* announcing their catalog. They continued to advertise in *Cook's Illustrated*, *Bon Appétit* and *Food & Wine Magazine*.

Seven years ago they opened a storefront and warehouse in Beaver Falls, where they employ a staff of 12. They have been on the Web for two years.

"It's been a lot of hard work," Gail said, looking back on 20 years in the mail order business. "Byron has had three jobs—if you count being a good father, his teaching career, and our business."

For the Bitars, the real secret to their success is their belief in the necessity to treat both customers and employees with respect.

"We treat people the way we would like to be treated," she said. "I'm surprised when I hear that not all companies are run that way."

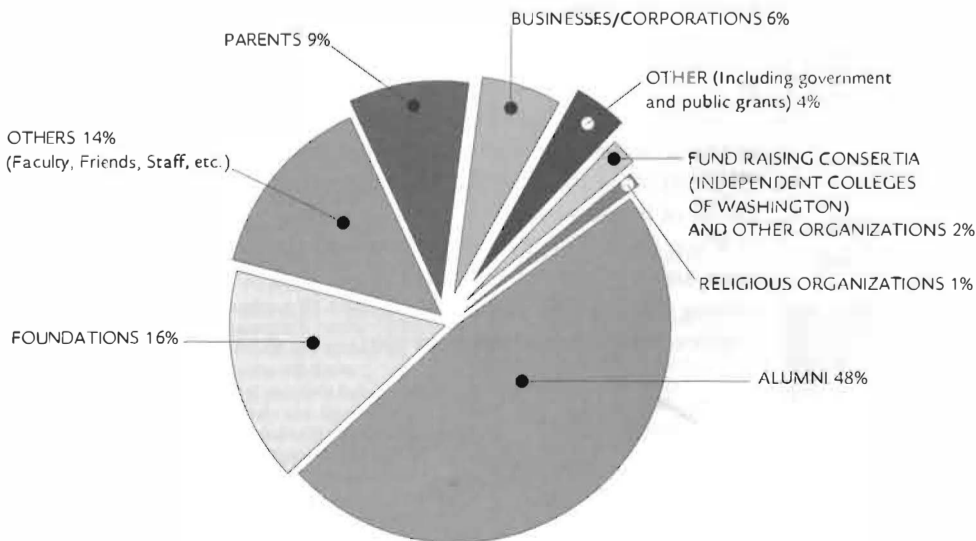

Undergraduate research studies at PLU are at an unprecedented level. Last year, research paper topics ranged from "Fatty Acid Desaturase 2 Gene in young zucchini" to "Study of water use, gas exchange and physiology of hardwoods on a presumed water gradient." There are several projects currently underway, including Mei Zhu's work on mathematical modeling of butterflies (pg. 5). Chemistry and physics faculty began doing research one-on-one with undergraduates in the '60s.

Since 1995, PLU's Division of Natural Sciences has received funding from the M.J. Murdock College Science Research Program. The Trust continues to provide research equipment and summer salaries for faculty and student researchers from all departments in the Natural Sciences.

PLU's Office of Development has raised \$332,400 in gifts and pledges, and the Trust has made a partial award of \$130,000. To secure additional funding, PLU must raise \$267,600 by March, 2002. An endowment of \$1.5 to \$2 million is planned to fully support the natural sciences undergraduate research program.

