COLORFUL SCANDINAVIAN DANCES TO FEATURE MAY FESTIVAL

Colorful Scandinavian folk dances will feature the 33rd annual May Festival May 6-7.

Part of PLU's 75th Anniversary Year Scandinavian Arts Festival, the program will include some 20 dances from Norway, Sweden and Denmark. The festivities will begin each evening at 8 p.m. in Memorial Gymnasium with the crowning of May Queen Karen Kane by Arne Tvete, supreme president of the Sons of Norway.

The dancers, a group of 50 PLU students, will appear in authentic costumes of the three countries.

All of the folk dancing will be done to music provided by the string and woodwind sections of the University orchestra under the direction of Stanley Petrulis.

Much of the music has been arranged in Scandinavia and is being played for the first time in America. It has been made available to PLU through Gordon Tracie, an authority on Scandinavian folk dance and culture, from Seattle. He is a personal friend of the co poser, Gunnar Hahn of Sweden.

A special feature of the program will be the playing of the Hardanger fiddle by Auden Toven of Oslo, Norway, as he leads the procession of dancers.

Reginald Laursen, a PLU senior, will play a salutation on the lur, a Norwegian horn made of birch.

Two well known Norwegian folk songs,
"Paul paa Haugen" and "Saeterjenten's Sondag,"
will be sung by Carolyn Malde, Linda Sandaker
and Katherine Vold.

The program is under the direction of Mrs. Rhoda Young. Assisting are Gerald Curtis, Tracie and Toven. (continued on page 3)

WATER BALLET, RECITALS, FOLK CONCERT FEATURE WEEK END FROGRAMS

A wide variety of activities are listed for the weekend, opening with the Second performance of the Sea Sprites water ballet tonight in the PLU swimming pool at 8 p.m.

The program will be comprised of 10 acts including oriental, western, modern, jazz, marching, folk, popular, Hawaiian, waltz and African numbers.

Also listed for tonight is a joint faculty recital, featuring Dr. Rolf Espeset: at the piano. The recital, which is complimentary, will be held in the Jacob Samuelson auditorium at 8 p.m.

A trio composed of Ann Tremaine, violing Lou Petrulis, cello, and Calvin Knapp, piano, will appear in the program.

On Saturday evening at 8 p.m. in Memorial Gymnasium, the Expression Series will present "Sounds of Music." The program will feature eight folk and popular groups from northwestern colleges. Among the groups will be the Nordic Trio from PLU.

Two PLU senior music majors, Roy Helms and Kent Isenberg, will appear in joint recital Sunday at 4 p.m. in the Eastvold Chapel auditorium. They will perform on the Casavant organ.

The program will include Baroque, Romantic and contemporary works, drawing from the master organ works of Bach and his contemporaries as well as the delightful modern sounds of Langlais.

NORDQUIST REPLACES KARL AS FACULTY ATHLETIC REPRESENTATIVE

Dr. Philip Nordquist, assistant professor of history, has been named as the new faculty athletic representative at PLU, according to an announcement by Dr. Robert Mortvedt, PLU president.

He replaces Theodore O. H. Karl, chairman of the department of speech, who has resigned from the faculty athletic representative post after serving in that capacity for 18 years.

Dr. Nordquist, a 1956 graduate of PLU, has been a member of the PLU faculty since 1963. He earned eight letters in football and basketball at PLU and in 1955 was selected to the All-Evergreen Conference basketball team. He ranks eighth among the all-time PLU basketball scorers.

Karl, in his capacity as faculty athletic representative, served three terms as president of the Evergreen Conference, was special advisor to the executive committee of the NAIA for four years, was the first chairman of the NAIA conference committee and was a member of the eligibility committee of the NAIA. He also has been a member of the District I NAIA eligibility committee.

The change will become effective with the start of the 1966-67 academic year.