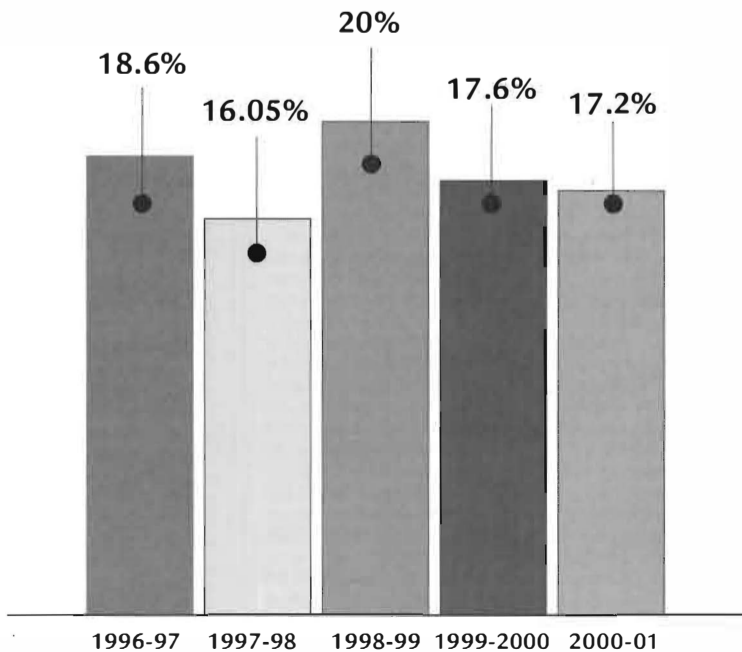

Thanks to the generosity of Chuck ('60) and Ann (Thingvall '56) Laubach, endowments to support both faculty and student research in the natural sciences have been established for long-time friend and retired PLU chemistry professor, Dr. Fred Tobiason '58.

Earnings from the Dr. Fred L. Tobiason Endowment for Faculty/Student Science Research will provide stipends for PLU faculty and undergraduate students involved in natural science research. Dr. Tobiason taught at PLU from 1966 until he began phased retirement in 1992. He has continued serving the university by teaching classes part-time and conducting research.

Gift proceeds also established the Charles and Ann Laubach Family Endowment for Faculty/Student Science Research. For most of his career, Chuck was a chemist at the Puget Sound Naval Shipyard in Bremerton, Wash., and Ann has been managing the family business, Bri-Lor Enterprises.

This significant gift from the Laubachs helped PLU meet the initial requirements of a challenge grant from the M. J. Murdock Charitable Trust. An additional \$267,600 for endowment to support faculty/student science research must be raised by March 2002 in order for the university to receive the final grant installment from the Trust.

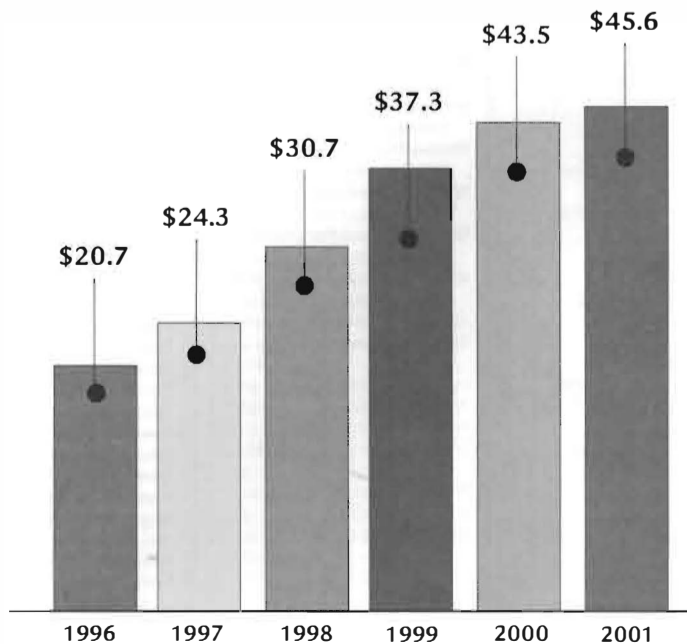

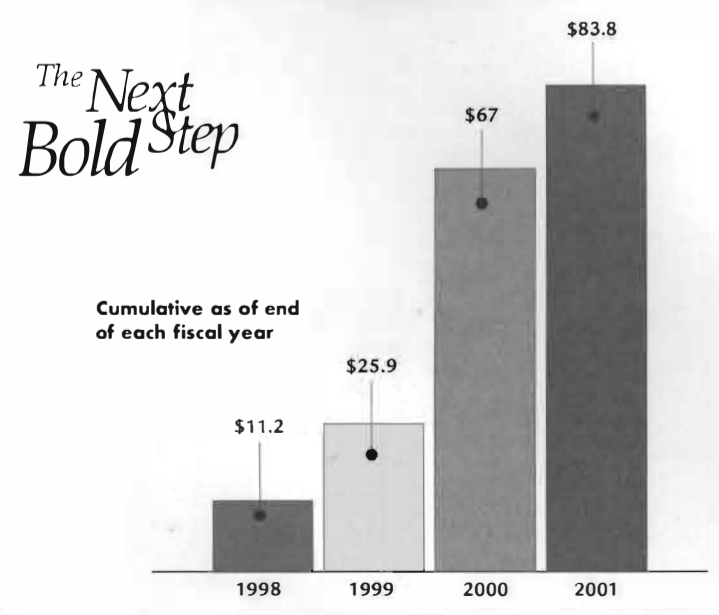

How I became a Lute

AS A SENIOR AT MOUNTLAKE TERRACE (WASH.) HIGH SCHOOL LAST YEAR, CHRIS JENSEN '05 WROTE A JOURNAL FOR THE AMERICAN COLLEGE TESTING WEB SITE ON HIS COLLEGE APPLICATION EXPERIENCES. THE FOLLOWING ARE SOME HIGHLIGHTS OF HIS JOURNEY.

August 2000 SENIOR YEAR—THE GRAND FINALE

I'm excited and a little nervous. I'm not sure where I'll be going yet, but I have a pretty good idea of what I'm looking for in a four-year college. I don't want to go to a big college where the student-to-teacher ratio is high...I like having someone I can go talk to who knows what's going on and who knows who I am.

Whatever school I go to has to have a strong education program. You see, I want one of the most under-appreciated jobs in the world: I want to be a teacher. Even if I can just touch one student, just one person, and help him or her find a dream and achieve it, well, then, it will be all worth it.

I've already visited one of the schools I'm looking at—Pacific Lutheran University—and even met with the football coach.

October 2000

I feel like our house is becoming College Central. Everywhere I turn I run into reminders—college brochures, financial aid forms, drafts of my résumé and scholarship forms.

In most cases the applications have to be in before December. That will be here before we know it! It's kind of scary because the choice I have to make ultimately will be with me for the next four or five years. There is a lot riding on this one.

November 2000

The pressure is starting to get to me a little. I'm dealing with homework, sports, my job, and—oh, yeah—finding a college.

I'm trying to meet with the college representatives from my top schools. Recently, I talked with PLU during their visit to my high school. Their representative did give me some good inside information on the application essay. She told me the same thing my mom has for years: less is more. Another thing I learned is that with the financial aid and scholarships they are generally able to offer students, the actual out-of-pocket cost for tuition is about the same as for public schools. That was good news for my parents and me.

I've also been on the phone a lot with colleges. PLU has called multiple times. I like being wanted!

February 2001

The hard work is done...all my applications are in. By now I think I know everything by heart—I can tell you what college my parents went to and when, the year they graduated and with what de-

gree—you name it, I know it! I've written about how I spend my summers, academic experiences that significantly influenced my life, who I am, special circumstances on why I should be selected, and favorite activities.

I applied to Central Washington University, Western Washington University, Eastern Washington University, Pacific Lutheran University, and University of Puget Sound. This has got to be the worst: just waiting.

May 2001

PLU is where it's gonna be! They've got the most to offer: a great campus, a great program, lots of options, and everyone I've talked to has been extremely nice. They actually care about who I am and what I want to do. It's going to be my home for the next four years. I'm really looking forward to it.

June 2001

June 18, I was officially enrolled as a college freshman at the fine institution of Pacific Lutheran University. Now that my college planning days are over, I'll tell you what I learned:

- **Keep your options open.** Apply to more than one or two colleges, and apply to both public and private schools. This will give you a better idea of which school "wants" you the most. Present yourself to those colleges the best you can. Don't play to them—just be yourself.
- **Work hard the entire four years of high school.** I wish I had. Good grades and a good GPA translate into more financial aid dollars from the college. A good GPA also helps you earn scholarships.
- **There are so many scholarships out there.** I was dumbfounded at just the ones our school brought in.

- **Get involved in community service.** Many scholarships ask about community service in the applications; the colleges like to see it, and it's a good way for you to help out and learn about yourself. I challenge all of you to go out and donate a few hours of your time each week or every other week to help a cause that you believe in.
- **Start saving money for college now.**

I'm excited about the next four years of my life, and I believe that I made the right choices. I know I picked the right college. It's time now to prepare for the rest of my life.
